I -- USE OF ALGIERS TRAMS AND TROLLEYBUSES

In response to an appeal by the officials concerned with public transportation in Algiers, all military personnel are urged to limit to the minimum their use of trams and trolleybuses, particularly during the rush hours, 0700 to 0830, 1100 to 1300, and 1800 to 2000 hours. Use should be made of military vehicles as much as possible where transportation is necessary, and the use of transportation avoided altogether when not absolutely essential.

II -- DRAWING OF PX SUPPLIES

Effective at once all units of this command will draw PX rations directly from the Army Exchange Service warehouse, Rue Commandant Lamy, Algiers. (This is a small street joining Rue de Lyon from the left about half-way between road junction: Rue de Lyon-Rue Sadi Carnot and the Municipal Stadium). The AES will furnish invoices for all supplies and will receive all payments therefor.

Requisitions, one copy only, will be submitted to the AES officer at the warehouse not later than 0900 hours, Sunday morning, of the week in which rations are to be drawn. Units will be advised through this Bulletin as to the time each will draw. This system will be very similar to that used in the past by this command.

Inasmuch as all units have already submitted requisitions to the Unit Exchange Officer, Headquarters Command, it will not be necessary to submit another requisition prior to this next drawing. These requisitions will be turned over to the AES. In the future, however, the procedure as outlined in the preceding paragraph will be observed. Special requisition forms will be provided by the AES.

All units will bring sufficient personnel to expedite the loading of their trucks. Unit Exchange Officers will bring with them a copy of the order appointing them as such.

I -- RETURN OF UNSERVICEABLE AMMUNITION

Unit Commanders are responsible at all times for the immediate return of any unserviceable ammunition, with its containers, to the Ordnance Office, Headquarters Command, Allied Force.

Immediate return of unserviceable ammunition is vitally important to the rapid segregation of lots which have not stood storage or shipment, and to the prevention of continued manufacturing defects.

I -- REPORT ON EXPERIENCED TAILORS

The services of an enlisted man with experience as a tailor are required for a period of seven days. This man will be used to cut material and make allotments of thread, cloth and lining material for bulk shipments. Unit Commanders are requested to submit the names of qualified men to this headquarters immediately.

II -- FURLOUGHS, LEAVES AND PASSES

1. FURLOUGHS.

a. Furloughs will be granted in accordance with AR 615-275 upon written request of the enlisted man concerned for destination within this theater. Request will be directed to Detachment or Company Commander and will contain the following:

- (1) Requested date of departure and length of time desired.
- (2) Address of enlisted man during furlough.
- (3) Means of transportation to and from destination.
- (4) Statement that he has read and understands the provisions of this bulletin.

b. Leaves and furloughs will be granted for periods not longer than seven (7) days.

c. Ordinarily no leaves or furloughs will be granted until three (3) months after arrival in this theater.

d. In general, not more than fifteen (15%) per cent of the strength of a command may be on a pass (24 hours or over) at one time and not more than seven (7%) per cent on furlough at any one time.

e. Civilian clothing may not be worn on leave, furlough or pass.

f. All military personnel on leave, furlough or pass will have on their person the following:

- (1) Leave Order, Furlough Certificate or pass.
- (2) Identification Card (WD AGO Form 65-1 or 65-4 if issued)
- (3) Identification Tags.

g. Arrangements will be made for transportation of enlisted men to destination by or under the supervision of the Detachment or Company Commander.

BULLETIN 92, Hq Comd (Contd)30 August 1943**2. LEAVE OF ABSENCE.**

a. Officers proceeding on leave of absence are responsible for securing their own travel and living accommodations.

b. Requests for leave will be made in accordance with AR 605-115, and will include the following:

- (1) Requested date of departure and length of time requested.
- (2) Amount of accrued leave.
- (3) Statement that officer is not a member of a court martial, board of officers or has any special duty requiring his presence during the requested period.
- (4) Address where officer can be reached while on leave.

3. PASSES.

a. Passes are authorized for periods up to seventy-two (72) hours, but no overnight passes will be issued unless the soldier concerned has presented evidence to his unit commander that he has a lodging for the nights or night involved, and transportation to and from his destination.

b. Passes will be shown to authorities requesting them and will be returned to unit orderly rooms on return of bearer.

