Before we your letter arrived 2/24/7 Mail, dated 6th February, 1947, I regret that it is outside the scope of this institution to either approve or disapprove the retention of a parachute Corps in the First Twenty Italian Army or Air Force, and I would suggest that matters be left as they are at present until after the reduction of the armed forces with Italy, when you should refer the matter to the Department (as we do forward) to the War Department in Rome, to whom reference is made in the name of the United States.

2. There is therefore, no useful purpose served by the Ministers of National Defence - Air or Army, forwarding requests to DMAS for the Parachutist Corps to be maintained after the Treaty is ratified.
3. Until then, their retention has already been agreed by this and your Sub-Sections.

Reference to letter No. 3/3 dated 20th December 1946 from the I.F.S.C. - A.C. forwarded to me in duplicate copy by your Sub-Commission and attached to your above mentioned letter.

This "Stato Maggiore" in agreement with the Ministry of War, requests that the "Parachutist Corps" be maintained. The Italian Army would greatly suffer should this important branch (Parachutists) be discontinued.

We think it necessary to include at least a small nucleus of Parachutists in the Italian Army strength so as to honour the glorious traditions of the Corps, as well as for the following reasons:-

1) It is necessary to maintain the functions and duties of the parachutists in order that their training and operational qualities be brought up to date with rapid aeronautical improvements. Also so as to avoid that these functions eventually fade away due to lack of training.

2) It is impossible to carry out a training activity even if limited to a small number of personnel, in order to encourage and develop all the technical duties which are necessary for cooperation between the Army and Air Force.

It is necessary to bear in mind that the above mentioned reasons do not lie beyond the limits laid down by

It is necessary to bear in mind that the above mentioned two reasons do not lie beyond the limits laid down by Article 52 of the Peace Treaty Plan, as their object is not at all violated due to the fact that they can be conceived only to satisfy the tasks of an internal character, as well as local and anti-aircraft defence.

Reply to 4/3 letter, dated 20/12/47 of the I.F.S.C., A.C., sent with copy and accompanying AFSC/98/IRG letter dated 3/1/47 by this A.F.S.C.

Whilst perfectly aware of the grave loss which the army would suffer if it were deprived of an important section such as that of parachutists, it is requested by this General Staff in accordance with the Ministry of War, that this glorious Corps, which is a link between the soldier and the airman in hardship and danger, be maintained.

We consider it necessary that this experimental section should be included amongst those which the Italian Army will be able to retain after the Peace Treaty, even if the number has to be reduced, in order to honour the glorious tradition of Italian parachutists and for the following reasons:

- I) It is necessary to maintain the parachutists tasks and offices in keeping with the administrative and operative criterions, either because these are continually adjoined because of the rapid evolution of aerial means, or because such tasks and offices, when deprived of continuity and applicable possibilities cannot gradually vanish.
- II) The possibility to carry out training activities, even if limited to fewer elements with the object of giving impetus and development to all those purely technical factors which can exchange points of view - in the most ample collaborative form - between superficial military elements and those of the Air Force.

It must be held in the dutifully needed consideration that the two above listed motives do not come from the limits imposed by article 52 of the Peace Treaty plan, in which nothing prohibits that the necessities expressed in it "can be conceived only to satisfy tasks of internal character, local defence and anti-aircraft defence".

E' doveroso tenere nella dovuta considerazione che i due sopraelencati motivi, non esulano dai limiti imposti dall'articolo 52 del Progetto del Trattato di Pace, in quanto nulla vieta che le necessità in essi espresse, possano "essere circoscritte solamente per soddisfare i compiti di carattere interno, difesa locale e difesa antiaerea".-
