INTERNATIONAL RADIO MEDICAL CENTRE -
REQUEST FOR AIRCRAFT AND OTHER
FACILITIES.

With reference to the request of the International Radio Medical Centre to ADMIRAL STONE dated the 2nd October, we assume that you will co-ordinate the reply for the Chief Commissioner. Our comments are as follows.

2. We assume that this Medical Centre's work may be classed as an essential service (whether this is so is not for us to judge).

3. At present, and probably until the peace terms are announced, Italian Civil Aviation is not permitted in Italy. Therefore any flying facilities which are to be provided must be of a military nature. I see no hope of the R.A.F. near the A.F.C. being able to grant facilities, consequently the flying facilities will have to be provided by the Italian Air Force.

4. There seems to be no justification for allotting Italian Air Force aircraft specially for this purpose, but there would appear to be no objection to the Radio Medical Centre making use of such facilities as already exist. We have no objection to the Radio Medical Centre being informed that:

(i) Italian Military Aircraft converted to passenger carrying are available both land planes and seaplanes.

(ii) Seaplane Bases are operating for air sea rescue work at Taranto, Brimisi, Venice, Cagliari (Sardinia) and bases are being opened at Lamo Bracciano (Near Rome) and probably Spezia.

(iii) Detailed arrangements will be discussed between the A.F.S.C. and the Italian Air Ministry (provided it is agreed that facilities should be made available to this organisation). 3073

5. The last but one paragraph of the Italian letter indicates that the organisation has the false idea that the Allies are selling or giving aircraft to the Italians; this is not the case, and furthermore aircraft suitable for the work under discussion are unlikely to become available as both the Americans and British have large commitments and insufficient suitable aircraft available.

6. As regards ambulances, I recommend that if they cannot be obtained from Allied or Italian civil sources, such vehicles be built by the Italians themselves.

With reference to the request of the International Radio Medical Centre to ADRIAL STONE dated the 2nd October, we assume that you will co-ordinate the reply for the Chief Commissioner. Our comments are as follows.

2. We assume that this Medical Centre's work may be classed as an essential service (whether this is so is not for us to judge).

3. At present, and probably until the peace terms are announced, Italian Civil Aviation is not permitted in Italy. Therefore any flying facilities which are to be provided must be of a military nature. I see no hope of the R.A.F. nor the A.F.C. being able to grant facilities, consequently the flying facilities will have to be provided by the Italian Air Force.

5. The last but one paragraph of the Italian letter indicates that the organisation has the false idea that the Allies are selling or giving aircraft to the Italians; this is not the case, and furthermore aircraft suitable for the work under discussion are unlikely to become available as both the Americans and British have large commitments and insufficient suitable aircraft available.

6. As regards ambulances, I recommend that if they cannot be obtained from Allied or Italian civil sources, such vehicles be built by the Italians themselves.

7. As regards signals organisation as between the Radio Medical Centre and ships, it is presumed that arrangements could be made through the Naval Sub-Commission, or alternatively the existing Italian Air Force signals organisation.

8. If and when the principle of allowing existing facilities to be used by the Radio Medical Centre is agreed, the subject will be discussed with the Italian Air Ministry as regards the use of Italian Military Aircraft and, if necessary, the signals organisation.

9. In spite of the dearest view indicated in the Italian letter by the words "we cannot count on any help on the part of the Italian ministries" I feel that the Italians must work out a part of their salvation themselves in this respect and not rely on the good offices of the Allies.

Centro Radio-Medico Internazionale

Rome, 2 October 1945

We take the liberty of informing you that, for several years, there has been in Rome an 'international radio-medical centre', the aim of which is to give sanitary assistance and medical advice by radio to such commanders of Italian and foreign ships at sea as have sick or wounded people on board, and no doctor, and wouldn't know what to do.

This institution, whose radio and medical service is entirely free, receives no subsidy from the various ministries, and gave brilliant results, saving many human lives.

Famous directors of nursing homes, head doctors of various hospitals, belong to the centre, and work free of charge for the benefit of Italian and foreign sailors.

No one better than you who belong to the U.S. Navy can understand the importance and practical usefulness of our welfare institution.

The Centre had been allowed by the Air Force Ministry to make use of civilian planes and of the fast motorboats of the R. Guardia di Finanza, to bring urgent help in case of need; in this way, the patient whether sick or wounded, was taken ashore without delay, or a surgeon or doctor sent on board.

Before the declaration of war, the Centre was also giving sanitary assistance to such small Mediterranean islands as lacked proper sanitary equipment.

We want to re-establish this sanitary service by air (service which might also be most useful for various Italian regions which happen to be isolated because of the lack of means of communications), but considering the disastrous conditions in which Italy finds herself, we cannot count on any help on the part of the Ministries.

Now that the war is over and that we must concern ourselves with welfare organizations, we ask your Excellency who has done so much for Italy, to have the Allied Military Authorities allocate one plane and one sea plane to us, for sanitary service, or military planes that could be adapted to this end, among those that are not being used, but are in a good state and have been left in Italy. Also an ambulance, to allow us to resume our free assistance service.

Considering the end of our institution and the brilliant results which have been obtained for many years, we trust your Excellency will support our request.

MEDICAL TREATMENT - ITALIAN PERSONNEL

Sir,

It is hereby reported that on two occasions recently, we have sent Italian Soldiers from this camp to the Italian Military Hospital at Foggia for treatment, it is regretted that no treatment was given to them.

2. Case No. 1 (Cookhouse Worker) PAGANO GENEROSO. On the 9th inst; this soldier accidentally cut his thumb, the wound, an incised one at the tip of the thumb of the left hand, was very deep and gaping and approximately 3/4" long. This injury was cleaned and dressed and the patient conveyed to hospital by special transport where the bandage was removed, the wound inspected and the same bandage replaced. No treatment of any description was given.

3. The patient took to hospital a R.A.F. Form 624 stating injury and the treatment required, i.e; suturing of wound, (because patient is continually required to wash dishes etc.) the form was duly handed in at the hospital but was not returned.

4. This injury still requires dressing daily as it has failed to heal completely owing to the patient's work.

5. Case No. 2. (General Worker) MANCO PASQUALE. On the 25th inst. this man, whilst at work, received a large lacerated wound at the base of the first finger of the left hand, the wound was exceptionally deep and exposed the Metacarpus bone.

6. The injury was cleaned thoroughly and the wound dressed. Special transport was obtained and patient conveyed to hospital bearing R.A.F. Form 624, giving the extent of injury and requesting that the wound be sutured.

7. It is regretted that this man was treated the same as Case No. 1, and returned to camp with the same dressing covering the injury.

8. This soldier is still unable to work and the injury will, in my opinion, take at least a month to heal sufficiently to allow him to return to normal work.

9. It is considered that the hospital personnel concerned are failing in their duties to their own soldiers and it would be greatly appreciated if this matter could be taken up and brought to the notice of the proper authorities.