4. SECURITY AND COURTESY, UNIFORM AND MILITARY BEARING.

a. Personnel going on leave, furlough or pass will have called to their attention previously issued instructions with regard to military courtesy and security.



I -- USE OF CIVILIAN TELEPHONES IN U. S. ARMY INSTALLATIONS

Much confusion and misunderstanding and many claims have resulted in this theater due to the indiscriminate use by U. S. Army personnel of unrequisioned civilian telephones in offices, warehouses, hotels, messes, and other properties occupied by Army installations. The requisitioning of a building or other property does not automatically include a requisition of civilian telephone service already installed.

Unit commanders will make an immediate check of all telephones (other than those installed by the Signal Corps) being used by their personnel in the Army installations under their command, in order to determine whether such civilian telephone service has been requisitioned, and, if not, whether such service is necessary. If such service has not previously been requisitioned and is deemed to be necessary, the civilian telephone service should be requisitioned without delay through the base or area signal officer. If the service is unnecessary, the civilian service should be terminated in order to prevent the continued accumulation of telephone service charges, local and long distance.

Information as to whether a particular telephone in the Algiers area has been requisitioned can be obtained by calling Filter 32. In other areas, this information can be obtained from the Signal Officer of the Atlantic Base Section, Mediterranean Base Section, or Eastern Base Section.

All unit commanders will render a report to reach this headquarters not later than 1200 hours, 31 July 1943, stating the number of civilian telephones which are in use and deemed necessary which have not previously been requisitioned. Also the number of civilian telephones which are at present in use and which have not been requisitioned and are unnecessary. The report should state the action taken by the unit commander in the case of each unrequisioned civilian telephone at present in use in compliance with this bulletin.

After 1 August 1943, any service charges for unrequisioned civilian telephones in U. S. Army installations will become the personal responsibility of the unit commanders.

I -- DRUM & BUGLE CORPS

II -- WATER CONSERVATION

At present, the water supply in North Africa is approaching that critical stage which normally occurs in the summer months and which will continue until the middle of October. This will require that all necessary measures be instituted at once so that water will be conserved.

The following instructions will be issued by all Commanding Officers to the entire personnel of their respective commands:

a. All units will check to see that sanitary measures are enforced so as to prevent the pollution of springs, wells, and streams. Cesspools and other sewage facilities should be so located that they will not drain into streams, wells, cisterns, etc.

b. Water rationing should be strictly enforced where necessary, but such rationing should be only as severe as the local situation demands.

c. The use of showers for bathing will be strictly controlled by officer supervision. Showers will not be allowed to flow indiscriminately. Scrub-down baths, using water from basins, buckets, or other containers, are encouraged since they are more economical. Water levels in bath tubs should be limited to the minimum requirements.

d. The use of water for laying dust is prohibited.

e. Motor vehicles will be washed only by using buckets of water. Water hoses are uneconomical and their use in washing vehicles will be discontinued during the critical period.

Compliance with the above instructions will begin immediately. Commanding Officers will institute necessary checks and make periodic inspections in order to insure strict compliance.

I -- RENTAL AND QUARTERS ALLOWANCES

Enlisted Men With Wives in Military Service of United States. - The payment of rental allowances or monetary allowances in lieu of quarters to members of the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps is equivalent to furnishing public quarters for their occupancy, and it is clear that quarters in kind furnished or made available to officer candidates of the corps or to officers and enrolled members thereof are "public quarters" within the meaning of that term as used in section 10 of the act of June 16, 1942 (56 Stat., 363, 364). See decision dated April 14, 1943, B 32874. Accordingly, enlisted men of the first, second, or third grade are not entitled to receive monetary allowances in lieu of quarters for dependents during any period when such dependents are furnished quarters, or an allowance in lieu thereof, as officers, officer candidates, or enrolled members of the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps. B 31914, April 22, 1943.

