1. The following are the impressions obtained during the meeting after AVM Brodie and Brig. General Lee had left.

2. (See paras. 2-10 Flt/Off Legats' notes). During the discussion of subjects "A and B" on the agenda, every effort was made to place before the meeting the disastrous point at which the IAF had arrived. The various difficulties reported by the Regional Commanders, e.g., effect on moral of discrimination, lack of financial assistance for reconstruction, the fact that though the IAF was nominally 30,000 strong they had still to administer their pre-armistice personnel to the total of 250,000, were answered by General Ajmone-Cat and his Air Ministry Director Generals by means of a prayer for patience because they fully understood the difficulties but were absolutely incapable of performing the necessary miracles to improve matters which are in perfect keeping with the Italian internal situation.

3. Coupled with the prayer for patience was the request for 100% efficiency, discipline, and honesty in the hope that the IAF could justify its existence to the Italian Government and people.

4. General Ajmone-Cat also quoted the ridiculous state of affairs whereby he himself earns 21,000 lire per month, his lieutenant 11,000, but the civilian porter at the main entrance to the IAM earns 16,000. Col. Girando (1 ZAT Milan) pointed out how dangerous this state of affairs was when everybody was tempted to supplement their incomes by rather dubious means, especially when a junior officer is posted and has to keep a home going on his miserable pittance (see Flt/Off Legats' report, para. 7).

5. The pay problem was agreed to be most serious and though no increases could be made recommendations were made to General Pellacci (Director of Service) and General Agnesi (in Personnel/Postings) to make every effort to cut down unnecessary transfers of personnel and where they were unavoidable if possible to place service transport on repayment at the disposal of personnel (N.B. at civilian rates it would cost some 500,000 lire for an officer to remove his wife, family, and furniture from Milan

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to Rome ((see also Flt/Off Legats' report para 819)).

6. General Pellacci said that everything possible would be done in this direction, but that the shortages of petrol and transport did not permit assistance to be rendered every time.

7. (See para. 11 and 13 Flt/Off Legats' report). General Ajmone-Cat stated most firmly that he was absolutely against direct control by the IAM of units (ZAT Commanders Areas, i.e. salvage units, etc.). General Pellacci stated equally firmly that he wished to retain control.

8. General Ajmone-Cat was forced to bring this discussion to a belated end and the meeting was definitely in favor of the responsibility and control being given to the ZAT Commanders.

9. The discussions were carried out in most satisfactory manner with little acrimony (except when General Pellacci endeavored to retain control of this salvage empire). Everyone seemed to be ready to face the almost unsurmountable difficulties in good humour and the wish to cooperate was apparent in both Regional Commanders and Civil Ministry Heads of Departments.

10. It is difficult to be convinced that the meeting will serve any useful purpose other than being (a) a useful interchange of ideas between IAM heads of departments and the Regional Commanders, and (b) a safety valve for very harassed generals who find themselves with very difficult jobs to do and no means to do them.

11. It is a pity, even though the meeting had no powers to take action, that a vote or decision was not taken on specific proposals rather than the CAS closing the discussion on each subject with a short speech giving his own views.

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Appendix 'A'Matters discussed at the Meeting of Unit Commanders at Italian Air Ministry on 23.3.46.

1. C.A.S. opened the conference by recalling similar meetings of Unit Commanders which used to be held regularly and which will be particularly useful in the present circumstances in order to give Officers an opportunity of airing their difficulties and generally getting the innumerable worries with which they are at present having to deal, off their chests.
2. Most things which are going wrong are due to the present national situation and not to the organisation of the Aeronautica itself.

Personnel and Discrimination.

3. General Raffaelli (Pagus) said that the personnel situation has improved but there are still moral and material worries. Discrimination and Epuration are causing a good deal of bitterness. Many people who received light sentences are still employed but are under constant fear of dismissal. This means that there is unrest for instance between personnel of equal rank but with different disciplinary records. Bad characters who are not employed are attacking those who are still employed but have not been fully discriminated. Many people at the time of the armistice had no opportunity of showing their capabilities because of the locality they happened to be in at the time and therefore it is very difficult to judge which are the best elements. There are undoubtedly a great many very good men who served with the Republic and have therefore been irremediably lost.
4. It is necessary to give a feeling of security to those who are good characters by letting them know as far as possible what their position will be in the near future. To this end Commissions for selection of personnel should start as soon as possible.
5. C.A.S. pointed out that the Discrimination Law is a state law which has never been properly applied. For instance an officer can be judged by a commission composed of Officers junior in rank to him.

