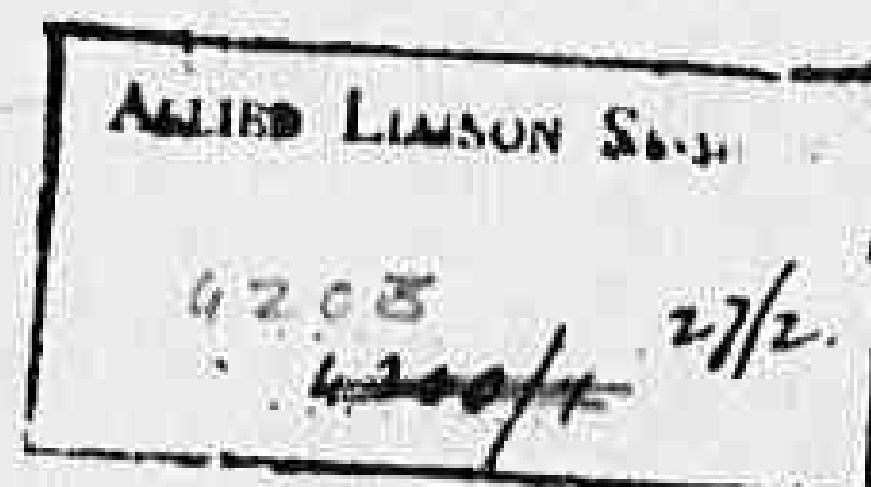

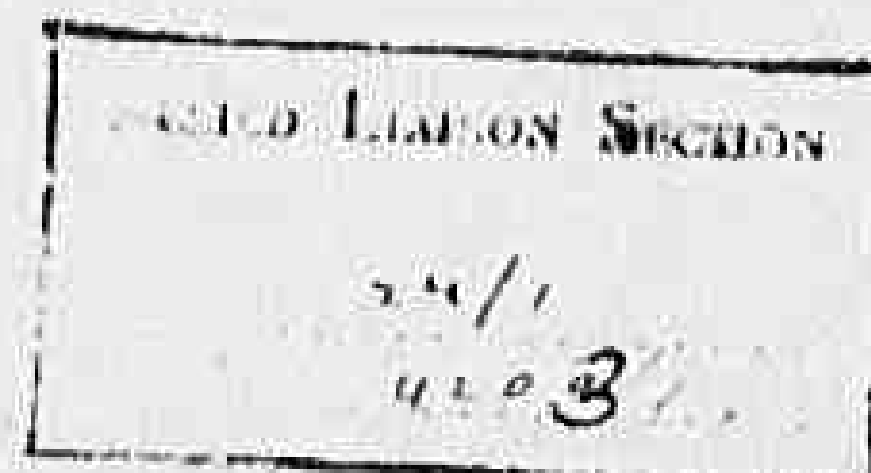

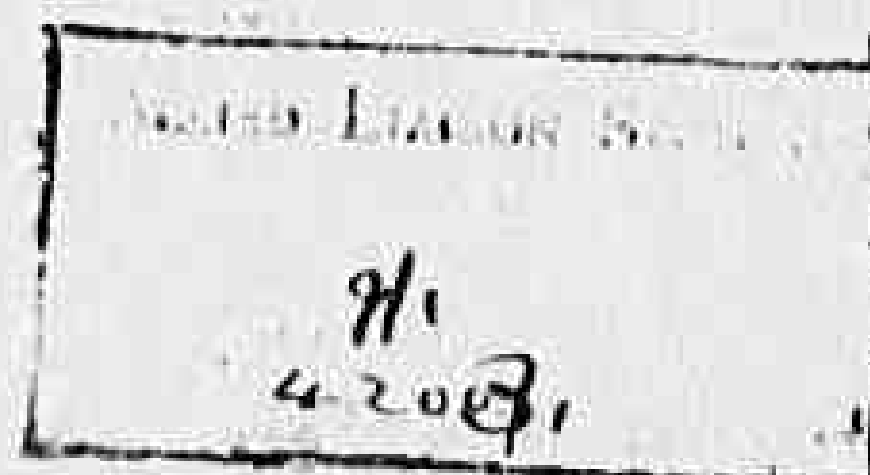

"I am informed by Lt/Colonel Hewitt (American) of G.3. Ops. at A.F.H.Q. Caserta that all concerned had begun to take an interest in the quality of the equipment being supplied the Italian Army in the same way the War Department was taking an interest in the quality of the aircraft being supplied the Italian Air Force. The United States War Department has expressed no opinion, so far as is known here (Caserta), on the Italian Army equipment nor has there been any suggestion, again in so far as is known here, of supplying the Italian Army from United States European sources."

