Political: Outstanding event of the week was escape of General ROBERTO (night of 4/5 March) on trial as accomplice in ROSENTHAL murder and for implication in terrorist activities under Fascism, etc. Government has offered million lire reward for his capture. 6 March Leftist groups held protest meeting after which greater part of demonstrators marched to the Viminale Palace and others, amongst whom were many hoodlums, proceeded to Viminale where at least one person was killed and several wounded as bombs were thrown, allegedly from crowd, and Carabinieri fired. Delegation at Viminale asked ROBERTO to resign. Elements represented in delegation included Action Party, Socialists, Communists, Union of Italian Women, Partisans and Wounded Veterans. Leftist Press urges resignation of ROBERTO, Communists threaten to leave Government coalition unless operative measures are made more drastic. Council meeting 7 March.

Strike at mines reported at CALABRIA 3 March, virtually ended 7 March.

WEIGHTS & MEASURES NO. 28

Political: CGIL and General Confederation of Italian Industry agreed on need for rise in wages and adjustments will be made through the Unions (24 Feb). In accordance with suggestions made by CGIL Council voted (27 Feb) to increase wages of state employees by 50 %, family allotments by 100 %.

New directive for Italy well received by press.

Food & Supplies: Nothing unusual to report.

Crime: SARDINIA. Enemy agent reported dropped on 21 February not yet apprehended. 3921

LIGURIA-PENINSULA. Police agencies carried out three raids for arms with success. Arms still appear in high percentage of cases.

ABRUZZI-MARCHE. Serious misbehaviour of Italian Troops of SAN MARCO Battalion at TIRANO on 11 Feb. Div. Commander warned he would be held personally responsible for further disturbances. Two cases of railway wagons containing valuable supplies sugar and caustic soda reported missing.

Health: AREZZO, SAN GIOVANNI, typhoid cases reported to date 132.

Anti-typhoid vaccination has been made compulsory. 2,000 persons already vaccinated.

Slight outbreak of typhoid at CUNCIUTA, ROMA.

Refugees: 583 Italian refugees left ROME for repatriation to homes in SICILY or the South (24 Feb.)

409 refugees arrived in ROME during the week mostly from CHIARAVALLE and CASTIGLION FIORENTINO areas.

Price Tendencies: No unusual trend.

Wheat Collection: Total to-date : 10,809,208 quintals.

AMC FIFTH ARMY: Nothing to report.

AMC EIGHTH ARMY: No change in territory but latest items included below.

General Recovery: Communist literature printed in ROME was found in a civilian car seized in RAVENNA. Arms and ammunition discovered by P.S.S. in a house in SAN MARTINO, FORLI Province, included 23 German and Italian rifles. Three arrests have been made, others are expected.

The water supply of FERRARA City which gave some cause for anxiety^{3/3/50} has been improved and will shortly reach 120,000 gallons per day.

Two pumps have been activated for drainage work in the area east of RAVENNA.

Lazio Umbria, Region: Salt for chlorine for ROME water supply still delayed but serious crisis postponed by discovery of small hitherto unrevealed supply.

Problem of prison population grows daily more acute with courts failing to keep pace with arrests.

Further shipment of livestock arrived from SARDINIA.

Total of 3,800 blankets distributed in TUNISIA and adjacent countries by welfare organizations.

PESCARA : Two temporary wooden quays, each about 15 metres long, with draft of 2.5 metres now available for use; no warehouses are at present available. A dredge, 3 tugs, about 20 schooners and several fishing boats are still submerged in harbour. Dredge blocks mouth of canal, leaving only a 7 metres width for the channel.

CROTONA : 100 metres of quay are now available for schooners, but port has no cranes or gear of any type and is badly in need for dredging. Maximum capacity likely to be achieved by repairs would be 1000 tons. Anchorage for about 12 schooners available.

Fisheries : Permission granted to fish within seven miles area round Island of CAPRIELLA and present naval regulations granting further relaxations revised for Northern Mediterranean.

Work on the double circuit 150,000 volt line between TUNI and CRTE finished during week. Will be utilized later in the transmission of power northwards from TUNI.

The 120,000 volt TAVRIZZU - REPPUFI line also finished. ³⁹¹⁹ in week as a supply towards BXAGHA.

Arrangements have been made to adjust Armed Forces wage scale to correspond approximately with the carobane bonus for the higher cost of bread.

Political : Council meeting on 16 February abolished political price of bread and approved a number of financial-economic measures. A commission to reduce state expenses and local committees to assist in tax estimates were set up. Also planned special price control committees with representatives of OMI and Unions. Broad powers over markets given to Food Commissariat. Increase in pay of state employees as from 15 February; similar increases to workers in private industry to be worked out between Unions and employers. 3917 ✓

Soldiers pay doubled.

