2. I have today spoken with Colonel Valentini (Operations officer) and Donadio at the I.A.F. Apparently the figures set out in Enclosure 31A are the estimated expenditure for one year by the Staras according to the revised training programme that Valentini hopes to put into operation. They stressed on the phone that they would like double the amount to cover two years of training.

3. It is impossible for me to check these estimates in the SD 98 or any other I.A.F. logistical manual since the case of reequipping a Foreign Air Force is unique and is not provided for in any SD 98 tables.

4. The requests do not seem to me to be excessive and in view of the fact that the I.A.F. will need to do an enormous amount of firing training to be brought up to scratch I suggest we agree to their requirements.

Actually, the British Air Ministry are issuing a scale of ammunition requirements under the "Plan". I have not seen this yet but it will only refer to British types and it remains to be seen whether it will cover training requirements, operational requirements or both. But what has even more bearing on the matter is the amount of ammunition in the country. British stocks at 126 H.Q. destined for the Italian Air Force are listed on the yellow forms attached to 16 A. In addition there will be the former Army reserves located at Inverness airfield, now being checked and listed.

As regards American ammunition, I think the Italian realise now that they must deal with OHC etc.

Status of Ammunition for Italian Air Force

On 23 April 1947, 1296 tons of United States Air Force ammunition stored at the Treviso Airfield was turned over to ARAR for demilitarization. None of the types included in this transaction were pertinent to subject requirement as outlined in letter Hq MTOUSA, subject: "Ammunition for Italian Air Force" which was sent to the Government of the Republic of Italy on 13 December 1946. However, the remaining 1475 tons, of applicable types, have been withheld from sale, and are presently being guarded by Italian Air Force personnel under the surveillance of an American Staff Sergeant furnished by Headquarters MTOUSA.

2. Attached availability chart lists the total ammunition requirement of the Italian Air Force, and indicated availabilities at Treviso. Where shortages exist, estimated availabilities which may exist in the dumps at Acerra, Manfredonia, Bari and Candelaro as of 15 May are indicated. As these dumps have long since been passed to ARAR for demilitarization, this headquarters cannot order the withholding from demilitarization of any such material. It is requested, therefore, that you take immediate action with ARAR and/or such other agency of the Italian Government as may be necessary in order to withhold necessary material from demilitarization.

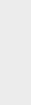

Air Headquarters, R.A.F., Italy have been considering the problem of No. 126 Maintenance Unit, Rivalto, which is the main ammunition depot of the R.A.F. in Italy.

2. It is hoped that in due course the stocks at this unit will be transferred to the Italian Air Force but in the meanwhile, the reduction in the strength of the R.A.F. makes it impossible to continue the necessary guards after the 1st May or thereabouts.
3. A.H.Q. have therefore requested that the Italian Air Force may be asked to supply guards from that date. Will you therefore please confirm that you are prepared to take over guard duties there on receipt of 48 hours warning.
4. The command of the unit will continue to be exercised by a R.A.F. Officer and a R.A.F. Care and Maintenance party will remain until final disposal is effected.
5. In connection with this matter, Capt. BRUNETTI and Lt. ROSSETTI of the Air Ministry and Capt. SALERNO of the 2nd M.A.T. visited Rivalto on 15th April and their report on requirement of men and the availability of facilities for their accommodation is no doubt by now in your hands.

My dear Undersecretary,

I thank you for your letter of 23rd March, 1947.

I wish to assure you that my staff officers have employed every practicable means to acquire from American sources the ammunition required for the operation and training of the Italian Air Force.

It is my understanding that the American authorities are now prepared to turn over to the Italian Air Force a certain amount of ammunition located in the Provino area subject to financial agreement between AFH and the Italian Air Industry. However, my Deputy Director, Lt. Colonel Frank E. Harek, has informed me that the Italian Air Force financial budget is so involved that you are unable to make a bid for the offered ammunition and therefore the transaction has reached a point of stagnancy.

