The Political Section of the Allied Commission presents its compliments to the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and has the honor to refer to its memorandum no. 6/1056/449 of 16 November 1944, regarding the repatriation of Vice Consul Tortorici from Algiers.

Information has been received from AFHQ that there is no objection to the release and repatriation but that application for the release should be obtained from the French Authorities and be made by the Italian Government to the French Provisional Government through the French diplomatic representative in Rome.

Should the French Provisional Government accede to the request for repatriation, subject should apply for travel permit for Italy to the British Consulate General (Vice Department) 4 Rue Arago, Algiers.

SUBJECT: Assassination of Vice Consul Pietro Tortorici.

There has been received from the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs memorandum no. 6/1006/449 dated November 16, 1944, which, with reference to a similar memorandum no. 6/244/120 dated August 14, 1944, requests that consideration be given to the volume and restriction of Vice Consul Pietro Tortorici who is at present located in the Hotel Excelsior Tripoli, El Ouen, Algeria.

The Political Section has no record of any specific information that is detrimental to Vice Consul Tortorici and the advisory states that Mr. Tortorici's conduct since September 8, 1943 has been that of perfect loyalty. However, in view of G-2 Section's position to the restriction of officers who had operated in North Africa on the ground that the provision of their transport is not justified because it would place it beyond control of the war effort, Political Section is not in position to make a recommendation in this case.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE POLITICAL SECTION, A.C.

Reference our Memorandum N.6/244/229 of August the 14th.

The Ministry for Foreign Affairs would be very grateful should the A.C., again take into consideration the possibility of approaching the competent Allied Authorities with a view to obtaining the release and repatriation of Vice Consul Pietro Quirino Tortorici at present interned in the Hotel Transports Tropicaux, El Golaa Algeria.

As it has already been stated, Vice Consul Tortorici's conduct after September the 8th has been one of perfect loyalty and the Ministry for Foreign Affairs trust that the difficulties, which in the A.C.'s opinion did not counsel the forwarding of their previous request, have now been overcome.

The Ministry for Foreign Affairs will be grateful for the steps that the A.C., will see fit to take in the matter.
