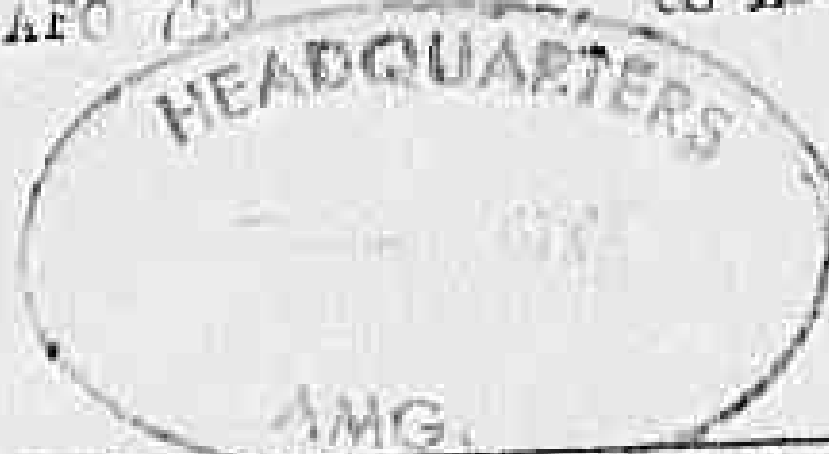

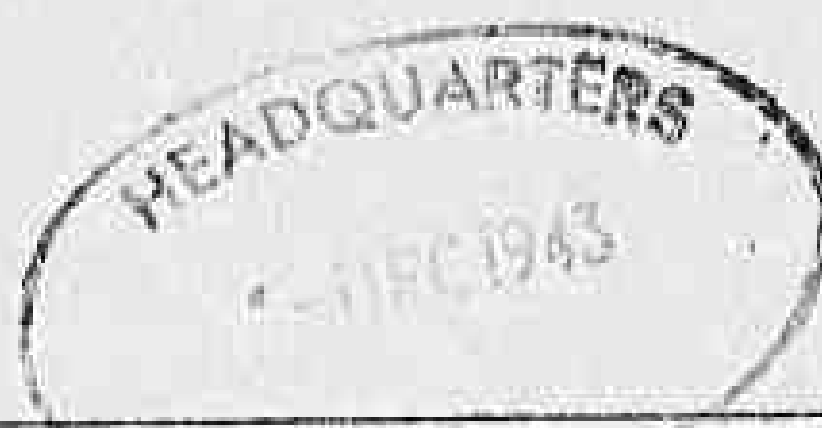

II - CONSERVATION OF FUEL

It has been directed by PATTON that fuel will not be utilized on the island of Sicily for space heating. It is essential in this theater to conserve every bit of coal and wood possible, as there is an extensive shortage of both items. Requisitions submitted covering fuel for space heating will be disapproved.

III - REGULATIONS GOVERNING MAINTENANCE OF REAL ESTATE

The following extract of War Department Memorandum No. W100-10-43, dated April 15, 1943, is re-published for your information:

"2. The critical shortages of materials and manpower make it imperative that the greatest economy be exercised in the maintenance, repair, improvement, alteration, extension, addition, or other work accomplished on real property, installed equipment, or facilities so that all possible effort may be directed to the immediate production and transportation of combat supplies and equipment and the training and furnishing of combat troops to theaters of operation.

"3. Hereafter, no maintenance, repair, improvement, alteration, extension, addition, or other work will be accomplished on real property, installed equipment, or facilities which are owned, sponsored, or controlled by the War Department or operated on War premises unless --

- a. It is vital to the war effort.
- b. Postponement would be detrimental to the war effort.
- c. It is essential in order to make services, supplies, equipment, transportation, or training facilities available to troops.
- d. It has been reduced to bare necessities.
- e. It is required to prevent a break-down of function.

"4. Spartan simplicity must be observed. Nothing will be done merely because it contributes to beauty, convenience, comfort, or prestige. Property should be kept in serviceable condition but not beyond that level.

