SUBJECT: Internal Security

TO : Chief Commissioner, ALCON

1. There are enclosed copies of ALLIED FORCE HEADQUARTERS Operations Memorandum No. 85 of 8 November 1946. This memorandum supersedes ALLIED FORCE HEADQUARTERS Operations Memorandum No. 78 of 22 July 1945.
2. You will note that this memorandum reiterates the right of the Supreme Allied Commander to reimpose Allied Military Government in areas of Italian government controlled territory.
3. Under the terms of this memorandum this right is intended to be invoked only as a last resort and then in a limited area for the duration of an emergency only. In effect, it does not actually envisage the reimposition of Allied Military Government as normally exercised but rather the institution of martial law for a limited area and period.
4. It is desired that you present copies of this memorandum to the Italian government requesting that they publish the necessary orders to support it.
5. It is requested that this headquarters be provided with translations of the Italian government's orders referred to in paragraph 4 above when published.

INTERNAL SECURITY

GENERAL

1. This Operation Memorandum supersedes Operation Memorandum No. 78 (Ground Defence) of 22 July 1945 which is hereby rescinded.
2. The preservation of internal security (i.e. the maintenance of law and order and defence against sabotage), within S.O.D.'s area of responsibility, will be the responsibility of:-
 - a. GOC-in-C CMG MAF in the provinces of UDINE and VENEZIA GIULIA.
 - b. The Italian Government in all other Italian territory.
3. The physical security of Allied localities and installations in Italy, wherever located, will be the responsibility of the Allied troops occupying such localities and installations. Commanders concerned will insure that plans are prepared for the protection of their installations.

MILITARY ZONES

4. The right is reserved by the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theatre, to declare specific areas of Italian Government territory to be military zones. By the issue of such a declaration, the exercise of the powers of military government in the zone in question is assumed by the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theatre. However, only in case of a most urgent threat to Allied interests is it intended that this right will be invoked.

2.1.4 - USE OF TERRITORY IN AND OUT CIVIL POWER

2. The preservation of internal security (i.e. the maintenance of law and order and defence against sabotage), within S.O.D.'s area of responsibility, will be the responsibility of:-

- a. GOC-in-C GH, MT in the provinces of UDINE and VENEZIA GUILL.
 - b. The Italian Government in all other Italian territory.

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USE OF TRUCKS IN AID OF CIVIL POWER

5. For special instructions covering the preservation of law and order and the prevention of sabotage in Italy see appendix 'A'.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS REFERENCE ANTI-SABOTAGE PRECAUTIONS AND PRESERVATION OF LAW AND ORDER

A. ITALY LESS PROVINCES OF UDINE AND VENEZIA GIULIA

1. Within ITALY, other than the provinces of UDINE and VENEZIA GIULIA, the Italian government is responsible for the maintenance of law and order and to accomplish this has the Police Force, the Carabinieri and the Italian Army.
2. Should the situation deteriorate to such an extent that the Italian authorities are unable to maintain law and order with their own resources it is possible that they may request assistance of Allied troops. Such requests will NOT be honoured, but will be reported immediately to Allied Force Headquarters. However, should disorders directly threaten Allied military installations or property or threaten to interfere with the execution of Allied military missions the local commander will take such steps as may be necessary to protect these Allied interests. As a last recourse, with the approval of Allied Force Headquarters and in SHCIED'S name, he may declare the threatened area to be a military zone, in which case he will assume command of all Italian troops and Police in that area.
3. In cases where the local commander considers the emergency so grave and so immediate that time does not allow for requesting Allied Force Headquarters authority he may act on his own initiative, reporting the full facts to Allied Force Headquarters at the earliest possible moment.

B. PROVINCES OF UDINE AND VENEZIA GIULIA

4. In the provinces of UDINE and VENEZIA GIULIA the Allied Military Government is responsible for the maintenance of law and order and the Police Forces are under the control of Allied Military Government for this purpose. Should additional assistance be required, the Allied Military Government will appeal to the nearest Allied Military Commander. It is essential that close liaison exists between Allied Military Government officers and the nearest Allied Military Commander.
5. A disturbance in which military personnel are involved is a military responsibility and will be dealt with by the appropriate military authority.

3. In cases where the local commander considers the emergency so grave and so immediate that time does not allow for requesting Allied Force Headquarters authority he may act on his own initiative, reporting the full facts to Allied Force Headquarters at the earliest possible moment.

