COLLI AIRCRAFT.

The following is an extract from the Rome Press ("Globe" 21st June, 1946):

"Globe" reports that a vehicle which can be used as a plane as well as a car was yesterday demonstrated to the Press in Milan. The new vehicle, is entirely metallic, reaches a speed of 50 Km per hour on the road and 190 in the air, can transport two persons, land almost anywhere and can be kept in any garage. It is 6 feet high and 17 feet long, has a 60 HP motor and weighs 748 lbs. Its mass production cannot be started until the Allied authorities permit it.

Have you any information regarding this demonstration, if so will you send all particulars to this Headquarters.

In view of the fact that orders were given that the construction of this aircraft was to cease, information as to who gave permission for the demonstration is requested.

COLLI AIRCRAFT

Referring to your letter AFSC/827/Eng. dated 24th May, 1946, this aircraft must remain grounded until the future of Italian light aircraft aviation is settled.

2. Some time ago the Italian Air Ministry were asked to notify all manufacturers that aircraft construction, without A.F.S.C. authority, was forbidden, and in the case of the Colli Firm I know that Headquarters N° I Z.A.T. issued this instruction, therefore they can have no excuse.

3. It is obvious that the Air Force Authorities are not taking any further measures to stop the illegal manufacture of aircraft in this and in other firms and we will take up ~~the~~ question of more active cooperation, with the Italian Air Ministry.

2. In addition to the directive then issued to the Colli Firm to cease aircraft construction, similar instructions had already been issued to this firm directly by G/Capt Jerman (letter of even reference dated 30th October 1945) and through the 1st A.A.P. Command (letter ref AFSC/M/829/Eng of 30 October 1945, no coll. to Rome).
  3. Today two representatives of the Colli firm, accompanied by General Sale, visited this office with photographs of the Colli aircraft which has recently been completed notwithstanding the orders given that work on this aircraft must cease.
  4. The Colli aircraft conforms to the following description:-  
Light, single-wing monoplane, "trirismo", lettered PL 2 C.  
Engine 60 HP Walter. Pusher system (airscrew placed behind passenger cabin and wing).  
2-seater, side by side position, single-control.  
Weight (unloaded) -350 kilos (800 lbs approx).

3. Today two representatives of the Colli firm, accompanied by General Solis, visited this office with photographs of the Colli aircraft which has recently been completed notwithstanding the orders given that work on this aircraft must cease.

4. The Colli aircraft conforms the following description:-  
Light, high-wing monoplane, "turismo", lettered PL 2 C.  
Engine 60 HP Walter. Pusher system (airscrew placed behind passenger cabin and wing).  
2-seater, side by side position, single-control.  
Weight (unloaded) -350 kilos (800 lbs approx).

5. The purpose of the visit was to request permission for a test flight of this aircraft to be made on Linete Airfield, Milan, and reference was made to a previous permit (ref ASOC/M/36/1/Air dated 13th Sept. 1945) given by S/Ldr Diamond for the earlier and even smaller Colli midget aircraft to be air-tested. No flight actually took place as the 16 hp engine failed to develop sufficient power for the aircraft to become airborne.

6. It would be appreciated if you would transmit instructions as to what action is to be taken with regard to this illegally-constructed plane.

CONSTRUCTION OF AIRCRAFT.

The definitive policy enunciated by higher headquarters relating to construction of additional aircraft compels this Sub Commission to disapprove the request made in your 8/896/Cost/6451 Coll, dated 3rd December, 1945.

2. You are therefore requested to inform the Celli Aircraft Company of the above policy with specific instructions that no attempts will be made to resume work to complete construction of these two aircraft.

3. In addition, you are kindly requested to inform the Azionaria Verolese Industrie Aeronautiche Company that their request of 6 December, 1945, to construct an additional twenty (20) FI/3 aircraft cannot be authorized and that they should concentrate on manufacturing vehicle parts, etc., as it is uncertain when the restrictions on Civilian Aviation will be lifted.

COLLI AIRCRAFT

Attached herewith a report is forwarded re-the "PL 2C" aircraft type planned by the Industrialist LUIGI PALLARINI and constructed by COLLI Bros, Milan.

The manufacturers had already built, some while ago, a prototype fitted with a twin cylinder engine which should have developed 20 HP but that in actual fact developed only approximately 12 HP.

For this reason the aircraft has only carried out rolling tests.

However, the results of this attempt encouraged the manufacturers to plan a second prototype "PL 2C" two seater of similar design as the original "PL 1C" and fitted with CNA/D4 60 HP engine.

The flying characteristics as per attached concern those foreseen and fitted with this engine.

It is to be noted that the characteristics are reliable as per order of size with the exception of the take-off run which should be considered not less than 250 metres.

Furthermore, the manufacturers foresee the construction of more prototypes with more work and power? the whole based on the same lines of construction.