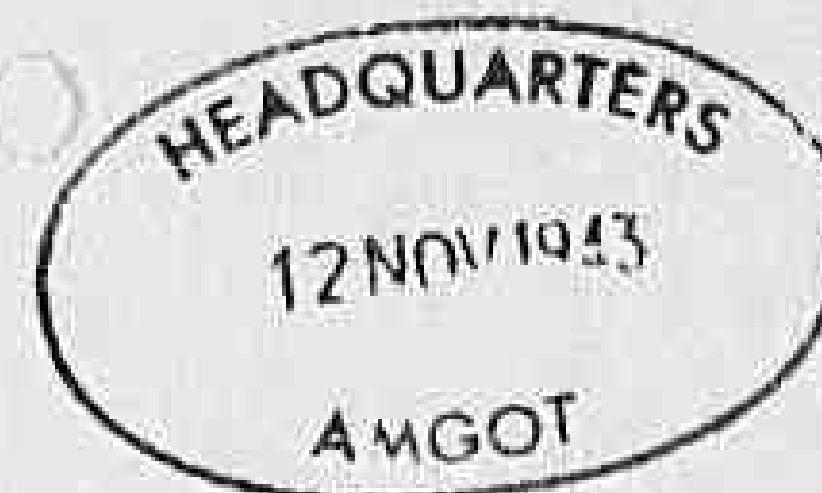

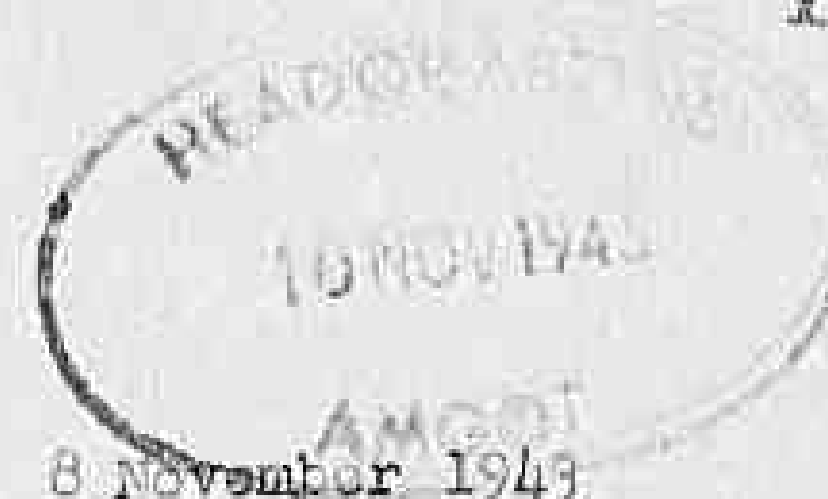

1. Civilian price control in effect in Sicily under General Order No. 4, Hq AMGOT, dated 11 October 1943, provides:
 - a. That each merchant post a list of prices of his goods or services for sale and also place a price tag on each piece of goods.
 - b. That all price lists be submitted to AMGOT to be checked for equitability.
 - c. That prices so posted and tagged shall not be higher than prices in similar instances prevailing on 9 July 1943.
2. The above mentioned General Order is not being enforced properly. Cooperation by military personnel is essential to enforcement.
3. Most of the goods sold are of inferior quality and American soldiers are often being charged as much as ten times the equitable price. All military personnel are enjoined to inform themselves of the proper price before making any purchase.
4. Any merchant charging overly high prices should be reported immediately to the Provost Marshal, Island Base Section.
5. The Provost Marshal will post "Off Limits" signs on shops that are obvious offenders. All U. S. troops in this area will strictly observe these "Off Limits" signs.
6. Unit Commanders will acquaint all ranks with the above directions. Every officer will aid in the enforcement of "Off Limits" restrictions by removing military personnel from such establishments and reporting name, serial number and organization of offenders to the Provost Marshal, Island Base Section.

Many requests have been made for War Department Circular number 160, 1943, which has not been received at this headquarters for distribution. Section VI of the cited Circular is quoted for the information and compliance of all concerned:

"VI-Campaign Medals for Current War-Eligibility to wear theater service ribbons.

1. Section 1, Circular No. 68, War Department, 1943, is rescinded.
2. Paragraph 3, Circular No. 1, War Department, 1943, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

3. Eligibility.

- a. An individual's eligibility to wear the appropriate ribbon of a theater is automatically established upon arrival therein under permanent change of station orders. This provision does not apply to the American Theater.