I have also been informed by my Deputy Director that the United States Government has recently authorized an additional ten million dollars credit to the Italian Government for the purpose of purchasing surplus property of this character. I recommend you to investigate this so you may be able to obtain from the Italian Minister of Finance the funds required to defray the cost of ammunition. During the meantime, higher American authorities have been informed of the inability of the Italian Air Ministry to offer a price for the ammunition and have been requested to determine whether it is possible to turn this ammunition over to the Italian Air Force on more favourable terms.

Please be assured that I am in sympathy with your problems and shall endeavour to assist you in any way that is possible.

Further to the letter dated 1/3/77 addressed to me by Mr. Vice Marshall I am replying to the release of munitions requisition on training and operational purposes of the Italian Air Force, to be released by A.S.A. and I have been able to ascertain the following:

Independent of a certain initial delay verified in meeting the offer made by the Council of Ministers to the Italian Air Force - a delay presumably caused by the President's mission to the United States - this Ministry brought the matter to a decision on 1st June.

As you will note from letter to C.A. 001/83 dated 15th January 1977 a copy of which is attached herewith, no reply has been received. The technical component unit endeavored in every possible way to clarify the conditions, according to the procedures indicated in Part I of the letter received from U.S. Marshal dated 19th November 1976.

Inspections were made at some time to ascertain the quantity of the equipment and also several personnel contacts were made with both the A.S.A. and C.I.L.O. offices in order to obtain direct delivery stating that the A.S.A. which had dealt with the matter, informed me that the latter could not be met. The persons given by A.S.A. are mainly involved in the fact that the requisition had been for the release of munitions for the A.S.A. to be delivered to the conditions in the situation after the date of completion.

The A.S.A. in order to carry out this condition has therefore offered to sell the whole consignment to the Italian Government (Government) immediately upon delivery of the equipment in 3rd October 1976.

It therefore appears that the steps taken by this Ministry since the date of the requisition results regarding the establishment of conditions under over to A.S.A. the latter has presented to the A.S.A. a change in the requisition claims regarding the material requested by this administration has produced a favorable result. This will affect future munition consignment, possibly to A.S.A., seeing that the latter has been informed by the A.S.A.

The reason for the delay is due to the trip of the Prime Minister to the United States, resulting in a delay in forwarding the letter to this Ministry.

2. We are grateful for the offer and we wish to state that it is our intention to acquire the following quantities of munitions:

The above facts are necessary so that we may give instructions as to their storage. We therefore await authority to visit the depots which will be specified.

It would be desirable if the release of this material be made directly between the ONIC and the Ministry so that we may choose, separate and place in custody the munitions assigned to the Italian Air Force. Regarding administrative procedures the final decision will be reached by the A.R.A.A. or the Treasury Ministry.

5. We would be pleased to ascertain the cost of the various types of munitions to be acquired, in order to make decisions considering the balance sheet position which limits our purchasing powers.

6. The request for direct dealings between the Italian Air Force and the ONIC is disactivated by the fact that if the release should be carried out through the A.R.A.A. with the time limit of 15 days for clearing and safe custody of the material (as in the case of the handing over of the 50,000 tons of material) the A.R.A.A. has declared that it cannot possibly adhere to the request.

