8. FULL DAY HOLIDAY PER WEEK:

Effective 15 July 1944, all personnel of this headquarters will take one full day off per week. Each chief of staff section and sub-commission will insure that every officer and EN/EN has a free day each week and that sufficient working force is on duty daily (including Sunday). (EX O)

APPENDIX "A"

REQUISITIONED CIVILIAN VEHICLES

1. All requisitioned civilian vehicles which have been or are being held by officers and personnel of ACC including all sub-commissions, will report to the ACC Headquarters Garage (super garage), Plaza Verdi, before 12 July 1944 for purpose of:

- a. Completing the requisition record.
- b. placing of proper markings on car, including the ACC windshield sticker.
- c. inspection and servicing; greasing, oil change, washing, etc.
- d. Assignment of parking stall.

2. All requisitioned vehicles, except those specifically authorized in writing by Executive Officer, ACC, will be kept in the ACC Headquarters Garage when not in actual use. No vehicle will be taken from the garage without a trip ticket issued by the pool dispatcher at garage. The signed trip ticket will be returned to the dispatcher when the vehicle is returned to the garage. The checker at the gate will record the time when each vehicle leaves and returns to the garage. The speedometer reading will be entered on the ticket by the dispatcher.

3. Every vehicle will remain in the garage 1/2 day each week for servicing, greasing, washing, etc. A schedule showing the time when each vehicle will be in the garage for servicing will be posted on the bulletin board. Those responsible for use of a vehicle will see that this requirement is complied with.

4. Fuel and lubricant for operation of vehicles will be issued from the ACC garage for ACC used vehicles only. The person driving the car will sign a receipt for the fuel and oil issued. Fuel and oil for other than ACC used cars will be issued only upon written order of Hq. Commandant.

5. The control of the use of all vehicles will be through the Hq. Commandant and his dispatcher at ACC Hq. office building.

- A. Full time and exclusive use of cars will be only upon the written order of Executive Officer, ACC.
- B. Regular daily assignments and special trip usage will be made by Hq. Commandant's dispatcher upon instructions from Hq. Commandant. Officers and sub-commissions of ACC requiring the services of a vehicle will contact the transportation dispatcher in office off left side of main rotunda ACC Headquarters Building, street level, phone ext. 210. Except for emergency requirements, the request will be in the dispatcher's office 24 hours in advance of the time required, as allocations are made at 1600 hours daily for following days use. If a vehicle is available it will be sent ¹⁴⁴to place and at the time required. ¹⁴⁴Special instructions ¹⁴⁴drivers may be given directly through the garage office, phone 841324, for assigned vehicles.

5. officers will inform vehicle driver of the waiting time required during any mission. If longer than one (1) hour, the vehicle will be returned to Hq. garage for other use with instructions to return at a designated time for completion of the mission. Upon return of vehicle at designated time, driver will wait not more than 15 minutes for resumption of the mission of the trip ticket. If the use is not resumed within the 15 minutes, the driver will return to Hq. garage pool for further assignment.
