SUBJECT: Traffic Regulations (U.S. Motor Transport)

TO : All Officers, 2675th Regiment, Allied Commission.

1. Official users of American motor transportation of this headquarters are hereby notified that existing instructions require a decrease in gasoline consumption. Therefore it is necessary that stricter supervision by the dispatchers and official users be applied.

a. In order to prevent gasoline from disappearing into irregular channels, the official users are requested not to apply for more than is absolutely necessary.

b. Gasoline requirements for each day's operation must be requested in remarks of the previous day's trip ticket and signed by the official user or no gasoline will be issued without a further written request stating reasons for the neglect.

c. A weekly report will be furnished to official users of assigned and daily dispatched cars for information as to hours driver worked, gasoline consumed, miles driver reported traveled and the daily time driver left and returned to the garage.

2. More cooperation and supervision in the proper completion of trip tickets is necessary in order for the dispatchers to have necessary information as to the official users desires for the next days operation, time for which driver is to be paid, and the preparation of required transportation records.

3. Attention is directed to attached Traffic Regulations No.1, Headquarters Rome Area, MTOUSA, dated March 15, 1946, which is being rigidly enforced.

4. "Remember": results must be obtained in the conservation of gasoline and overtime of drivers. More strenuous methods for conservation may be expected if present directives fail. Cooperation of all concerned is necessary and desired.

1. Paragraph 2a, Section VI, War Department Circular 383, dated 22 December 1945 provides the authority under which any individual may volunteer for overseas service in excess of the 2½ year maximum.

2. Any officer or enlisted man who has completed the 2½ years maximum overseas service, as set forth in War Department Circular 383 mentioned above, may elect to volunteer for further overseas service. The minimum period for which an officer or enlisted man may volunteer is 90 days. The first day of such volunteer service will be the day following the last day of the officer's or enlisted man's completion of 2½ years overseas service, or the day following the last day of each volunteer period for which the officer or enlisted man volunteers subsequent to his completion of 2½ years overseas service.

3. A volunteer statement, facsimile inclosed herewith, must be signed in duplicate by the individual concerned. The original certificate will be filed in the field 201 file and appropriate entry will be made in the Service Record under "Remarks Administrative" for enlisted man and under "Remarks" on the form 66-1 in the case of officers. Duplicate copy of the certificate will be transmitted to this Headquarters for file in the Adjutant General's records.

SUBJECT: "Class Four" Volunteer Enlisted men.

TO : All units, this Command.

1. Enlisted personnel who are eligible for separation under existing discharge criteria may now volunteer for a period of 60 days or greater. All such volunteer statements will terminate on the last day of a month.

2. Personnel wishing to volunteer will sign the following statement which will be filed with EM's service record.

"Regardless of any present eligibility for separation under discharge criteria as announced by War Department on 15 January 1946, I elect to remain on continued active duty with the overseas or major command to which I am presently assigned as a class IV volunteer until (here insert desired date), or for the duration of the present emergency plus six months; whichever is sooner unless sooner relieved for the convenience of the Government."

Mr. Johnson of Colorado introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Military Affairs

A BILL

To provide for the appointment of additional commissioned officers in the Regular Army, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled. That it is hereby declared the policy of the Congress to provide for the immediate selection for appointment in the Regular Army in a fair and equitable manner of a limited number of persons who, by their outstanding performance of duties while serving as temporary officers of the Army of the United States during the present wars, have demonstrated their fitness to hold commissioned grade in the Regular Army; and to provide a minimum increase in the commissioned officer strength of the Regular Army for that purpose.

Sec. 2. On and after the effective date of this Act the commissioned strength of the Regular Army shall not exceed twenty-five thousand officers: Provided, that notwithstanding the foregoing limitation on the commissioned strength of the Regular Army, graduates of the United States Military Academy may be promoted and commissioned as second lieutenants in the Regular Army in accordance with the provisions of the Act of May 17, 1886 (24 Stat. 50; 10 U.S.C. 486).

Sec. 3. The President is authorized to bring the actual commissioned strength of the Regular Army up to the commissioned strength specified in section 2 of this Act by the appointment and commissioning of additional officers, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, in such arms and services of the Regular Army as he may prescribe. Appointments of such additional commissioned officers may be made in accordance with any existing provision of law providing for the appointment of commissioned officers in the Regular Army, or as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 4. At any time not later than a date eight months following the

Sec. 2. On and after the effective date of this Act the commissioned strength of the Regular Army shall not exceed twenty-five thousand officers: Provided, that notwithstanding the foregoing limitation on the commissioned strength of the Regular Army, graduates of the United States Military Academy may be promoted and commissioned as second lieutenants in the Regular Army in accordance with the provisions of the Act of May 17, 1886 (24 Stat. 59; 10 U.S.C. 486).

