Subject: Farewell Message

To: All men and women serving in or with Allied Forces in the
Mediterranean Theater

Soon I leave this theater to assume other duties assigned me by the Allied Governments.

I take my leave of you with feelings of personal regret that are equalled only by my pride in your brilliant accomplishments of the year just past. Although tempted to review again the many advantages that have accrued to the Allied cause through your bravery and fortitude, I believe all these will come home to you if you will merely compare your present position and prospects in this great conflict with your position and outlook in the late Fall of 1942. Then the Eighth Army was making its final preparations to attack the enemy, who was standing only a short distance west of Cairo. Vast Allied armadas were approaching North-west Africa in complete ignorance as to whether good fortune or complete disaster awaited them. Battered Malta was being defended only by the bravery of her almost entirely isolated garrison. No Allied ship could transit the length of the Mediterranean. Our fortunes appeared at a low ebb.

All this is changed—changed by your skill, your determination and your devotion to duty. Enemy action against our convoys in the Mediterranean is limited to harassing and submarine efforts. You have established yourselves on the mainland of Europe. You are still advancing.

You, along with the other Allied Forces fighting on many fronts, have already achieved the certainty that, provided every soldier, sailor and airman, and every citizen in our homelands continues incessantly to do his full duty, victory will be ours.

Altogether you comprise a mighty fighting machine, which, under your new Commander, will continue, as a completely unified instrument of war, to make further inroads into the enemy's defenses and assist in bringing about his final collapse.

Until we meet again in the heart of the enemy's continental stronghold, I send Godspeed and good luck to each of you, along with the assurance of my lasting gratitude and admiration.

SUBJECT: Prevention of Loss of Coal by Spontaneous Combustion.

TO : See distribution list.

1. If not properly stored and handled coal being imported into Italy is subject to spontaneous combustion. This is particularly true of Serbian coal. The demands for coal can only be met if it is carefully preserved and if no substantial losses occur.

2. The following are some of the obvious steps which should be taken by all having coal of any considerable amounts under their control.

a. Spread the stock pile as much as possible. The height of the pile should not exceed eight feet for domestic coal and twelve feet for other coals.

b. The stock pile should be leveled off and not a series of pyramids in which large lumps segregate from the fine coal and form ventilating ducts for entrance of air to the fine interior coal.

c. Pack coal tightly. Do not try to ventilate it.

d. Prevent all foreign combustible matter such as oily waste, paper, straw, etc., from being mixed in or near coal piles, and keep it away from heated elements such as furnace walls.

e. If practical coal should be dry before being placed in covered storage. If stored wet do not attempt to ventilate unless the stock pile is to be turned over to dry out.

3. It is desirable that the temperature of coal piles be taken at intervals. If the temperature reaches 150° Fahrenheit immediate steps to move entire contents of the heated area should be taken. Water should not be placed on a coal pile except as a last resort as it induces additional heat and noxious gases. If a coal pile is blazing or glowing red it may be necessary to cool it with water but this is only an "immediate action" remedy. The repiling of the coal in shallow piles two feet or less in height is generally the only sure remedy.

SUBJECT: Non-Secret Short Title Unit Designations.

TO : All Concerned.

1. Circular Number 75 and Section I, Circular Number 79, this headquarters, 1943, are being rescinded and the following substituted therefor.

2. The following non-secret short titles are approved to designate the units indicated below for use in all communications in this theater when brevity of the transmitted material is a paramount consideration. These short titles are not secret code words for units, but are merely to be used for brevity in messages in place of the full name of the unit. Subordinate commands will submit additional proposed non-secret short titles for elements of their command to this headquarters for approval and announcement.

3. For uniformity and to avoid confusion, no other non-secret abbreviations or non-secret short titles should be used for these units. The purpose of these short titles is brevity in the preparation of messages and to facilitate the transmission of messages by electrical means. The short title is to be used in the text of the message in place of the whole name of a unit or installation. They are not to be used in addressing official correspondence. All new short title names or changes in non-secret short titles will be approved and announced by this headquarters.

4. For convenience, the list of Short Title Unit Designations is in two parts; Part I being the units or organizations listed alphabetically and Part II being the Short Title Unit Designations listed alphabetically.