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5. A disturbance in which military personnel are involved is a military responsibility and will be dealt with by the appropriate military authority.

6. Immediate reports will be made through normal channels in all cases of riots or civil disturbances, whether or not it has been necessary to employ Allied troops.

C. TEAR GAS SMOKE GRENADES

7. In any instance where Allied or Italian troops, police or carabinieri are employed under Allied command to quell civil disturbances, tear gas and/or smoke grenades, but not white phosphorus smoke grenades, may be employed subject to the following restrictions:-

a. Every security precaution will be employed to ensure that stocks of these grenades do not fall into unauthorized hands.

b. All major commands will issue instructions to lower echelons concerning the use of these grenades, subject to that no grenades will be issued to troops or except on command of an officer. In exceptional circumstances such orders may be

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These grenades will be employed only when it is considered that use of force is necessary and that the object will be achieved with fewer casualties by the use of tear gas and/or smoke, than by opening fire.

1. It is understood that funds are procured directly by a representative of the Allied Commission, from the Allied Finance Agency (AFA) for the payment of wages to Italians working for the Commission or its agencies. These funds are possibly being procured for ~~any~~ other purposes.

2. Due to the financial clauses of the pending American and British Military and Civil Affairs agreements it appears that such direct methods of procuring funds is no longer proper. Not only does this procedure tend to evade the spirit of the two agreements but appears to permit the receipt of services by military personnel which are not authorized.

3. It is therefore proposed that effective at the earliest practicable date that the AFA shall cease to make funds available for Allied Commission use except thru either American or British finance channels or thru AMG XIII Corps. To implement this procedure, immediate steps are being taken jointly by British and American fiscal officers to determine the new procedures required to continue the necessary payments for authorized and essential allied services to Commission.

4. Due to the variances between the American and British agreements it is believed to be desirable that so far as practicable, there shall not be joint occupancy of real estate or joint usage of services. While it is recognized that the Commission as an Allied agency must occupy its offices jointly and that the certain services in connection with the operation of the Commission must be provided on an allied basis, no necessity remains for the allied occupancy of billets and quarters or for the allied payment of personnel or personal servants or attendants who serve one nationality only.

5. It is desired therefore that you give this matter early consideration and report:

- a. The purposes in itemized form for which funds drawn by you from AFA are expended.
- b. Whether any real estate occupied by the commission or its agencies or personnel is held by other than national requisition executed thru the normal requisitioning agencies.
- c. Your recommendations as to procedures whereby real estate and services which must continue to be used on an allied basis may

- c. Your recommendations as to procedures whereby real estate and services which must continue to be used on an allied basis may be properly accounted for within the letter and spirit of the two civil affairs agreements. In this connection it may be practicable to procure funds from ALC XIII Corps to cover authorized and essential allied official requirements, where it is improper to make a charge against either the British or US governments.
- d. Your recommendations as to adjustments in billeting and messing arrangements whereby British and American personnel on duty with the Commission may be segregated in order that they may comply with the provisions of instructions issued by their respective Theater Commanders. In this connection,

Directive, this headquarters, file as above, dated 13 March 1946, and amendments thereto dated 19 March 1946 and 17 June 1946, are cancelled. The policy and procedure that will become effective forthwith are:

PART I.INTRODUCTION

1. This directive is applicable to all arrests, detentions and disposals of persons, effected by United States and British CI/I(b) agencies. No other non-Italian agency may carry out arrests for security reasons in ITALY, even of their own nationals, except the Polish Security authorities who, within areas occupied by their troops, may arrest persons considered a danger to the security of their personnel or installations. (For essential co-operation with Italian Police authorities see paragraph 4, Part IV).

2. Previous Allied Force Headquarters instructions governing security arrests, with the exception of those parts of instructions applicable to the arrests of Prisoners of War and War Criminals or the guarding, segregation, administration, documentation and welfare of military or civil internees, are superseded and hereby cancelled. CI/I(b) instructions issued by Formations or Districts now defunct are invalid, being automatically superseded by those issued by the relative Formation or District accepting hand-over.

 3. Appropriate modifications should be made to this directive by subordinate Districts or Formations for territory within Allied Military Government jurisdiction or territory declared a Military Zone under the terms of current Operational Instructions.

