ARMAMENT FOR P.38 AIRCRAFT.

Further to conversations between Col. CIGERZA and representatives of the Air Forces Sub-Commission on the above subject, the following points are brought to your attention.

2. (a) The 3 x 20 mm Hispano guns will give a greater fire power with better performance at long ranges, especially against thinly armoured vehicles.
- (b) Also, there is the advantage in this case of the whole aircraft armament being of the same type.
3. In favour of the 1 x 20 mm. Hispano and 4 x 50 Browning guns, it may be said that it would probably be a much easier job to re-fit the aircraft to take the armament for which it was originally designed, rather than to fit an entirely new installation. It is considered that on the whole the original installation is preferable.
4. If the 3 x 20 mm. Hispano gun installation is adopted, care should be taken to ensure that the aircraft C of G is not displaced beyond the limits laid down for the Lightning.

Reference is made to your letter AFSC/58/AIR dated 21st May, 1946.

2. There are points in favour of both armament lay-outs.

ARMAMENT FOR P.38 AIRCRAFT

-- Referring to conversation between Colonel Gasperi and Group Captain Jarman it is confirmed that permission is given to modify one P.38 aircraft with three (3) 20mm. British cannon in the nose in place of the normal equipment of one (1) cannon and four (4) 0.5" machine guns.

2. Overall permission to modify all the P.38 aircraft will depend upon :

- (a) D.A.F.'s report on the effectiveness of the proposed armament.
- (b) Any engineering difficulties taking into consideration the storage of ammunition and the possibility of an alteration to the centre of gravity of the aircraft.
- (c) Whether the cannons and ammunition necessary will be available from British sources.

3. A report should be rendered to this Headquarters when the modification is complete and has been tested.

ARMAMENT FOR P.38 ("LIGHTNING") AIRCRAFT.  
ITALIAN AIR FORCE.

The Italian Air Force has been issued with American "Lightning" aircraft mainly fitted for photography.

2. They propose to use these as day fighters and for ground strafing and to do so they must modify and stress the nose of the aircraft to take the guns.

3. To standardise their armament as much as possible they have asked to fit three (3) British 20mm. cannons instead of the normal American equipment of one (1) 20mm. cannon and four (4) 0.5" machine guns.

4. Would you, from your knowledge of fighter requirements give your views on this change of lay-out, whether it is to be preferred from the point of fire power, and accuracy and whether you would recommend it.
