REPORTS ON DETERIORATION OF NATIONS.

With reference to your letter AFSC/671/Eq. of 20th August,
we should like to point out the following:

1) Your Sub-Commission, in answer to our letter 13585/COM/1965 Coll. of 22nd May, informed our Directorate on 25th May that the 90 day period allowed for the rendition of reports on deterioration of items had to be effective for the Italian Air Force from 30th May in view of the fact that the rationing period for the Air Force had been extended until May 1946.

2) No notifications were received by our Directorate before that date either from your Sub-Commission or the War Ministry as to the procedure on reintegration of damaged foodstuffs. However, the rules which were eventually in force could not concern direct the Italian Air Force, as the latter, as is known, used to draw its own requirements direct from the Italian Army Stores and carried out all reintegrations matters with the Italian Army once the damage had been ascertained.

3) Only on 12th June this Directorate sent around to all the Units under its control a circular letter requesting them to forward the reports on deterioration of rations from Allied sources, and which had been ascertained to be damaged, so as to obtain, as your Sub-Commission had pointed out, the credit of the corresponding amount of money to the Italian Government.

4) Therefore, the above reports could not be transmitted by the Units before that date on which they received instructions; and, if the time required to make out reports and then for their collection at this Ministry is taken into account, it appears that the time taken is justified. It is requested, on the other hand, to bear in mind that some of these reports are dated 4 Or 5 months ago as they were made out on the consumption of items but were not forwarded because, as it has been mentioned above, this Directorate was informed of the procedure to be followed only on 25th May.

5) Finally it was found out that, in some cases, in addition to the report on deterioration your Sub-Commission had also requested the analysis report in respect of deteriorated foodstuffs. In this regard it

It is requested, on the other hand, to bear in mind that some of these reports are dated 4 or 5 months ago as they were made out on the consumption of items but were not forwarded because, as it has been mentioned above, this Directorate was informed of the procedure to be followed only on 25th May.

5) Finally it was found out that, in some cases, in addition to the report on deterioration your Sub-Commission had also requested the analysis report in respect of deteriorated foodstuffs. In this regard it is to be noted that, although this Directorate requested the analyses from the Units concerned, it is thought that they cannot be submitted as the foodstuffs had already been destroyed in front of the Sanitary Officer concerned who ascertained they were not eatable, as it is shown on the reports forwarded.

It is to be born in mind that from the LF.SC.A.C. (MIA) ref. Q/I/17/234 dated 30th April, 1946 addressed to the War Ministry and forwarded by the latter to this Directorate it appears at paragraph 2 that "the rules as to the verification of damage of foodstuffs will be laid down by you". This Directorate therefore in giving instructions to the Units complied with the rules which are generally used in the Italian Air Force, according to which the deterioration is reported by a Committee composed of the Officer Commanding the Unit, the Head of the Administration Section and, for the hygienic-sanitary side, the Medical Officer of the Unit, considering the interests of the Administration fully guaranteed in this way either from the accounting point of view or from the sanitary one.



In fact of the total ten reports submitted six are more than two months old.

3. It must be appreciated by you that as the last issue of rations was made to you on the 1st of May M.M.I.A. at this date are not in any position to check the validity of these reports and therefore it is doubtful whether any recompense will be made to you unless you have some very good reason for coming along now with reports on such large quantities of food which have been condemned.



As these items cannot be used, the under-signed Mission state their deterioration authorising the consequent accounting deduction and order them to be buried.

REPORTS ON DETERIORATION AND WASTAGE OF FOODSTUFFS FROM ALLIED SOURCES.

The Land Forces Sub-Commission A.C. (IATA) with letter ref. Q/1/17-234 of 30th April addressed to the War Ministry has pointed out that:

- a) after the 10th May 1946 consideration will not be given to reports on the analyses of foodstuffs from Allied sources and which have been verified as not being suitable for consumption.
- b) whenever it can be proved that the deteriorated rations have been drawn from allied Depots, within 90 days from the deterioration, the reports on the analyses will be examined by this Command in order to credit the rations to the Italian Government.

This Directorate is of the opinion that the above limits of validity have been fixed in accordance with the fact that the War Ministry has been rationed by the Allied Command until 31st January, 1946; infact, having granted 90 days' time for the verification and report on the wastage, the claim must be submitted on 10th May.

As, on the contrary, the supply for the I.A.F. from Allied sources has been postponed to 30th May 1946 it would be appreciated if your Sub-Commission would explain whether a similar grant could also be extended to the I.A.F. and, in the affirmative case, specify up to what date consideration will be given to reports made out at the I.A.F. Units on deteriorations.

