AWARD OF THE SOLDIER'S MEDAL

By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, as amended, the Soldier's Medal was awarded to the following named individual:

ROBERT G. WILSON, 36876792, Technician Fifth Grade, 3197 Signal Service Company, for heroism at Lago De Vico, Italy on 27 July 1945. Upon hearing a cry for help from a soldier who was floundering in water over his head, and who was about three hundred (300) yards from shore, Technician Fifth Grade Wilson, with utter disregard for his own safety, proceeded to swim the three hundred (300) yards to the rescue. The drowning soldier, Staff Sergeant Berceich, was fatigued and distressed to such a degree that he was unable to head any closer toward shore or toward a boat which, because of a strong wind that suddenly came up, could not be maneuvered by an Italian civilian and began to drift aimlessly away. Technician Fifth Grade Wilson pushed the boat closer to the drowning soldier, pulled him into the boat, brought him to shore and applied artificial respiration. The heroism displayed by Technician Fifth Grade Wilson at the risk of his own life, reflects great credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of the United States. DEATH OF THE COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF

1. It is the sad duty of the Commanding General, Rome Area MTOUSA, to announce to troops of this Command the untimely death of Franklin Delano Roosevelt, President of the United States of America.
2. The grief and loss we Americans feel in the passing of this great American leader becomes a sorrow common to all our Allies. The commanders of Allied forces and missions have kindly called or sent messages of condolences which give positive evidence of the solidarity of our alliance and the depth of friendship which exists between the representatives of the United Nations.
3. The evidences of true friendship and solicitude on the part of the Italian Government as evidenced by the marks of consideration and deep respect which have been accorded us, binds more closely the Italian and American peoples. Such demonstrations prove the true character of the Italian people and their appreciation of a great American figure who was ever a friend of democratic Italy.
4. Memorial services in honor of our late President will be held in St. Paul's Church on 15 April 1945 at 1100 hours.
5. All U.S. national flags will be displayed at half-mast for 30 days beginning at 0800 hours, 13 April 1945.
6. This order will be read to all units of this command on 14 April 1945.
