INTERNAL SECURITYGENERAL

1. The attention of all ranks is again drawn to the essential need for suspicious alertness at all times, particularly during the hours of darkness.
2. Recently, incidents of sabotage and attempted sabotage have occurred in which considerable amount of damage and personnel injury has been suffered by the Allied Forces.

INFORMATION

3. The possibility cannot be dismissed that similar attempts may be made in the Rome area. Incidents reported have included attempted arson of petrol installations and vehicles and of other installations, and the booby trapping of vehicles. All ranks must be warned of the danger that distance from the Fighting Front may generate a feeling of false security and of the constant risk to which lack of alertness will expose them.
4. Any Headquarters, dumps, "depots", administrative organisations and other military installations, where death and destruction can delay the Allied effort are liable to attack and sabotage.

PROCEDURE

5. All Units, Sub-Units and Detachments, irrespective of their role, will immediately ensure that unit internal security is maintained at the highest degree and that every individual is made clearly aware of the necessity to be alert and inquisitive of any incident, circumstance, and potential subversive activity which are not readily answered or which may appear to be suspicious, no matter how trivial.

FIRE PRECAUTIONS

6. All Units, Sub-Units and Detachments will ensure that fire-fighting measures are complete and available for immediate action at all times.
7. Equipment and appliances will be maintained at operational efficiency and personnel trained in their use.
8. The safeguard of equipment and appliances will be arranged in order that the sabotage of fire-fighting measures cannot be effected.

9. Immediate reports will be made, at any time during the 24 hours by the QUICKEST possible means, of all subversive actions, incidents, and suspected subversive activities, direct to:

10. The essential need for immediate reports is particularly stressed, for it is VITAL that prompt action be taken by each and every individual. Failure to comply with this order neutralises effective counter-action.

11. All ranks will be reminded at frequent intervals of their personal onus of responsibility for the maintenance of Security and their attention will be drawn by means of Unit Orders and talks of the necessity to be constantly aware of the dangers exposed by complacency and indifference, together with the unfortunate attitude that someone else, somewhere else, is responsible for the Security of Allied interests.

INTENTION

1. The de-restriction of a certain part of the Security Area at OSTIA LIDO will effect 3 Dec 44.
2. The return to the Italian Authorities of that part of the Security Area thus released by this Operations Memorandum.
3. The cancellation of Operations Memorandum No. 3 dated 22 July 44.

BOUNDARIES: SECURITY AREA

4. With effect 3 Dec 44 the boundaries of the Security Area at OSTIA LIDO will be amended as follows:

- a. NORTH Viale delle Galie - Viale Duca di Genova.
- b. EAST Viale Duca di Genova - Juno rd Route 8 - ROME.
- c. SOUTH Juno rd Route 8 - ROME - Sea at Viale della Marina.
- d. WEST Sea.

5. The area thus de-restricted is thereby released for such use as may be required by the Italian Authorities in conjunction with Allied Commission.

SECURITY AREA

6. The amended Security Area as given vide para 4 will ON NO ACCOUNT be entered for any purpose without the written authority of this Headquarters.
7. Houses, Villas, and all other premises within the Security Area WILL NOT be entered by Allied Military personnel, civilians or Italian Military personnel without the authority of this Headquarters (see para 6).

TENTS

8. Passes to enter this Area will be issued as hitherto before by G-3 Rome Area. Passes to enter or take over premises as outlined in para 7 will be issued by Per-1 Estate Rome Area.

9. G-2 will arrange for Notice Boards at present in position around perimeter of area as laid down in Operations Memorandum No. 3, para 3, to be re-erected by Det 1 S.A. L of C FSS as required on the new boundaries of the Security Area as laid down in para 4 above NOT LATER than 3 Dec 44.

9. G-2 will arrange for Notice Boards at present in position around perimeter of areas laid down in Operations Memorandum No. 3, para 3, to be re-erected by Det 1 SA L of C FSS as required on the new boundaries of the Security Area as laid down in para 4 above NOT LATER than 3 Dec 44.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR OFFICERS ACTING AS MILITARY
COMMANDERS IN CHARGE OF TROOPS EMPLOYED IN
AID OF THE CIVIL ORDER IN ITALIAN GOVERNMENT

TERRITORY

1. It may happen that cases will occur when the local Italian authorities may ask for the assistance of Allied Troops to quell civil disturbances.

2. If such a request is made the local commander will take no action unless he is satisfied that Allied lives or property are in danger or that assistance is necessary in order to protect Allied military interests. He will point this out to "whosoever makes this request, adding that the quelling of Italian riots and disturbances is a responsibility of the Italian Administration and that if he gives such assistance the territory in question will forthwith become an Allied Military Zone.

