SUMMARY OF NEWS - SUNDAY - 5 DECEMBER 1943

RUSSIA.

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No developments are reported in the KIW bulge, but above the bulge our Allies have flung back many German counter-attacks. West and South-West of KREMENCHUK the enemy has been dislodged from several strong points.

Soviet guerilla troops in the Crimea and behind the German lines at 0700 other parts of the front are playing a useful part in hampering enemy movements, and often receive supplies from Russian aircraft which land behind the German positions.

PACIFIC.

Allied aircraft have made a heavy raid on CAPE GLOUCESTER in New Britain. The whole area of this Japanese base was blasted and burnt.

Enemy shipping continues to receive attention from our aircraft, whilst one patrol shot down 4 Japanese planes without loss to themselves.

Australian land operations are progressing satisfactorily.

In CHANG-KAY in central China street fighting is still in progress.

GERMANY.

Great fires were still sweeping across the German city of LEIPZIG more than 12 hours after RAF bombers had dropped over 1500 tons of high-explosives and incendiary bombs on it on Friday night. Reconnaissance pilots flying over the city yesterday afternoon reported that the fires appeared to be out of control, and were visible over 250 miles away. The Germans themselves admit great destruction in the city.

It is quite evident that the Germans thought BERLIN was to be the target again on Friday night. The first waves of our planes flew straight towards the German capital and drew the enemy fighter cover towards the city. Mosquitoes carried out the diversion, and our heavy bombers following switched over to LEIPZIG. Over 100 miles of sky outside BERLIN was illuminated by fighter flares in preparation for the attack which did not materialise. By the time the Germans realised what was happening and moved their fighters over to the LEIPZIG area, most of our bombers had dropped their loads on the target.

We lost 23 machines during the night's operations, whilst several German fighters were shot down on the way to BERLIN.

RAF Typhoons over HOLLAND yesterday shot down 11 out of 14 enemy machines which attempted to intercept them.

ITALY.

General Montgomery's campaign is bringing the Eighth Army through the German defences in the East just as the Fifth is beginning to smash their way on the West. There is no detailed news available, but it is reported that progress is satisfactory.

Italians in LANGRANO welcomed the Eighth Army troops on their entry of the town the other day.

CONFERENCE.

The whole world is awaiting an official statement following the meeting of President Roosevelt, Marshal Stalin and Mr. Churchill, Moscow states the meeting, is the main topic of conversation in Russia. All Sunday papers at home give it big headlines.

