THE ADVISORY COUNCIL FOR ITALY PASSED FOLLOWING RESOLUTION YESTERDAY: (THIS IS MAP 715). "THE ADVISORY COUNCIL FOR ITALY HAVE EXAMINED THE EVENTS LEADING UP TO THE FORMATION OF THE PROPOSED NEW GOVERNMENT BY SEDOR BONOMI, AND THEY CONSIDER THAT IN ALL THE CIRCUMSTANCES THIS GOVERNMENT SHOULD PROVE SATISFACTORY IN FURTHERING THE MAIN PURPOSE OF THE ALLIED POWERS WHICH IS THE FINAL DEFEAT OF GERMANY.

THEY ALSO HOWEVER INSIST THAT: (1) THE NEW GOVERNMENT EXPRESS THEIR READINESS IN WRITING TO ACCEPT ALL OBLIGATIONS TOWARD THE ALLIES ENTERED INTO BY THE FORMER ITALIAN GOVERNMENTS. SINCE THE CONCLUSION OF THE ARMISTICE SIGNED ON SEPTEMBER 3, 1943, AND THAT EVERY MEMBER OF THE GOVERNMENT SHOULD BE PERSONALLY ACQUAINTED WITH THE TERMS OF ALL SUCH OBLIGATIONS INCLUDING THE TERMS OF THE ARMISTICE SIGNED ON SEPTEMBER 29, 1943.

(2) THE NEW GOVERNMENT UNDERTAKE NOT TO REOPEN THE INSTITUTIONAL QUESTION UNTIL SUCH TIME AS ITALY HAS BEEN LIBERATED AND THE ITALIAN PEOPLE CAN FREELY EXPRESS THEIR VIEWS."

SINCE PREDUARLY EACH MEMBER HAS FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS OF HIS GOVERNMENT AND AFTER TAKING ADVISE OF MURPHY AND MACMILLAN, I HAVE ACCEPTED COUNCILS ~~RECOMMENDATIONS~~ SUBJECT TO THE TERMS PROPOSED. I HAVE ADDED THE FOLLOWING IN ~~THE~~ MY FORMAL REPLY TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL: "I TAKE THE OPPORTUNITY OF REAFFIRMING THAT UNDER THE REGIME OF THE ARMISTICE, THE ITALIAN GOVERNMENT IS BOUND TO CARRY OUT PROMPTLY AND EFFICIENTLY ALL ORDERS GIVEN BY THE UNITED NATIONS. IT IS THEREFORE ESSENTIAL THAT THE PRIOR AGREEMENT OF MYSELF AS PRESIDENT OF THE CONTROL COMMISSION SHOULD BE OBTAINED AND THAT THE GOVERNMENTS CONCERNED SHOULD BE CONSULTED THROUGH THE MACHINERY ESTABLISHED FOR THIS PURPOSE, BEFORE ANY IMPORTANT DECISION

The Advisory Council for Italy have examined the events leading up to the formation of the proposed new Government by Signor Bonomi, and they consider that in all the circumstances this Government should prove satisfactory in furthering the main purpose of the Allied Powers which is the final defeat of Germany.

They must, however, insist that:
