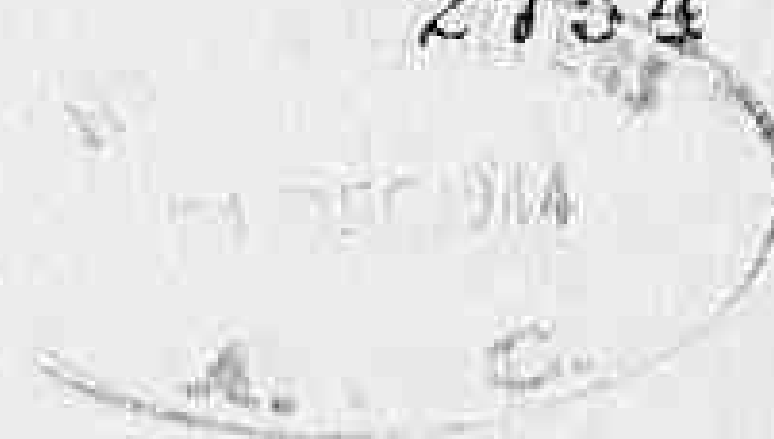

SUBJECT: Italian Property in Patras and Athens.

TO : Headquarters Allied Commission, APO 394.

1. Reference is made to letter number 505-LA of 3rd November, 1944, and its enclosure, cy mm 6/919/389.
2. No information has been received from Patras in regard to Mr. Rossi, but will be forwarded as soon as available.
3. Mr. Agostino Cecchi has been contacted. He is in residence at the ex-Italian Legation now under the protection of the Swiss Legation. He has no complaints to offer as to his treatment and no part of the building has been occupied by troops.
4. The Police Branch do not consider it necessary to issue Mr. Cecchi any form of permit to remain in Athens since (a) Italians are not being interned, and (b) a person occupying his position would not be interfered with.
5. It is further confirmed that no other buildings required by the Italian Government have been occupied in Athens.

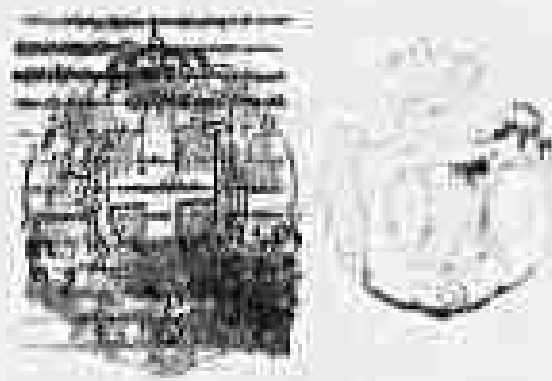

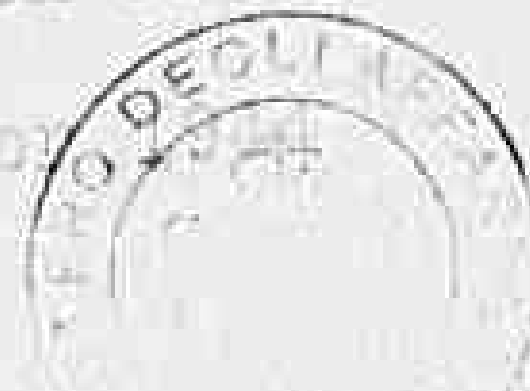
MEMORANDUM FOR THE A.C. POLITICAL SECTION

Signor Umberto LANZETTA, former Consul at Patrasco, has been repatriated to Italy after being interned by the Germans 14 months in Athens for his not having adhered to the Republican Government. He now finds himself at Turin in the Military Hospital "Acunfora" owing to bad conditions of health.

It appears that difficulties have been raised to his leaving hospital and coming to Rome as the Allies wish to carry out an enquiry on his former activities.