Sec. 3. The President is authorized to bring the actual commissioned strength of the Regular Army up to the commissioned strength specified in section 2 of this Act by the appointment and commissioning of additional officers, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, in such arms and services of the Regular Army as he may prescribe. Appointments of such additional commissioned officers may be made in accordance with any existing provision of law providing for the appointment of commissioned officers in the Regular Army, or as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 4. At any time not later than a date eight months following the date of enactment of this Act, the President is authorized to appoint and commission additional officers in the Regular Army, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, in the grades of second lieutenant, first lieutenant, captain and major, subject to the conditions and limitations hereinafter set forth. Persons appointed under the provisions of this section shall---

(a) be male citizens of the United States, at least twenty-one years of age, of good moral character, physically qualified for active military service, and have such other qualifications as may be prescribed by the Secretary of War; and shall

(b) have served honorably in the active Federal service as commissioned officers of the Army of the United States, or any component thereof, on or after December 7, 1941, in grades equal to or higher than those prescribed in section 5 of this Act for officers credited with the amounts of service with which they would be credited under that section if appointed in the Regular Army.

Sec. 5. Each person appointed as a commissioned officer of the Regular Army under the provisions of section 4 of this Act shall be credited, at the time of appointment, with service equivalent to the total period of active Federal service performed by him as a commissioned officer in the Army of the United States or any component thereof from December 7, 1941, to the date of such appointment, or a period of service equal to the numbers of days, months and years by which his age at the time of such appointment exceed,

twenty-five years, whichever is the greater: Provided, that in computing the total period of active commissioned Federal service of any such person who was honorably discharged or relieved from active service subsequent to May 12, 1945, there shall also be credited the period from the date of his discharge or relief from active service to the date of his appointment in the Regular Army under the provisions of section 4 of this Act. Upon the basis of service so credited the grade in which each such person shall be appointed shall be determined as follows:

(a) Persons appointed in arms of service of the Regular Army, the officers of which are on the promotion list, who are credited with less than three years' service shall be appointed in the grade of second lieutenant; such persons who are credited with three or more years' service, but less than ten years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of first lieutenant; such persons who are credited with ten or more years' service but less than seventeen years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of captain; and such persons who are credited with seventeen or more years' service, but less than twenty-three years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of major. Such persons shall be placed on the promotion list immediately below these officers of the same grade having the same or next greater period of service;

(b) Persons appointed in the Medical Corps, the Dental Corps, or the Veterinary Corps of the Regular Army, or as chaplains in the Regular Army, who are credited with less than three years' service shall be appointed in the grade of first lieutenant; such persons who are credited with three or more years' service, but less than twelve years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of captain; and such persons who are credited with twelve or more years' service, but less than twenty years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of major;

(c) Persons appointed in the Medical Administrative Corps of the Regular Army who are credited with less than five years' service shall be appointed in the grade of second lieutenant; such persons who are credited with five or more years' service, but less than ten years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of first lieutenant; and such persons who are credited with ten or more years' service, but less than seventeen years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of captain;

(d) Persons appointed in the Pharmacy Corps of the Regular Army who are credited with less than three years' service shall be appointed in the grade of second lieutenant; such persons who are credited with three or more years' service, but less than six years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of first lieutenant; such persons who are credited with six or more years' service, but less than twelve years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of captain; and such persons who are credited with twelve or more years' service but less than twenty years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of major.

6. No person shall be appointed as a commissioned officer of the

(b) Persons appointed in the Regular Army, or as chaplains in the Regular Army, or as chaplains in the Regular Army, shall be appointed in the grade of first lieutenant; such persons who are credited with three or more years' service, but less than twelve years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of captain; and such persons who are credited with twelve or more years' service, but less than twenty years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of major:

(c) Persons appointed in the Medical Administrative Corps of the Regular Army who are credited with less than five years' service shall be appointed in the grade of second lieutenant; such persons who are credited with five or more years' service, but less than ten years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of first lieutenant; and such persons who are credited with ten or more years' service, but less than seventeen years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of captain;

(d) Persons appointed in the Pharmacy Corps of the Regular Army who are credited with less than three years' service shall be appointed in the grade of second lieutenant; such persons who are credited with three or more years' service, but less than six years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of first lieutenant; such persons who are credited with six or more years' service, but less than twelve years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of captain; and such persons who are credited with twelve or more years' service but less than twenty years' service, shall be appointed in the grade of major.