3. After receiving such a request the local commander will, if time permits, consult the local AC officer and seek instructions from his superior commander before giving assistance. In any event he will inform his superior commander of any request made to him and the action taken therewith without delay.

4. Within the limits of the City of Rome the only authority for ordering Troops to take action in aid of the Civil Power is HQ Rome Area Allied Command. Any requests for assistance will be referred by the quickest possible means to this Headquarters.

5. Within Rome Area Allied Command but outside the City limits, any officer who receives such a request for assistance will, if time and circumstances permit, similarly refer the request to this Headquarters. In the event of Emergency, however, when in the judgment of the Officer concerned circumstances do not admit of the delay involved in referring the matter to this Headquarters, he will act on his own initiative but will invariably report action taken at the earliest possible moment.

6. Firearms will only be employed when the Military Commander is of the opinion that loss of Allied lives or the destruction of valuable installations will result unless drastic measures are taken.

7. If firearms are used the following procedure will be adopted except in the case of the gravest emergency:



 - b. The actual firing will be done by a comparatively small number of soldiers selected for their training and marksmanship.
 - c. A limited number of rounds will be fired from each rifle and that number clearly stated before the order to fire is given.
 - d. The soldiers detailed to fire will if possible concentrate their aim on the ring-leaders or apparent ringleaders and will not fire indiscriminately into the crowd.
 - e. Shots will not be fired over the heads of the crowd, and blank rounds will not be fired.
 - f. Automatic weapons will not be used.
 - g. All precautions will be taken to prevent the shooting of women and children.
 - h. Firing will cease as soon as it becomes effective.

BLOCKOUT REGULATIONS

1. Effective the date of this order till observation of a complete "blockout" in Rome will have been discontinued, except during the current period, i.e. 2400 hours (midnight) to 0500 hours, or if an air raid "alarm" is sounded by the sirens, or if, although no alert has been sounded, an air raid is observed to be in progress by antiaircraft fire or the dropping of bombs or firing from aircraft.

2. The modified blackout conditions in effect between the hours of dusk and 2400 hours will be known as "dimout" and are defined as follows:

a. Buildings, tents, trains and vehicles used for accomodation.

(1) No source of light shall be directly visible from outside any building, tent, train or vehicle used for accomodation, subject to the following conditions:

(e) It is permissible for indirect or reflected light from within to be visible externally. Any such light will be screened at door or window by shutters or other means so as to be deflected downward at least 30 degrees from the horizontal.

(b) All precautions will be taken to prevent light being reflected upward.

(c) Skylights must be covered, as far as the blackout, so that no light whatsoever, direct or indirect, shall be visible from above.

b. Vehicle lights during "Dimouts" and Alerts.

(1) During "Dimout".

(a) All motor vehicle headlights may be fully operative (unshielded) - if fitted with a dimmer or cut-off switch.

(b) All headlamps will be adjusted so that the top or properly focused beams shall not project above the height of the lamp centers. Under no circumstances will the light beam project above the horizontal.

- (c) All sidelights may be fully operative.
- (d) Vehicles will be parked on the right hand side of the road only and facing normal direction. Headlights will be extinguished and tail lights where fitted with separate switch will be left on.
- (e) Animal driving vehicles will be tethered when stopped.

(2) During an Alert.

- (a) Headlights will be extinguished and a speed limit of 15 Km. per hour (10 miles per hour) will be observed in towns and cities within strategic points (strategic points include: (1) all areas within two miles of the coast; (2) all towns, military establishments and airfields).

- (b) Military and Civil Defense vehicles are authorized to use headlights if necessary in the discharge of an urgent anti operational duty. In such circumstances they are not bound by the speed limit imposed for other traffic.
- (c) Animal, drawing vehicles will be removed from the shafts and tethered.
- (d) Civil Defense and Fire-fighting vehicles, recognized by the marking UNPA (Union National Protection Antiair) inside one headlight, will be given the right of way.
3. Other external lighting.
- a. External lighting for installations of military importance may be authorized by the Area Commander, (provided that the Air Defense Commander and Anti-aircraft Defense Commander of the area are in agreement).
 - b. Provision must be made for immediate extinguishing of such external lighting in the event of an air raid or alert.
4. Action on "Alert". On the alert being sounded or if it becomes apparent that an air raid is in progress, complete blackout will be applied immediately.
5. Periodic tests will be carried out as follows:
- a. At a day appointed hour to be announced in advance the alert will be sounded by siren. All lights will immediately be extinguished or screened for complete blackout, i.e., no light will be permitted to remain visible outdoors.
 - b. Tests will normally last for ten minutes only, being ended by the all-clear sounded by siren. The time may be extended if agreed necessary by the military and civil authorities concerned, to a maximum of thirty minutes.
 - c. Tests will be held once per month or more frequently if the standard of blackout achieved is not satisfactory.
- d. During tests, patrols will note any lights not blacked out and take appropriate action authorized, reporting particulars without delay to the authorities concerned.
- e. Sirens on air raid warning be received during a test the alert will be sounded a second time.
6. Infringements.
- a. Disciplinary action will be taken against persons responsible by the service concerned.
- b. Civilian authorities have been requested to impose authorized penalties on civilian civil or military offenders, the maximum penalty to be inflicted for neglect of sky-lights.