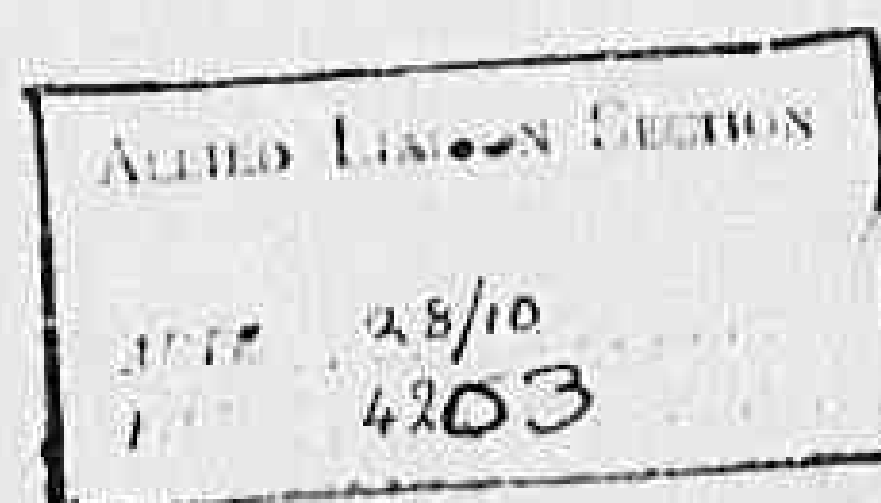

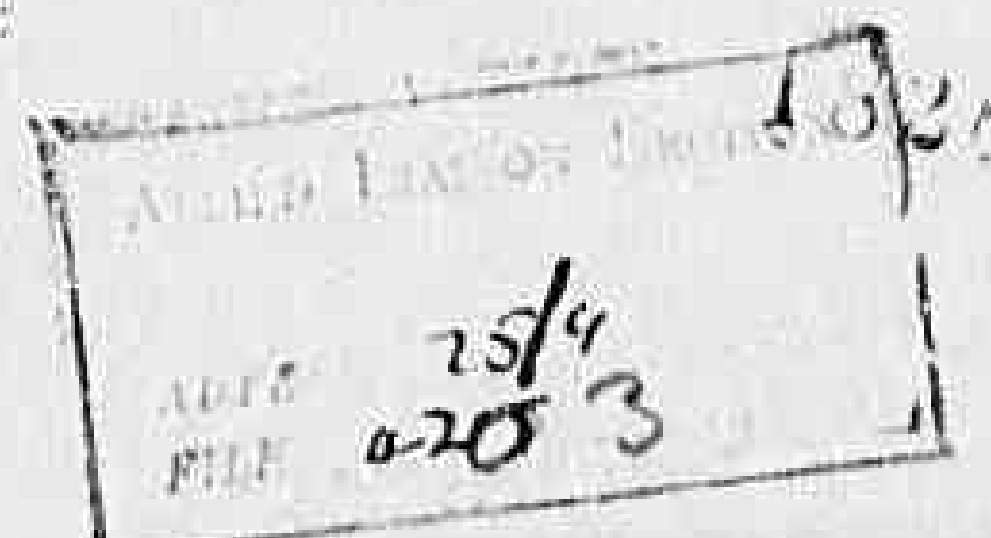

2. The Fighter Pilots of both Spitfire and P.38 Squadrons are now fully trained on their types. No operations have been carried out to date. The Baltimore crews are fully trained to operational standards for reconnaissance and photography. The Night Wing at Guidonia is composed of obsolescent Italian S.M.82 Aircraft, these crews are not in Night Flying practice.