In consideration however of his firm and unquestionable attitude during these last months, the Ministry for Foreign Affairs would much appreciate should the A.C. interest the competent Allied Authorities in obtaining his release from Hospital and a means of transport to Rome, where he has been recalled to the Ministry.

1. Reference is made to your letter No 505-LA of 22 October 1944 (which quoted Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs Memo No. 6/734/349 dated 19 October 44) and this Headquarters letter G-5: 383-4 of 31 October 44.

2. Information has now been received that Mr. Umberto Lanzetta was returned from Hospital to the Italian Legation but that in August, when the Italian Fascist personnel left Greece, he was sent back to the Italian Military Hospital at Goudi, Athens, which is still continuing to function. He has had a surgical operation successfully performed on the retina of the left eye, but is in good general health and is being looked after. He hopes in due course to be evacuated to Italy with the hospital. He received his family's messages through the Vatican, but was unable to communicate in reply.

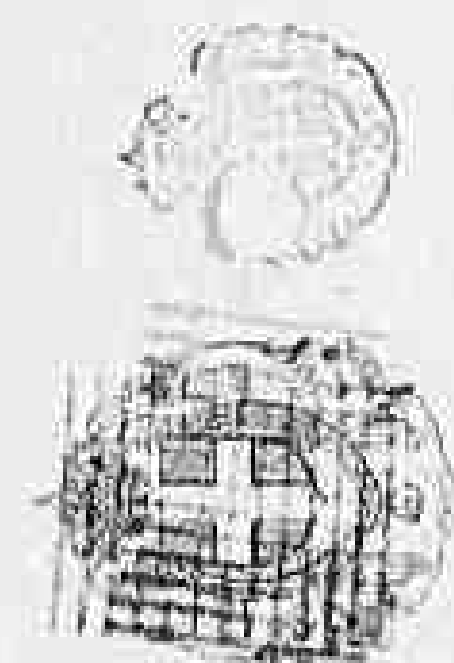

MEMORANDUM FOR THE POLITICAL SECTION, A.C.

Reference is made to Memorandum N. 6/734/349 dated October 19th concerning Sig. Lenzetta, former Italian Consul in Patrass.

From further information received it appears that before leaving Patrass for Athens (Sept. 19th, 1943) Sig. Lenzetta left a chancellor, Sig. Guido Rossi, in charge of the Consulate. Eventually (March 10th, 1944) Sig. Rossi was arrested by German Military Authorities and the Consulate was closed.

After a short period of detention Sig. Rossi was released and permitted to remain in Patrass where he continued to render the necessary assistance to the needy Italians there.

The Ministry for Foreign Affairs would be grateful to the Political Section, A.C., if they could inform the competent Allied Authorities in Greece that Sig. Rossi is duly entrusted with the custody of the Italian Consulate in Patrass and that it would be appreciated if he could be permitted to remain there for the time being.

At the same time the Allied Military Authorities in Greece should be informed that the Chancellor, Sig. Agostino Cecchi has been left in Athens after the repatriation of the personnel of the Italian Legation there, for the purpose of taking care of all the buildings belonging to the Italian Government and Institutions in the said town. The Ministry for Foreign Affairs would now wish to confirm Sig. Cecchi to this task. *Cecchi*

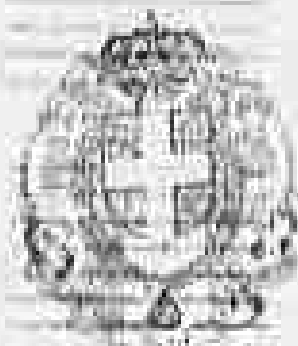

In view of his grave conditions and of the fact that he was left in Athens quite alone (his wife was in Rome at the time of the armistice) the Ministry for Foreign Affairs would be much obliged if the competent Allied Authorities could be approached in order that every possible assistance be given him.