- b. Zignition must be made for immediate extinguishing of such external lighting in the event of an air raid or alert.
4. Action on "Alert". On the alert being sounded or if it becomes apparent that an air raid is in progress, complete blackout will be applied immediately.

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c. Tests will be held once per month or more frequently if the satisfactory of blackout achieved is not satisfactory.

- d. During tests, patrols will note any lights not blacked out and take appropriate action authorized, reporting particulars without delay to the authorities concerned.

- e. Sirens in air raid warning be received during a test the alert will be sounded a second time.

6. Infractions.

7. Under no circumstances will a guard or any member of the allied Military Forces attempt to extinguish lights found showing during blackout ACC-DIST hours by any means.



2. Method and Organization.

a. P.A.D. Control.

b. In event of P.A.D. Control becoming inoperative, alternate Control Room will be: G-3, RAAC, Duplex 3.

3. Unit Control.

c. Units (U.S.) - Units and subunits (Br.), and other Allied units will detail an Officer, or where this is not possible, a senior C.O. to act as PAD and incident Officer in addition to his normal duties.

d. Duties of Unit PAD and incident Officers.

- (1) To establish control posts from which activities can be directed.
(2) To coordinate the work of Rescue Squads, Working Parties and Army and/or Civil Fire Brigade Leaders in attendance at an incident.
(3) To inform PAD Control of progress, additional assistance required and conclusion of incident.
(4) To report all local incidents to PAD Control.

4. Communications

a. Telephones:

- (1) PAD calls will be given priority during air raid alerts or other such emergencies.

b. Alternative measures:

- (1) In extreme emergency the Provost Marshal U.S. and P.L., British, will each provide two Motor Cyclist LP's to be made available to P.A.D. Control for use in case of break down of telephones.

c. Units will make full use of Motor Cyclists, runners or other means if telephone communications fail.

5. Fire Prevention.

a. Prevention of fire is a unit responsibility.

b. All sentries will have fire watching included in their orders.

SECRET

During an air raid units will endeavor to extinguish fires without calling Fire Brigade. The Senior Officer will decide whether Fire Brigade should be called.

d. All normal fires will be reported immediately to "PAD Control" or the Italian Fire Brigade will be called, pending the arrival of Army Fire Brigade services within the area.

- a. Units nearest to crashed military aircraft (Allied or enemy) will detail personnel to guard the wreckage until relieved by airforce personnel or by such other guards as arranged by the Commander of Rome Area Allied Command.

8. Unexploded Bombs, Mines, Booty Traps etc.

- 2. UXB (unexploded bombs) reports will be made to PAD Control in accordance with Appendix 'A'.

b. U.S.... Engineers and British Army BD (Bomb Disposal) Sections are responsible for the clearance of all UXB's in Rome Allied Area Command, except:

- (1) The Royal Navy is responsible for disposing of:
 - (a) UXB in ships or below high water mark.
 - (b) Anti-ships mines and circling torpedoes.
 - (c) Any other purely naval devices which may be found ashore.

- (2) The Royal Air Force is responsible for providing trained personnel to assist British Army BD Section to dispose of Allied Bombs.

9. War Gases.

- a. In the event of suspected gas attack, units will immediately inform PAD Controller.
- b. If gas is reported, normal antigas routine will be carried out.
- c. Decontamination of personnel, stores, vehicles, etc is unit responsibility.
- d. Contaminated areas will be clearly marked or reported.

10. Protection of Personnel

Unit Commanders are responsible for issue of orders for sheltering of personnel.

11. Air Raid Warnings.

Town Sirens, guns opening fire or bombs dropping, which ever is the earliest.

12. Routine.

- a. At 1830 hours DAILY units providing services as stated will report state of readiness of squads and vehicles to PAD Control.

- b. PAD Control will be manned continuously during 24 hrs.