Day of the soldier and the Partisan celebrated 18 February with parade and speeches by DONINI, CABATTI, SCOCCHIMARRO.

Six Roman dailies suspended because of paper shortage (19 February). Italian Press Commission has been criticised for lack of foresight and arbitrary action. Suspension revoked the following day.

MILITIA: The estimated figure of 40,000 men for the military call-up has already been met.

Political : Government set up new Commissariato for Veterans. Will take care of returning veterans, liberated civilians and patriots. GASPAROTTO named High Commissioner.

Socialist and Communist parties issued joint statement of programme (10 February) urging a national convention of C.L.N. and formation of Consultiva Assembly. They announced that both parties will participate in administrative elections with common programmes and candidates, not however excluding possible agreements with other parties.

Press statement from Presidenza (14 February) says Interministerial Committee working out plans with ALCOM for trade relations with SWITZERLAND: similar action to be studied for other countries.

WEEKLY SUMMARY NO. 25

Political: CGIL congress at NAPLES closed 1 Feb with resolutions looking toward participation of workers in management of industry and urging nationalization of private monopolies and key industries. LIGUORI, DIVITURIO, and GRACI re-elected with acclamation to the segreteria generale.

Government gave figures 6 Feb on prisoners in GERMANY and in the hands of British, French and Americans, stated it was impossible to give accurate figures on those in RUSSIA. Press has been urging repatriation of prisoners in Allied hands and government pressure to clarify status of prisoners in GERMANY.

Council of Ministers announced, 7 Feb, that the political ³⁹¹¹ of bread would be abolished as soon as possible.

CATERINA AFRODITA, ROMIA, general feeling against military call-up with several demonstrations. Hand grenades thrown. No casualties but arrested conscripts released by force.

Political: Council approved women suffrage, 20 January. Same rules and restrictions as for male voters. Electoral lists, to be ready 10 April, will also include female voters.

General staff brought under authority of Ministry of War 30 January. General RONCO named chief.

XII. Congress began in NAPLES 28 January. BONOMI sent message urging Unions to be above parties. 500 delegates from all over Liberated ITALY attended.

Separation. It was announced at Council meeting, 30 January, that 322 civil administration officials had been separated. Four Vice-Multi Commissari for Sanctions against Fascism named: BRUNER (Socialist) replaces PAGNINI (Communist) on previous list. Others are MUSANI (Liberal), MAZZOTTI (Liberal) and ITALIA (Christian Democrat).

Government announced on 31 January that it has asked counterpart for all AM lines.

Food & Supplies: Measures taken to increase the olive oil collectiⁿ resulted in improved returns.

AMERICAN Army: Food supplies for three months were sent into 24 mountain communes likely to be isolated during the winter.

LIGURIA: Coal and lignite continued to improve. Shortage of salt for chlorine threatened water supply for ROM.

Crimes: ROM: Carabinieri searched the offices of the Movimento Comunista d'Italia (25 January). Quantities of arms and ammunition were found behind a false wall. The premises were unoccupied and no arrests were made.

Refugees: All civilians are being cleared from front line zone by Army order. Accommodation was arranged either by local dispersal or at AM or AG Camps. The evacuation was proceeding smoothly.

Wheat Collection: Total to-date: 10,443,090 quintals.

General Remarks: ABRUZZO-MOLISE Region: Total of 153,887 mines, 600 unexploded bombs and approximately 800 tons abandoned ammunition cleared up to 31 December in CHIANTI, FISCHIA and TERRAID Provinces. Total of 180 Italians killed and 405 seriously wounded by mines in three provinces since Allied occupation.

Larger numbers of patriots joined Italian Army due to increased efforts by recruiting agencies.

Patriots in MIGRANT Army area were fed on the Italian Army ration scale

WEEKLY SITREP NO. 23.

Political: Press supports Government's mobilization decree but appeals for abolition of armistice terms and Allied status. Council meeting (18 Jan) adopted measures in favour of soldiers and their families, partisans being included in subsidy allotments. DE GASPERI reported C.L.N. message urging formation of really National Italian Army had been transmitted to United Nations leaders.

DE GASPERI announced recognition of Chiang King Government and abolition of VIENNA accord of 1940 looking instead to "friendly ^{34/15} ~~collaboration~~" with BALKAN-DANUBE States.

