It has been brought to the attention of this Headquarters that in recent weeks originators of outgoing cables have been considerably abusing the precedence classifications "Urgent" and "Operational Priority". It is pointed out that this Headquarters is largely administrative and that no cable originating at this Headquarters should be given a precedence higher than "Priority" unless it directly concerns operations or administration of vital importance to the combined effort of the Allied Nations.