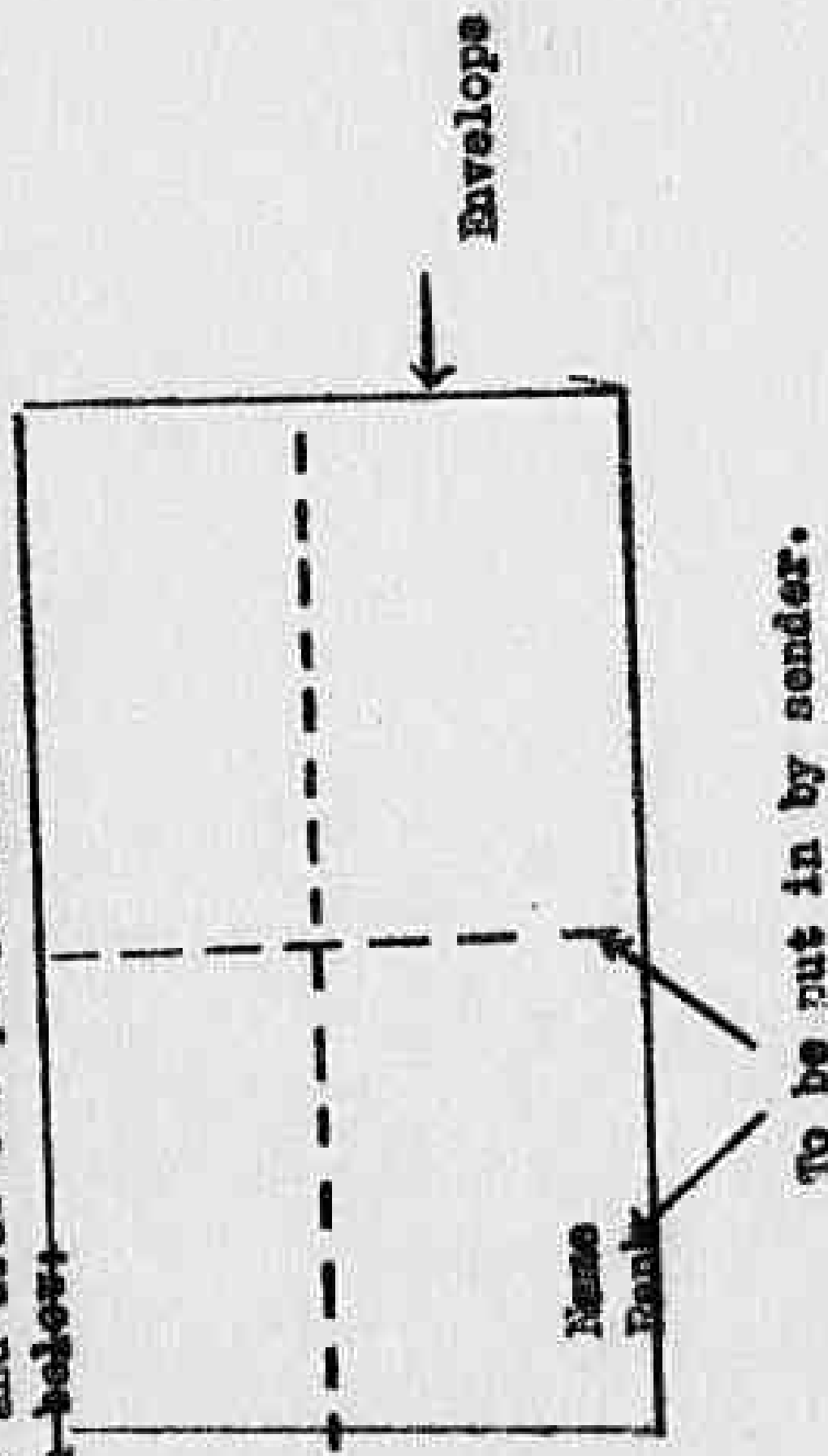

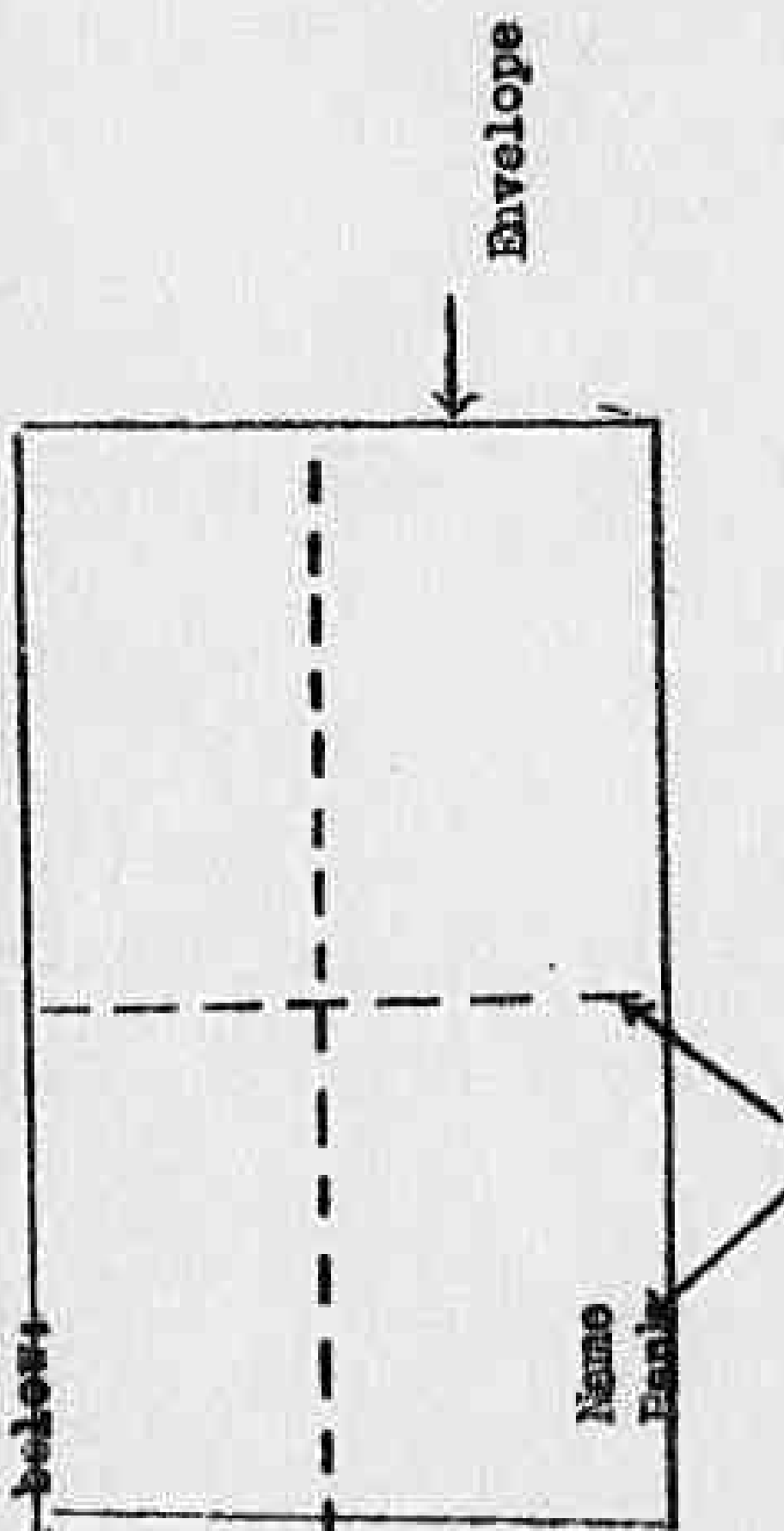

ITALY

Highway Army is on the offensive again - a new attack has been launched from the Sangro bridgehead and several points vital to the enemy have been taken. The new attack was preceded by an "ALLIED" artillery barrage and hundreds of Allied aircraft bombed the German positions - all previous German conceptions of a "salute" were put in the shade. The enemy put up a fierce and resourceful resistance - using tank flame-throwers with some early success, but our guns soon got their range. The Luftwaffe has also been very active, but - THE ALLIED GROUND ARMY.

RUSSIA

The Red Army is still meeting with success all along the line. N. of CORREL they are only 12 miles from LORAIN - an important rail junction which is crisscrossed with German trucks and equipment. In the KUBANSK area progress is still being made. The enemy is still attacking the KIEV bulge, but the Red Army is "stone-walling" and the Germans have not gained an inch of ground for days.

ENGLAND

American Liberators attacked BARNBY again last night - it was a very heavy raid - 13 bombers were lost and 35 enemy planes were shot down.

The R.A.F. attacked targets in N. Germany and occupied territories.

Australians are making good progress in New Guinea.

RUSSIA.

The Red Army still advances all along the line. In the CORREL area they are now threatening to outflank the main German defence line in White Russia. Pierce fighting is raging in the ILLW bulge, where the Russians continue to hold the German counter-attacks.

The Germans claim to have re-taken KOSTOMER JUNCTION, but Russians report fierce fighting in this area and that the German counter-attacks have failed. The German atrocities in KIV during the 2 years of its occupation exceeded all previous deeds committed by them. Of a population of 1,000,000 only about 50,000 remain. 70,000 Jews were assembled at a ravine and mown down by machine guns. The retreating Germans tried to hide this and made prisoners dig up the dead and burn them in incinerators.

ITALY.

The Eighth Army bridgehead North of the SAMERO has been enlarged. The weather has improved and some lively exchanges are taking place.

The Germans in the hills to the North are reported to be "jumpy" and observers say that MONTGOMERY'S threat to deal them a "COLOSSAL BLOW" has caused much nervousness.