TARCHIANI (Action Party) appointed Ambassador to Washington (10 Jan). BOERI (Action Party) appointed Secretary of Commissariat for Sanctions Against Fascism.

BANI Zone. Short strikes MESSAGNE and MOLFETTA shipyards settled. Compromise reached in ROME between Government and delegation government employees from BARI, has removed possibility serious strike. Sporadic student protest against army call-up and non-publication of armistice terms indicates potential trouble probably due outside subversive elements.

NAPLES-TARANTO. Similar protests university students but no incidents reported.

CARRONIA, Sardinia coal strike settled (17 Jan). Strike condemned by all parties.

Cagliari, Sardinia. Demonstrations against call-up for Italian Army 17/18 Jan. Bombs thrown on 16 Jan resulted in death of police agent. 11 persons were injured. No firing by police. Demonstrations now prohibited by order of Italian High Commissioner. City quiet and normal.

Food and Supplies: ANCONA Province. Great relief effected by arrival of salt ship of 750 tons.

LAZIO UMBRIA. Olive oil prospects in ANC territory fairly good. Elsewhere progress bad and there is very strong opposition.

ROMA. 30 days grain still in the city. Fruit and vegetables are low at 350 to 400 tons daily. Fish and potatoes not available. Eggs, ~~pell~~ 390 lire for 35 lire each.

Crime: ROMA. Important raid by police agencies resulted in 212 arrests which included 21 of "Washback gang". Large quantities of arms, grenades and military stores taken.

NAPLES. Italian paratroopers threw hand grenade at Allied Military Police wounding one military policeman and three civilians. Two paratroopers arrested.

FOGGIA Zone. Several cases of stealing of standing timber by Allied troops.

Health: ANCONA Zone. Shortage of medical supplies due to lack of organization of ENDINA.

NAPLES and BENEVENUTO. Decline in smallpox contamination.

FOGGIA Zone. Smallpox under control. Vaccination campaign very active, but 45,000 doses vaccine still required.

1. The meeting opened with the review of Executive Order No. **3598** of 3 January 1945, and a reading of a suggested draft procedure of which is part of these minutes.

2. It was pointed out by Transportation Sub-Commission that Paragraph 4 of Executive Order No. 1 might be interpreted to mean that claims should be sent directly to the Priorities Board, whereas the procedure proposed stipulated that all claims should be filed with designated Allocating Sub-Commission. It was agreed that claims should be filed with Allocating Sub-Commission, at that time would be exercised to circulate the procedure embodying this decision to the same list who received the Executive Order so there would be no confusion as to the place to file claims for movement of materials.

3. The draft procedure was reviewed and discussed. The Board agreed that it should be rewritten to incorporate the suggestions brought forth in the meeting, and re-circulated to all Allocating Sub-Commission for further comment before final acceptance as governing procedure.

4. It was agreed that special meetings of the Board would be called by the Secretariat, and that any Allocating Sub-Commission could request the Secretariat to call a meeting.

5. It was agreed to hold a regular monthly meeting of the Board on the third Monday of each month.

6. Record keeping for the purpose of judging the effectiveness of each priorities and allocation program was regarded as too voluminous for centralization in the Secretariat. It was agreed that the Allocating Sub-Commissions themselves would maintain the records necessary to ascertain that movements actually followed allocations or that priority ratings actually had the desired effect on movement trends; and that periodic progress reports should be rendered to the Board based on such records.

7. It was agreed that the Secretariat would develop necessary forms in consultation with Allocating Sub-Commissions. Forms immediately required were agreed to be the applications on which claimants file requests for materials with Allocating Sub-Commission and the forms on which Allocating Sub-Commissions will present cases to the Board through its Secretariat. *3201*

8. Paragraph 5 of the draft procedure will be re-written to permit continued functioning of the present procedure whereby civilian claims for movements are routed and screened. It is desired to preserve the basic procedure but to have Government do some screening and present all civilian claims to appropriate sub-commissions.

9. Paragraphs 6 and 7 of the draft procedure will be re-written in consultation with the Transportation Sub-Commission and Mr. Cleveland.

10. Some doubt was expressed as to whether AT&T can give a three-month forecast of toll facilities available for AC; however, Transportation Sub-Commission will see if this can be arranged.

11. The Board called a special meeting at 10:00 hours Monday, 15 January 1955 to consider allocation of availability of salvage clothing which will be presented by the Commerce Sub-Commission. Col. Evans stated that all relevant data would be prepared for presentation to the Board at that time.

Political: At Press Conference of Ufficio Stampa della Presidenza 27 Dec the following statements were made: Italians were hopeful of soon renewing diplomatic relations with FRANCE; curation would go on though SFORZA wished to resign and would probably be succeeded by a magistrate; administrative elections would be held in Spring; the Government is determined to increase war effort.