Your prompt acknowledgement will be very much appreciated and will enable us to give the proper and careful instructions to the Units under our control.

April and May requirements have been loaned by Allied Armed Forces but must be repaid as no further surplus stocks are available. Requirement for second six months is 5,16 tons. This figure includes provision for increase of 10,000 men in Italian Army/Carabinieri figure. Strength of forces now as follows: Army/Carabinieri 215,000, Navy 58,000, Air Force 31,000. Figure quoted of 5650 tons in OCS 425 is incorrect. Sugar requirements were not given in NOC air - given 149. All Italian Government were proposing to meet this demand from UNRRA imported stocks as they did not realize that this was not allowed under UNRRA charter. Requirements from October onwards will be met from local resources but 1,027 tons required for July, August, September.



The object of this communication is to clarify the whole position in regard to loans of subsistence made to the Italian Army from Allied Military Sources.

2. As it is known, on 15 November 45 the Italian Army was returned to the control of the Italian Government, and responsibility for procurement of subsistence became that of the Italian Government.

3. As an interim policy in order to assist the Italian Government while it was preparing provisioning action, the Allied Military Commission loans to the Italian Government for the Italian Army. In most cases these loans were subject to repayment in kind at a stated time. Request for these loans was initiated by MTA after the ECOC Sub Commission confirmed that commodities required on loan from Allied Military stocks could not be found in Italy. It was confirmed by the Food Sub-Commission that loans made would be repaid in kind by the Italian Government by the stated time.

4. Certain foodstuffs originally made on loan from U.S. sources subject to repayment in kind were declared surplus to U.S. Military requirements and adjustment of same has been negotiated through the U.S. Office of Foreign Liquidation (OFIL) and Italian Government. 2. As it is known, on 15 November 45 the Italian Army was repudiated to the control of the Italian Government, and responsibility for procurement of subsistence became that of the Italian Government.

3. As an interim policy in order to assist the Italian Government while it was preparing provisioning action, the United Nations made certain loans to the Italian Government for the Italian Army. In most cases these loans were subject to repayment in kind at a stated time. Repayment for these loans was initiated by UNRRA after the Good Sub-Commission, Allied Commission confirmed that commodities reported on loan from Allied Military stocks could not be found in Italy. It was confirmed by the Good Sub-Commission, Allied Commission that loans made would be repaid in kind by the Italian Government by the stated time.

4. Certain foodstuffs originally made on loan from U.S. sources subject to repayment in kind were declared surplus to U.S. Military requirements and adjustment of sale has been negotiated through the U.S. Office of Foreign Liquidation (OFOL) and Italian Government. 5. A quantity of flour (4,100,000 lbs) was loaned by the U.S. Navy to the Italian Army in December subject to repayment in kind. This repayment is being effected at present through the High Commissioner for Food to the U.S. Quartermaster, P.B.S., Leghorn.

6. Statement of loans of foodstuffs made by the British Army to the Italian Army appears in Appendix 'A' hereto. Indicated are the amounts by the Italian Army and repayments effected through the High Commissioner for Food.

7. The Italian Air Force and Navy will be provisioned by the British Army until 31 May 46. In order to conserve transportation and avoid double handling, certain items which were due to the British Army on the basis of previous loans to the Italian Army have been issued directly to the Italian Air Force and Navy, to be considered part repayment to the British Army. Commodities by amounts repaid to the British Army by issue to the Italian Air Forces and Navy by the High Commissioner for Food are indicated in Appendix 'A'.

8. Concerning the accounting setica transfers below made with reference to diverse transactions in accordance with understandings reached in a meeting, AICOM/Italian Government representatives this date:

- a. Items loaned in accordance with procedure, para 3 above have been debited to the Italian Government (Ministry of War) through the British Accountant, Allied Supply Accounting Agency (Allied Commission Food). A special account has been maintained by the British Accountant, Allied Supply Accounting Foodstuffs to be reported.
- b. Items released, 25-26 AUG, Italy debit to by non-commissioned means as outlined in the same paragraph.
- c. For flour being repaid to U.S., QM, TBS, London (and held) by the High Commissioner for Food, para 5 above, the Ministry of War should be debited by the High Commissioner for Food on interim-bilateral accounting action. When complete repayment in kind has been effected, the temporary debit against the Ministry of War will be cancelled on our accounts, following adjustment to be made.
- d. For repayment made directly to the British Army by the High Commissioner for Food (para 6 above); i.e., ex-sail "Leisure Queen" and remaining due for repayment, (see Appendix 4), the Ministry of War should be debited by the High Commissioner for Food on interim-bilateral adjustment basis. The original debit made against the Ministry of War will be cancelled on our special accounts, following repayment to be made.