It would also be appreciated if this Ministry could get some information on his health conditions and on the possibility of his return to Italy. *Calla*

1. The Political Section of this Headquarters has now been informed that Count Mora di Lavriano was arrested for addressing a small meeting held in ~~the~~ territory without the necessary permit. When charged and found guilty of this, he was fined 5000 lire and sentenced to 3 months' imprisonment.
2. The local ~~the~~ authorities, however, allowed Count Mora and his co-accused to remain at liberty pending a review of the case, and on the 12th January the Acting President of the Allied Commission also gave instructions that the Count should be released.
3. The case has now been reviewed by the Legal Sub-Commission of this Commission which states that the conviction was correct and in complete accordance with the provisions of Proclamation 3, Article IV. The sentence has now been reduced however from 3 months' imprisonment and a fine of 5000 lire, to a fine of 5000 lire only, which had been paid promptly in the first instance. Similarly the sentences imposed on Count Mora's co-accused have been reduced to fines only.

1. In answer to your memo at Folio 6A, Count MORRA was charged with attending a meeting in Allied Military Government Territory for which the requisite permit had not been obtained. In fact, Count MORRA was the speaker at the meeting which was extremely small.

2. Count MORRA was found guilty and sentenced to imprisonment for three months and to a fine of 5,000 Lire. This fine was promptly paid.

3. On the instructions of the Acting President, instructions were issued on 12 Jan 1945 that MORRA should be released forthwith. It has subsequently come to light that the local Allied Military Government authorities had very properly allowed MORRA and his co-accused to remain at liberty pending ~~the~~ review of the case.

4. The case has now been reviewed by the Legal Sub-Commission who state that Count MORRA clearly failed to comply with the provisions of Proc.

3, Art. IV and that he was properly convicted. The sentence of the court has been reduced from 3 months imprisonment and a fine of 5,000 lire to a fine of 5,000 lire only.

5. The sentences on Count MORRA's co-accused have also been reduced to fines only.

I am sorry that I have not replied before to your letter of the 1st November about John Litta. I had known him before and soon as he arrived back here he came to see us. I quite agree with everything you said about him and am glad to say I was successful in finding him a job with the Allied Screening Commission which, as you know, is responsible for investigating and settling claims of Italians who looked after our prisoners during occupation. I have seen him several times since and I understand that he is delighted with the work. He will only, however, be able to carry on with it for another 2 or 3 months as I understand after that he will be wanted to rejoin the 6th Army as a Liaison Officer.

Incidentally, you might be interested to know a little of what the Allied Screening Commission have been doing. They have had so far some 14,000 claims out of which they have already settled over two thousand, payments being between six and eight thousand lire per person. They will no doubt be a lot more when we get further North.

Alice is here with us now and I do hope you will let us know when you next come to Rome, and either come and stay with us or, at least, come for a meal. We have just had Andrew Porter here for the last week. He is in great form and has enjoyed himself playing a little polo and riding a few show-jumpers.

It will have been seen that Marchese Avvocato Falcone Lucifero has replaced Signor Tomaso Sicilliani as Minister of Agriculture. Some brief notes on the new Minister are given below.

2. MARCHESE AVVOCATO FALCONE LUCIFERO, member of an old Calabrian family, was born in 1898 at Crotona (Catanzero). He graduated in law at Turin and later practised in Rome, where he conducted a movement for the reform of Italian legislature and penal laws for minors. A volunteer in the last war, he was decorated with the War Cross and was discharged as a lieutenant. In 1919 he became a member of the Official Socialist Party and in 1920 was elected Municipal Councillor of Crotona. He travelled widely, visiting Russia, Canada, the U.S.A., South America and Africa. At the time of the Allied occupation he was at Calabria and was appointed by AMGOT as Prefect of Catanzero, which post he held until his appointment as Minister of Agriculture.

Marchese Advocate Falcone L. ALFARO, born on 5/1/1898 at Grotto (Catanzaro).