Pay.

6. Although improvements to pay can be proposed by Air Ministry they have to be approved by the Government. So far everything possible has been done at the Air Ministry and without the least possibility of the uncertainty of the future and the precarious

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Results of Low Level of Pay.

7. There is a general lack of enthusiasm. Technical personnel and good junior officers have found better paid jobs as civilians. In many cases a posting almost results in tragedy as it takes considerable time to get a family sufficiently organised in one place to make a totally inadequate income stretch as far as possible.

8. Owing to the extraordinary cost of transport it is often necessary to suspend postings because of lack of funds. The cost of transporting a family from Padua to Rome area is estimated at 500,000 Lire.

9. This high cost of living also explains the delay which we often find in carrying out plans for courses, transfers etc.

C.A.R.'s (Personnel Dispersal Centres).

10. There is an enormous amount of work to be done with this personnel which includes all prisoners of war who have still to return and be processed. C.O.'s were requested by C.A.S. to deal as sympathetically as possible with these people and not to turn them away without listening to their story even though practical assistance could not be given.

Equipment.

11. There was a long discussion on the necessity for decentralising departments, particularly Equipment. C.A.S. was convinced that Regional Commanders should be in charge of all services in their area. As General Officers they ought to be capable of attending to all problems and it was inadmissible that certain departments in the provinces should be allowed to themselves. When this happened there was no effective control from either end. The Equipment Officer (Gen. Fellacci) appeared to be the only one to disagree with this.

12. Gen. Fellacci also stated that his budget had been cut down from the 1,000,000,000 requested, to 200,000,000 Lire.

Salvage of Material.

13. Gen. DONSO (Sardina) referred to the difficulty of salvaging and guarding materiel due to lack of personnel, transport, workshops and funds. A great many people were employed on work which had no bearing on the future of the aeronautics such as the guarding and administering of materiel which would never be of any use. This they were obliged to do by law although the materiel was deteriorating, being stolen or was not worth the cost of transport to another locality for processing. Also certain airfields had to be maintained in the condition in which they had been handed over.

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Appendix 'B'

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Matters discussed at the meeting of Unit Commanders at I.A.M. on 25th March 1946.

1. Gen. Gaeta spoke of the necessity for the dismissal of inefficient personnel. Commanding Officers are inclined to be too lenient because of the present situation. Proper assessments should be given on personal reports.
2. The question of cancelling or delaying postings due to individual economic circumstances was again discussed. In order to avoid abuses it was suggested that a "means test" should be carried out by the Carabinieri and Questura in these cases.
3. There was widespread use of the system of recommendations, especially from political sources, which they were powerless to resist. The severest measures should be taken against these Fascist practices.
4. Personnel, particularly N.C.O.'s, from the north of Italy, who had served for 5 or 6 years during the war, should now be rewarded by postings near their families.
5. Col. Remondino pointed out that severity should be applied but with discretion on account of the national situation.
6. Col. Remondino asked the Allies to give warning before handing over airfields in order to avoid a period of abeyance which at present results in the thieving and destruction of airfield equipment.
7. Gen. Raffaelli proposed the formation of flying sections with small touring aircraft. This would improve and maintain morale with the minimum of flying activity. At present this was not practicable due to lack of material and funds.
8. Col. Girardo (Milan) referred to the difficulties of restoring and maintaining discipline when barrack accommodation was not available for all and when even Officers possessed no standard uniform.
9. Col. De Vincenti said that English courses were not giving very good results due to lack of good teachers and practice. It was suggested that courses for pilots, who would have to speak to Control Towers in English, should be run with gramophone records (linguaphone etc.) which might be obtained from Allied sources. In order to give practice in conversation and Air Force terms the assistance of

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10. Gen. Raffaelli mentioned the need for more Sport and Educational facilities for personnel wishing to study.

