I. MILITARY COURTESY AND DISCIPLINE:

The following is extracted from MTOUSA letter AG 420/918 CG-O, Subject: "Military Courtesy and Discipline", dated 29 November 1945:

"There is a marked laxity on the part of U.S. Officers and enlisted personnel throughout MTOUSA in observing the basic principles of military courtesy and discipline. Saluting is far from the standards prescribed, and discrepancies range from carelessness and improper execution to complete failure to render the salute. Improper wearing of the uniform is common. Unbuttoned jackets, wearing of torn or dirty articles of uniform, improper wearing of or failure to wear the proper headgear, dirty and tarnished insignia, unpolished boots and shoes, and unbuttoned pockets are frequently observed offences. Such derelictions are inexcusable and are a reflection upon the Army of the United States. The appearance and behaviour of our officers and enlisted men in foreign lands make an impression upon the inhabitants by which they will judge our nation. Vigorous action will immediately be taken to correct present conditions, and the proper standards of military courtesy and discipline will be maintained. Laxity will not be tolerated."

II. REDUCTION IN LONG DISTANCE TRAFFIC:

It is imperative that use of the military long distance telephone lines be curtailed. Reduction of personnel and in the number of available circuits requires a great reduction in traffic. Long distance telephone calls therefore must be kept to a minimum limited to only those calls which are absolutely necessary. Military circuits are monitored to detect and report unnecessary calls and calls of a purely personal nature. Compliance with the above is necessary to permit satisfactory service on the military circuits.

I. ROAD BLOCKS - HALTING AT:

No. 2 District RO 118/45 is republished.

(a) In order to check the increasing number of robberies and incidents of violence occurring within the District the Italian Police are instituting a number of road blocks. These road blocks may be imposed anywhere, and in order that all drivers of WD vehicles should easily recognise these road blocks they will take the following design. (Shown diagrammatically in Appx "A" hereto)

On each side of the block and at a distance of approximately 100 yards will be placed boards,

The boards will be painted white or yellow and will clearly show in black letters both in English and Italian the words "STOP POLICE ROADCHECK".

Whenever possible 40 gallon petrol drums painted white will be used to form the block.

They will be manned by Italian Police.

During the hours of darkness the road blocks will be adequately illuminated to ensure that drivers can see that

- (i) they are required to stop.
- (ii) it is the police who require them to stop.

(b) All drivers will be warned that these blocks are liable to be met at any time and it is their duty to assist the Italian Police by halting when signalled or called on to do so and, if required, by establishing their identity. The inconvenience and delay will be accepted with good grace as the British contribution in assisting the Italian Police in this important work.

II. SKID CHAINS:

(a) Skid chains will be used when ice or snow conditions make them essential. They will NOT be used merely to avoid the necessity for careful driving e.g. on dry, damp or muddy roads, as this causes unnecessary wear both to tyres and ~~road~~ ~~road~~ surface.

(b) Arrangements are being made for the erection of movable notices on ice-bound roads stating "PUT CHAINS ON HERE" - "TAKE CHAINS OFF HERE".

It is requested that drivers comply with these orders

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- (i) they are required to stop.
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- (b) Arrangements are being made for the erection of moveable notices on ice-bound roads stating "PUT CHAINS ON HERE" - "TAKE CHAINS OFF HERE".
- (c) Road checks are to be made to ensure that drivers comply with these orders and that skid chains are NOT used when they are not necessary.
- (d) To be repeated in Unit Orders monthly. (59 Area)



The following is an extract from a memorandum dated 3 December 1945, received from GHQ CMF, subject "Message Writing":

"The standard of message writing by British originators has deteriorated considerably during the last few months. The main faults are verbosity, unjustifiable high priorities and incorrect security classification. The over-all result of the above practises is to reduce the efficiency of the service for all users, including those who originate messages in the correct manner.

"With a view to effecting an improvement, CSO CMF is being instructed to provide scrutineers who will examine messages originated in GHQ CMF or the British elements of integrated sections of AFHQ and also those originated in other HQs and passed to GHQ CMF for retransmission. All such messages which are challenged by the scrutineers will be recorded and bad cases will be referred to heads of departments for necessary action. In the case of incoming messages a report on messages which merit comment will be forwarded periodically through Signals channel to the originating HQ. The scrutineers will be given strict instructions on no account to delay the transmission of messages".

d. Form of Applications: US Standard Form 5, which may be obtained from the office indicated below or from the headquarters of major commands. All applicants will fully state their work experience attained prior to military service. In the case of enlisted personnel particular care will be taken to describe duties and abilities involving responsibilities above those usually associated with enlisted grades.

e. Time of Making Application: As early as possible. Individuals cannot be hired as civilians until finally separated from the service, but earlier application, if accepted, will permit employment as a civilian directly upon separation.

f. Channels for Application: From the applicant to the Civilian Personnel Officer of the major command to which his unit is assigned. Accompanying it in memorandum form will be the applicant's sick record, assignment record, character and efficiency ratings, together with any additional comments which his immediate commanding officer may think appropriate.

g. Hiring: By the major commands, from the best qualified of the applicants whose applications are on file with them, and to the extent that position vacancies exist.

h. Salary: A basic rate per annum as specified for the position by the Federal Employees Pay Act of 1945, plus overseas allowance of 25% of basic pay, plus overtime. Salary is payable in 13 equal installments a year.

i. Overtime: Payable for all time over 40 hours weekly (but not in excess of 8 hours per week) at the rate of time and one-half on the portion of any salary exceeding \$ 2,980 per annum, and at lesser graduated rates on the portion of any salary above that figure.

j. Length of Service: One year minimum unless the applicant is sooner released for the convenience of the Government.

k. Annual Leave: 26 days per year, granted during the year if employing service consents - if not, available at termination of employment.

l. Sick Leave: As required but not exceeding 15 days per year with pay. Medical, dental and hospital care furnished by the Government without charge.

j. Length of Service: One year minimum unless the applicant is sooner released for the convenience of the Government.

k. Annual Leave: 26 days per year, granted during the year if employing service consents - if not, available at termination of employment.

l. Sick Leave: As required but not exceeding 15 days per year with pay.

Medical, dental and hospital care furnished by the Government without charge.

m. Workmen's compensation provided in accordance with US Employees Compensation Law.

n. Billets and Meals: Furnished by the Government in places designated by the Government, at cost to employees of \$ 13 per month for room by payroll deduction (or \$ 8 per month if two persons in room), and \$.75 per day for food, plus any mess service charge. These rates are subject to change.

o. Place of Work: At any point or points in the theater, and with any command, as the Government may designate.

p. Miscellaneous Facilities: Including PX, Post Theaters, rest camps, etc., will generally be open to civilian employees. Local rules may vary somewhat.

q. Transportation to the States: At termination of employment will be furnished by the Government as far as Port of Debarkation in the US (Travel allowance from Port of Debarkation to point of enlistment is provided at time of discharge). Travel to US will be free unless employee was discharged for cause or quit without consent of employing service before his term was up. In either such case he will pay for return trip himself.

r. No Contract: No contract is given to War Department civilian employees.