PART II.CLASSIFICATION OF ARRESTABLE PERSONS

The classifications of persons who should normally be arrested are:

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Ltr, AFHQ, file AG 371.2 GBI-O, dtd 13 Aug 46 (Cont'd)

1. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION.

a. Any person who appears to constitute a threat to the security of the Allied Armed Forces or Allied Military Government. (For special consideration see part III).

b. Any non-Italian national, who, while acting as an agent of the NSDAP or Nazi Government, has held in German occupied territory a rank or appointment of equal status with any of those listed as specific classifications of arrestable persons. (For specific classifications see paragraphs 2 and 7 of Part II).

c. War Criminals. (For special procedure see paragraph 7, part IV).

2. THE GERMAN INTELLIGENCE SERVICES.

a. All personnel of Amters (Departments) I, II, III, IV, VI Militarischeramt (formerly Abwehr) and VII of the Reichssicherheitschauptamt (RSHA, or National Department of Security), together with the outstations and organizations dependent on or controlled by any of these departments.

(NOTE: "All personnel" is not intended to include typists, messengers, chauffeurs, charwomen, V leute, etc., though these are liable to be important sources of information and should be exploited as such).

b. All personnel of the Geheime Feldpolizei (GFP, or Secret Field Police).

c. All personnel of the Reichssicherheitsdienst (Reich Security Service).

3. THE SICHERHEITSPOLIZEI (Sipo, or Security Police)

a. All personnel of the Geheime Staatspolizei (Gestapo, or Secret State Police, including the Grenzpolizei (Grepo, or Frontier Police)).

b. All officials down to and including the rank of Regierungs and Kriminaldirektor, or their equivalent, in the Kriminalpolizei (Kripo, Criminal Police).

4. HIGHER POLICE OFFICIALS.

a. All Government officials in the Police Hierarchy, down to and including Regierungs and Kriminaldirekteron.

b. All Polizeipräsidenten in Polizeidirekteron.

c. All Oberpräsidenten in Preussia.

d. All Regierungspräsidenten.

- e. All Landrate.
- f. All Hohere SS and Polizeiführer.
- g. All Befehlshaber der Ordnungspolizei.
- h. All Befehlshaber der Sicherheitspolizei.

5. THE ORDNUNGSPOLIZEI (Orpo, or Regular Uniformed Police)

All officers down to and including the rank of Oberst (Colonel) or equivalent in these branches:

- a. Schutzpolizei (Schupo, or Protection Police).
- b. Feuerschutzpolizei (F Schupo, or Fire Protection Police).
- c. Gendarmerie (Gen, or Rural Police).
- d. Wasserschutzpolizei (SW, or Waterways Protection Police).
- e. Luftschutzpolizei (L Schupo, or Air Raid Protection Police).
- f. Technische Nothilfe (Teno, or Technical Emergency Corps).
- g. Verwaltungspolizei (Administrative Police).

6. PARA MILITARY ORGANIZATIONS.

a. Waffen SS (Armed SS) - All Officers and NCO's down to and including the rank of Scharführer and all ranks of the Totenkopfverbände (TV, or Death's Head Formations).

b. Allgemeine SS (General SS) - All Officers and NCO's (except those who claim only nominal rank by reason of their being in the Orpo or Kirpo, and not to have taken any active part in SS work), down to and including the rank of Unterscharführer.

c. Sturmabteilung (SA, or Storm Troops) - All Officers down to and including the rank of Sturmbannführer.

d. Hitler Jugend (HJ, or Hitler Youth) - All leaders (Führer) to and including the rank of Gefolgenschaftsführer, and all personnel of the HJ Streifendienst.

e. Nationalsozialistisches Kraftfahrkorps (NSKK, or National Socialist Motor Corps) - All Officers down to and including the rank of Staffelführer.

f. Nationalsozialistisches Fliegerkorps (NSFK, or National Socialist Aviation Corps) - All Officers down to and including the rank of Sturmbannführer.

g. Reichsarbeitsdienst (RAD, or Compulsory National Labor Service) - All Officers down to and including the rank of Arbeitsführer.

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Ltr, AFHQ, file AG 371.2 GBI-O, dtd 13 Aug 46 (Cont'd)

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7. NAZI PARTY OFFICIALS.

a. All administrative officials of the Party down to Kreis level and all Ortsgruppenleiter.

b. All members of the Party down to and including the rank of Abschnittsleiter.

c. Nazi Party officials of Italian Nationality who hold office in the S. TYROL will not be regarded as being in a compulsory arrest category.

