I have received your letter of 26 February urging that I accept the honorary presidency of a committee being constituted between the counties of Milan and Trento for the purpose of establishing a colony near Trento to take care of some 800 boy refugees from Cassino.

I appreciate greatly the honor you pay me in asking me to accept the honorary presidency. Nothing is closer to my heart than assistance to the poor children so grievously affected by the war. However, my position as Chief Commissioner of the Allied Commission is an appointment under the armistice which, as you can appreciate, is but temporary and will terminate upon the conclusion of the treaty of peace, or perhaps even earlier.

I was interested and a little surprised to read the paragraph on page 16 of the July 26th issue of "Telecommunications Reports" re the appointment of Mr. Dunn as Ambassador to Italy.

Who are the "Italian politicians" who charge me "with being too friendly to the country's monarchy"? If you do not know their names, what is the authority for the statement in question?

Actually, monarchists deeply resented my refusal to postpone the referendum in order to give them more time to campaign for the monarchy. My reasons for refusing to intervene in this question were given in the enclosed statement which was widely hailed by the republican press.
