OFFICIAL

1. DESPATCH LETTER SERVICE:

Despatch Letter Services are provided for urgent and/or secret packets only. They are not intended to be used for the despatch of ordinary non-secret official mail, which should be despatched via the APO.

Despatch Letter Offices are being flooded with large amounts of non-urgent and non-secret mails resulting in delays to urgent and secret operational packets.

All Formations and Units will in future only send by DLS those packets which by reason of their urgency and/or security classification it is essential should be under escort throughout despatch. Similarly, only packets for which a receipt is required will be sent as "Registered Packets".

Originators are responsible for endorsing registered packets with the following, in addition to the address:

- a. A coloured pencil cross made over the entire face of the packet.
- b. A reference (file) number.
- c. The signature and organization of an officer.

Unauthorized abbreviations will not be used. Originators should wherever possible avoid the use of abbreviations in addresses. Hundreds of packets are delayed daily because they are insufficiently addressed

Examples of incorrect use of abbreviations which are often met are:

FB - for Fire Brigade, Field Bakery and Field Butchery.
W/T or WT - for Wireless, Water Tank and Weapon Training.

2. HANDLING OF PHOTOGRAPHIC MATERIAL

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2. HANDLING OF PHOTOGRAPHIC MATERIAL

Photographic material exposed by amateur photographers will be disposed of in accordance with the following instructions:

a. Black and white film (still pictures) will be handled through the Army Exchange Service as follows:

(1) Army Exchange Service will receive exposed film from military personnel and have it processed at civilian laboratories approved by the Base Section
(2) After processing, film will be censored by Chief Base Censor, and then forwarded to addressee designated by soldier.

b. Color film and motion picture film, in which the cost of processing is included in the original cost of the film, will be forwarded direct to the Chief Base Censor for handling and disposition, and will not be handled through Army Exchange Service. Such film will have attached thereto, name and address of addressee in the United States to whom processed film will be sent. Processed film of this class will not be returned to addressee in this theater by processing agency.

c. Undeveloped exposed film will not be sent out of this theater in personal mail except as in b. above.

d. All negatives and prints not passed by the censor will become the property of the United States Government and will be disposed of as directed by the War Department, Washington, D.C., or by the Theater Commander.

OFFICIAL

1. FOOD - LOCAL SUPPLIES AND PURCHASE

a. Owing to the shortage of foodstuffs available in ITALY for the civil population and the necessity for reducing to a minimum the shipping tonnages required for imports into ITALY on civil account, all purchases of foodstuffs are forbidden with the following exceptions:

(1) Those made by the official purchasing agencies of the Allied Services.

(2) The purchase of such fruit and vegetables by units and individuals as may be declared surplus from time to time by the Allied Local Resources (Italian) board and released for sale to the Allied Forces.

b. Declared Surpluses under a.(2) above will be advertised in the UNION JACK, STARS AND STRIPES and Official Orders.

c. It will be brought to the notice of all ranks by means of repetition in Unit Orders that purchase or procurement of the items specifically numbered below is prohibited except as a. (1) above.

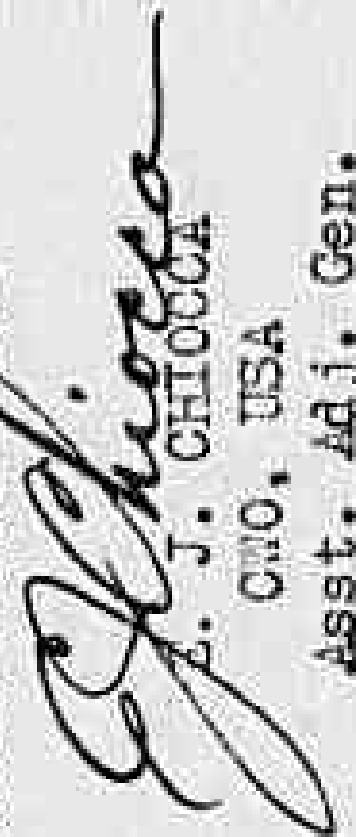