8. PRISONERS OF WAR, SURRENDERED ENEMY PERSONNEL.

a. All Prisoners of War listed in the U.N.W.C.C. Lists.

b. All General Officers and other officers down to and including Divisional Commanders and equivalent officers in other services.

c. All General Staff officers of Army, Navy and Air Force and officers seconded to the General Staff after passing through a staff course.

d. All other officers of rank of Lieutenant Colonel and above and equivalent in other services.

(NOTE: All recalcitrant PW at present in custody will be reclassified in accordance with this directive. Those who are not recalcitrant (in arrest categories) within the meaning of this directive will be reclassified as normal PW/SEP. This reclassification will apply to ALL nationalities.)

PART III.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS

1. GERMAN AND AUSTRIAN NATIONALS.

German and Austrian nationals should not be arrested merely on the grounds of their nationality, but only if they are considered to be a threat to Allied Security or fall within one of the classifications of arrestable persons.

2. DESIERTERS AND DISCHARGED PERSONNEL OF THE FASCIST REPUBLICAN ARMED FORCES.

Italian members of the Fascist Republican Armed forces who are able to prove that, either by dismissal or desertion, they had ceased to serve the enemy armed forces at the time when they were overrun by the Allies will only be arrested if they are considered to be a danger to security or fall within one of the classifications of arrestable persons. If arrested they are accorded PW status.

3. FASCIST AND FASCIST SYMPATHIZERS.

Italian nationals of Fascist sympathies or background fall within the jurisdiction of the Italian occupation authorities and should therefore be dealt with by them unless they present a threat to the security of the Allied Armed Forces.

4. ANTI-ALLIED PROPAGANDA.

The reasonable expression of anti-Allied sentiment by Italians within the bounds of free speech now accorded to the Italian people should not be accepted categorically as a threat to the security of the Allied Armed Forces. Cases of persistent propaganda should normally be referred to Allied Force Headquarters for consideration before arrest is made.

5. PUBLIC DISORDERS, DEMONSTRATIONS, etc.

In the event of a public disorder constituting a threat to the security of the Allied Armed Forces, the case should be handled in accordance with extant policy expressed in separate operational instructions.

PART IV CATEGORIES OF ARREST, DOCUMENTATION PROCEDURE etc.**1. The three categories of security arrests are:**

a. Category A for trial by Allied Military Government (applicable only to persons arrested in territory under the jurisdiction of Allied Military Government).

b. Category B for internment by the Allies.

c. Category C for temporary detention while investigations are proceeding.

2. Documentation required by Allied Force Headquarters for each category of arrest is:

a. For Category A arrests NO reports are required other than the usual analysis of arrests given in routine security summaries.

b. For Category B arrests the proforma AFIB/1 (specimen at Appendix A) is required.

c. For Category C arrests NO reports are required unless detention exceeds a period of 14 days. As soon as possible after the 14th day notification is required of those particulars:

Category of Arrest, Name, Christian names and paternity, home address (including province or gau), date of original detention, designation of present prison or other detention center where held, District/Formation responsible for arrest. If, after such notification, a detained person is arbitrarily released or transferred to another detention center, Allied Force Headquarters must be informed accordingly.

The proforma AFIB/1 must only be used for civilians in Category B and NOT for Prisoners of War, Surrendered Enemy Armed Forces or civilians in Categories A or C.

3. No committal to an approved civilian internec camp may take place without the authority of Allied Force Headquarters. This authority must always be quoted on the relative committal proforma (AFIB/1).

4. Except in special circumstances, arrests should be made with the close co-operation of the Italian police in such a manner that in the event of the arrested person being transferred to Italian jurisdiction, acquittal would not be caused by incorrect arrest procedure or failure to present essential evidence connected with the arrest.

5. An arrested person should be given the opportunity to pack essential personal effects such as clothes, washing kits, etc. These effects should be checked before departure to insure that there are not included any arms or instruments of escape.

6. Money and valuables will NOT be taken from an arrested person unless considered necessary in the interest of security or unless special instructions have been given. In all such cases the owner must be given a detailed receipt, a copy of which will be sent to Allied Force Headquarters.