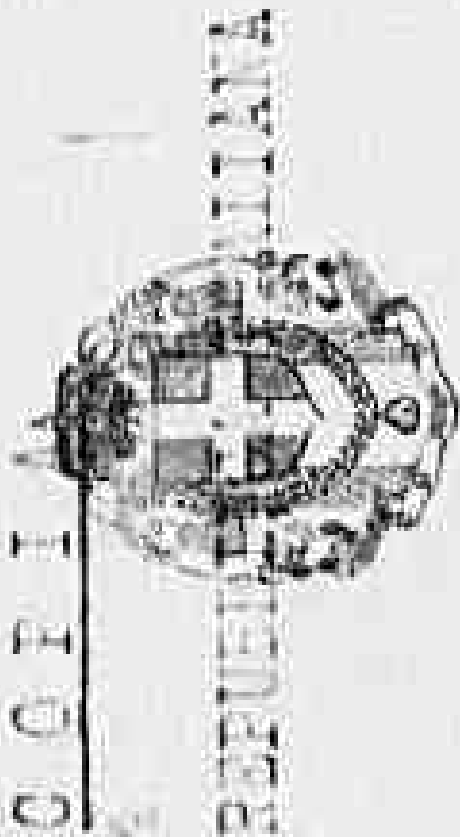

 - explosive shells, 12 caliber bombs.
5. On the other hand only 1000000 out of 8300000 12.7 caliber cartridges were found available, including all other types of bombs previously pointed out.
6. Will you therefore give instructions for the withdrawal of the ammunitions also bearing in mind that cartridges are most urgently needed and we will provide for their immediate withdrawal.
7. Moreover we ask you to let us know the locality in which we might be able to examine and check the ammunition required to complete the quantities of ammunition assigned according to letter A.S. 400 3295/054 D.O. dated 13th December 1946, to letter H.2. MIOUSA.

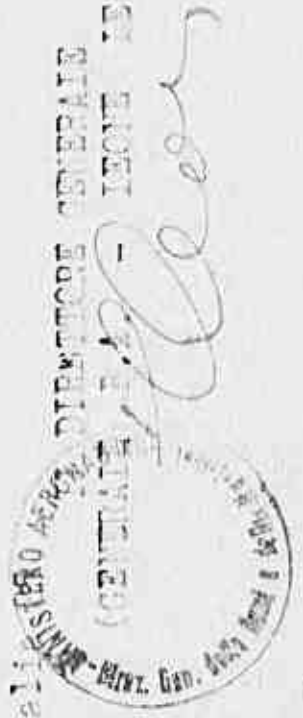

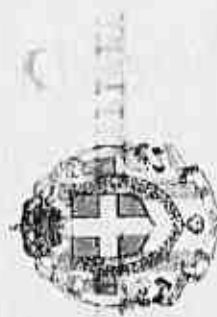

My Dear Mr. Bramson,

I feel it my duty to draw your attention to what appears to be a curious lack of co-ordination in certain Italian Government Departments whereby our best efforts to obtain some much needed ammunition for the Air Force have been rendered fruitless.

The matter concerned, so far as the Italian Air Ministry is concerned, with our letter reference AFRO/637/BA, dated 3rd December 1946, which informed the Air Ministry that an offer had been made by H.Q. MOWSA to the Government of Italy. Our letter of the same reference dated 7th January 1947 gave further details of the matter and a few days later a complete copy of the proposals addressed by H.Q. MOWSA to the Italian Government through the Chief Commissioner, was passed to the Italian Air Ministry for information. This is MOWSA letter AG 400.3295/US. D-0 dated 13th December 1946 with Admiral Stone's covering letter CC 8575 dated 3rd December 1946.

I think you will agree that, if the action requested in para. 5 of the H.Q. MOWSA letter had been taken promptly by the Department concerned, there would have been no difficulty in obtaining the ammunition which all agreed to be an urgent and necessary requirement. Instead, however, when Air Force officers, after some lapse of time, visited the sites, they found that disposal had already been effected by AFAP to civilian firms.

This disappointing result would appear to be due to a failure on the part of the responsible Government Department to carry out the instructions of para. 5 of the H.Q. MOWSA letter, particularly to the instructions of clause (b) (immediate notification to AFAP of the quantities to be surrendered). I also feel that the Air Ministry itself might in its own interest have approached the responsible Government Department or the AFAP organization itself with a view to ensuring that co-ordinated action was taken in a matter that concerned it so vitally.

I make this observation solely with a view to the future. I believe there are other dumps of ammunition still available and that it may not be too late to obtain some of them for the Italian Air Force. Also, other equipment often becomes available through AFAP and is lost to the Air Force through some unexplained reluctance to deal with them. It seems that action at a high ministerial level is necessary in these cases to ensure that things do not go astray.

Finally, in the matter of the ammunition, I am sure you will appreciate that the Allied authorities can do no more than they have already done. All surplus ammunition had in fact been sold to the Italian Government, as represented

Finally, in the matter of the acquisition, I am sure you will appreciate that the Allied authorities can do no more than they have already done. All surplus acquisition had in fact been sold to the Italian Government, as represented by AFAP, and the U.S. authorities expressed their willingness to revise their contract and permit the selected portion to be exempted from demilitarisation. Further action was then to be and still is entirely an Italian matter.
