TO : G-2 Section, Allied Forces Headquarters

1. There has been received from the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs Memorandum No. 6/257/120 dated 24 January 1945, of which a copy is attached, requesting authorization and travel facilities for the journey from Rome to Brussels and return of Italian Consul, Livio Theodoli.

2. The Ministry points out that Mr. Theodoli was the last Italian official who served at the Italian Embassy in Brussels until September 1943 when he was interned by the Germans. Because of his knowledge of the office and of the conditions there, it is deemed desirable that Mr. Theodoli accompany to Brussels the newly appointed Charge d'Affaires, Fernand Commaux, in order to assist him in the re-opening of the Embassy.

3. This request by the Ministry would appear to be a logical one, and applications for Military Travel Authorization for Mr. Theodoli are submitted herewith.

With reference to Your No. 59, I have informed the International Committee Red Cross at Geneva of the appointments of Marquis Theodoli as Secretary General and of Ambassador Valentini as President of the Italian Red Cross. The establishment of the High Commissary for POW entrusted to General Gazzera also has been notified. I stated that these bodies will do their utmost to meet needs of our internees and prisoners of war in collaboration with the International Red Cross. Her Royal Highness Princess of Piedmont also has been informed of these appointments. Close contact is being maintained by me with Swiss authorities in an effort to bring about improvement of conditions of our prisoners and communities in French North Africa and I am reporting via Madrid to Your Excellency in this connection.

Dear Caccia,

According to reports received by the Italian Ministry for Foreign Affairs, Allied Headquarters are believed to have given instructions to the British and United States diplomatic missions in Madrid and Portugal to oppose the return to Italy of all Italian subjects of doubtful political sentiments, i.e. suspect of being in favour of the self-styled Fascist republic.

I do not know if these reports are correct. In our opinion, however, it is undoubtedly preferable, indeed necessary, that such persons, rather than remaining abroad where they escape all control, be authorized to return to Italy where it is far easier to follow and strictly control them.

Abroad, on the other hand, they would merely increase the dissident feeling, and would sow seeds of contrasts in the Italian population; they would add to the already very difficult and delicate task of the Italian diplomatic and consular authorities; they would most probably facilitate the opportunities of German propaganda against us.

The foregoing applies all the more in the case of officials and employees, none of whom, if immediately repatriated, and taken away from the local atmosphere, would certainly not have passed to the other camp.

May I ask you to represent and explain this point of view to your authorities?

I would also ask you to submit to the former the possibility of considering with a greater latitude certain individual cases, as the one of Marchese Ugo Theodoli, whose return to Italy appears to have been held up on account of reports which I have no hesitation in qualifying at least very superficial.

As you are aware, Theodoli has nothing more to do in Lisbon, where he merely represents a relatively big expense for us; that his activity would on the other hand be extremely useful and extremely beneficial in Italy.

I shall indeed be most grateful, dear Caccia, if you will be so good as to insist on his name, on the strength of my formal assurance that Theodoli is an absolutely inoffensive person.

The reorganisation of the Red Cross in Southern Italy, and the tasks which we intend to entrust to it, represent an extremely urgent and necessary matter. 38/4

MEMORANDUM TO: Military Government Section, Allied Force Headquarters.

SUBJECT: Transportation of Private Secretary to the Secretary General of the Italian Red Cross.

Reference is made to previous telegram No. 51233, PMSCS, February 13, authorizing the return to Italy, via Portugal of the Marquis Theodoli who has been appointed Secretary General of the Italian Red Cross to re-organize its activities on the mainland. When Theodoli was appointed, see Italian Foreign Office telegram to Lisbon No. 19, February 10, he was authorized to return accompanied by his private secretary, Miss Vittoria Boselli. Miss Boselli, however, was ill at the time and could not accompany the Marquis Theodoli. She has now recovered and her services are urgently required in the Secretariat of the Italian Red Cross which is now being organized. Her presence here would greatly facilitate the work of the Italian Red Cross which is cooperating fully with the American and British Red Cross.

It would be appreciated if arrangements could be made to permit Miss Boselli to return to Italy by air.