e. For repayment made, us to para 7 above, to the Italian Navy and Air Force, the Ministry of War should be debited by the High Commissioner for Food, separately in kind more made similar to para 8 above. The Italian Air Forces and Navy will be debited, by MTOU through the Allied Supply Accounting Agency, us if an issue directly upon the British Army.

b. It is recommended that "accruals" may be carried over from time to time as outlined in the same paragraph.

c. For flour being repaid to U.S., U.K., Lend-Lease and France by the High Commissioner for Food, paragraph above, the Ministry of War should be debited by the High Commissioner for Food on Inter-British Commissarial accounting action. When complete repayment in kind has been effected, the temporary debit against the Ministry of War will be cancelled on our accounts.

d. For repayments made directly to the British Army by the "Ministry" and Finance due for repayment; i.e., ex ship "Lauria" (see Appendix 4), the Ministry of War should be debited by the High Commissioner for Food on an interim basis. The original debit made against the Ministry of War will be cancelled on our special accounts, following repayment in kind.

e. For repayments made, as in para 7 above, to the Italian Army and air force, the Ministry of War should be debited by the High Commissioner for Food, as if payment in kind were never settled, by para 8d above. The Italian Air Force and Navy will be debited, by DITA through the Allied Supply Account, as if an issue directly from the British Army.

RATIONS' REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MONTH OF MAY.

As a consequence of railway difficulties which delayed supplies for the month of March, this Ministry contacted and made arrangements with the Food High Commissariat to obtain the ration allocation for the month of May in advance.

The request was submitted to the above High Commissariat because, as this Ministry was aware, on the 30th of April the supply of rations by the Allies to the I.A.F. was to cease.

On the basis of agreements reached with the above Unit it has been possible to have rations released direct to the different localities of Commissariat Sections under the control of this HQ., and in this way to ease the situation while awaiting supplies in respect of March and April.

After these agreements had been fixed and withdrawals of foodstuffs were going on, Col. Walker of your Sub-Commission informed us that also during the month of May the supply of rations for the I.A.F. was going to be effected by the Allied Command. For this reason this Ministry, considering the difficulties of returning the rations already drawn, either owing to the fact that they had already been allocated in the major part to private Firms and had already duly been paid for, or because they have already been partly consumed while awaiting the rail trucks, has requested the High Commissariat to consider the issues already made as in anticipation of those which will be disposed of in the future by this Commissariat.

It is pointed out, on the other hand, that the Commissariat Section of the IV Z.A.T. (Bari) has notified us that the flour released for April by the Allied Command, through the Food Commissariat, cannot be available at the mills in the Bari Province before the end of this month. Consequently it will not be shipped to the Commissariat Sections before the 12th April which makes it necessary to use the flour obtained in anticipation by the Food Commissariat for the month of April's requirements.

Owing to all the above-mentioned reasons this Ministry assumes that it is not possible, at least for now, to return the May rations anticipated by the above Commissariat and, therefore, the request submitted by the under-signed is to be considered justified.

The above is being communicated to your Sub-Commission for your information.

MINUTE No. 2."2. FEEDING OF THE ITALIAN NAVY AND AIR FORCE.

(Previous reference SAC (46) 2nd Meeting, Minute 4).

MAJOR GENERAL DUFF, Chief Administrative Officer, raised the question of the date by which the Italian Government were to assume responsibility for the feeding of the Italian Navy and the Italian Air Force. At the meeting of the Supreme Allied Commander's Conference, SAC (46) 2nd Meeting, held on the 14th February, the SUPREME ALLIED COMMANDER directed that 31st March be fixed as the latest date by which the Italian Government should assume their responsibility for the feeding of the Italian Navy and the Italian Air Force.

The Chief Commissioner, Allied Commission, had written to AFHQ in regard to this decision; in view of the very serious Italian food situation he hoped that some less drastic action might be adopted.

MAJOR GENERAL DUFF went on to say that he had put forward a suggestion that two months supply in bulk should immediately be transferred from British Depots to Italian Depots. This would provide for subsistence of the Italian Navy and the Italian Air Force, except for a very small US commitment which he understood Headquarters TOUSA would have no difficulty in meeting, until 31st May 46. This proposal was, he understood, acceptable to the Chief Commissioner, Allied Commission, and would enable the Italian Navy and Italian Air Force to be fed until 31st May 46 without increasing the strain on the resources of food of the Italian Government.