SUBJECT: Security Danger of Wide Distribution Lists.

TO : All Concerned.

1. Information has been received that the enemy has obtained valuable information regarding our Order of Battle from distribution lists placed on captured documents.

2. Originators of documents will avoid, as far as possible, showing a wide distribution by one of the following methods:

a. Showing only the designations of higher echelons, to which sufficient copies should be sent for further distribution to lower echelons. In this case the scale to be adopted should be shown; that is, one copy per battalion. This method is particularly suitable for distribution within a theater or force.

b. Adopting a standard distribution list which may be given an initial circulation and which subsequently should be referred to as "Distribution List A (plus or minus---)". This method is particularly suitable for the distribution of a series of documents to substantially the same addressees.

3. When it is essential to show a wide distribution, the classification of a document will be that warranted by its entire contents.

4. The above does not apply to distributions within a headquarters.

1. All previous instructions concerning the disposition of subversive or disaffected personnel issued by this or any other headquarters which are contrary to the provisions contained herein are rescinded.

2. This letter will govern the disposition of subversive and disaffected military personnel in this theater. The disposition of subversive and disaffected officers and enlisted men is a responsibility of command, which responsibility will be exercised subject to the provisions of this letter so as to maintain security, discipline and morale. The Commanding Generals of the major theater commands indicated in the distribution above are responsible for carrying out policies and procedures established by this letter, keeping this headquarters informed of all general instructions issued thereunder.

3. The phrase "subversive personnel" is defined, for the purpose of this letter, as personnel engaging in, or who, while in the Army, have engaged in, subversive activity of any sort. The phrase "disaffected personnel" is defined as personnel who lack affection for or loyalty to the Government and Constitution of the United States. The use of the phrase "potentially subversive personnel" will be discontinued.

4. Cases of subversion or disaffection will be investigated as soon after the discovery of subversion or disaffection as possible. Investigation will be made by qualified investigative agencies, and will be

made for the purpose of determining whether the officer or enlisted man in question is actually subversive or disaffected. Investigation will be initiated only upon reliable information of sufficient seriousness so that, when weighed against the individual's known reputation and record of service, it compels a grave suspicion that he is subversive or disaffected. The determination in each case as to whether investigation is justified will be made by a responsible officer having command jurisdiction of the individual concerned.

5. Action will be taken only upon verified factual information which positively establishes that the individual concerned is subversive or disaffected. No temporary or permanent action or restriction adverse to the interest of any officer or enlisted man will be taken until such proof has been obtained. As an exception to the foregoing statements, persons under investigation for subversive activity or disaffection will not be assigned to:

- a. Officer candidate schools, as candidates.
- b. Aviation cadet training.
- c. Security and Intelligence duties.
- d. Duties in connection with Radar.
- e. Duties in connection with secret or confidential cryptographic systems or equipment.

6. Commanding Officers will be responsible that enlisted personnel under investigation for subversion or disaffection are not placed or retained in assignments which will give them frequent access to secret or confidential matter or other opportunity to seriously injure the war effort. Except for the duties stated in 5 a, b, c, d and e, above, the determination of which assignments give frequent access to secret or confidential matter or other opportunity to seriously injure the war effort, is a matter of command.

7. Permanent Disposition.

a. In all cases of proven subversive activity concerning either officer or enlisted personnel, commanding officers will institute court-martial proceedings when legally justified. It is desired that investigation by the Counter Intelligence Corps be directed primarily at obtaining evidence to support court-martial charges.

b. As soon as investigation or interrogation establishes that an enlisted man is so dangerously disloyal that he cannot be considered sufficiently reliable for any normal duties within the military establishment, recommendation will be made by the responsible commanding officer through military channels to this headquarters for his transfer. The recommendation will be accompanied by a report of the investigation. Such investigations will be made only by qualified investigative agencies.

c. When investigation or facts otherwise obtained indicate good cause to believe a soldier is disloyal but not sufficiently dangerous to warrant transfer, the soldier will not be permitted to remain in, or be transferred to, any of the duties or organizations mentioned in subparagraphs 5 a, b, c, d and e of this letter. In all cases of individuals restricted in accordance with this paragraph, a statement of the restriction will be placed in individual's Service Record and Form 20.

d. When investigation or facts otherwise obtained indicate the presence of a reasonably understandable refusal or reluctance on the part of a soldier to bear arms against a particular European enemy and further indicates no disloyalty to this country, other than that which can be inferred from his expression of refusal or reluctance to fight, he will be returned to the United States.

