I - Use of Elevators by Military Personnel

With effect from the date of this Order, the use of elevators by Allied Military personnel for any purpose whatever IS FORBIDDEN. The doors of all elevators in military hotels and other installations will be locked, or, if this is not possible, other suitable precautions will be taken to ensure that this Order is put into effect AT ONCE.

This Order cancels ALL authorities previously issued permitting the use of elevators for any purpose.

II - Supply of Electricity and Fuel to Military Personnel living in Flats, etc

All Allied Officers who have taken up residence in flats, etc (whether with official approval or otherwise) are warned that special arrangements cannot be made for the supply of electricity or fuel for heating and lighting during the winter months.

REGULATIONS FOR U.S. ARMY OPERATED HOTELS

1. Pursuant to authority contained in letter, file A.C. 004/416 A-O, subject: "Responsibility for Supervision of Hotels in Rome Area", dated 26 September 1944, all hotels for US Army personnel in the Rome Area are under the general supervision of the Commanding General, Rome Allied Area Command, and will be operated under the following regulations:

a. Moral:

- (1) Civilian guests will not be permitted in officer's rooms, or above the first or main floor, except in public bars or lounges.
- (2) Known prostitutes will not be allowed to enter any hotel.
- (3) Unescorted women will not be permitted to enter any hotel.

b. Reges: All messes will be operated in compliance with existing regulations and policies of the Theater Commander.

(1) Rest Hotels:

- (a) Civilian guests, except other than those of the United States, US Army and associated agencies, will be restricted to the evening meal only and to one guest per officer for each three days, or fraction thereof, during his leave period.

(2) Permanent Hotels:

- (a) Civilian guests, except other than those of the United States, US Army and associated agencies, will be restricted to the evening meal only and limited to two guests per officer per week.

- c. Black Market: The Black Market will not be patronized.
- d. Electricity: Electric current will be used in compliance with orders issued by the Commanding General, Rome Allied Area Command.
- e. Hours for Closing:
 - (1) Bars will be closed at 2330 hours.
 - (2) Civilian guests will leave hotels before curfew - 2400 hours.
- f. Responsibility:
 - (1) Hotel managers will be directly responsible to the Commanding General, Rome Allied Area Command for compliance with this order.
 - (2) Violations by officers will subject them to disciplinary action.

2. Copies of these regulations will be conspicuously posted in all US Army operated hotels in the Rome Area.

3. Reversion - All previous instructions in conflict with the above are hereby rescinded.

ELECTRICITY CONTROL

All units and military personnel will observe the following restrictions on the use of electricity in ROME Area except where special exemption has been granted by the Electricity Control Board, ROME Allied Area Command.

No military unit or individual is entitled to the use of permanent current without the authority of the Electricity Control Board, ROME Allied Area Command.

No electric elevators, cooling appliances, refrigerators, fans or other small electric power units will be used without special authority. All such appliances at present in use will be disconnected forthwith.

The following restrictions will apply to the actual consumption of electricity within billets and premises occupied by military personnel.

- a. One bulb (medium power) only will be in use in each bedroom, sitting room or anti-room.
- b. 60% of all normal light bulbs will be disconnected in corridors, messes and lounges.
- c. No electric light will be used during daylight except where absolutely essential for work.

Civilian staffs employed in hotels and military units will be advised of these restrictions.

No exemption will be given to these rules except in the case of hospitals and selected places of entertainment, etc, sponsored by Welfare/Special Services. In all cases strict economy will be observed and the instructions contained in paragraph 4(a) above will apply to all resident welfare personnel.

All applications for exemption will be submitted to the Chairman, Electricity Control Board, ROME Allied Area Command.

Military units and personnel will allow entry to authorized agents of the Electricity Power Companies bearing a pass stamped by G-4 Section, ROME Allied Area Command, to examine meters and make necessary disconnections where ordered by the Board.

The Military Police have been instructed to enforce the observance of these orders.

No military unit or personnel is entitled to the use of permanent current without the authority of the Electricity Control Board, RCAF Allied Area Command.

No electric elevators, cooling appliances, refrigerators, fans or other small electric power units will be used without special authority. All such appliances at present in use will be disconnected forthwith.

The following restrictions will apply to the actual consumption of electricity within billets and premises occupied by military personnel.

- a. One bulb (medium power) only will be in use in each bedroom, sitting room or anti-room.
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All applications for exemption will be submitted to the Chairman, Electricity Control Board, RCAF Allied Area Command.

Military units and personnel will allow entry to authorized agents of the Electricity Power Companies bearing a pass stamped by G-4 Section, RCAF Allied Area Command, to examine meters and make necessary disconnections where ordered by the Board.

