S E C R E T,REPORT OF NAVY SUB COMMISSION FOR
FEBRUARY, 1945.

On the 19th February, Rear Admiral G. L. Warren, was appointed as Chief of the Navy Sub Commission, vice Rear Admiral C. E. Morgan, C.B., D.S.O. Rear Admiral Warren will have his office in the Allied Commission Headquarters, Rome. Commodore H. W. Zirolì, United States Navy, will continue to be Deputy Chief of the Sub Commission.

2. The Ministry of Marine has informed the Navy Sub Commission that captured Italian merchant seaman who are prisoner of war co-operators under the control of the British Government, may now send remittances to beneficiaries in Italy. The remittances will be received and distributed by the Ministry of War in accordance with arrangements made by that Ministry and the Director General of the Mercantile Marine.

3. The Ministry of Marine, at the request of the Navy Sub Commission, has agreed to supply 60 Italian Naval officers for assignment to duty with Italian Military Courts. The 60 Navy officers will be assigned to the Courts in order that the Navy may bear its proportionate share of the Court work in accordance with the wishes of the Procuratore Generale Militare and the Legal Sub Commission.

4. It has been confirmed with the Ministry of Marine that the present capacity of the Port of SAN STEFANO, which is now under the control of the Italian Navy, is four motor schooners of 200 - 300 tons. These vessels could moor simultaneously to the jetties. By placing mooring buoys, the Italian Navy Port Officer at SAN STEFANO considers that an 8000 ton ship with a maximum draft of 8 metres could be accommodated in the port.

5. In recent weeks the Italian Navy has shown an interest in obtaining general technical publications from England and the United States. Some publications already have been supplied to the Ministry of Marine by American and British representatives.

6. In spite of the fact that the attention of Italian Naval authorities has been brought to the repeated violations to travel regulations by Italian Naval personnel, the violations of the security of the Rear Army Zone continue to occur. As a result, Chief, Navy Sub Commission has initiated action with a view to securing the trial by Allied Military Courts of all Italian Navy personnel who are found to be illegally travelling in the Rear Army Zone. It is hoped that such action will have a deterrent effect on other would be violators of the security regulations.

7. Strong representations have been made to the Minister of Marine drawing attention to the frequent breaches of the censorship regulations on the part of Italian Naval personnel in ships visiting Malta. The Minister has issued a general order to all Commanding Officers on the subject in which he indicated that, should Allied Authorities withdraw leave privileges for Italian ships at Malta on account of the continued breaches of the regulations he will not intercede to secure their restoration.

8. At the request of the Minister of Marine, the possibility of arranging a small welfare enquiry service for the purpose of establishing a recognised source of information for ratings who have relatives in the Army Zone is being investigated.

9. The two reserve battleships "DUILIO" and "DORIA", carried out exercises together off the east coast of Sicily on the 21st February, 1945, subsequently returning to Taranto and Syracuse respectively. Apart from this, there has been no change in the normal activities of the Fleet.

10. On the 19th February, following attacks on Italian Naval Officers in the Rome press, some fifty ratings of the Italian Navy were reported to have demonstrated against the "AVANTI" by breaking into the offices of that newspaper and also protesting to the Socialist headquarters in Rome. Various newspapers commented adversely on what was termed a serious attempt on the freedom of the press; the Ministry of Marine, however, in an official statement referred to the incident as a spontaneous act on the part of the seamen which demonstrated their disapproval of the newspaper's assertions. Continued press attacks on serving officers in the Italian Forces had already been the subject of official representations.

1. You have been appointed head of the Naval Sub Commission of the Allied Commission and as such you will report direct to the Chief Commissioner.
2. The duty of the Naval Sub Commission is to represent the Allied Navies on the Allied Commission, and to advise the Chief Commissioner on such matters affecting the Italian Navy as are dealt with by the Commission. The function is a professional one and not a political one.
3. The Naval Sub Commission is responsible for all administrative and material questions affecting the Italian Navy. These include:
 - a. Employment of Personnel
 - b. Supplies of food, clothing, transport and naval stores
 - c. Disposal of war material
 - d. Requisitioning of Italian Naval property.
4. Effective this date all communications relating to matters of policy in connection with the Italian Navy under the Armistice Terms and the general administration of the Italian Navy, not directly affecting the operation of the Italian Fleet under the Cunningham-de Courten Agreement, will be referred directly to the Sub Commission.
5. You are authorized to deal direct with the Ministry of Marine, Chief Commissioner of the Allied Commission, Headquarters 15th Army Group and the various sub commissions of the Allied Commission regarding all such administrative questions. Matters of policy or any question requiring decision by higher authority should be referred to the Supreme Allied Commander through the Chief Commissioner.
6. For Naval Sub Commission business, the channels of communication with Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean, should also be through the Chief Commissioner.