- (1) The refusal or reluctance to fight a particular European enemy must be expressed.
- (2) The presence of close relatives, a background which is not remote, or citizenship in any enemy country will constitute sufficient grounds to cause the reluctance or refusal to be understandable.

e. If the service record of any enlisted personnel in this theater contains the notation "not available for service in the European or African Theater of Operations", such an individual will be returned to the United States.

8. Only paragraphs 4 and 7a of this letter are applicable to commissioned officers. Commissioned officers who are proven by investigation to be subversive or potentially subversive will, when possible, be court-martialed, discharged or otherwise disposed of under Articles of War or Army Regulations. If disposition as stated above is not possible, such officers will not be given assignments which will result in security being endangered by reason of their lack of loyalty and in no case will be assigned to or retained in any of the following duties:

- a. Security and Intelligence duties.
- b. Duties in connection with Radar.
- c. Duties in connection with secret or confidential cryptographic systems or equipment.

1. All previous instructions concerning the disposition of subversive or disaffected personnel issued this or any other headquarters which are contrary to the provisions contained herein are rescinded.

2. This letter will govern the disposition of subversive and disaffected military personnel in this theater. The disposition of subversive and disaffected officers and enlisted men is a responsibility of command, which responsibility will be exercised subject to the provisions of this letter so as to maintain security, discipline and morale. The Commanding Generals of the major theater commands indicated in the distribution above are responsible for carrying out policies and procedures established by this letter and for keeping this headquarters informed of all general instructions issued thereunder.

3. The phrase "subversive personnel" is defined, for the purpose of this letter, as personnel engaging in, or who while in the Army, have engaged in, subversive activity of any sort. The phrase "disaffected personnel" is defined as personnel who lack affection for or loyalty to the Government and Constitution of the United States. The use of the phrase "potentially subversive personnel" will be discontinued. **2331**

4. Cases of subversion or disaffection will be investigated as soon after the discovery of subversion or disaffection as is practicable. Such investigation will be made by qualified investigative agencies, and will be

made for the purpose of determining whether the officer or enlisted man in question is actually subversive or disaffected. Investigation will be initiated only upon reliable information of sufficient seriousness so that, when weighed against the individual's known reputation and record of service, it compels a grave suspicion that he is subversive or disaffected. The determination in each case as to whether investigation is justified will be made by a responsible officer having command jurisdiction of the individual concerned.

5. Action will be taken only upon verified factual information which positively establishes that the individual concerned is subversive or disaffected. No temporary or permanent action or restriction adverse to the interest of any officer or enlisted man will be taken until such proof has been obtained. As an exception to the foregoing statements, persons under investigation for subversive activity or disaffection will not be assigned to:

- a. Officer candidate schools, as candidates.
- b. Aviation cadet training.
- c. Security and Intelligence duties.
- d. Duties in connection with Radar.
- e. Duties in connection with secret or confidential cryptographic systems or equipment.

6. Commanding Officers will be responsible that enlisted personnel under investigation for subversion or disaffection are not placed or retained in assignments which will give them frequent access to secret or confidential matter or other opportunity to seriously injure the war effort. Except for the duties stated in 5 a, b, c, d and e, above, the determination of which assignments give frequent access to secret or confidential matter or other opportunity to seriously injure the war effort, is a matter of command.

7. Permanent Disposition.

a. In all cases of proven subversive activity concerning either officer or enlisted personnel, commanding officers will institute court-martial proceedings when legally justified. It is desired that investigation by the Counter Intelligence Corps be directed primarily at obtaining evidence to support court-martial charges.

b. As soon as investigation or interrogation establishes that an enlisted man is so dangerously disloyal that he cannot be considered sufficiently reliable for any normal duties within the military establishment, recommendation will be made by the responsible commanding officer through military channels to this headquarters for his transfer. The recommendation will be accompanied by a report of the investigation. Such investigations will be made only by qualified investigative agencies.

d. SUBJECT: Supervision and Control of Railway Operation in Occupied ITALY.