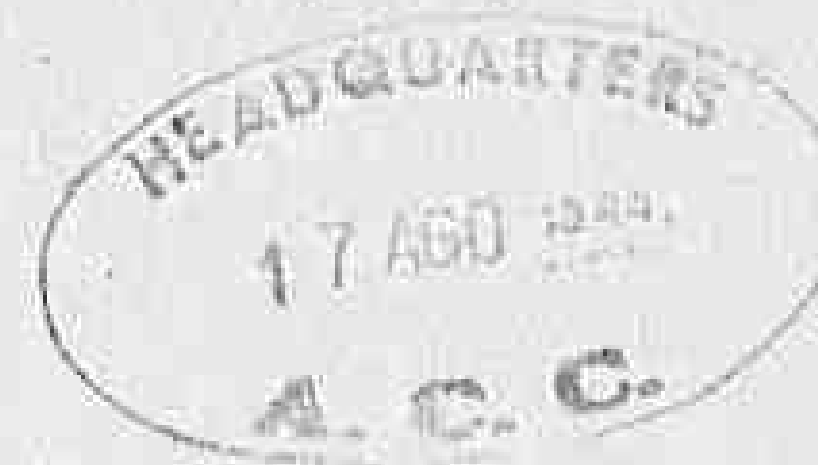

I - REQUISITIONING OF MOTOR VEHICLES

General

No motor vehicle will be requisitioned in Rome Allied Area Command without prior approval of the G-4 Section of this Headquarters.

Requests for approval to Requisition

Channels through which requests are to be placed will be as follows:-

a. Allied Control Commission

All requests will be screened by Allied Control Commission and passed to G-4 Section, Rome Allied Area Command, with the exception of requests from Rome Region and Region IV, which may be passed direct. G-4 will approve and requisition.

b. US Military Units

Requests will be made direct to G-4 Section, Rome Allied Area Command who will approve and requisition.

c. British Units

Requests will be made to Ordnance (British) who will screen and pass to G-4 (British) for approval. Actual requisition will be made by ADOS (British).

d. French Military Units

Requests will be screened by the French Liaison Office, Rome Allied Area Command, and passed to G-4 Section who will approve and requisition.

e. Italian Government Agencies and Italian Military Units

I - REQUISITIONING OF MOTOR VEHICLES

General

No motor vehicle will be requisitioned in Rome Allied Area Command without prior approval of the G-4 Section of this Headquarters.

Requests for approval to Requisition

Channels through which requests are to be placed will be as follows:-

a. Allied Control Commission

All requests will be screened by Allied Control Commission and passed to G-4 Section, Rome Allied Area Command, with the exception of requests from Rome Region and Region IV, which may be passed direct. G-4 will approve and requisition.

b. US Military Units

Requests will be made direct to G-4 Section, Rome Allied Area Command who will approve and requisition.

c. British Units

Requests will be made to Ordnance (British) who will screen and pass to G-4 (British) for approval. Actual requisition will be made by DOS (British).

a. French Military Units

Requests will be screened by the French Liaison Office, Rome Allied Area Command, and passed to G-4 Section who will approve and requisition.

c. Italian Government Agencies and Italian Military Units

Requests will be screened by Allied Control Commission and passed to G-4 Section who will approve.

All requests will be made in duplicate on forms supplied by G-4 Section, Rome Allied Area Command.

Supply of Spare Parts for Requisitioned Vehicles

Demands for spare parts for requisitioned vehicles will be made to It-col Carnes, Transportation Sub-Commission, Allied Control Commission.

Registration of Requisitioned Vehicles

- a. Vehicles requisitioned by Allied Control Commission will be given a registered number by Allied Control Commission and marked distinctively.
- b. Vehicles requisitioned by British units, including the Royal Air Force, will be given a registered number by ADOS (British), Rome Allied Area Command.
- c. Vehicles requisitioned by US, French, AFM, etc, will be given a registered number by G-4 Section, Rome Allied Area Command.

Supply of Requisitioned Vehicles

It should be clearly understood that approval for requisitioning does not constitute a promise to supply a requisitioned vehicle.

II - CIRCULATION OF CIVILIAN VEHICLES

No civilian vehicle will circulate in Rome with the exception of the following:-

- a. Vehicles bearing British War Department, Rome Allied Area Command or Allied Control Commission authorized registration numbers.
- b. Vehicles bearing official circulation permits issued by Allied Military Government or Allied Control Commission.
- c. Vehicles vested with Vatican or Corps Diplomatique immunity.
- d. Authorized vehicles of the Italian armed forces.
- e. Vehicles bearing special "protection" slips signed by the Commanding General, Rome Allied Area Command, granting immunity from requisition and freedom to circulate.

Vehicles not included in these categories will be stopped and impounded by the Military or Civil Police.

Civilian drivers of authorized vehicles will carry on authority to drive, signed by the competent employing Service.

NOTES: 1. Employees (civilian) or the Armed Forces are protected against industrial accidents by the Cassa d'Infortunati; prompt reports of accidents must be made to this agency by the employing officer.

2. Applications for the establishment of new classifications or changes of existing rates should be made in writing to the Labor Division for reference to higher authority. Applications for new classifications must include a complete job description of the position contemplated, proposed terms of employment and present salary and position.