Sec. 6. No person shall be appointed as a commissioned officer of the Regular Army under the provisions of section 4 of this Act.

(a) in a promotion-list arm of service if he would upon appointment receive credit for twenty-three or more years' service under section 5 of this Act;

(b) in the Medical Corps, the Dental Corps, the Veterinary Corps, the Pharmacy Corps, or as a chaplain, if he would upon appointment receive credit for twenty or more years' service under section 5 of this Act; or

(c) in the Medical Administrative Corps if he would upon appointment receive credit for seventeen or more years' service under section 5 of this Act.

Sec. 7. For the purpose of determining eligibility for promotion, each person appointed as a commissioned officer of the Regular Army under the provisions of section 4 of this Act shall be credited, as of the time of such appointment, with continuous commissioned service on the active list of the Regular Army equal to the period of service credited to him under section 5 of this Act. Each such person appointed in a promotion-list arm of service in the grade of major shall be deemed to have served in that grade during that portion of such credited service which exceeds seventeen years.

SUBJECT: Retention Desires of Officers

TO : All Officers, 2675th Regiment

1. The War Department has revoked all previously signed statements regarding retention desires of officers and has established a new procedure which is published in War Department Circular 366, 1945.

2. Accordingly all officers are advised that any previous statements made by them regarding retention desires are null and void and it is necessary that they read the afore-mentioned circular and sign one of the statements contained therein.

3. Attention is invited to the fact that the date agreed on for category IV volunteers must be at least 60 days subsequent to the date statement is signed. In this connection it is requested that officers of this command who sign category IV statements make the termination date of such statements the last day of the month in which the officer desires to be released.

4. Blank statements covering each category are included herewith and it is directed that all officers make their decision and return the appropriate statement in triplicate immediately upon receipt of this communication, and in no case dispatching them later than 15 January 1946.

5. For the information of all concerned there are inclosed copies of Section IV, WD Cir 366 and the bill now before Congress in regard to integration of Reserve, National Guard and AUS officers into the RA.

IV. OFFICERS. 1. The purpose of this circular is to establish a procedure whereby Reserve, National Guard, and Army of the United States officers may volunteer to continue on extended active duty.

2. The demobilization program is pointed toward an orderly reduction in the strength of the Army with the over-all reduction in the strength of the officer corps proportionate to the reduction of enlisted personnel. It is the desire of the War Department when relieving officers from active duty to give every possible consideration to the wishes of the individual officer concerned and, at the same time, utilize to the maximum extent the services of officers who desire to continue on extended active duty. In the past, various means have been established whereby an officer may elect to remain on active duty by signing statements which were of an interim nature. The War Department is now prepared to furnish officers throughout the Army with information they have requested. Accordingly, it is considered appropriate to revoke all outstanding volunteering statements; establish the categories of statements listed below; and require each officer concerned to sign one of the statements after studying the information contained in this circular and evaluating the future as it affects him personally in the light of further active service. While no definite assurance can be given individual officers regarding the length of time their services will be needed by the Army, it is the intent of the War Department that those officers with the highest record of performance of duty who desire to be retained in the service will be retained longest.

2025 3. The War Department considers it essential that officers be informed of the War Department policies with respect to the following matters prior to determining how long they want to continue on extended active duty: integration and appointment of temporary officers in the Regular Army; length of tours of overseas duty; and movement of dependents and household goods. The final details of these policies will be announced at a later date; however, the major principles are substantially as outlined below.

a. Integration and appointment of temporary officers in the Regular Army. Legislation is now pending in Congress which would increase the size of the Regular Army officers corps. This legislation will authorize the integration of approximately 10,000 selected wartime officers into the Regular Army in the grades of second lieutenant through major, inclusive. Officers to be integrated into the Regular Army will be selected on a standardized competitive basis in a fair and equitable manner from all temporary commissioned officers of the Army of the United States who are United States citizens and on the date of appointment held a temporary rank equal to or higher than the rank to be offered as described below. Appointees must meet certain general fitness, intelligence, and physical standards. General fitness will be determined from a completed officer evaluation report executed by one of three previous commanding officers of the candidate's choice, a standardized interview conducted by an Officer Interview Board and a Biographical Information Blank. The candidate's intelligence level must be demonstrated by satisfactory completion of a General Survey Test. Physical standards are those required for assignment of a commissioned officer in the Regular Army. So far