TO : Commander-in-Chief, Allied Armies in ITALY (Administrative Echelon)

1. A unified system of supervision and control of railway operation will be brought into effect as soon as practicable in such parts of ITALY as are now, or may be in the future, occupied by the Allied Military Forces.

2. This unified system will be based on the Divisional System already in force on those sections of railway in ITALY at present operated by or under the supervision and control of, the United States Military Railway Service.

3. In order to introduce the unified system into those sections of railway in ITALY at present operated by, or under the supervision and control of, the British Transportation Service, the Director of Transportation (British) will be responsible for making the necessary readjustment in the disposition of the British Transportation personnel at his disposal in conformity with the overall requirements of the Director General, Military Railway Service.

4. In order to obtain the necessary flexibility in the future employment of military railway units, both United States and British, the Director General, Military Railway Service, will, in agreement with Headquarters, Allied Armies in Italy, establish a policy of an early and progressive substitution of civil for military operation of successive section of the railways. The extent of this substitution, and the times when it should take place, will depend upon the military situation and the degree to which the various sections of railway are vital to Allied requirements.

5. Headquarters, Allied Armies in Italy, in conjunction with the Director General, Military Railway Service, and the Director of Transportation (British), will arrange the distribution of Movement Control and Military Railway Operating personnel so as to eliminate any overlapping or duplication of functions. This distribution of personnel will be constantly reviewed to ensure efficient and economical use of manpower.

6. Arrangements will also be made by Headquarters, Allied Armies in Italy, to ensure that whenever Military Railway Operating units are withdrawn from any specified area, Movement Control personnel are available to maintain staff supervision and control in that area over those sections of the railway operated by the Italian civil railway organization, but still vital to Allied military requirements.

SUBJECT: Conservation of Electric Power Facilities of Italian Utilities.

TO : All Concerned.

1. A critical shortage of electric utility service exists throughout wide sections of occupied Italy. In order to conserve the limited supply of electric power available, and in order to meet the increasing military and essential civilian requirements, it is necessary that all possible means be utilized to reduce non-essential electric consumption from utility sources, by both military and civilian users in Italy.

2. The following steps will be taken to reduce loads on commercial electric systems:

a. LIGHTING.

- (1) Offices - No lights will be burned during daylight hours except in cases where natural lighting is insufficient for proper working conditions. Wattage of lamps will be limited to a minimum requirement, and fixtures will be located for most economical utilization of light source.
- (2) Halls and Stairways - Lamps in halls, corridors and stairways will be of the smallest wattage commensurate with safety, and a minimum number will be illuminated.
- (3) Hotel Rooms, and Private Living Quarters - No more than two (2) lamps per private living room or one (1) lamp per bath room will be permitted to be connected. No more than one (1) lamp per private living room will be illuminated at the same time. The lamp bulb will not exceed 60 watt rating. Lighting, when permitted in living tents of military personnel, will be limited to one (1) lamp of 60 watt rating in pyramidal or small wall tent.
- (4) Public Space in Hotels, Cafes, Clubs, and Public Buildings - Reduce wattage to a bare essential commensurate with area, use and occupancy. Discontinue all electric signs or display lighting.
- (5) Other Military Facilities - Lighting of mess halls, kitchens, work shops, etc. will not exceed the following scale:

(6) Outdoor Areas - Guarded areas, POW enclosures, storage areas, streets, etc., will be lighted only in accordance with necessity.

(7) TURN OFF ALL LIGHTS NOT IN USE.

Post signs conspicuously and make every individual economy-minded in use of electricity.

b. HEATING AND COOKING.

(1) Electric heating will be permitted only in essential industrial processes engaged in production for the military effort, and in hospitals for the treatment of patients.

(2) No electric cooking will be permitted.

c. POWER.

(1) The use of electric power will be limited to:

(a) Those industries contributing directly to the military effort or essential to the civilian economy.

(b) Installations necessary to safeguard public health.

(2) Elevators will be operated by electric power only for movement of hospital patients or for heavy freight.

(3) No electric motors will be allowed to idle for extended periods.

d. ELECTRIC RAILWAY POWER will be utilized only on approval by the Electric Power Committee of the AFIR (Italian) Board.

e. ELECTROLYTIC PROCESSES AND ELECTRIC ARC FURNACES will be utilized only on approval by the Electric Power Committee of the AFIR (Italian) Board.