He graduated in law at Turin. As a student he organized the first Calabrian sport society, the Naval League of Grotto, a fishing cooperative and took an interest in the serious and complex social and economic problems of his native Calabria, an eminently agricultural place.

At Turin he founded the federation of University Students; at Rome, together with others, the Artistic Universalist Group.

He entered law practice at Rome, but at the same time he gained a reputation as a writer on law and collaborator with the principal Italian juridical and penal periodicals. He created the Center for Study of Youth criminality, contacting similar institutions of other nations, and conducted with a special string of publications quite a movement for acceleration of Italian legislative and penal reform for minors. He was made a corresponding member of the Academy of criminal Anthropology of Sperto and of Italian and international scientific Associations. He collaborated with Italian juridical periodicals; published writings on various legal subjects and founded, with other researchers, the review "Criminologia". He published some travel books and a translation of the "Prodigal life of Honore de Balzac" by Benjamin. He also translated from the English the "Outlines of Criminal Law" by Kennedy and from the French "La peine de mort en matiere politique" of Guizot, translations which, however, up to now have not found a publisher. Some years ago he proposed to the Italian Association for the League of Nations an international investigation of the practical possibilities of revision of the peace treaties by peaceful means, but his idea did not meet approval, because the Association was a Fascist tool.

Also his idea to create an association for the study of the problems of the Balkan Peninsula, danger spot of Europe, similar to what exists at the House of Commons - and he was in touch with the respective English Parliamentary Group - did not find practical application.

He was a volunteer in the war of 1915-1918, decorated with the war Cross and was discharged as a Lieutenant.

He became a member of the official socialist party in 1919; was elected Municipal Councillor of Grotto in 1920. At Rome he took an active part in the life of the Roman Socialist Union, distinguishing himself for his sense of equilibrium and responsibility. With the split in the socialist party, he adhered to the Unitarian socialist party, of which Giacomo Matteotti was Secretary.

After the dissolution of all parties by Fascism, he devoted himself exclusively to the study of law, management of his vast agricultural enterprise in Calabria, and to long travels abroad for mainly technical purposes.

He visited Europe, including Russia, Canada, the United States of America, South America and Africa, taking a special interest in what related to his studies on criminal and agricultural legislations. He took part and organized international Congresses, such as that of Mental Hygiene at Rome and the International Congress for Penal Law at Palermo. During the last few years he withdrew to Calabria to take care of his lands and was there at the moment of the Allied occupation.

He was chosen by AMROF as prefect of Catanzaro, a position which he has held to the great satisfaction of the Allied Military Government from the 30th of October until his appointment as Minister, imparting a passionate rhythm on the reconstruction work of that vast province, considerably damaged by the war and German destruction. It is therefore believed that Marshal Badoglio chose him, in addition to his great gifts, as a person particularly welcome to the Allies.

He belongs to a most ancient Calabrian family, whose first records date back to the year 1000, which has given men of arms, clerics, men of politics, art lovers and patriots.