3. Airfields and Sea Plane Bases:

Only Airfields and Sea-Plane Bases actually being used by the I.A.F. are shown hereunder: -

- a) Those controlled by I.A.F. - Bracciano, Centocelle, Frosinone, Levarano, Monserrato, Misida, Perugia, Urbe, Taranto, (sea planes) Turin, Venice, Bologna, Brindisi, Cagliari (sea Planes), Guidonia, Lecce, Milan, Linate, Palermo, Pomigliano.
- b) Allied Bases used by I.A.F. - Bari, Elmas, Trevino, Ciampino, Capodichino.

4. Training Schools:

- a) Frosinone. There is a navigation school at Frosinone. Courses last for three months and are attended by 36 Officers Pilots on each course. Pupils are either navigators or pilots. The standard of training is quite good, photographic exercises and land Recce reporting are good, but D.R. navigation over the sea, square

searches and other exercises of a G/R nature are rather inadequate. There is no night flying training and no Astro. The school uses Baltimores and each pupil does about 35 hours flying training.

- b) Lecce. There is a refresher flying school at Lecce, where Macchi 200 and 202 Aircraft are used. Training is on a separated primary and secondary bases.
- c) Cadet This is a purely academic training college and is in process of moving to Florence.

5. Strength of Italian Air Force:

This is shown in the Secret Publication "Italian Military Air Force Strength State", issued by the Italian Air Ministry on the 1st of each month.

6. Fighter Aircraft Spares:

Except for breaking down of other aircraft there are no spare available for the P.38 or P.39 aircraft. The position as regards Spitfire is also very unsatisfactory. There are certain amount of spares on hand for the Italian Fighters.

7. Transport and Sea Plane Aircraft Spares:

The transport spares (apart from the Baltimore aircraft) position is normal. The Sea Plane spares position is very unsatisfactory and the majority of the machines are awaiting complete overhaul.

8. General.

Only 16 P.38s are fitted with guns, the remainder of this type being photographic reconnaissance aircraft; 14 of the Baltimore A/C have been converted to passenger carrying. Further it must be noted that since May, 1945 no operationally serviceable aircraft have been handed over to the Italians, while of the 57 Spitfire IX aircraft recently handed over it is anticipated that approximately 40 only will be made serviceable, i.e. engines and airframes. No guarantee was given as to the condition of ancillary equipment, i.e. radio gear etc. No calibrating gear has been handed over to the Italians.

9. In the event of the Italian Air Force being called on to carry out any operational roll, it is felt that from an equipment point of view they would be little or no assistance on active operations. At the present moment although re-equipping is being carried out with Spitfire aircraft, the bulk of aircraft issued have already had a long life and require considerable overhaul. For this work although the R.A.F. promised a considerable spares backing i.e. about one year's maintenance, all of which equipment was authorised for issue, and is at present being collected, we are now informed that it will almost a hundred per cent be required back by the R.A.F. within the next 2 or 3 months. This leaves the Italian Air Force with 57 aircraft all of which require overhaul, and there-

fore they must revert to cannibalisation which will reduce the front line strength of aircraft to a figure which will be of no operational value.

10. Again in the case of Baltimore aircraft, spares have been promised for these aircraft but they are being shipped from the Middle East, they cover air frame spares only. As regards to the supply of any equipment other than engines or air frame spares for either these or Spitfire aircraft, no definite policy has been laid down as to what this Sub-Commission should supply and in fact although the I.A.F. raise many demands for general equipment required, for day to day maintenance and a working reserve, little or nothing is issued.

11. As far as ammunition and bombs are concerned, the position is that although the I.A.F. have certain quantities of bombs in their own depots, no authority has been given for their use (Csee MAAC/4208/AFALS/ dtd 7-8-46), the same applies to ammunition, aircraft are fitted with British and Americans Type of guns, but no ammunition is held neither is any being issued by sources (see MEDHE/4208/AFALS, dated the 12th of July, 1946).

