Reference is made to your letter 301742/Z.8/a/6270ell dated 3rd May 1947.

2. When the Royal Air Force surrenders the firing range at Piave it will revert to the original owner, whilst all equipment and buildings erected upon the site will pass to the Italian Air Force.
3. If in fact the land on which the range has been built did not belong to the Italian Air Force before having been taken over by the Allies then it cannot revert to the Italian Air Force and your only means of obtaining possession is by direct negotiation with the owner.

- 5° Regarding the 50.000 cartridges 7.7 calibre, orders have been given for drawing them from No. 126 Rivalta M.U.

All Firing Ranges.

Information has now been received from Air Headquarters, R.A.F., Italy that they no longer require to use the Air Firing ranges situated at GRADO, PIAVE, and COTILLOME, and that these can be taken over by the Italian Air Force immediately.

2. The quadrant installations, targets and other markers have been left in situ, but the actual quadrant scales have been removed. It is suggested, therefore, that you send Major Cao or some other properly qualified officer to see Squadron Leader Wood, the Chief Ammunition Officer at Air Headquarters, Udine, as soon as possible, in order formally to take over the ranges and to ascertain what equipment should be installed by the I.A.F. before the Wings start firing on the ranges.

3. This Headquarters has been informed that the live range at TOLLIAMENTO cannot be used for another two months as the Navy are at present carrying out extensive mine clearance in that area. You should consult the Ministry of Defence (Marine) if you wish to use this range in the future.

4. Ammunition for the Fighter Wings. We have been informed by Air Headquarters, Italy, that 90,000 rounds of ammunition are now awaiting collection by the Italian Air Force at No. 126 Maintenance Unit, Nivolti and it is suggested that your State Maggiore takes immediate steps to see that this is made available to the Fighter Wings, in order that they may start their firing training as soon as possible, either on the range at PUNTA DELLA COSTIERA or on one of the ranges now made available in the North.

Training of L.A.F. personnel with R.A.F. Wings

With reference to the attachment of Colonel Sforza to A.H.Q. Udine for the purpose of acquiring a working knowledge of the Mobile Operations Room which is stationed there, it is requested that you insure that Colonel Sforza is provided with accommodation and rations at the nearest L.A.F. unit (presumably this will be on the aerodrome at Caspofondo).

2. The Senior Air Staff Officer, A.H.Q. Italy, has been informed today that Colonel Sforza should be arriving on Saturday 1st March or on Monday 3rd March.

3. It is now certain that the Mobile Operations Room will be handed over to the Italian Air Force when the R.A.F. leaves North Italy. You should therefore brief Colonel Sforza to make a thorough study of the organisation at Udine and also instruct him to call upon other signals and operational specialist officers from your State Maggiore as and when he thinks fit. Should Colonel Sforza require an office, stationery or a car, he should notify the S.A.S.O. at A.H.Q., Group Captain Morton.

4. This Sub Section considers the familiarisation of L.A.F. personnel with the highly complicated machinery of the Mobile Operations Room as a matter of importance and urgency and recommends that Colonel Sforza maintains a close liaison with your training staff.

Training of IAF Personnel with RAF Wings.

21st February 1947.

Reference is made to your letter ANGI/L/4/AIR dated the 10th of February 1947 and it is noted that there is no objection by your HQ to the attachments of IAF officers to RAF Wings as suggested in our letter dated the 13th of January 1947.

2. Colonel Sforza is at present with his Storme at Lecce and it is intended that he will return to you as soon as flying conditions render this possible. Once he has settled in at Udine he will then be able in consultation with our operational and administrative staff to call for the respective IAF specialist officers. The relief of Major Spagnolini should already have arrived at Treviso.

3. No special arrangements are required in respect of these attachments since all administrative arrangements can be made through the IAF Unit at Campofioride. Colonel Sforza will however require accommodation but his rations he will draw from Italian sources and put them into the general messing.