3. Military Commanders will be responsible that these instructions are carried out within their jurisdiction of military installations, and civilian authorities will be required to enforce similar measures in those civilian installations which are allowed to receive electric service.

SUBJECT: Relations between Military Commanders and
Officers of Allied Military Government.

TO : All concerned.

1. a. As outlined in Administrative Memorandum No. 69, this headquarters, as, the Allied Military Government of Occupied Territory has been divided into two units; one under Allied Military Government 15 Army Group, to operate in the combat zone, and the other, under Headquarters Allied Military Government, to operate in all other occupied territory.

b. This directive defines the relationship between Military Commanders (British District, Sub-District, Area, Sub-Area and Garrison Commanders and U.S. Base Section and District Commanders) and AMG Officers, in the area which is under Headquarters Allied Military Government for military government purposes.

2. a. It is intended that the government of Italian territory in rear of the combat zone shall be handed over to the Italian authorities as soon as the situation permits. Headquarters Allied Military Government will then be replaced by an Allied Control Commission which will administer a system of post-armistice control over the Italians.

b. Until this transfer of responsibilities takes place, the existing system of military government will continue in operation, under the direction and control of the Chief Civil Affairs Officer at Headquarters Allied Military Government, and through his subordinate Regional Civil Affairs Officers.

3. a. Allied Military Government personnel will be under command of the Commander of the Base Section, District, Sub-District, Area, Sub-Area or Garrison concerned for disciplinary purposes, subject to the provisions of Administrative Memorandum No. 11, this headquarters, as, (Revised to 1 Oct. 1943).

b. In cases of military emergency, the Allied military commander responsible for defense and security will assume full command of Allied Military Government personnel and will issue such orders to them as the situation demands.

c. In special circumstances, e.g. where there is a very small garrison under a commander junior to the Allied Military Government officer, or where an Italian commander is responsible for the administration, defense or security, special instructions will be issued by this headquarters.

3.4. It will be the duty of the Regional Civil Affairs Officer to assist military commanders in his region in their dealings with the civil population. Similarly it will be the duty of the military commander to assist the Regional Civil Affairs Officer, and to uphold his authority in the civil sphere, by military action if need be.

4.5. Military commanders and Allied Military Government officers will maintain liaison at all times and will carry out their respective functions in close cooperation. Any difference which may arise between them will be promptly reported to this headquarters. If however an immediate decision is required, the military commander will make that decision and Allied Military Government Officers will comply with his orders, pending receipt of instructions from this headquarters.

TO : All Concerned.

1. It is a G-2 responsibility to settle the claims of helpers of British and USA escapers or evaders in this theater.

2. G-2(P/W) Section, this headquarters, will assume full responsibility for any already existing organizations or future organizations set up to carry out this work in Mediterranean Theater of Operations.

3. a. In order to carry out this task as expeditiously as possible, G-2(P/W), this headquarters, will immediately set up an Allied Screening Commission for this purpose in ITALY and in GREECE.

b. The commissions in ITALY and GREECE will be known as:

Allied Screening Commission (IS 9), c/o AG, and
Allied Screening Commission (IS 9), c/o ALL GREECE, respectively.

c. IS 9 personnel have been attached to all Military Missions in the BALKANS and Central European countries for the same purpose, and will be the only authorized channel for receiving and investigating claims in these countries.

4. Commanders and Heads of Missions will insure that claimants within their area are referred to the nearest IS 9 organization, or to the Allied Screening Commission in the case of ITALY and GREECE.

SUBJECT: Port Security Instruction (Italy) No 709 - Travel of Civilians
From Italy to France.

TO : All Concerned.

1. Inter-Allied Laissez-passer will no longer be required for travel by civilians from Allied-occupied Italy to France. This will be replaced by Allied Expeditionary Force Permits and Military Travel Authorizations in accordance with the following paragraphs.