7. Commodore H. W. Ziroli, United States Navy, will be your Deputy and will act on your behalf in your absence. Subject to the concurrence of the Chief Commissioner the remainder of your staff is to be organized as you think best for the efficient performance of the above duties.

SUBJECT: Directive for Air Forces Sub-Commission, Allied Commission

TO: Air Vice-Marshal W.A.B. Bowen-Buscarlet, C.B.E., D.F.C.
 Air Forces Sub-Commission, Allied Commission
 FROM: Chief Commissioner, Allied Commission

1. The following instructions supersede and cancel the directive which was issued to you from this headquarters on 7 December 1944, under reference Number JCS.1021.

2. Your duty is to represent the Allied Air Forces on the Allied Commission and to advise the Chief Commissioner on matters affecting the Italian Air Force. As representative of Mediterranean Allied Air Forces you will be responsible to the Air Commander-in-Chief. As a member of the Allied Commission you are responsible to the Chief Commissioner on matters which, under the Armistice Terms, are the direct responsibility of the Allied Commission.

3. a. The Combined Chiefs of Staff have agreed that an Italian Air Force, with an authorized manpower ceiling of (at present) 31,000, shall be allowed to remain in being for the present, as a co-belligerent Service for the defeat of GERMANY.

b. Your primary function, in general, is to assist the Italian Air Minister, Chief of Staff and Italian Air Force authorities generally, to run as efficient an Air Force as possible for the above end, in accordance with the policy laid down by the Air Commander-in-Chief, within the limits of their authorized resources and of such resources as the Allies can make available to them. You should be quite clear, and should make clear to the above mentioned Italian authorities, that the efficiency of the Italian Air Force is their responsibility. Your responsibility is first to transmit to the Italian Air Ministry the policy instructions of the Air Commander-in-Chief, and secondly to assist them with advice and with such material resources as can be made available by the Allies. If in your view the Italian Air Force authorities are failing in their duty, you will make such representations as you may think fit to the Air Commander-in-Chief and the Chief Commissioner including, if necessary, recommendations for the removal of any particular officer or officers.

4. a. Your function is thus a professional and not a political one. In the event of a change of government in ITALY you will be responsible for advising the Air Commander-in-Chief, in the light of your knowledge and official contacts as a member of the Allied Commission, as to the qualifications, from the Air Force point of view, of any potential Secretary or

Under-Secretary of State. And you will reserve the right to approve or reject on grounds of professional suitability, the appointment of Commanding Officers and Senior Staff Officers in the Italian Air Force; in doing so, however, you should as far as possible ensure that there is nothing in the officer's previous record under the Fascist government that makes him unsuitable for his appointment. You should discourage any political activities on the part of Italian Air Force personnel that may come to your notice. Apart from this it is not your function to concern yourself with the political views of any Italian Air Force personnel unless they obtrude themselves by affecting the efficiency of the Italian Air Force; nor is it your duty to discover any political activities in which Italian Air Force personnel may be engaged - that is a matter for the Italian Air Force authorities themselves.

b. Thus you and your staff have no political responsibilities, but should keep in close touch with, and consult as necessary, any authorities under Allied Force Headquarters whose duty it is to concern themselves with the past and present political activities of any Italian Service personnel.

5. You and your staff will be in the same relation to the Staff branches of Mediterranean Allied Air Forces concerned with organization, maintenance, supply, training and equipment, as a subordinate Air Officer Commanding and his staff. You should keep these branches fully informed and you are entitled to their assistance and advice as required.