2. Investigations have been made by this Sub Commission on the adaptability of Italian aircraft for this work. It is thought that the Cents are not suitable, due to their unserviceability rate. Also they are not ideal for fighter co-operation activities, as they have not the necessary manoeuvrability.
 3. Regarding single engine aircraft, the I.A.F. does not possess any type which can be readily adapted for target-towing.
 4. We suggest the possibility of re-forming a target-towing unit similar to the one recently operated by 23 A.A.C.U.
 5. It is suggested that the Vengeance aircraft formerly belonging to this unit, might be operated entirely by the Italians in the form of a mobile unit. This unit could then travel around fulfilling both Allied and Italian target-towing commitments both for anti-aircraft and fighter co-operation purposes.
 6. We would appreciate your views on the possibility of such a project.

It is believed that the American, and possibly British, Glider Units now stationed on Guidonia airfield will shortly be withdrawn, and that the airfield will, therefore, become vacant if it is not required for some other Allied purpose. It is requested that consideration be given to the aerodrome being derequisitioned when it is finished with, and handing it over to the Italian Air Force.

2. It was, before the war, the Experimental Establishment (equivalent to R.A.E. Farnborough,) and it had permanent buildings, although now most of them are destroyed, and the landing ground is said to remain fit practically throughout the winter, whereas the landing grounds at LITTONIA and CESTOCCELLE which are now occupied by Transport Italian Units, become unserviceable fairly often.

3. It is not intended at this moment to suggest any long-term policy as regards the aerodromes to be used by the Italians around ROME, although this might well have to be determined in September, and the decision will depend on the amount of air traffic and policy at CIAMINO.

4. Your early approval is, however, requested to allow of an Italian Air Force guard being placed on GUIDONIA airfield at a very early date in order to safe-guard the buildings that have been renovated against the degradations which are to be expected when the Allied Units move out; on this matter COL. TOWERS the C.O. of the American Glider Unit is in favour of having Italian guards provided.

1. With reference to your letter ABBG/351/ORG: dated 23rd. June, 1945, the Chief of Staff of this Headquarters has ruled that no further assistance is to be given by this Headquarters to the Italian Air Ministry in the preparation of establishments for the Italian Air Force until its policy regarding organisation and employment is settled.
2. The opportunity is taken to request that the Order of Battle of the Italian Air Force submitted by the Air Forces Sub-Commission to this Headquarters should be submitted in English so that the changes in organisation can be more easily recognised. As a guide an old copy of a Desert Air Force Order of Battle (Serial No. 20 dated 31st. May, 1945 (copy No. 2)) is enclosed herewith. This has been down-graded to secret, but should not in any way be communicated to the Italian Air Ministry, and it is requested that its receipt may now be acknowledged and that it may be returned to this Headquarters as soon as possible.
3. With regard to paragraph 2 of your letter, to facilitate the appreciation of Italian Air Force establishments, it would have been necessary to peruse a similar organisation chart which, in addition, would have needed to show the maintenance organisation and various administrative headquarters, e.g., ZAFS, supporting the operational units. For instance, in the Desert Air Force Order of Battle one can roughly assess the size of the Air Stores Parks, appreciating the ranges and numbers of aircraft that they serve. Similarly, the Order of Battle of the Italian Air Force, if required for review of establishments as a whole, would need to show the various maintenance units and their commitments.

Reference is made to the Interim Report on Italian Air-Sea Rescue forwarded under cover of our AFSC/42/Air dated 16th June, 1945. In this report, there are statements which are not quite accurate and the corrections are listed below.

Para. 3. Centrale Assistenza Volo (CAV) Brindisi.

The flying assistance centre at Brindisi is not in full operation because it has no satellite R.F. D/P station reporting to it. Investigations are proceeding at this moment in an endeavour to obtain the full C.A.V. organisation.

Para 6 (a) This is a dawn to dusk watch, not 24 hours.

Para 6 (c) (ii) Tests made with the I.A.F. R05 and B30 were satisfactory. This equipment is suitable for flying control work.

Para 6 (c) Allied Radio Aids are used by Italian aircraft. Appendices E and F of the Regia Aeronautica Signals Instruction are devoted to Allied Aids.

Where possible, work on the recommendations given on Page 3 is in hand.