FAR EAST

Lively air activity in the SOLOMONS. RUKA was heavily raided by American bombers, a Japanese Cruiser was hit by a 1,000 lb bomb.

The Japs are meeting fierce resistance in Central China.

ENGLAND

A chain of airfields now stretches across England - they have cost approximately \$615,000,000 and are mostly for the R.A.F. although Americans occupy about one fifth.

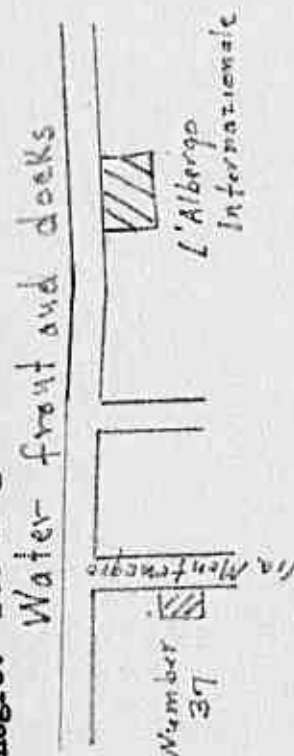

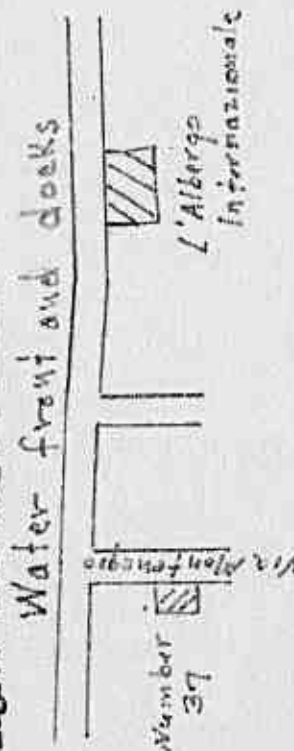

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RUSSIA

The Russians are now driving on and are 20 miles SW of Kiev. It is apparent that the Germans were savagely mauled in the assault on the city, whose capture comes as a fitting part of today's celebrations. 50 more towns and villages have been captured. Kiev, the ancient Capital of Moscow, has always had high place in the affections of the Russians. A great threat to the Germans in the south is now imminent. On other sectors - the first Russian reports have been made of the operations on the Kirch Peninsular although the Germans mentioned fighting in this area some days ago. With Air and Sea support Soviet troops made a landing near Kirch and are now fighting on the outskirts. Another landing was made 10 miles north of Kirch. First place is given in the world press to Marshal Stalin's review of the war. He gives impressive figures of German losses during the last war - 2/3 of the territory lost has been captured and 4 million German troops put out of action. "Hitler has run Germany into a dead end".

ITALY

The Fifth Army has occupied the heights around Mignano and some troops have by-passed the town, which is a key point to the German defense scheme and dominates the main route. The Germans were pushed back quickly behind the Garigliano River and they had to leave some very valuable equipment and had no time for demolition. The flooding of the Garigliano plains was not properly carried out and found not as serious as expected. The Germans are at a great disadvantage across this river as their main arterial road runs along the river bank and is within mortar range of Allied troops. Further inland our troops have pushed forward NE of Isernia on the Adriatic coast. One of General Montgomery's spearheads is up to Vasto, the most northerly point yet reached by our forces.

RAF

RAF and Dominion Aircraft yesterday carried out widespread attacks in France - locomotives, oil tanks in Brittany and railway yards at Rouen. London had a short alert and bombs were dropped there, and in England and S. Anglia. 3 enemy raiders were destroyed. Air Chief Marshal Harrieves stated that we have a list of 100 German war places which we have planned to wipe out. He estimates that for each bomb dropped on Germany the lives of 10 Allied soldiers will be saved.

although the Germans mentioned fighting in this area. Air and Sea support Soviet troops made a landing near Kirch and are now fighting on the outskirts. Another landing was made 10 miles north of Kirch. First place is given in the world press to Marshal Stalin's review of the war. He gives impressive figures of German losses during the last war - 2/3 of the territory lost has been captured and 4 million German troops put out of action. "Hitler has run Germany into a dead end".
