I have a feeling that because of the somewhat irregularity of the State Department in the issuance of orders assigning me to the Allied Control Commission, there may be no record in the Office of the Division of Foreign Service Personnel of my ever having actually served here. This happened to me once before when two years of tedious and important duty were never recorded for me.

In consequence, may I ask that you be so good as to sign a letter reading somewhat as follows:

This is to certify that William W. Schott, a Foreign Service Officer reported for duty in the Political Section of the Allied Control Commission to Lieutenant General Mason MacFarlane, Chief Commissioner of the Allied Control Commission, in Naples on July 12, 1944. Upon the transfer of Mr. General Reber, Mr. Schott was appointed to his position as Vice-President of the Political Section and reported to me in Rome on July 27, 1944. He served in this capacity until March 1, 1945 when the Political Section was abolished and subsequently until March 10 as Political Adviser to Allied Commission when he was relieved by Mr. Walter C. Dooling, 2nd Secretary of the American Embassy, Rome.

Dear Bill:

The attached letter to Samuel Reber, which I gave to Serafino Romualdi last June has just been returned to me undelivered. It appears that Mr. Romualdi did not get around to deliver the letter to Sam before his departure. Consequently, I am sending it to you as an informal introduction to Mr. Romualdi should you ever have an opportunity to meet him. I should imagine you could get in touch with him through the Labor Council Sub-Commission. In any event I think it will be worth your while to send for him and have a talk with him some time about his work and the particular field that he is following. We found his information very helpful and understand that he is doing a very good job in Italy.

We have good reports of you from people returning from the theater. I hope you are liking your job. Has Janet been able to join you yet in Rome? Is Caccia still in Rome? When Sam came home he believed - and we had understood from other sources - that Caccia was being transferred to another post and that Captain Pierson was succeeding.

Dear Jack:

Permit me first to congratulate you on your splendid new appointment which should bring you to these parts before long. We shall be delighted to see you and to put you up if you wish. The assignment should be an interesting one and you will be going back home, so the answers to the questions should come easily.

I should like to take this occasion also to express my views on my future here. As you know, I have been Joint Vice-President of the Allied Commission, with a British opposite number. In case under the U.S. Political Advisor and the British Resident Minister, respectively. Since Mr. Kirk superseded Bob Murphy, I have worked with Offie when Mr. Kirk named as his Deputy. Contact with the Embassy in Rome was maintained through the Liaison Officer of the Embassy - first Cowling, then Shepherd. These two, in consequence, are familiar with the workings of the Commission.

With the change in Allied-Italian diplomatic status, the American and British Commission came into closer contact with the Italian Government. Also, Mr. McMillan, the British Resident Minister, has become the acting President of the Commission. It is his idea (and I understand the State Department and the Foreign Office have, or will, approve it) that the Political Section of the Commission be abolished and that the American and British Ambassadors name a member of their respective staffs as Political Advisor to the Chief Commissioner. The British, in anticipation, already have done this and the British Vice-President, Political Section, has been sent to Greece. The British ambassador has nominated his Minister-Counselor as Political Advisor (temporarily with the title of acting Vice-President), and the First Secretary of the Embassy as his assistant.

Even though I have never been on the staff of Mr. Kirk and have never worked intimately with him, I feel that most probably he will prefer to designate a member of his staff as Political Advisor to