as possible, an appointee will be commissioned in the arm or service of his choice within arm or service vacancies. The rank which will be offered the officer selected for integration will be determined on a basis of actual or constructive service, whichever is greater. Actual service is the total number of years, months, and days that the officer has actively served in the Army of the United States from 7 December 1941 to the date of appointment. Constructive service is the number of years, months, and days by which the officer's age on the date of appointment exceeds 25 years. If the officer's actual service is greater, the appointee will be placed in an advanced position on the promotion list or nonpromotion list proportionate to the number of years, months, and days of actual service. If constructive service is greater the appointee will be placed in an advanced position on the promotion list proportionate to the number of years, months, and days of his constructive service. Thus, using the appointee's actual or constructive service, whichever is greater, on the date of his appointment into the Regular Army, the following rank would be offered:

b. Length of tours of oversea duty. In order to provide equitable tours of oversea and zone of interior service, the War Department has under consideration for early implementation a policy which will prescribe a maximum oversea tour of 2 1/2 years. Consideration will not be given to oversea service performed prior to 7 December 1941 and to the length of time officers have served in the continental United States.

c. Movement of dependents and household goods. All Reserve, National Guard, and Army of the United States Officers (except general officers and those on terminal leave), irrespective of their eligibility for relief from active duty, will be encouraged to sign one of the above categories of statements at the earliest practicable date and, in any event, will be required to sign one of the above categories of statements not later than 31 January 1946. The appropriate statement will be entered on the Officer's Qualification Card (D AGO Form 66-1, 66-2, or 66-3) under "Remarks" and on the Officer's Adjusted Service Rating Score Card.

6. As of 31 January 1946 each command immediately subordinate to the War Department will be required to furnish a report which for category I, II, and III volunteers will include the following information: Category, efficiency index (as specified in Appendix I, IR 1-5), primary military occupational specialty, arm or service (except Army Air Forces type personnel), number of months of cumulative overseas service since 7 December 1941, age, race and grade. Category IV and V officers will be reported by total number only in each category. This report will be prepared by machine records units or statistical control units where such units are available to the command concerned, or will be prepared manually by those commands not serviced by machine records units facilities. A separate letter of instruction setting forth complete detail will be forwarded to each command by air mail at an early date.

7. All officers concerned are requested to consider carefully the factors set forth in paragraph 3 and 4, bearing in mind national and military commitments and obligations, and sign the category of statement which best suits their own personal desires and conditions. Should a sufficient number of officers volunteer for continued active service it may be possible to relieve officers from active duty based primarily on their desires.

SUBJECT: Application for Temporary Duty in the US.

TO : All Units this Regiment.

1. Letter, this Headquarters, subject as above, dated 27 October 1945, is rescinded.

2. Effective immediately the following personnel will not be eligible for temporary duty to the United States, except as qualified by par 3 below:

a. Officers other than Medical Department:
Individuals having more than 2 years 9 months service or an ASRS of 48 or above or age 49.

b. Medical Department Officers:
Medical Corps, ASR score 45, or age 40, or 2 years 6 months service
Dental Corps, ASR score 45, or age 40, or 2 years 6 months service
Sanitary Corps, ASR score 30, or age 35, or 2 years 6 months service.

c. Enlisted Men:
Individuals having more than 21 months of service, or an ASRS 36 or above, or age 37, or age 34 for individuals with more than one year of service.

d. Length of service as used herein includes total active commissioned or enlisted service since 16 September 1940 and continues to accrue with the passage of time.

e. Adjusted rating service rating score as used herein is the score computed for each individual as of 2 September 1945.

3. Exceptions to paragraph 2 above:

- a. Regular Army personnel
- b. Officers who are Class "A" Volunteers
- c. Enlisted Men who are Class I Volunteers.

4. In addition to the requirements of paragraphs 2 and 3 above, a minimum of 18 months continuous overseas service is required.

5. Qualified officers who wish to apply for temporary duty must sign the following statement, to be submitted in duplicate with letter of application:

"In applying for temporary duty in the United States I certify that I understand that if this temporary duty is granted I will remain under the control of the Mediterranean Theater of Operations, US Army, unless I meet current War Department Screening criteria for overseas shipment. I further certify that I will not under any circumstances seek assignment in the Zone of Interior."

6. Applications will be submitted on the letter of application form distributed as inclosure 1 to letter referred to in paragraph 1, above.

7. The application will be forwarded to the person under whom the applicant actually performs duty for accomplishment of the 1st Indorsement, who will forward it through channels to reach this Headquarters not later than the 25th of the month preceding the requested effective date.

