Sul nuovo Ministro dell'Aeronautica, il Generale Pietro Piacentini, l'Agensia "Italia Nuova" fornisce la seguente nota biografica

Il Generale di B.A. Pietro Piacentini è nato a Verno (Udine) il 26 novembre 1898. Arruolatosi volontario di guerra come soldato semplice a 18 anni combattè sul Carso ed altri settori. Passato successivamente in aeronautica, ha totalizzato 22 anni di attività ed oltre 2000 ore di volo, 800 delle quali in voli di guerra. In combattimento ha riportato 3 ferite e una mutilazione. Ha avuto 11 ricompense al valore, tra cui l'Ordine Militare di Savoia, 4 medaglie d'argento, 2 promozioni per merito di guerra, e 2 promozioni a scelta.

Appassionato esploratore si è dedicato a studi e ricerche sul territorio africano e ha scritto vari libri su tali argomenti, e su argomenti di natura militare.

Fatto prigioniero in Africa Orientale il Generale Piacentini rientrò dopo l'armistizio nell'Italia liberata e da allora ha comandato i reparti operanti dell'aeronautica.

1. The Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs has informed the Political Section that after the previous of 1941 the situation of certain Italian economic institutions in Albania, which, in operating public utility services comply with important exigencies of Albanian economy, has become precarious due to repatriation imposed by the Germans of part of their directing staff and technicians. The Ministry states that following the liberation of Albania the personnel of these institutions, who remained in Albania, have pointed out the necessity of re-establishing contacts with the mother-houses in Italy by having a few technicians return to Albania to settle some of the most urgent questions.

2. The Ministry has requested in particular that Signor Umberto PICCARPI, Accountant General of the National Bank of Albania, be permitted to go to Tirana to overcome the numerous difficulties due to the suspension in the clearing between Italy and Albania which was formerly carried out by the branches of the Bank in Rome and Albania.

3. It would be appreciated were the Political Section to be informed in due course of the decision made in this matter.

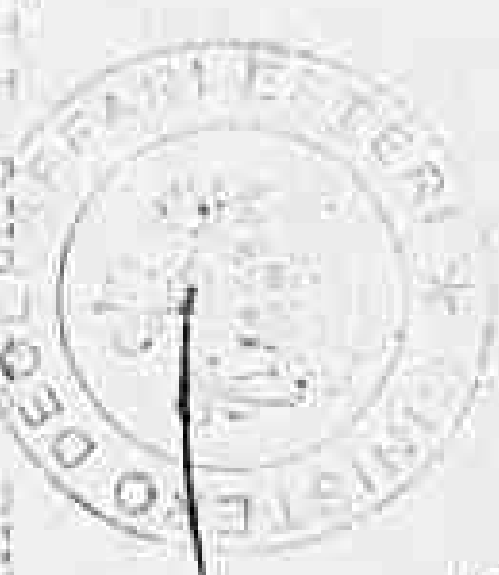

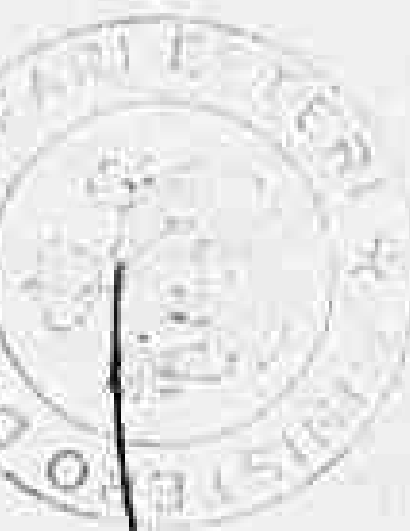

With reference to our memorandum No. 97 of the 5th June, transmitting a request received from the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs for the repatriation of Marchese Pasquale Pinto, it has been noted that telegram No. 52 from the Italian Ambassador at Ankara to his Government advises that Consul Pinto left Ankara on June 1st. No action is therefore necessary on our previous memorandum.

2. When sending over this telegram to the Italian Government their attention has been drawn to their memorandum, dated June 3rd, requesting Marchese Pinto's repatriation. It can only be assumed that they were unaware arrangements for his journey had already been made in Turkey.