Officers With Wives in Military Service of British Government. - While it is assumed that an officer's wife who is a member of the Women's Auxiliary Air Forces of the British Army is furnished subsistence and quarters, or is paid a monetary allowance in lieu thereof, by the British Government, the officer's situation with respect to his right to the increased allowances is not the same in such a case as that of an officer whose wife occupies quarters provided by the United States. In the latter case, payment of the allowance for quarters is prohibited on the basis that quarters in kind have been provided by the United States. Accordingly, in the former case payment of increased allowances as for an officer with a dependent (lawful wife) is authorized. B 32772, April 23, 1943.

In view of the above decisions, where officers claim rental allowances for their lawful wives, a notation will be added to item (10) of War Department Form No. 336 (Pay and Allowance Account), as follows: "Or receive a monetary allowance in lieu thereof."

Where enlisted men of the first three grades claim monetary allowances in lieu of quarters for dependent wives, the certificate as to quarters on the pay roll (War Department Form No. 366) will be amended to include the notation set forth in above paragraph.



I -- SALT TABLETS

Effective 1 June 1943, Salt Tablets will be issued automatically with rations on a minimum basis of two (2) tablets per man per day, every ten (10) days.

II -- ARTIFICIAL ICE

An inspection of Entrepot Frigorifique, an Artificial Ice Plant, showed that this ice is not being produced under sanitary conditions.

This ice will not be used in direct contact with foods to be eaten raw or in drinks. It may be used for refrigeration purposes.

III -- EXPEDITIONERY FORCE MESSAGE SERVICE

Effective immediately, Headquarters Command will have EFM service to the United States with no actual fixed limit on the amount of messages that may be sent. However, unit EFM Officers are cautioned that the supply of EFM forms are limited, and for that reason, individuals should be limited to one message until all members of their organization have had an opportunity to send an EFM.

I -- SOLDIERS' DEPOSITS

It is desired that organization commanders fully explain to all enlisted men of their commands the opportunity and advantages of making deposits of a portion of their pay at frequent intervals.

An enlisted man may deposit his savings in sums not less than \$5.00 at any time by taking the money to his organization commander or personnel officer, who will deposit same with the Finance Officer, and receive a receipt therefor in a deposit book which will be furnished the soldier and may be kept by him or retained with his service record as he desires. The subject of Soldiers' Deposits is fully covered in AR 35-2600, as amended by Charges Number 2, dated 21 January 1943, which has been reproduced and published in Circular 10, Hq NATOUSA, 18 February 1943.

In connection with the above the following points should be stressed:

1. The substantial pay received by U. S. soldiers, augmented by twenty per cent increase of their base pay for duty on foreign service, should leave a margin for savings.
2. The advantage of having a lump sum of money available upon discharge from the service at the conclusion of hostilities to assist the soldier to become adjusted in civil life should be made obvious.
3. The interest rate of four per cent on these deposits is much more favorable than is generally now obtainable on sound securities or at savings banks.
4. Deposits are not subject to ordinary forfeitures.
5. The habit of thrift should be developed among the men of this command.

Unit and separate organization commanders will bring the contents of this bulletin to the attention of replacements shortly after their arrival.

I -- REDESIGNATION OF UNIT AND SIMILAR FUNDS

Each unit commander under this command is referred to Circular 58, NATCOSA, cs, with relation to unit funds, maintenance and inspection. I -- CONSUMPTION OF RAW VEGETABLES (Cir 53, Hq MATOUSA, 6/4/43)

All personnel of the Army of the United States, North African Theater of Operations, will refrain from eating lettuce or other types of fresh salads. Fresh vegetables and fruits which can be satisfactorily washed and peeled may be consumed except in the Fez-Meknes area where amoebic dysentery is hyperendemic. Vegetables and fruits which are to be consumed will be repeatedly washed in fresh running water and will be peeled before they are served. The dipping of vegetables, fruits, etc., in solutions of permanganate of potash or of chlorine is not recommended because such a procedure gives a false sense of security not warranted by experience.

II -- USE AND CARE OF MOSQUITO BARS (Cir 53, Hq MATOUSA, 6/4/43)

1. Mosquito bars will be requisitioned and issued to all personnel of the Army of the United States, North African Theater of Operations. If the issue of mosquito bars is not practical in the combat zone they should be stored in a place where they will be accessible when such a unit is relieved from combat duty.