I. ACCOUNTING FOR AUTHORIZED ALLOWANCES OF EQUIPMENT UPON CHANGE OF
STATION.

1. Officers and enlisted men transferred from one company to another, this regiment, will take with them one (1) Cot, canvas, folding, and authorized allowances of individual small arms and equipment.

a. In order to account for the transfer, a Shipping Ticket listing the abovementioned items will be prepared in triplicate by the (old) unit commander from which the individual is transferred, and forwarded with attached Memorandum Receipt through this headquarters to the (new) commanding officer of the unit to which the individual is transferred.

b. Copies of the Shipping Ticket will be distributed as follows:

- (1) The new commanding officer will retain the Memorandum Receipt and the third copy of the Shipping Ticket as a debit voucher to his Company Property Book. He will sign two (2) copies of the Shipping Ticket and return them through channels to the old commanding officer.
- (2) Regimental Supply Office will withdraw the duplicate signed copy of the Shipping Ticket as an information copy.
- (3) Regimental Supply Office will indorse the original copy of the Shipping Ticket on to the old commanding officer who will use it as a credit voucher to his Company Property Book.

2. Units having excess stocks of cots and individual small arms will turn in the excess amounts to Regimental Supply by normal procedure.

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE FOR SUPPLY SECURITY CONTROL

1. Fencing:

a. Motor Parks not within a guarded building will be surrounded by barbed wire fencing with one entrance and one exit which will be guarded by military personnel. Special Orders preventing unauthorized persons from entering or leaving the park will be issued.

b. Ration Rooms whether they are within a mess hall or warehouse will be fenced with ordinary chicken wire wherever a probable means of entry other than a door is noticed. Door will be kept locked when room is not occupied by military personnel and only one key should be in the possession of the responsible military representative.

c. Supply Rooms (same as above)

2. Guard Towers:

a. Guard towers will be erected in the case of extremely large motor parks where lack of sufficient military guards prevails or where large quantities of supplies are stored under canvas.

3. Guards:

a. Motor parks or garages will have guards posted 24 hours per day. During the daylight hours dispatcher may be utilized as guard provided that the motor park has only one means of entrance.

b. Ration rooms and warehouses will be guarded constantly. Guard may be a Charge of Quarters who will make tours of the premises at irregular and frequent intervals during hours of darkness.

4. Entrances and Exits:

a. Entrances and exits of all installations will have guards posted whenever practicable. If not practicable due to lack of personnel, entrances and exits will be kept locked at all times and opened only after identification of authorized personnel.

b. Office furniture such as typewriters and adding machines will be placed under lock and key upon leaving the respective office where the item is in use. Guards at exits will be instructed to examine all parcels that appear large enough to cover equipment of this type.

SOP Supply Security Control (cont'd)

c. In addition to General Orders, Special Orders will be issued from time to time depending upon the necessity, locality and situation.

5. Flood lights:

a. Flood lights will be utilized on all open car parks, entrances and exits which are in function during the night. Lights will be erected high enough so that the maximum exposed area will be illuminated.

6. Traffic Control:

a. In car parks, motor pools, supply installations and exposed supply dumps, a one way traffic will be maintained wherever practicable. This will be in coordination with the entrance and exit instructions, thereby prohibiting any vehicle from exiting without surveillance from the appointed guard.

7. Pass System:

a. Pass system will be initiated in any military installation where a group of more than 15 laborers is employed. Passes should bear the name printed and the signature of both the laborer and officer authorizing the bearer entrance to the installation.

8. Guards and Laborers:

a. Guards will be checked at frequent intervals to satisfy the responsible officer that guards are fully aware of their responsibilities. Laborers who physically handle U. S. supplies must be cautioned and checked for all possible means of pilferage. A physical search prior to daily departure of each laborer will be made by an officer or the commander of the guards. Vehicles will be checked for loads, and guards will be mounted on the rear of each truck whenever possible.

9. Checks and Tallies:

a. A simple debit and credit system will be maintained on all items stocked in warehouses and a daily or weekly running inventory should be made wherever practicable.

10. Vehicle Movement of Supplies:

a. Supplies will be moved in small convoys. When drawing rations or other supplies from a warehouse, the following will apply:

- (1) A checker will be posted at the tail gate of the vehicle in order to prevent loss while loading.
- (2) A checker within the depot will check off items prior to their loading and a signature will be obtained as an acknowledgment that the items listed thereon were received and were all in apparent good condition.

SOP Supply Control (cont'd)

- (3) Armed guard will travel on rear of the truck to prevent pilferage while in transit.
- (4) The consignee will check all loads received by him during the unloading and will report all shortages, overages and damages immediately to the consignor.

11. Showdown Inspection of Troops.

a. Inspection will not only be made physically, but whenever possible, the Enlisted Men's Form #52 will be used as a basis for determining unauthorized items of government property in the hands of troops. Disciplinary action will be taken upon the initiation of a Statement of Charges for loss of property.