Whilst on the way up to UDINE on Monday with the C-in-C he asked me some questions about the Italian Air Force vis-a-vis Balkan Air Force. During the course of conversation I incidentally suggested that it might be a good thing, in view of the political situation, particularly around MILAN, that a British Fighter Squadron should be stationed there, at least temporarily, and he thought it quite a good thing - he asked me whether I had suggested it to you, and I replied that I had not, but I do so now for what it is worth.

2. If your Headquarters decides that no British squadron shall be stationed at MILAN, it might be a good thing to put an Italian fighter squadron up there, preferably the Spitfire squadron. This is a very tentative suggestion, and no plans have been considered and nothing has so far been put on paper, but I believe that there would be sufficient accommodation at MILAN (LIRATI) for one squadron.

3. I would be grateful if you would let me know the reactions of your H.Q. to the above suggestion, and would you please keep A.L.S. informed.

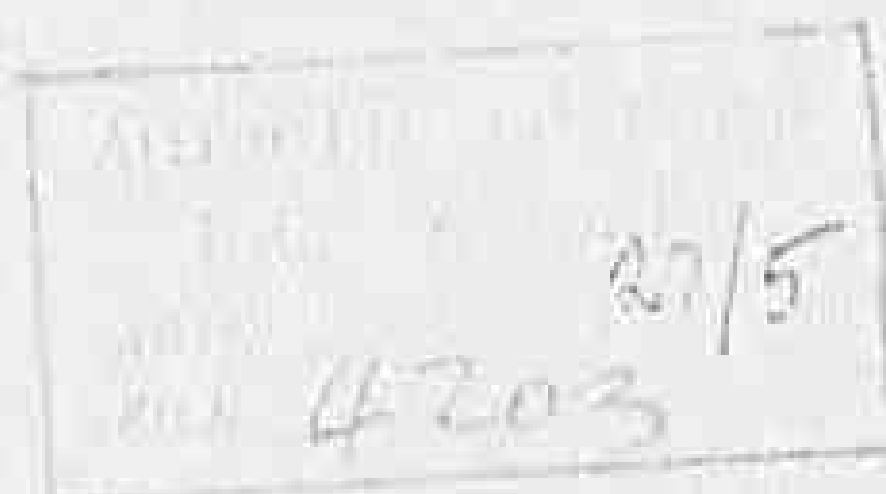

With reference to your GB.85 dated 17th May, I am sorry that you are in disagreement of the introduction of Moral Leadership Courses into the Italian Air Force, and that it was too late to stop information being given to the Italian Air Ministry.

2. When I got back from my visit to you in which you suggested that the Italian Air Force fighter squadrons should begin administration courses, I had an after-thought that it would be a good thing for them to do Moral Leadership Courses as well, largely to inculcate a Christian Spirit into those men who should be fitted to lead others in the correct way of living, which very briefly is, I think, the object of these courses, and at any rate, in my view, should be part of the training of an officer.

3. I had a long conversation with GROUP CAPTAIN O'CONNELL, the Senior R.A.F. Roman Catholic Chaplain at your Headquarters, before the leaflets were sent to the Air Ministry, and, in fact, O'CONNELL thought the idea a good one, and he gave me the leaflets personally; he had intended to contact the Senior Chaplain to all the Italian Fighting Services on this matter, but I am not sure whether he in fact was able to do so.

4. I hope to see you on Thursday, 24th May, when perhaps we can discuss this matter, and meantime no further information will be given to the Italian Air Ministry by this Headquarters.

The attached list shows the last known dispositions of these craft.

2. H.S.L. RAMA No. 1022 was a new boat of latest design and is urgently required in accordance with the new policy to replace a British H.S.L. for Air Sea Rescue service in the Adriatic. The remainder, if traceable, are all useful craft and even though possibly damaged, can be utilized for spare parts.

3. It is requested that enquiries may be made with a view to them being located and ultimately collected for use by the Italian Seaplane Wing.

Training Flying Control Officers - Italian
Air Force.

1. A loose minute has been received from the Aircraft Safety Section, suggesting that Italian Air Force officers should be trained in Flying Control Duties.