11. C.A.S. was only present for a short time during today's meeting.

He mentioned the inflation of Senior Officers, particularly Generals, and stressed that of the 28 Generals at present in service only 6 or 7 are actively engaged in Air Force work. The others

Dear Air Vice-Marshal,

In answer to your letter AFSC/366/ORG.

1. My comments on your letter cannot be other than favourable, for the simple reason that the conferences of the Territorial Commanders do not constitute for us a change of policy since they were always held in normal times.

2. Periodical monthly conferences had always been held in the Italian Air Force by all Units and Zone Commanders, and when the occasion demanded it, by the heads of departments.

The system adopted by the Army is, therefore, a renewal of an old method which in effect presents the advantages expounded in your letter.

3. If, up to the present, the P.A. has not adopted once more this method, it has been principally because of the dissimilarity of functions which have so far been given to the various Territorial Commands, and for the resulting economy in time. As a matter of fact up to a short time ago the two Commands of the 1st and 2nd ZAT, both under one High Command, had the function of recuperating personnel and material, that of Central Italy had administrative and conservative functions; the 4th ZAT added to its administrative and conservative functions, technical and logistic function of interest to the Unità, the two Insular Commands were responsible for the establishments of both personnel and buildings. Thus each Command dealt with problems which did not concern the other.

4. The present situation in fact calls for the readoption of these conferences, and this will take place in due course and will be made known to you. The conferences will take place once a month and will start in March, as this month the Ministry and Stato Maggiore will be moving to its old quarters.

2. Periodical monthly conferences had always been held in the Italian Air Force by all Units and Zone Commanders, and when the occasion demanded it, by the heads of departments.

I understand that the Italian War Ministry (Stato Maggiore) has instituted a Monthly Meeting of Territorial Commanders, and that these meetings are proving to be a great success in that the Italian Chief of Staff is able better to keep in touch with problems arising within the Territorial Commands, and the advice of the Generals Commanding is useful to him; furthermore the Territorial Commanders themselves are extremely pleased with this idea as they are able to air their views and feel that they themselves are being consulted; also the Territorial Commanders get together and exchange views on various problems. All of this, if taken in the democratic spirit, must lead to higher efficiency.

2. You may like to adopt a similar procedure with your four Z.A.T. Commanders, the Commanders of the Station Commands in Sardinia and Sicily, and the General Commanding Unità Aerea (so long as that Formation remains in existence.)

3. General Lee and I would very much like to attend as observers at the first meeting, and thereafter you may like to have representatives of the A.F.S.C. as observers. I like the idea of our sending Officers to your meetings as that too would keep us in better touch with problems arising in the Italian Air Force generally, and it may appear that certain problems may be solved more easily if A.F.S.C. representatives do attend your meetings as they may be in a position to answer any queries which may arise, from the Allied standpoint.

MONTHLY REPORTS

1. In order to facilitate relations between the General Staff, Centralised Units and Boundary Units (ie. Detachments), and because the duties assigned to the latter are on the point of being definitely settled, is being reinstated the system of monthly reports from Commanding Officers of Main Units, Z.A.T.s and of Insular Air Force H.Q.s to the General Staff.
2. The carrying out of this program will take place with effect from next month.
3. The date and time of the first meeting will be brought to notice in time.
4. The subjects which will be referred to by the Commanding Officers of these Boundary Units (ie. Detachments) and which will be brought up at this first meeting will be in regards to personnel, salvage, routine and estrangement activities.
5. The arguments will have to be stated clearly and precisely in order to save time and avoid confusion.
6. The Officer Commanding the Unità Aerea will have to refer, instead, to problems dealing with flying, Flying Schools, technical and admin. training.
7. The Air Vice Marshal Director and the General Director of Allied Commission will assist to the first meeting. These mentioned Officers will also attend to the next meetings, or appoint their delegates according to the problems in discussion.

8. In order to facilitate the preparations for this meeting, a detailed plan of the problems to be dealt with and referred to in paragraph 4 will be forwarded to the persons concerned.

9. The H.Q. of the 3 rd. Z.A.T. having been informed in time by the General Staff will make all possible convenient arrangements in order to assist from the Administrative angle the various Commanding Officers called up to Rome for this meeting.