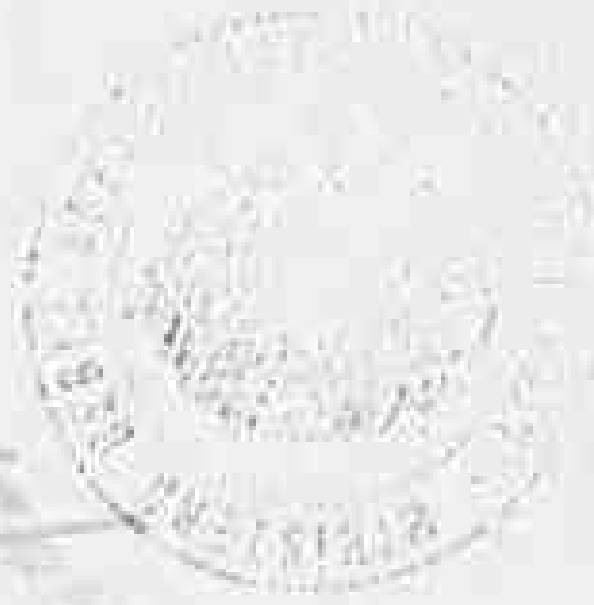

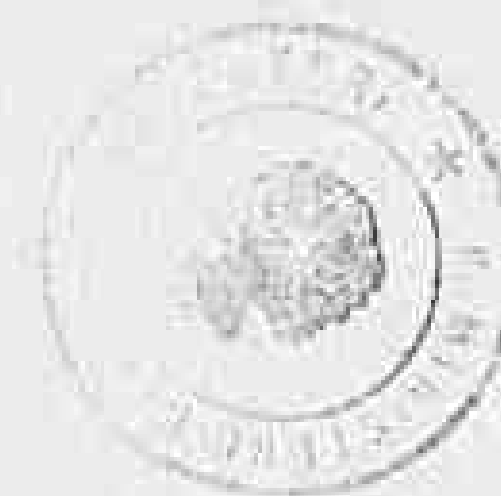

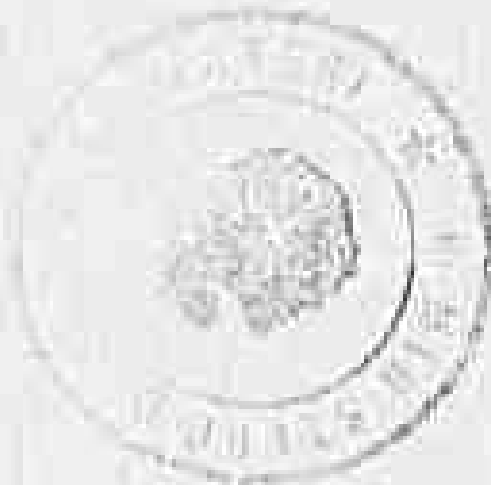

Control Commission)

1. Reference is made to the response of the Italian Cabinet to the "U. S. Congress Statement Regarding the Italian People" (see Italian message 1202, November 29, 1943, to Freedom). This message was transmitted by Civil Affairs to the U. S. Department of State.
2. State Department telegram No. 158, January 15, 1944, for Haber is in reply to this message.
3. It is requested that the following paraphrase of the above indicated telegram be transmitted to Haber for his information and action:

"It is believed that the message to the U. S. Congress from the Italian Cabinet is in reply to a concurrent resolution introduced by Representative Ludlow into the House. I present this resolution is being considered by the House Committee on Foreign Affairs and has not been reported out. Therefore, at this stage, the resolution is not a message to the Italian people.

"The Department understands that on October 19 an OWI Italian broadcast announced that the Foreign Affairs Committee of the American Congress was studying a resolution which Representative Ludlow had presented. During his broadcast the text of the resolution was read. It is assumed that being unfamiliar with the procedure of American legislature the Italian Government regards the resolution as an approved Act of Congress. This is an unfortunate misunderstanding. For background information, please transmit the above to Haber. 2680

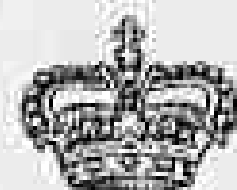

Mr. Makins tells me that when he was in Naples he went through your "pending file" with you and that you showed him all the letters to this office which appeared to be without an answer. The position as regards each of these letters is as follows:

EXTRACT:

3. Our memorandum of February 26th to General Strong, of which a copy was sent to you, asking if A.F.H.Q. would object to the return to Italy of Ricardo Luzzatto. A.F.H.Q. did not object and we so informed the Foreign Office. We also know that the Embassy in Washington reported to the Foreign Office at the end of March that the State Department had also no objection. Action, however, lies with the Foreign Office for it was to them (in fact to me myself when I was there) that Luzzatto applied for repatriation. Perhaps he no longer wants to come.