2. In support of this it is stated:-

As long as RAF Flying takes place in the Mediterranean theatre the elementary principles of Flying Control must be adhered to, and the routes over which RAF Flying takes place, a complete system should be in existence. Therefore, it would benefit all aircraft if Flying Control Stations were set up in Italy, Yugoslavia and Greece.

The undertaking of this training is considered to be of permanent value in that some sort of Flying Control over Europe is bound to be in operation after the war, for civil aircraft, and probably service aircraft also.

Italian officers could be trained at Brindisi or Palermo and it is suggested that it would be of great advantage if the I.A.F. could set up Flying Control at Rome.

3. This argument appears perfectly sound as far as flying generally is concerned, it does, however, require a ruling from the policy angle.

4. If this is put into effect it will mean that we are assuming that the I.A.F. will be existent after the war, and to some extent, depending upon its assistance to control flying during the post-war period.

5. Furthermore, there is the equipment point of view, and should this be mentioned it will mean that we must back up the I.A.F. by supplying them with the equipment necessary to carry out this project.

6. I would appreciate your guidance on this matter.

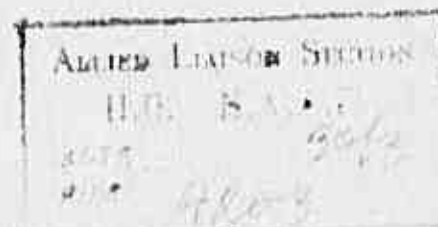

I have had a large number of reports from EARI that the U.S. Army is going to make an attempt to evict the I.A.F. from their Stores Depot at MINGIVACCA. There is no doubt that there is some move of this sort in progress.

2. As you will realise the effect of this on the I.A.F. would be quite catastrophic, and I really cannot see at this stage of the war why it should be necessary to take such a drastic step.
3. Such a step would be in complete violation of A.F.H.Q. circular No.21 dated 9th December 1944.

Reference is made to AIRSTAFF signal 13 370 dated 23rd March, and to Air Force Sub-Committee signal 1.150 dated March 26th 1945, addressed to your Headquarters and referring to a request by Adriatic Depot to take over H.A. No. 4 Base Italian Air Force Depot at England.

2. It is confirmed that it is the desire of this Headquarters that the Italian Air Force should remain in possession of the premises at England, as the operational and other needs of Italian Air Force serving with the H.A.F. are supplied from this Depot.

3. However, continuing telephone conversation Major Whiston - W/Adm. Warley, the H.A.F. through Air Force Sub-Committee from definite responsibilities in relation to the Italian Air Force; and would require to be fully examined before any re-allocation of premises took place.

4. It is understood, however, that there is little likelihood of Adriatic Depot's request being agreed at your Headquarters; but in the event of reconsideration being given to their application it would be appreciated if this Headquarters were afforded an opportunity for stating a detailed case for the retention of the England Depot by the Italian Air Force.

Until further instructions are received, it is requested that the following action be taken in respect of Italian Fighter Units which are withdrawn from operations under Royal Air Force Operational Control:

(i) In order to conserve petrol and oil, flying to be restricted to a maximum of 6 hours per pilot, except at the S.T.M. FERRIERE, where the conversion courses should continue.

(ii) Flying to be restricted to local areas only, i.e. within approximately 100 kilometers from base, and South of the Northern limits of the Provinces of VITERBO, TIVOLI and TERNI. It is undesirable that flying entailing the landing at an aerodrome other than the home base, should take place without the authority of the Senior R.A.F. Officer on the spot - for example, GROUP CAPTAIN GILSON at INOC.

(iii) In order to occupy Fighter Pilots, administration courses to be begun for both Officers and S.O.O's.

2. As regards these administration courses, the object is to take the opportunity of giving Officers and S.O.O's a greater knowledge of administration, discipline and Officer-like qualities. A syllabus as used in the Royal Air Force will be forwarded as soon as it is available, for your guidance.

3. In addition to administration courses, it is suggested that you should begin what we call, in the Royal Air Force, Moral Leadership Courses which would assist in the formation of Officer-like qualities and good behaviour. Specimen syllabuses for Roman Catholic and Protestant courses will also be forwarded as soon as possible, for your guidance.

4. Further instructions concerning the further employment of the fighter personnel will be forwarded as soon as they are determined.