2. The use of mosquito bars will start on 22 April 1943, unless in the opinion of the unit commander an earlier date is desirable.

3. All troops will be carefully instructed in the use and care of mosquito bars. This will include remarks upon how to set them up under all conditions of use, how to get in and out of them, the time at which they should be raised or lowered (one-half hour after sunrise or before sunset) and a warning against smoking in mosquito bars. Frequent inspections will be made to insure compliance with these instructions.

III -- SPORTS

The local baseball season will be inaugurated on Saturday, 10 April, with a game between the 2nd Battalion, 133rd Infantry and the 2nd Squadron, 102nd Cavalry. Time, 1500 hours - place, Municipal Stadium.



I -- LATE PASSES

The privilege of late passes up to 2300 hours to men selected for their good conduct has been justified by the very small number of cases in which the privilege has been abused.

It has, therefore, been decided to increase the percentage of men on unit strength who may be granted these passes in any one night from 5% to 15%, thus enabling units to grant these passes approximately once a week to men whose conduct justifies it.

The continuance of the extension of this privilege will depend on the good behavior of the troops and unsuitable men will not therefore be given late passes.

I -- DISINFECTION OF FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

All fruits and vegetables, which are to be eaten raw, should be treated as follows:

Prepare a solution of calcium hypochlorite, one ampule to 5 gallons of water. Immerse article in solution for 15 minutes. Wash with clean water. Allow to dry. Leafy vegetables should be pulled apart before being immersed. This applies to all fruits whether they are to be peeled or not.

The ampule is the same as used with the Lister bag. This solution can be used for 24 hours. The vessel should be well covered when not in use.

4. a. The Article of War 104 will be used to the fullest extent for the punishment of minor offenses. Courts-Martial will be utilized only if suitable punishment for the offense cannot be administered by unit commanders.

b. Charges will be thoroughly investigated and accompanied by the summary of testimony obtained from all witnesses in the case.

c. Charge Sheets will be carefully scrutinized and checked as to accuracy of form and data. (See Section II, AFHQ Circular No 13, dated 25 January 1943, and appendices of the H.Q.M.)

d. Commanding Officers will make every possible effort to see that charges are brought to trial in the most expeditious manner possible in keeping with a fair and impartial investigation.

Revised Procedure for Distribution of and Accounting for Field Rations.--

Effective February 1, 1943, Circular No. 195, War Department, 1941, as amended by Section V, Circular No. 239, War Department 1941, and Section III, Circular No. 88, and Circular No. 297, War Department, 1942; Section II, Circular No. 68, War Department, 1942; and Section V, Circular No. 134, War Department, 1942, as amended by Section III, Circular No. 216, and Section III, Circular No. 353, War Department, 1942, are rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

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*

37. Collection of Cost of Field Rations drawn for military personnel (except enlisted men).--The Station Commander will prepare, for each Disbursing Officer concerned, a separate report in triplicate, listing by name, serial number, grade, and organization, the members of the military personnel (except enlisted men) for whom field rations were drawn, and will indicate the number of rations drawn for each, and the amount due the United States therefor, computed at the rate of 70 cents per ration. These figures will be verified, so as to agree with the various daily ration allowance returns. The original and one copy of each report will be forwarded to the Disbursing Officer who pays the pay accounts of the individuals listed thereon. The Disbursing Officer will enter the amount due the United States on the pay voucher of each such individual with the notation, "Due the United States For--Field Rations at \$0.70 per ration furnished during the month of ____." and will take up the amount so deducted to the credit of the appropriation, "Replacing Supplies and Transportation, Army" indicating proper project for subsistence. The Disbursing Officer will stamp the duplicate copy of each report with his office stamp, and will forward it to the service command fiscal officer for the property auditor's file.