REAR ADMIRAL STONE confirmed that this suggestion was acceptable.

MAJOR GENERAL DUFF went to say that he considered that the Combined Chiefs of Staff should be informed that after 31st May 46, HQ CMF would be unable any longer to meet the commitment of feeding the Italian Navy and the Italian Air Force and asked for their approval to the transfer of responsibility for this commitment to the Italian Government with effect from the 1st June 46.

THE SUPREME ALLIED COMMANDER:

- (a) Approved the telegram at Appendix "B" to the paper CMO/225/1 of the 14th March 46,
- (b) Directed that this telegram be despatched to the Combined Chiefs of Staff (Despatched as NAV 1123). "

1. The Italian Ministry of War has been charged for all foodstuffs received from Allied Military Stocks on a loan basis.
2. When the Ministry of Food (High Commissioner for Food) has completed repayment in kind to Allied Military Depots of loans, credit will be given to the Italian Government.
3. Concerning repayment of foodstuffs made by the High Commissioner for Food to the British Army by way of issue direct to the Italian Air Force and Navy; e.g. dried vegetables, preserved meat/fish, and flour for March and April maintenance, the charge made for original loan (para 1 above) will stand as a charge against the Italian Government instead of credit being given for the repayment to British Army.
4. The charge had been made against the Ministry of War for foodstuffs issued to the Italian Air Force and Navy, as has been the procedure in the past.





This Majesty's Ambassador present their compliments to the Royal Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and have the honor, under instruction, to communicate the views of His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom on certain points related to the continuation of the Italian Armed Forces;

1. Italian military requirements should, as far as possible, be provided from indigenous Italian resources.
2. All imports, including arms and tobacco, should be purchased by the Italian Government through dealers and resources in accordance with existing arrangements for supplies outside the Italian Republic.
3. Italian importers may not be used by the Italian Army.
4. Italian importers of certain imports by agreement to supply for the disposal of surplus imports by Italy.
5. The situation was found to make it difficult and uneconomical to meet the requirements of the Italian Army.
6. Requirements for Italy should be established to meet Italian military over requirements for the Italian Army.
7. Supplies in addition to those of the civilian importers should not be used for military purposes except where the allied Commission has licensed it to contractors to establish a separate line of supply for supplies items outside that programme.
8. No specific additional tonnages should be included in the category A programme for Italian and Military requirements.
9. No assurances can be given as to the flow of military supplies.

On these questions, the views of the United States Government are as follows:-

1. We agree that Italian military requirements should, in first instance, be taken from Italian military resources, and secondarily, from surplus United States and United Kingdom stocks in Italy.
2. U.S.A. should have priority over Italian military requirements in the disposal of surplus property in Italy.
3. Items including tires and trade requirements which cannot be supplied locally or from surplus should be purchased by Italian Government through its available foreign resources. Italian Government **£202** determine relative priority of military and civilian requirements meeting its purchases.
4. U.S.A. supplies cannot be used for military purposes.
5. Supplies in category A, civilian import program, should not (repeat not) be used for military purposes except where Allied Command believes it is impracticable to establish separate line of supply for specific items outside that program. To specify additional tonnages should be included in category A program for Italian military requirements.

SUBJECT: Feeding of the Italian Navy.

TO : C-5 Section, AFHQ

1. I refer to my letter TS/100/B/25 dated 7 February 1946 and to the decision made at SACED's Conference that as from 1 April 1946 the responsibility for feeding the Italian Navy must be assumed by the Italian Government.

2. In view of the very serious food situation in this country and the failure of GNERA to provide sufficient imports for the country as a whole, I must point out that it is extremely unlikely that the Italian Government will be able to procure to feed the Navy.

3. If, as was expressed at SACED's Conference, the difficulty of continuing supply from British sources is due to lack of manpower, then I would suggest that consideration be given to the substitution of British RASC staff by Italian naval maintenance staff who, I am advised, would be capable of assisting if not taking over entirely, the work of distribution.

4. If, on the other hand, shortage of British rations is the underlying reason for the decision, then I would suggest that consideration be given to rationing the Italian Navy, at any rate for two or three months, from the surplus stocks of U.S. rations which I understand are not available in this country.

5. A further suggestion has been made that bulk commodities should be issued to the Italian Government from British sources, a proposal which I should be glad to explore.

6. I feel bound to ask for consideration to be given ~~of~~^{to} the points in view of the responsibility for maintenance of the Italian Services which has been assumed and, I submit, must continue to be assumed, by SACED.


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