2. Effective this date the following regulations are applicable:

a. Civilians who require Military Travel Authorizations issued by G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, to leave Italy under the provisions of letter, this headquarters, file AG 371.2/015 GEG-O, subject: "Military Travel Authorizations", dated 7 November 1944, will also require French entry visas. Applications for Military Travel Authorizations will not be considered without production of a French entry visa.

b. All categories of persons exempted from Military Travel Authorizations under paragraph 2 of the above quoted letter, with the exceptions noted below, will in future require Allied Expeditionary Force Permits issued by G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, on behalf of SHAEF, unless already in possession of Allied Force Permits, Joint Chiefs of Staff Permits, or Allied Expeditionary Force Permits. Persons already in possession of the above permits which have not been validated for France should apply to G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, for the appropriate validation.

c. Allied service personnel will not require any form of military permit. This category includes British and US civilians employed by any of the Service Ministries in the UK or US who are in possession of AGO cards or British military, naval or air force identity cards.

d. War correspondents accredited to SHAEF or AFHQ, merchant seamen serving in Allied or Allied-operated ships, and merchant seamen, other than Italians, proceeding to France to join ships under proper authority, will not require any form of military permit for travel to France.

3. Persons who are not documented in accordance with the above will not be permitted to embark for France at sea or airports in Italy.

1. a. This directive assumes that personnel of Regions I and II are under command of the Allied Control Commission. During such time as may elapse from the date of this order and Regions I and II come under command of Allied Control Commission, the channels of administration and communication outlined in this directive will operate so far as is possible as though Regions I and II were under command of Allied Control Commission.

b. Personnel of AMG, Fifth Army, AME, Eighth Army, and of Regions III and IV are under command AMG, 15 Army Group.

c. In this directive 1a. above will be referred to as "ACC Command", and 1b. above will be referred to as "AMG Command".

2. a. All U.S. Army personnel concerned with administration of Italian territory under both Allied Control Commission and Allied Military Government are held on the manning table of 2675th Regiment, Allied Control Commission (Provisional).

b. All British personnel similarly concerned will be held on a consolidated War Establishment now in the course of preparation.

c. Headquarters of 2675th Regiment (Rear Echelon) has been established at Tizi Ouzou (North Africa) where the Headquarters will remain until the events contemplated in paragraph 2 d. occur. A British Administrative Headquarters has likewise been established at Tizi Ouzou to administer the personnel held on the proposed consolidated War Establishment and to keep appropriate records of equipment held on Army Form 6109B. The British Administrative Headquarters will remain at Tizi Ouzou until the events contemplated in paragraph 2 d. occur.

d. Both the above headquarters will move from Tizi Ouzou to join their immediately superior headquarters (see letter, this headquarters, file AG 337.4-1 MCS-ACM, subject: Organization of 2675th Regiment (U. S. Contingent) and its British Counterparts, dated 3 November 1943) as soon as adequate arrangements can be made. At the same time all personnel then held at Military Government Center, Tizi Ouzou, will move to the mainland of Italy or Sicily.

e. In the meantime,

- (1) A Forward Echelon of Headquarters 2675th Regiment is now established at Palermo. The Forward Echelon has authority delegated by the Commander of 2675th Regiment to keep and maintain all records of personnel other than those in North Africa. The Forward Echelon will also draw so far as is possible all equipment authorized by the Table of Equipment from sources available in Sicily and the mainland of Italy.
- (2) British Administrative Headquarters will send an officer for G-4 duties to Palermo. He will draw so far as is possible all equipment authorized by Army Form G1098 from sources available in Sicily and the mainland of Italy.
- (3) Both headquarters will exchange all necessary information and copies of records with Headquarters Allied Control Commission and Headquarters AMG 15 Army Group in respect of personnel and equipment. To insure coordination and information, details will be worked out between all headquarters concerned.

f. Basic administrative orders defining the channels and methods of administration and communication in respect of all U.S. and British personnel will be issued by the Headquarters of the 2675th Regiment and by the British Administrative Headquarters respectively. Before such basic administrative orders are issued the contents will be coordinated with the Military Government Section, this headquarters, Allied Control Commission, and Headquarters AMG.

3. Allotment from the aggregate of appointments authorized by the manning table and War Establishment will be made by Military Government Section.

