The Swiss Legation at Rome, in charge of the Interests of the Republic of Nicaragua in Italy, has the honour to present the following:

The motorcar "Peckard eight 1937 Model Sedan" motor No. 133-825, vehicle No. 1090-1473, chassis No. 46-22, license No. Roma 0210, H.P. 110, property of Mr. Francisco Medina, late Minister for Nicaragua accredited to the Royal Court, which was deposited at the garage "Casa dell'Automobile S. A.", Piazza Verdi 4, Rome, under the protection of the Swiss Legation, was requisitioned on the 25th of June 1944, by Lieutenant Colonel James J. Carnes, H.Q. A.C.C. O-15340. 772

The Legation would appreciate if the Allied Commission could kindly re-examine this case, and taking into consideration that the above mentioned motorcar is the property of a Nicaraguan Diplomat and under the protection of the Swiss Legation, to see whether it is possible for the requisition of same to be revoked. 7456

TO TAYLOR (MEMO)
Political Summary

4 January 1944

1. A weekly and political, economic summary is a well known corvee in our missions abroad and is quite useful for reference as a diary of events. Presumably this is what is required.
2. In view of the circulation proposed any such weekly report by the Commission would presumably simply consist of publishable facts.
3. Even for such a report I do not think we shall be able to produce anything of much value until we get concentrated at Salerno. But if required, the Political Section will undertake to have a short paragraph ready on January 6, 13, 20, etc. Is it contemplated that there shall be a meeting to submit contributions or is the Chief of Staff going to do the necessary collating?
- 4.. As regards the monthly reports I think December will have to go by default. A document of the kind required precludes easy access to files and staff which will not exist in time for such a report to reach Algiers by 22 January.