12. Illegal Disposition of Government Property.

a. The following is extracted from Provost Marshal General Security Instructions for the information and guidance of all concerned:

*

*

*

"15. Illegal Disposition of Government Property.

a. Articles of War 84 and 94 prohibit the sale, wrongful disposition, misappropriation or diversion of United States government property to unauthorized persons. In this connection, particular attention is directed to the fact that abandonment, misappropriation or bartering in any way of Army rations, gasoline and oils, captured materiel, clothing and equipment and Army Exchange supplies of all types fall under the provisions of these articles and Army Regulations.

b. All military personnel who observe any act of abandonment, pilferage or illegal diversion of United States government property will, without delay, apprehend the offender, obtain the name, grade, organization and serial number of the offender. They will also obtain similar information concerning witnesses, if any, and submit a detailed report of the incident to the appropriate commander having courts-martial jurisdiction. If apprehension is not possible, all information available will be obtained, and a similar detailed report of the incident will be made. The information obtained from military offenders will be checked against their War Department Identification Cards and Tags. When there is no doubt as to the veracity of information given, the individual will be turned over to the Military Police.

c. Negligence on the part of any United States military personnel in reporting crimes of this nature will be considered dereliction of duty and will be punished accordingly.

d. All commanders having courts-martial jurisdiction will issue such additional instructions as may be necessary to enforce compliance with the foregoing and will take strict disciplinary action in all cases."

SUBJECT: Limitation upon Forfeitures by Sentence of Court-Martial.

TO : See Distribution.

1. Following is an extract from War Department Circular 484, 29 December 1944:

"III -- Foreign Service.-- 1. With reference to Section 2, Act 16 June 1942 (56 Stat. 360; 37 U.S.C. 102; M.L. 1939, Sup II, Sec. 1371c-2), relative to pay for foreign service, an extract of an opinion of the Judge Advocate General, 25 November 1944, is quoted below:

"It is the opinion of this office that * * * a soldier is not entitled to foreign service pay for any period during which he is confined pursuant to a sentence adjudging confinement * * * While the increase in pay of an enlisted man for foreign service is included within the term "base pay" as used in the fourth subparagraph of paragraph 104c, Manual for Courts-Martial, 1928, * * * the amount of pay which may be forfeited by courts-martial is governed by the actual pay status of the accused at the time the forfeiture is imposed * * *. Accordingly, * * * in determining the maximum limits of forfeiture prescribed by paragraph 104, Manual for Courts-Martial, 1928, in cases in which the sentence of a court-martial adjudges confinement and partial forfeitures, foreign service pay may not properly be considered as an element of pay subject to forfeiture * * *"

"2. Section II, Circular No. 437, War Department, 1944, pertaining to the foregoing subject is rescinded."

20 The information contained in this extract should be brought to the attention of all special courts-martial and summary court officers for their guidance as to the amount of forfeiture to be imposed in cases where confinement is adjudged.

Circular No. 3, this headquarters, dated 27 April 1944, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. A brief report of loss, damage, or destruction through enemy action, theft, accident, and/or salvage will be submitted to this headquarters within 48 hours by the responsible officer through the Company Commander. Report will list time, place, serial number, type of vehicle and a brief explanation.

2. In addition to the above, the following action will be taken:

a. Where loss, damage or destruction is the result of enemy action or is without fault or neglect on the part of the responsible officer, the property may be dropped on certificate (Certificate of Loss) with supporting papers (Affidavits and Certificates) of the responsible officer and no report of survey need be made. (Ref Par 6, Cir #57, NATOUSA, 1944). This certificate will be forwarded in quadruplicate by a letter of transmittal to the Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, Allied Commission, for approval. If approved, a signed copy will be returned for Company files, to be used as a credit voucher. A replacement vehicle will be requisitioned through the RSO, 2675th Regiment, Allied Commission, supported by a copy of the certificate.

b. Where loss, damage, or destruction of property has resulted from a probable negligence or culpability, the responsible person will either pay for the property or initiate a report of survey through the Company Commander, (Ref Pars 1 & 2, AR 35-6640, and Par 7, Cir #57, NATOUSA, 1944) within thirty days, unless exceptional circumstances which will be explained by an officer's certificate, prevent such action within the prescribed period. It is the duty of the Company Commander to provide adequate clerical help to aid the responsible officer in drafting and initiating a report of survey. Reference will be made to the following directives and forms prior to initiating a report of survey:

WD AGO Form #15

c. Prior to forwarding reports of survey to the Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, Allied Commission, for further action, a careful check will be made to insure that all supporting papers, certificates, and affidavits are attached. All papers will be prepared in quadruplicate. Par 8b, AR 35-6640 requires reports to be made in triplicate. However, reports forwarded to this headquarters will be in quadruplicate to allow one copy for file in the office of S-4, this Regiment.