4. a. All officers provisionally assigned to Regions VIII and IX now at Tizi Ouzou will at once be employed to fill existing vacancies in "AMG Command." Officers provisionally assigned to Region VIII will fill vacancies in AMG Fifth Army and Region III; officers provisionally assigned to Region IX will fill vacancies in AMG Eighth Army and Region IV.

b. The numbers of EM/ORs and the proportion of vehicles and equipment (authorized by Table of Equipment, Army Form G1098) to accompany the officers coming under command Regions III and IV in accordance with paragraph 4 a. above will be decided by Military Government Section.

5. a. On a decision to call forward the personnel for a new region, the appointments allotted by Military Government Section for that region

will be filled by the personnel available to "ACC Command" and "AMG Command".

b. The appointments which will be relinquished in Regions I and II and in regions subsequently coming under "ACC Command" will be determined by Military Government Section. The personnel will be selected by Headquarters Allied Control Commission.

c. The personnel to fill Regions VIII and IX and regions beyond (so far as they come from personnel under command of "AMG Command") will be selected by Headquarters, AMG 15 Army Group.

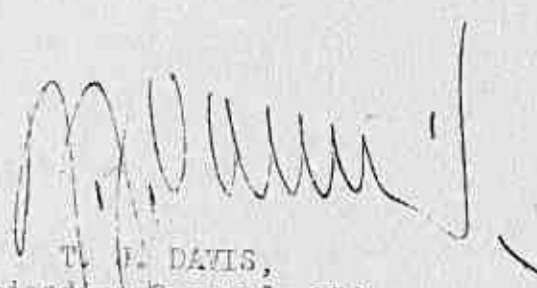
d. Such preference as is possible in selection of personnel for Regions VIII and IX should be given to officers who have already been provisionally assigned to these Regions, particularly in the Headquarters and Specialist Groups.

e. On a decision to hand over territory to Italian administration, the allocation of appointments under command of "ACC Command" in such territory will be made by Military Government Section. Personnel equivalent in rank, qualification, and nationality will be selected by Headquarters AMG 15 Army Group for transfer under command "ACC Command".

6. Personnel, vehicles and equipment, will not be transferred from "ACC Command" to "AMG Command" or vice versa without the approval of Military Government Section.

7. A separate order will be issued in respect of the personnel now provisionally assigned to Region V.

SUBJECT: Vetting of Italians for Entertainment Purposes.

TO : All Concerned.

1. Welfare or Special Service Officers of all installations under the jurisdiction of this headquarters who engage Italian personnel for entertainment purposes will henceforth submit the names of such personnel for vetting to the appropriate Intelligence authorities of the local district, sub-area or base section headquarters in which the installation is located.

2. Requests for vetting of Italian entertainment personnel will be submitted in duplicate, together with other required information, on attached Form CI-2V-10 (see Appendix "A"). Copy of completed form will be retained in files of office requesting security screening.

3. Italian entertainment personnel will be vetted in accordance with established security procedures by the appropriate Field Security Section or Counter Intelligence Corps Detachment and all investigations of this nature will be given expeditious handling by the security authorities concerned. If necessary, security investigations of such entertainment personnel will be given preference so as not to delay or conflict with ENSA or Special Service schedules, commitments or arrangements.

4. Upon the security clearance of Italian entertainment personnel by the FSS or CIC, such personnel will be issued a Work Permit in accordance with the attached form (Work Permit - Appendix "B").

5. It will be the responsibility of the appropriate ENSA and Special Service Sections to ensure that Italian personnel will carry both the usual Identity Card and the Work Permit referred to in the previous paragraph at all times.

6. Issuance of Work Permits will not obviate the necessity for obtaining the usual individual AG/AC travel permits which may be required for travel of civilians in Italy.

7. These instructions are applicable to:

- a. All entertainment projects which will require aid or assistance by Italian Personnel.
- b. All civilian personnel whose duties will require them to:
- (1) Travel into restricted areas or zones.
 - (2) Come into contact with special personnel or installations.
 - (3) Go on extended or protracted tours of military installations or units.

8. These instructions are not applicable to stagehands, prop-men, waiters or concert artists hired for a single evening or performance.

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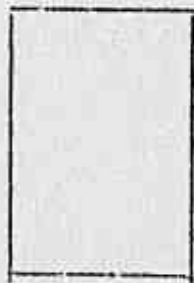