- b. An individual while in any theater, though not permanently assigned thereto, may establish eligibility to wear the appropriate theater ribbon provided-

- (1) He engages in active combat operations against the enemy and is either-

- (a) Awarded a combat decoration, or
- (b) Furnished a certificate from a corps or higher commander or the commanding officer of an independent force, to the effect that he has participated in combat operations.

- (2) Or he serves in the theater for a period in excess of 90 consecutive days.

- c. In addition to the means provided in b above, eligibility for the American Theater Ribbon is established by-

- (1) Arrival, under permanent orders, at a place of duty in the American Theater outside the continental limits of the United States, or

- (2) Thirty consecutive days' service while permanently assigned to duty as a member of the crew of a vessel sailing ocean waters, even though the vessel may be based within the continental United States or

II-SANITARY REGULATIONS

1. The sickness records of this Command indicate evidence of continued violations of repeated sanitary regulations regarding food and drink.

2. A number of cases of Typhoid and Para-typhoid exist in this Command. These patients have admitted violating existing regulations against the drinking of city water and the eating of food obtained from street vendors and other unauthorized sources.

3. The vaccinations and inoculations will not protect against the ingestion of such massive quantities of filth organisms.

4. Civilian sources of food and drink must be avoided, except those specifically and officially approved.

5. All military personnel will be thoroughly instructed regarding the danger of partaking of unauthorized food and drinks. Particular emphasis will be given to the instructing of military personnel going on pass.

6. The above mentioned typhoid and para-typhoid cases have occurred as a direct result of flagrant failure to obey specific orders. The protection of the health of military personnel is a function of command, and all commanders will be held strictly responsible for any violation of sanitary discipline occurring within their command.

1. Recent reports indicate that in certain sections of Sicily, cattle stealing has assumed serious proportions. It is further reported that at least some of these stolen either in bands or by single animals have been purchased by Allied Forces.

2. Under Italian law, all cattle are required to be registered. All animals in the possession of the lawful owner are evidenced by a card known as a "genealogical card". When an animal is sold, this card must be transferred to the purchaser.

3. It is directed that prior to purchase of animals that the genealogical card of the animal be secured from the owner and transferred at the same time.

4. It is further directed that in any instance where animals are offered for sale to military units without genealogical cards, the individuals be held until they can be turned over to the local CC.RR (AMGOT) for further investigation.

It has come to the attention of this Headquarters that the improper salute or none at all is being rendered the National Anthem of the United States. Paragraph 9b, Section II, FM 21-50, is quoted for the information and compliance of all concerned:

"Whenever or wherever the National Anthem is played or To the color (standard) is sounded, at the first note thereof all dismounted officers and enlisted men present but not in formation will face the music, stand at attention, and render the prescribed salute, except that at Escort of the color or at Retreat they will face toward the color or flag. The position of salute will be retained until the last note of the music is sounded. Those mounted on animals will halt and render the salute mounted. Vehicles in motion will be brought to a halt. Persons riding in a passenger car or on a motorcycle will dismount and salute as directed above. Occupants of other types of military vehicles remain seated in the vehicle at attention, the person in charge of the vehicle dismounting and rendering the hand salute (tank commanders salute from the vehicle). Individuals leading animals or standing to horse will stand at attention but will not salute. The same marks of respect are shown the national anthem of any other country when played upon official occasions."

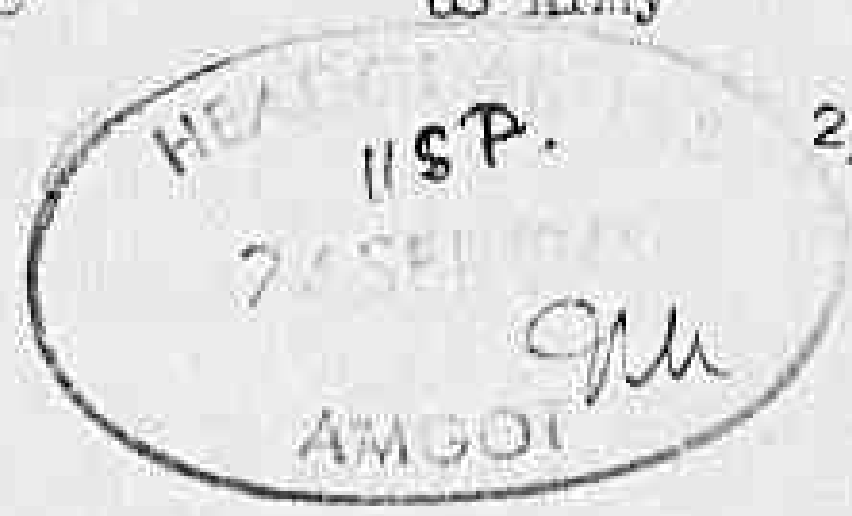

b. Military Personnel.