At meeting of Council 30 December President announced message from CLNAI affirming solidarity in fight for reconstruction. WEEKLY SUMMARY NO. 10

POSITION: Council meeting on 20 Dec 1944 stressed desire of all Italians to participate in war, pointed out importance of decision of U.N.I. - to cooperate with Government in war effort and reconstruction of the country and maintenance of liaison between component political parties. The Italian Government had delegated to C.I.C. A.L. direction of patriotic action against fascists and Nazis. Consultative organs to be set up by the council and hope was expressed for administrative elections in Spring. Creation of interministerial committee to coordinate economic reconstruction approved. Further grants to SICILY and CALABRIA for economic rehabilitation, both islands to have advisory bodies to assist High Commissioners, but Council made strong statement against separation. Also approved various relief measures giving new food Commissioner wide powers. 3887

Food and Supplies/.....

3787

Food and supplies: Shortage of flour in CATTANEO and ROGGE due to interruption of both road and rail services. Some communes without bread for four days. Export of flour from FOGGIA to CORTINA temporarily stopped owing to interruption of railway line beyond BARI.

General report that olive oil is not being amassed, but is nevertheless moving on the roads in large quantities. It is the view of SOUTHERN region that the massing course is useless without the control of large numbers of Allied officers.

Petrol is in short supply in CAMPOBASSO.

The shipment of citrus from CALABRIE, mentioned in last week's intrep, arrived at CIVITAVOGLIA. Of the 23,000 cases on board 1,500 were reported stolen between CIVITAVOGLIA and ROMA.

Crime: Series of disturbances have taken place in SICILY since 12 Dec., reported to you separately. Origin is given as protest against military call-up. The move to the Island of two Reg Italian Army troops when completed will strengthen confidence in ability to deal with untoward events. Also moving to the Island is Montegranaro in re-inforcement for Carabinieri.

This has necessitated some evacuation and a good deal of movement of civilians in coast towns to the country districts outside. The hardly devastated area of CORLIANO and in the neighbourhood round about, gradually being re-populated under the personal supervision of the Prefect of PONTE. About 1,000 people are now in the town. Communes in the hills in Western PESEJO Province through which troops have not passed and which are ~~now~~ 3845 accessible in the normal way by road, are being gradually visited by GAOs on foot or on mule, over mountain tracks known to peasants who are acting as guides where necessary. Most of the roads to these communes are either mined or have been cratered. In San Marino the situation continues unsatisfactory, and the new Captain Regent are being very helpful in all respects. One battalion has been temporarily billeted in the town of SAN MARINO, on their invitation, but early evacuation of Republic by troops is planned.

General Remarks: : The Germans are removing many art treasures as they move northwards. WEEKLY SUMMARY REPORT

Political: Discussion of Roosevelt-Churchill message continued in press; towards the end of the week the possible participation of Italians in war against Japan came to the foreground. Food and Supplies: Food is a very serious problem. A committee comprising HQ and Region IV staff meets daily to consider the ROME situation which shows little improvement. A daily target of 14,000 tons of meat, potatoes, vegetables, fruit and other unrationed food-stuffs has been set which if achieved would ameliorate the position but daily average of official deliveries is only 666 tons. New populous areas occupied by 5 Army are giving cause for anxiety whilst Region V has serious misgiving over distribution in the winter due to transport shortage.

Food for northern Regions still under consideration as you know.

Crime: Southern Region reports less black market activity. Robberies and hold-ups by troops continue. Number of arrests have been made

Health: Small pox in NAPLES continues to decrease but there is some typhoid both here and at SALENNO. The typhoid epidemic in BENEVENTO city shows some improvement. In Region V typhoid is on the increase but some cases have been traced to infected milk others to uncooked vegetables.

Refugees: Northly movement of refugees in Southern Region is again reported.

Wheat collection: 6,057,651 quintals to date. AVELLINO Province has reached the target figure. BENEVENTO, SALENNO and TARANTO within easy reach, NAPLES has collected 75%.

- Food & Supplies: There is no change in the situation which is generally satisfactory except for ROMA. Everything possible is being done to improve ROMA's supplies and it is hoped that the situation will shortly be materially improved; pasta ration to be considered pending arrival of potatoes.
- Criminal: No important change. Approximately 10,000 persons now condemned for violations of grain laws in Sicily and 22,000 quintals grain have been confiscated. 11 road blocks are being operated in the Province of AQUILA to check black market in potatoes.
- Health: No further developments in outbreak of typhoid. Quarantine continues to abate.
- Refugees: The situation reported last week is now under control. ROMA is becoming very crowded.