38. Collection of cost of field rations drawn for civilians.--Where field rations are drawn for civilians serving with the Army, who are not authorized to be furnished a ration in kind, the mess officer will collect from

each such individual at the rate of 70 cents per ration for the number of ration so drawn, and will deliver the funds collected, together with a list showing the names of the individuals and their designations, the number of rations involved and the amount paid by each, to the officer who prepares the consolidated daily ration allowance returns covering the issue of the rations. An appropriate receipt for the funds will be given to the mess officer. The officer receiving the funds will prepare on a shipping ticket in triplicate, a consolidated list of all such funds turned in to him by mess officers, and will deliver the total amount of such funds, together with two copies of the shipping ticket, to the station sales officer (See Par. 10B (3), AR 35-6660). The third copy of the shipping ticket will be forwarded to the service command fiscal officer. The sales officer will give a receipt for the funds transferred on one copy of the shipping ticket, and will retain the second copy as a debit voucher to his sales account. A whole days ration will be charged at the rate of 70 cents per ration for each day on which rations were drawn, regardless of the number of meals eaten.

I -- MALARIA CONTROL

All units of this command are responsible for taking the necessary steps to control Malaria Fever within and immediately adjacent to the areas occupied by them. This control consists principally of the control and eradication of mosquitoes. The following will be adhered to by units of this command:

- a. Screen of sixteen (16) mesh to an inch or finer (when available) will be placed on windows and doors of occupied buildings.
- b. Mosquito nets will be used by all personnel while sleeping.
- c. Drain all stagnant water in the area and fill in places where water may collect. Fire buckets or similar containers will be refilled with fresh water at least once each week.
- d. Ponds, swamps, and slow moving streams will be oiled by the use of waste motor oil now available at Transportation Battalion. A continuous film on the surface for three hours will kill the mosquito larvae. This oiling must be repeated every seven (7) days. A method of oiling slow moving streams is to submerge a sack filled with oil soaked sand in the stream. This will keep a continuous film of oil on the surface for several hours.
- e. All used cars will be washed, binned, punctured, crushed, and disposed of by burying to prevent accumulation of water as a possible breeding place for mosquitoes.

Effective this date, five (5) percent of the total enlisted personnel of any subordinate unit of this command is authorized to be absent from duties on official pass until 2300 hours daily.

The quintuplicate will be retained by the personnel officer."

I - CHANGE IN VALUATION OF MONEY USED IN NORTH AFRICA

The official rate of exchange in French North Africa and West Africa is changed to 50 Francs to the dollar and 200 Francs to the £, effective 0001 hours 2 February.

Through 8 February personnel may exchange yellow seal dollars and BMA notes with Banks at the rate of 50 Francs to the dollar and 200 Francs to the £.

After 8 February the yellow seal dollar and the BMA note shall continue to circulate at the new rate.

From 9 February to 15 February, inclusive, military personnel only may exchange yellow seal dollars and BMA notes with Finance Officer at the rate of 75 Francs to the dollar and 300 Francs to the £. Special efforts must be made to exchange money for personnel in the forward areas and in hospitals before time limit expires.

No payments of yellow seal dollars or BMA notes to be made by Finance Officer between 2 February and 25 February except for pay earned prior to 31 January. All other payments to be made in Francs at 50 to the dollar.

After 2 February arrears of pay personnel in North and West Africa, to include 31 January, will be paid at the rate of 75 Francs to the dollar and 300 Francs to the £. This authority expires midnight 25 February.

After 25 February and to include 31 August arrears of pay to include 31 January may be paid at the 75 Francs to dollar rate (300 to £) by securing necessary authority from Chief Finance Officer, AFHQ.

All arrears of pay will be completed as soon as possible giving special attention to personnel in hospitals and those separated from organizations. No arrears of pay to be included in payrolls and vouchers covering pay and allowances from 1 February on. Arrears of pay to be stated on separate vouchers.

IV - NATIONAL SERVICE LIFE INSURANCE

The following War Department cable, dated 27 January, is quoted for the information and guidance of all members of this command:

"Life Insurance Memorandum Number 1 dated January 25, 1943, is being air mailed to you today. This memorandum grants an additional 120 day period until May 25, 1943, in which military personnel outside the United States may make application for National Service Life Insurance without detailed physical examination required by Veterans Administration Form 350a, but requires a short certificate as worded in Memorandum Number 1 signed by a Medical Officer or the Commanding Officer of individual making application. WD is concerned about the men in overseas theaters who have no insurance or less than maximum amount. The Secretary of War desires that Commanding Officers of all grades stress value of this insurance which Congress has provided as a protection to dependents. At present pay rates soldiers should be able to carry maximum amount. If Veterans Administration Insurance Form 350a and AGO Form 29 (Allotments of Pay for Premiums) are not available in sufficient numbers you are authorized to duplicate these forms locally."