1. It has come to the attention of this headquarters that officers and enlisted men, having been placed on temporary duty or attached other organizations within the Regiment, are departing parent organizations without necessary mess and field equipment, blankets and other necessary items for comfort and personal protection.

CHARGE: Violation of the 94th Article of War.

Specification: In that Tec 5 AMIL O. NUDI, Company "D", 2675th Regiment, Allied Control Commission, APO 394, US Army, for the purpose of obtaining approval allowance and payment of a claim against the United States, by presenting to an officer of the United States, duly authorized to approve, pay and allow such claims, did at Mitchel Field, New York on or about the 8th day of July 1943 make an oath to the effect that he was married to Margaret S. Boksau, which said oath was false in that this marriage was illegal because of his first marriage to Virginia Greco in Italy in the year 1927, and never divorced, and was then known by the said soldier to be false.

PLEAS

To the specification and the charge: "Not Guilty"

FINDINGS

Of the specification and the charge: "Guilty"

SENTENCE

To be confined at hard labor, at such place as the reviewing authority may direct, for six (6) months and to forfeit Forty-four dollars (\$44.00) of his pay per month for a like period. (Record of no previous convictions considered).

The sentence was adjudged on 1 August 1944 as pertaining to the confinement and 17 August 1944 as pertaining to the forfeiture.

The sentence is approved and will be duly executed, but the execution thereof, in so far as it related to confinement at hard labor, is suspended.

TO : All Concerned.

1. Under the provisions of AR 600-185, dated 13 October 1942, as amended, the following information is published for your guidance in accomplishing semi-annual Efficiency Reports to be rendered as of 30 June 1944.

I - FIELD GRADE OFFICERS

1. An Efficiency Report on WD AGO Form Number 67 will be rendered on each officer of field grade of all components by the Senior (American) officer within each Company or Sub-Commission of Allied Control Commission on 30 June 1944 for the preceding six (6) months, (1 January 1944 to 30 June 1944 inclusive). Efficiency Reports will be rendered in duplicate on officers of field grade and on officers specifically subject to provisions of paragraphs 3b and c, AR 600-185. Original and duplicate copy will be signed by the reporting officer and forwarded to higher authority, as stated in paragraph 6, AR 600-185. All reports will be forwarded by the reporting officer within 10 days after close of the period covered by the report, - Change #5, AR 600-185, dtd 14 Apr 44).

2. This Efficiency Report consists of completed paragraphs, A, B, C, E, F, H-10, L, M, N, P, Q, and S of WD AGO Form Number 67. No others will be filled in. Paragraph 3c, AR 600-185, states that a full report may be submitted if the reporting officer so desires. However, in view of the number of field grade officers in this organization, and in order to provide a system of uniformity, it is requested that no full reports be rendered.

a. Paragraph "A" will include name, serial number, grade, arm or service, organization and official duty status of the rated officer to the officer rendering the report.

03 b. Paragraph "B" will show the entire six month period for which the report is rendered regardless of the length of time the officer reported upon has been under the command of the reporting officer. However, in the event that a SPECIAL Efficiency Report has been rendered on an officer for any portion of the six month period and the WD AGO Form 66-1 so indicated, the semi-annual report will not include that period of time, but a notation to that effect will be entered under Paragraph "P".

c. Paragraph "C" will include all stations at which the officer served during the period covered by the report. Such entries as "North Africa", "Sicily", "Italy", "Camp Grant, Ill", etc., are appropriate.

In the event that there are no entries on the enclosed Efficiency reports, it is to be understood that there are no entries on WD AGO Form 66-1 (or that WD AGO Form 66-1 is not on file at this headquarters).
- (3) If principal duties for any period of time are not recorded and the officer upon whom the report is rendered cannot furnish necessary information or no duties have been assigned for any period, a remark, "Unknown" followed by the period of time will be made.
- (4) All fractions of months will be shown in thirtieths, (5/30, 14/30, etc). The total length of service shown in this paragraph will agree with length of service covered by the report.
- (5) In describing the manner of performance of duty or in making any ratings, the following terms will be used:
 - (a) Superior: Outstanding and exceptional performance of the particular duty reported upon. Personal characteristics, professional qualifications, or efficiency above that considered EXCELLENT. (SUP).
 - (b) Excellent: Performance of the particular duty reported upon in a very efficient manner. Personal characteristics, professional qualifications, or efficiency above VERY SATISFACTORY but below SUPERIOR. (E).
 - (c) Very Satisfactory: Performance of a particular duty reported upon in an efficient manner, or efficiency above that acceptable as SATISFACTORY. (VS).
 - (d) Satisfactory: Performance of the particular duty reported upon or personal characteristics or professional qualifications up to a minimum standard - passably efficient. (S).
 - (e) Unsatisfactory: Performance of the particular duty reported upon or personal characteristics or professional qualifications below minimum standard - inefficient. (U).