Political : Anti-monarchical feelings reported strong in Region VIII (Groccato Province)

In Naples Unione Femminile Italiana has been formed with the purpose of furthering the welfare and political rights of women. This is the first organization of its kind in Italy.

Food and Supplies : In Sicily the sugar supply has now been distributed. Food and supplies generally in Rome are still causing anxiety. Coal is urgently required for paper mills and caustic soda for soap factory in BOGLIA. A shortage of naphtha exists in GROSSETO Province and limits the threshing of wheat.

Crime : No important change. In SICILY police activity in connection with grain collection continues and there is some increase of serious crime.

Health : Smallpox epidemic in NAPLES area decreasing. Typhoid is now reported epidemic in BENEVENTO City and there is also a sharp seasonal increase in SICILY together with typhus. In ROMA the health standard is low due to malnutrition.

Refugees : No important change.

Considerable damage to half of listed Churches. King's Palace received direct hit.
- AMG Eighth Army: AMG representative in REGGIO 3 September. Considerable damage but not as great as feared. Germans evacuated civilians from the town August 6 after which considerable looting took place. Only about 200 people in city normal population 30/40,000. Do not anticipate serious refugee problem. No light, water disrupted but believed easily repairable, investigation proceeding. Sufficient food. Water and electric mill available the latter inoperative but can be adapted to tractors. 250 bed hospital intact and believed well stocked with drugs, about 50 patients. Industrial plants including pottery works and cycle factory understood to have been destroyed by Germans before leaving. Unable to give definite information owing to absence of population.
- General Comments: Provincial local government in GRIGLIO Province complete and functioning on 3rd September. Some wage unrest among unskilled labour in this Province Railway from PALERMO to Messina, MESSINA to CATANIA and CATANIA to PALERMO opened 22nd August. Augmented passenger service for civilian ~~and~~ and military travel commenced 1st September. Serious bush fire occurred MURO district, SARDINIA - now control. Italian troops assisted to extinguish fire and two officers lost their lives.

New series weekly survey requested your letter 1 Aug begin : -

Political : Continued resistance to grain collection in SICILY has a background of political agitation and unrest but Separatism is subdued. Socialist-Communist influence in FOGGIA is noticeable.

Food & Supplies. Distribution is the main problem and is likely to be with us continually due to shortages of transport. Chief difficulty at present is to be found in Southern Italy (Region II). ROME also not up to its ration scale because supplies have not reached the city in sufficient quantity. SICILY has been short of sugar for some time but arrangements have now been made for a three months supply.

Crime. Shows no unusual trend except in SICILY where violations of grain laws continues. Nearly 9000 persons have now been denounced and 15000 quintals of grain confiscated. The whole effort of the Carabinieri is focussed on grain collection. Evasion of grain laws is by no means non-existent elsewhere but it is only in SICILY that it approximates to organised resistance. The trouble has been recognised for some time and all possible measures to cope with the situation have been taken.

Health. The outbreaks of smallpox are abating but typhoid has appeared in CATANIA City and elsewhere. Water and milk supplies not incriminated and the outbreak is believed to be due to insanitary conditions and flies.

Reported to be under control as result of countermeasures but situation being watched. No exceptional increase of malaria is reported. PONTINE MARSHES area being sprayed weekly from the air.

Refugees. There has been considerable trouble recently due to a spontaneous movement of refugees in parts of Italian Government Territory. Those are people who have attempted to return to their homes without authorization and communications are in no state to deal with them yet. A firm directive has been issued to the Regions concerned to ensure through the medium of Italian officials that this does not occur.

Personnel. Brig. M. CARR has relieved Col. A.N. HANCOCK Region I. Col. J.T. ZELLANS Region II returned USA and in view of impending reorganisation of AGC control of Southern Italy no new appointment made. Col. J.A.C. Penycuick relieved Brig. M. CARR Region VI.

General Comments. MATERITA Province passed to control Region V on 19 Aug. In Region V an average of 18 people are being killed or injured daily as a result of mine explosions. Two Italian Mine Clearing Cos. are operating in the Region. Very successful conference with Regional Commissioners and Staffs held 22 and 23 Aug. Full report in preparation. Activities of Army AMGs not included in this sitrep as you have been kept fully informed and little is happening at the moment. *3824*

Purpose of this sitrep explained at Regional Commissioners Conference and it is hoped to make it increasingly comprehensive and interesting as a result.
