I -- HIT AND RUN DRIVING

Several instances of "hit and run" driving in this vicinity by American military personnel have been reported. The commanding officers of American units which are connected with this headquarters and which have motor transportation will instruct all drivers regarding the proper procedure to be followed in the event of a motor vehicle accident.

If a civilian is injured or if the property of a civilian is damaged as the result of an accident involving a United States Army motor vehicle, the service driver should use Form C-2, which is printed in French and English, for the purpose of furnishing information to and obtaining information from the injured person or the person in charge of the damaged property or a policeman if one is present. See in this connection Section III, Circular Number 12, this Headquarters, ca.

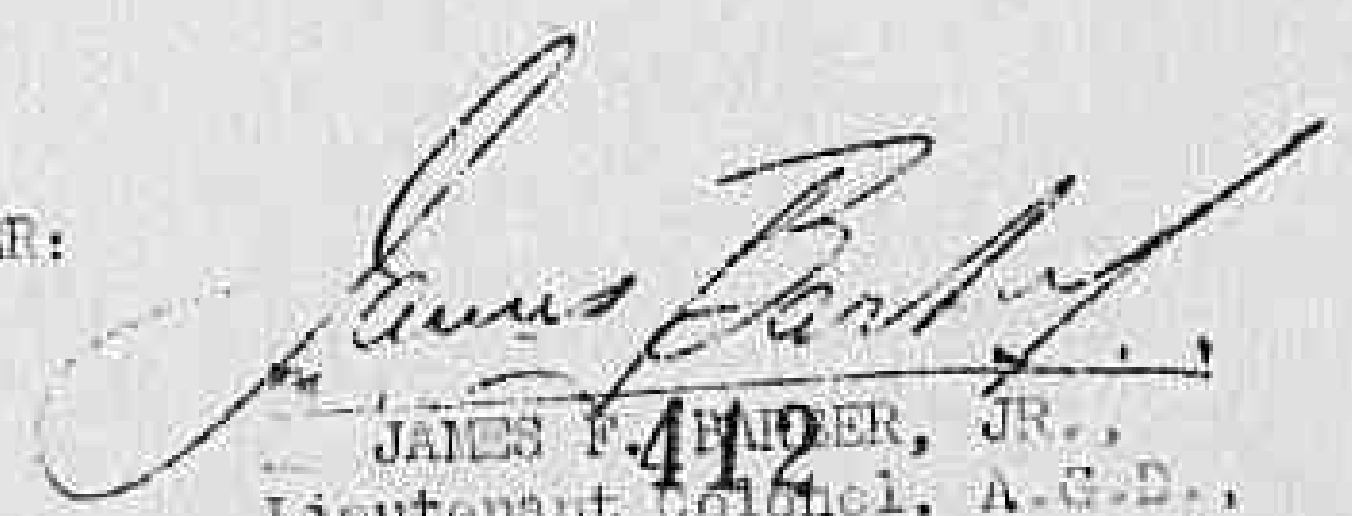

II - PARKING OF VEHICLES ON STREETS OF ALGIERS

United States vehicles which are not protected by a suitable locking device, other than ignition key, will not be parked unattended on the streets of Algiers.

Military Police have instructions to drive such vehicles, when found unattended, to the Central Police Station. In this connection attention is invited to Bulletin No. 17, this headquarters, cs, which prohibits the parking of vehicles on Rue Michelet and Rue D'Isly.

III - PHYSICAL INSPECTIONS AND INNOCULATIONS

Regulations for this theater of operations require that ALL enlisted men must undergo a physical inspection TWICE a month. This inspection is of vital importance to you and to the United States Army, and must be complied with.

Inspections for enlisted personnel of Headquarters Company, AF, will be held at 2030 hours on Thursday 15th April, and on every other Thursday thereafter until further notice. Men will assemble at the following places:

St. Elizabeth Convent.

All men now quartered at St. Elizabeth Convent, the Motor Pool, and School No. 1.

School No. 4

All men now quartered at School No. 4, the Junior Officers' Mess, 103 Elve Bru, Hotel St. George, and School No. 5.

School No. 6

All men now quartered at School No. 6 and the Sanitarium.

Flower Shop (On Blvd Mareschal Petain)

All men now quartered at the Alpin Club, School No. 7, the Bakery, Red Cross, near LeBerry Restaurant, and near D'Isly Restaurant.

Any enlisted personnel whose quarters are not listed above will go to the nearest concentration point at the time and date shown.

Innoculations will be given at the same time, at the same places, to all those whose records indicate their need.

All section men must notify their Section Chiefs, or other responsible superiors, of the order. No one will be excused from attendance except those required for duty. Personnel on duty will report to the 8th General Dispensary the

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following afternoon, or notify the 1st Sergeant and special arrangements will be made.

IV - ARTICLES OF WAR

Articles of War will be read 15 April 1943, immediately following physical inspection, for all those absent at the previous reading. Location is the same as for the physical inspection. Personnel on duty will notify the 1st Sergeant or non-commissioned officer in charge of quarters, and other arrangements will be made.

I -- RE-VACCINATION OF AMERICAN MILITARY PERSONNEL

The Chiefs of each General and Special Staff Section will submit the data required by letter, this headquarters, 23 January 1943, subject: Re-vaccination of American Military Personnel, to the Adjutant General's office, in order that the required reports for this headquarters may be prepared.

II -- REPRODUCTION FACILITIES

1. The Engineer Section has now set up a reproduction section which is capable of doing a limited amount of reproduction work.
2. The types of reproduction equipment available and the capabilities of each are as follows:

- a. Black and White Process (B-W). Suitable for the reproduction of copies where the original is drawn on a transparent medium such as tracing cloth or tracing paper. Maximum permissible width of copy is 30".

- b. Multilith offset lithographic press. Maximum printing surface 8 1/2" x 12". This machine makes use of either zinc plates, which require that a negative photographic film of the copy be furnished, or "Dupli-mat" plates, in which case the image is placed directly on the plate by the draftsman or typist. Zinc plates are available. "Dupli-mat" plates are not yet available.

Film negatives for zinc plate work can be made by Photo-Heliogravure Algorime, 4 Rue Ballez or possibly at other local commercial firms.

This machine is capable of half-tone photographic work or line work in one or several colors provided proper originals or negatives are furnished.

- c. Photostat machine. Maximum size of finished copy is 18" x 24". This machine is suitable for usual photostatic reproduction and is capable of half reduction or twice enlargement of copy in one operation.

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3. Supplies for accomplishing reproduction work are limited. It is requested that sections requiring reproduction work first consult this office as to proper type of reproduction.

4. This office cannot accept for reproduction, work that is considered suitable for reproduction by other means.