6. Five (5) squadrons of the Italian Air Force are equipped with Allied types. Anything above that must be maintained from existing Italian material resources. You should ensure that the Italian Air Force authorities retain in the Service only such Italian-equipped units as can effectively contribute to the war against GERMANY, in which should be included such communications units as may be essential for internal courier services; the decision on the number, strength and composition of units falling under this category is one for the Air Commander-in-Chief acting on your advice. You will be responsible for ensuring that the Italian Air Ministry does not maintain any units in excess of those authorized by the Air Commander-in-Chief.

7. All first line operational units will be unreservedly at the disposal of the Air Commander-in-Chief who will place them under the operational control of the appropriate Mediterranean Allied Air Forces subordinate Commander.

8. You will submit routine reports on matters affecting the organization, administration and maintenance of the Italian Air Force to Commanding General, Mediterranean Allied Air Forces. All normal reports concerning the operations of the Italian Air Force units will be rendered by the Mediterranean Allied Air Forces Commander responsible for operational control. Special reports by you or the operational Commander concerned may be necessary from time to time, such as on matters of organization, administration or maintenance of Italian Air Force units which are affecting their operational efficiency. No reports are to be made direct to any other authority except

the Chief Commissioner and this headquarters; the latter will be responsible for determining any wider distribution which may be necessary.

9. Over and above the requirements of the operational units, and of such nonoperational and ancillary units as may be authorized, there is and will be a surplus of trained Italian Air Force manpower within the present ceiling of 31,000 referred to above. You will be responsible for organizing the provision of such surplus manpower - and any additional surplus that may become available - for the use of the Mediterranean Allied Air Forces, the decision on the proportion to be employed in the Italian Air Force and in Allied Air Force establishments respectively resting with the Air Commander-in-Chief.

10. The Italian Air Ministry should be encouraged, and as far as possible assisted, to reorganize and rehabilitate such resources of the Italian aircraft industry as may now be available, or may become available as additional Italian territory is occupied, and that could be of service to the Italian or Allied Air Forces in the prosecution of the war against GERMANY.

11. You should ensure that the Intelligence Staff of the Italian Air Ministry make available to you, for the information of Commanding General, Mediterranean Allied Air Forces, any information that they may obtain that may affect the operational situation or be in any way of value to the Intelligence Staff at Headquarters, Mediterranean Allied Air Forces.

RE-ORGANIZATION OF TRANSPORTATION SUB-COMMISSION, AC

1. With effect from the date of this memorandum, the Transportation Sub-Commission, AC, will be composed of a Director, Deputy Director, Planning Staff, and five divisions - Administration, Movements, Rail, Road, and Port and Warehouses. Their duties are set out in the following paragraphs. It is emphasized, however, that the duties are in all cases within the general framework of the Transportation Sub-Commission's responsibility and subject to any changes in policy that may be laid down by higher authority.

2. The Planning Staff will be responsible for all forward planning on transportation questions; it will advise and work closely with the Priorities Board (see Executive Order Number 4) and with the Movements Division.

3. The Administration Division will cover all internal administration, keeping of personnel records, assignments and transfers of personnel and central secretarial work. Its Accounting Branch will be responsible for accounting for all stores handled at AC warehouses, keeping records, etc. Its Statistical Branch will keep records of all movements by rail, road, sea and other means.

4. The Movements Division will ensure that the policy laid down by the Priorities Board is carried out; it will determine, in accordance with the bids made to it, what traffic is to be carried by rail, road, sea, including coastal, inland water transport, or other means, and how best this work can be coordinated with military movements; for this purpose it will have Rail, Road and Shipping Branches. The Movements Division will make out and circulate programs and be responsible for seeing that they are fulfilled or for notifying those concerned of changes of program. It will also plan and assist with the repair and provision of road vehicles. It will be responsible for the raising of new road transport units. It will assist and render technical advice to the Italian road organizations.

7. The Port and Warehouse Division will be responsible for the technical aspect of port, warehouse and inland and coastal water

transport work and for seeing that all installations are worked in the best way possible. Its responsibility for warehouses will extend only to those warehouses which are used as incidental to transportation, e.g., at ports and at certain limited points in the interior. The Port and Warehouse Division will advise the Movements Division of port capacities for loading and discharging ships, and of any changes in capacity. It will plan and assist with the repair and construction of all facilities at ports, warehouses, and in connection with coastal and inland water transport. The division will work in close contact with the Shipping Sub-Commission.