(1) If military personnel arrive at ports of departure or entry without complying with the provisions of sub-paragraph a (1) and (2) above, all personal documents will be surrendered to Customs for censorship examination. When classified official documents or documents claimed by the traveler to be official in character and necessary in the interest of our war effort are found, Customs will immediately request the nearest Military Intelligence Service Branch Office, or District Office, or representative thereof, for certification and exemption from censorship examination.

a. Customs regulations provide that an exemption from Customs duty for \$100 worth of merchandise is granted returning residents of the United States. Such exemption may, however, be claimed only once in any 30 day period. All items of merchandise acquired abroad must be declared to Customs officers at the Port of entry into the United States.

c. The carrying of personal communications for other individuals is specifically prohibited by paragraph 8b, W.D., TC 15, 1943.

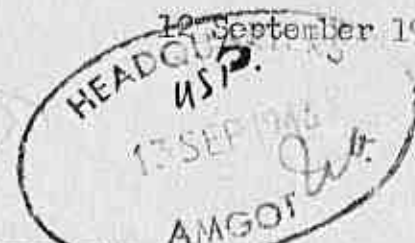

2. Alternate military routes P and R will be used for east and west traffic pending restoration of traffic on CORSO VITTORIO EMANUELE. Traffic for Seventh Army advance CP will be admitted through arch from CORSO ALBERTO ARMANDO and CORSO TUKORY.

III - CONTRACTS FOR PURCHASING OF LIVE STOCK AND OTHER SUPPLIES

The following Memorandum from Fortbase, Headquarters Fifth Army Group, dated 24 August 1943, is published for information and guidance of all concerned.

1. It is understood that units of the Seventh Army have outstanding contracts for the purchase of live stock and possibly other items of supply in the area of Ragusa - Vittoria - Gela, which has been transferred from U.S. to British control.
2. Hq Fortbase would greatly appreciate, at the earliest date practical, a report on any such contracts which are still in force.
3. It should also be understood that any renewal contracts or new contracts between civilians in the British Area and units of the Seventh Army be coordinated with Fortbase before they are executed."

Compliance with the above memorandum will be expedited. Direct communication is authorized, information copy to be forwarded, Fiscal Officer, G-4 Section, Seventh Army.

1. The attention of all Seventh Army Units is directed to letter file AG 370.26/073-M, Hq NATOSLA, dated 15 April 1943, Subject: "Standing Instructions for Movement by Water", letter same file number, inclosure thereto, Subject: "Unit Alert Plans", dated 15 April 1943, 1st Indorsement, Hq Fifth Army, 4 May 1943, and 2nd Indorsement, this headquarters, 13 May 1943.

2. The standing instructions for movement by water will be complied with immediately by all units of the Seventh Army. The required data forms will be kept current. G-4

III-ARREARS IN PAY OF ENLISTED MEN

1. It has come to the attention of this headquarters that a considerable number of individual enlisted men claim they have not been paid for two or even three months. It appears that a portion of these cases arise among men who were absent from their organizations on pay day due to hospitalization, or who were temporarily in staging areas.

2. This matter is considered of such importance as to merit investigation by Commanding Officers to determine that all men of their commands are paid regularly. All Commanding Officers will also take action to insure that enlisted men have Soldier's Individual Pay Record Book, WD AGO Form #23 on their person at all times. In cases where sufficient information on which to base a complete pay roll is not available, partial payment rolls may be prepared for patients in hospitals and men in staging areas, etc., by the Commanding Officers thereof, said partial payments being entered on the

soldiers individual pay record book or service record. The methods to accomplish the payment of enlisted men as above, and in all other circumstances, are proscribed in AR 345-155.

3. Disbursing officers can only make payment upon receipt of a properly prepared payroll. They are charged with the duty of promptly meeting all payrolls submitted to them, preference being given to the payment of rolls covering arrears in pay.