I. WASTE OF RATIONS (Ltr AFHQ, 22 Jan 43)

Reports reaching this headquarters indicate that there are instances where rations are being wasted unnecessarily. This situation appears to be particularly prevalent in areas where individuals and small detachments are traveling in rear of the combat area.

Waste of rations like other wastages is due to lack of discipline and lack of appreciation of the accumulative effect of small wastage when spread over the entire area.

Care will be taken that individuals and small detachments will be issued only the maximum rations required for the mission they are to perform.

Sale, barter or any other means of disposition of rations to unauthorized persons is strictly forbidden.

Containers will not be opened unnecessarily. Contents of opened containers will not be disposed of if their condition warrants preservation for future use.

II. WEARING OF U.S. ARMY CLOTHES BY NATIVES

It is a violation of AF 64 to sell or otherwise dispose of government property, including individual clothing and equipment.

Individuals disposing of clothing to natives without authority will be severely punished. The practice facilitates activities of subversive agents, brings discredit upon the uniform and complicates the civilian police problem of differentiating between thieves and honest individuals.

I - WEARING OF THE SERVICE UNIFORM

Changes Number 9, 29 November 1942, to paragraph 45, AR 600-40, 28 August 1941, is quoted for the information and guidance of all concerned:

"On each shoulder loop of the service coat, the long overcoat, the short overcoat, the raincoat, the field jacket, and on each shoulder of work clothing, metal or embroidered insignia of grade will be worn. On each shoulder of special suits or jackets of flying personnel, metal embroidered or leather insignia of grade will be worn."

II - PHYSICAL INSPECTIONS

All units will immediately contact Medical Officers in reference to monthly medical inspections if they have not already done so.

III - PUBLIC RELATIONS INFORMATION

Each unit commander will immediately institute a check to determine whether he has an NCO in his organization who has a son in the army.

Any unit commander finding such an NCO, will report the fact to this headquarters.

IV - CONTROL OF VENEREAL DISEASES

Section II, Circular Number 21, AFHQ, 24 December 1942, is quoted for the information and guidance of all concerned:

"1. The commanding officer of each post, camp, station or garrison is basically responsible for determining if and when prostitution in areas adjacent to military establishments adversely affects the efficiency, health and welfare of the personnel of the post, camp, station or garrison. He will enlist the efforts of the local civil authorities to remove such conditions.

2. Reports received at this headquarters indicate that the incidence of venereal disease among troops in North Africa has risen sharply. Every effort will be made to reduce this condition to a minimum. Toward this end the following procedure will be adopted in all commands immediately.

a. Physical inspection of all troops will be made by medical officer twice each month. 4638

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RESTRICTEDHq Comd Bulletin No 3 - cont'd.

b. Early treatment centers and prophylactic stations will be organized, condoms provided, and all ranks fully instructed in preventative measures.

c. Every soldier contracting a venereal disease shall be interrogated as to name, description and address of the individual causing his disease. This information will be forwarded through channels to the Surgeon of the unit concerned who will report such individual to the local authorities and M.P.'s.

3. Investigation reveals that of the large number of soldiers now under treatment for venereal disease a high percentage are suffering from syphilis. Venereal disease is extremely prevalent amongst native women and is of a severe type. Sexual intercourse with these women means syphilis for the soldier.

4. Personnel of the U. S. Army contracting venereal disease will be dealt with as prescribed in Par 5, Sec. III, W.D. Circular 14 of 1940, and other pertinent regulations.

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6. All officers in command of troops will emphasize the seriousness of the venereal situation to all ranks. Unit surgeons will cooperate with unit commanders in formulating educational programs on sex morality, the effects of venereal disease, and the value of prophylactics. Every opportunity will be utilized to obtain wholesome entertainment, organize sports, and provide the maximum amount of recreation for the men which the military situation will permit."