- (f) Unknown: To be used in all cases in which the reporting officer has had insufficient opportunity during the period covered by this report to observe the officer reported upon to permit a rating as to the performance of the particular duty, his personal characteristics or professional qualifications. - (6) Whenever an efficiency report contains entries which may be considered in any sense unfavorable, the reason for the entry will be clearly stated, and the reporting officer will refer the entire report by indorsement to the officer reported upon for remark. (Par 5, AR 600-185).
- (7) In all cases the rating of "Unsatisfactory" will be considered as unfavorable except when based on physical condition of person reported upon. Any comments which detract from the reputation or the lack of good qualities of the officer will also be considered as unfavorable. For the purpose of determining when a report is to be referred to the officer reported upon, no distinction will be made between unfavorable entries of fact and opinion. (Par 5, AR 600-185).
- e. Paragraph "F" will be filled out completely by indicating an "X" in the appropriate square. If any of the six items are unknown it will be indicated by placing an "X" under the Unknown column.
- f. Paragraph "H-10" only will be completed. Paragraph "H-1-9" inclusive will be left blank.
- g. Paragraphs "I", "J", "K", "Q", and "R" will not be filled out.
- h. Paragraphs "L" and "M". If the answer to these are "No", then fill out accordingly.
- i. Paragraph "N" will be specific and give sufficient information to permit higher authority to gain an adequate idea of the future value of the rated officer. It will also include the following statement: "In comparing this officer with all officers of his grade known to me, I would place him among the (Upper) (Middle) (Lower) third".
- j. Paragraph "P" will include the following statement: "This officer (is) or (is not) performing duties commensurate with his grade."
- k. Paragraph "Q". If the answer is "NO", then state No unfavorable entries.
- l. Paragraph "S" will be filled out completely and if no inclosures, so state.

It is desired that all U.S. military personnel increase their purchases of Class "E" War Bonds, which are sold in denominations of 25, 50, 100, 500 and 1,000 dollars, either on installments (Class B Allotments) or for cash. For obvious reasons no bonds purchased in this theatre may be delivered to the purchaser or other person outside the United States. However, the purchaser may at time of purchase cause the bonds to be registered in his own or some one else's name, may designate a co-owner with himself, may designate a beneficiary, may designate the address within the U.S. to which any such bond may be sent, or may direct that the bonds be retained in the U. S. Treasury for safe keeping and that the receipt therefore be mailed to him at his organization or to any person in the United States.

b. Installment Purchase.

(1) There are eleven (11) plans for purchase of War Bonds by Class "B" payroll deductions, as follows:

(2) However, no new Class "B" allotments for purchase of War Savings Bonds under Plan 1 (Deduction of 3 dollars 75 cents per month) will be accepted, requiring pay deductions starting in or after the month of April 1944. Any such allotments already submitted effective 1 April or later will not be accepted. Allotments already in effect under Plan 1 (3 dollars 75 cents per month) will automatically be discontinued and payroll deductions will be stopped, without need of use of WDAGO Form 30-7 as payments for full bonds are completed, i.e. as of end of month in which 3 dollars 75 cents deduction completes purchase of a full \$25.00 bond.

(3) Consequently, military personnel now purchasing bonds under Plan 1 (3 dollars 75 cents per month) deductions who wish to continue to buy bonds by such allotments must increase the allotment to Plan 2 (6 dollars 25 cents per month) or some higher plan to start with the first pay after the current bond is completely paid for.

(4) Military Personnel having no Class "B" allotments for War Bonds and desiring to initiate such allotments with Plan 2 or higher, should do so immediately.

(5) Military personnel having Class "B" allotments for War Bonds on a Plan 2 or higher and wish to increase such allotment should do so immediately by discontinuance of old allotment and initiating of the new one.

(6) The War Bond officer, this Headquarters, and the War Bond officer for Hq Company will assist purchasing. All purchases by way of Class "B" Allotment must be effected through the Personnel Officer.

c. Cash Purchases.

Military personnel may purchase War Bonds for cash through the nearest A.P.O. using postal money orders or through a finance officer. The War Bond officers of this headquarters and of Hq Company will assist with advice to military personnel, in the cash purchase of War Bonds.