8. When rail, road, port, shipping and other facilities are controlled by a military formation, the Movements Division will request an allotment of capacity from the competent military authority.

RE-ORGANIZATION OF TRANSPORTATION SUB-COMMISSION, AC

1. With effect from the date of this memorandum, the Transportation Sub-Commission, AC, will be composed of a Director, Deputy Director, Planning Staff, and five divisions - Administration, Movements, Rail, Road, and Port and Warehouse. Their duties are set out in the following paragraphs. It is emphasized, however, that the duties are in all cases within the general framework of the Transportation Sub-Commission's responsibility and subject to any changes in policy that may be laid down by higher authority.
2. The Planning Staff will be responsible for all forward planning on transportation questions; it will advise and work closely with the Priorities Board (see Executive Order Number 4) and with the Movements Division.
3. The Administration Division will cover all internal administration, keeping of personnel records, assignments and transfers of personnel and central secretarial work. Its Accounting Branch will be responsible for accounting for all stores handled at AC warehouses, keeping records, etc. Its Statistical Branch will keep records of all movements by rail, road, sea and other means.
4. The Movements Division will ensure that the policy laid down by the Priorities Board is carried out; it will determine, in accordance with the bids made to it, what traffic is to be carried by rail, road, sea, including coastal, inland water transport, or other means, and how best this work can be coordinated with military movements; for this purpose it will have Rail, Road and Shipping Branches. The Movements Division will make out and circulate programs and be responsible for seeing that they are fulfilled or for notifying those concerned of changes of program. The Movements Division will not, however, be responsible for the technical aspect of the carrying agency's work which is the concern of the Rail, Road, and Port and Warehouse Divisions referred to below, and of the Shipping Sub-Commission.
5. The Rail Division will be responsible for the technical aspect of the Italian Railways' work, for advising the Movements Division what can be carried by rail, of any changes in capacity, and for seeing that the program laid down is carried out in the best way possible. It will also plan and assist with the repair and reconstruction of all rail facilities including track, locomotives, rolling stock, stations, buildings, etc. It will work in close contact with the DMRS and the Italian State Railways.

It will also plan and assist with the repair and reconstruction of all rail facilities including track, locomotives, rolling stock, stations, buildings, etc. It will work in close contact with the DARS and the Italian State Railways.

6. The Road Division will be responsible for technical questions on all operation by road, for advising the Movements Division what can be carried by road, of any changes in capacity, and for seeing that the program laid down is carried out in the best way possible. It will also plan and assist with the repair and provision of road vehicles. It will be responsible for the raising of new road transport units. It will assist and render technical advice to the Italian road organizations.

7. The Port and Warehouse Division will be responsible for the technical aspect of port, warehouse and inland and coastal water

transport work and for seeing that all installations are worked in the best way possible. Its responsibilities for warehouses will extend only to those warehouses which are used as incidental to transportation, e.g., at ports and at certain limited points in the interior. The Port and Warehouse Division will advise the Movement Division of port capacities for loading and discharging ships, and of any change in capacity. It will plan and assist with the repair and construction of all facilities at ports, warehouses, and in connection with coastal and inland water transport. The division will work in close contact with the Shipping Sub-Committee.

8. When rail, road, port, shipping and other facilities are controlled by a military formation, the Movement Division will request an allotment of capacity from the competent military authority.

TO : Division Head listed.

1. By direction of Colonel Poletti this division ceases active operation in the field of Movement Control and becomes an advisory unit as of this date.
2. In the organization of Ente Nazionale Autotrasporti di Cose (E.N.A.C.) a Control Office is provided which will function as a counterpart of this Division. Eng. Saul Graco is the head of that Control Office with offices in the Ministry of Communications Building, located in Piazza Croce Rossa. Telephone installation is not completed at present.
3. From this date all application for civilian road transport should be made directly to Ufficio Trasporti di Roma (U.T.R.) by the person, organization or Division using the transport and paying for it. Time is lost rather than saved if a Division submits a request for transport on behalf of a civilian organization. When the request is unusual or out of the ordinary it would be well for the Division concerned to endorse the request and explain the need or urgency of it.
4. A certain amount of paper work and record keeping is necessary for the Control Office to properly function. Therefore, emergency requests should be restricted to honest emergencies and not include lack of foresight in getting application filed in reasonable time.