7. War Criminals arrested by FSS (British) should be transferred as soon as possible to the custody of SIB (War Crimes).

Chief, UNRRA, Italy Mission, APO 794

1. This letter rescinds the provisions of letter, this headquarters, file as above, dated 25 February 1946, subject: "Transfer from ALCOM to UNRRA of Administrative Responsibility for Care and Repatriation of Displaced Persons in Italy", and amendment thereto dated 24 March 1946.

2. The instructions contained in this letter, implementing the SACMED/UNRRA Agreement, will be carried out through the Allied Commission in coordination with UNRRA to effect the efficient and expeditious transfer to UNRRA of responsibility for the care of eligible, non-Italian, displaced persons in Italy effective 1 August 1946.

3. Complete responsibility and the administrative control for camps and other installations maintaining displaced persons eligible for UNRRA care will pass to UNRRA on 1 August 1946. On that date the Supreme Allied Commander declares an end to the period of military responsibility with respect to such displaced persons. Minimum Allied Commission personnel will remain with UNRRA in a liaison role until the transfer of property has been completed.

4. a. UNRRA has selected displaced persons camps and installations for the maintenance of displaced persons eligible for its care:

BARI TR.	- IT 31	MILAN	- IT 77
DI BAGNI	- IT 34	TURIN	- IT 17

5. The initial exchange of acceptable and non-acceptable displaced persons between UNRRA Camps and camps retained by the Allied Commission has been completed.

6. The transfer of camps and other facilities will include all movable and immovable property, premises, stores, supplies, vehicles and other equipment surplus to military requirements. Appropriate arrangements for the transfer will be worked out between the Allied Commission and UNRRA, specifically:

a. Premises required by UNRRA under requisition for the Allied Commission will be de-requisitioned only at UNRRA's request and immediately reoccupied by UNRRA in cooperation with the Italian Government. De-requisitioning and reoccupation will take place simultaneously.

b. UNRRA will take over only such movable and immovable equipment and supplies, surplus to military requirements, as it may elect. Excesses will be disposed of by the Allied Commission as provided in:

- (1) Letter, GHQ CMF, file 1903/1/Q1, dated 13 June 1946, subject: "Transfer of Military Responsibility for Displaced Persons' Camps to UNRRA";
- (2) MTOUSA Letter, dated 26 July 1946, subject: "Procedure to be Applied for Turn-over of Property in Displaced Persons' Camps from ALCOM to UNRRA";
- (3) MTOUSA Circulars 111 and 121, 1945;
- (4) MTOUSA Circular 7, 1946.

c. United States or British military property turned over to UNRRA will be listed separately and signed receipts delivered to the Allied Commission. The signed receipts referred to in the preceding sentence will include classification as to condition of items appearing thereon. The items on these receipts, which are declared surplus by military authorities and which UNRRA elects to purchase, will be priced by appropriate property disposal authorities. Eventual payment for this property will be made by UNRRA in accordance with standard procedures for the procurement of military surpluses from the governments concerned.

d. Until such time as ownership of the military property turned over to UNRRA passes to UNRRA, it shall not be altered or remodeled without the approval of the Allied Commission or appropriate military authorities, except for proper maintenance and repair. The cost of avoidable damage will be paid by UNRRA.

e. On 1 August, the balance of expendable supplies such as rations, medicines, and sanitary supplies found in the camps and other displaced persons' installations taken over by UNRRA will be transferred to UNRRA without payment.

f. It is anticipated that effective 1 August 1946, UNRRA will make rations available for displaced persons maintained by UNRRA. However, should SACMED for administrative convenience provide rations to UNRRA after the effective date of the SACMED/UNRRA Agreement, it is agreed that:

- (1) When reimbursement is to be made in sterling or dollars, priced invoices will intimate which currency is required.
- (2) Payment in dollars will be requested only for such rations as the Government claiming reimbursement can show that it incurred disbursement in dollar exchange.
- (3) UNRRA shall receive priced receipts for any reimbursement made in kind.

7. After 1 August 1946, should it be necessary for UNRRA to use military transport or militarily controlled transport, approved requests shall include a definite charge therefor.

8. With the assumption of complete responsibility for eligible displaced persons by UNRRA, the Supreme Allied Commander relinquishes control except for:

- a. The supervision of such displaced persons as are not eligible for UNRRA care.
- b. The necessary action to insure reimbursement for military supplies and services supplied to UNRRA for displaced persons.

SUBJECT: Security of Telephone Conversation

TO : Chiefs of all Staff Sections
Commanders of all Major Commands, Separate Units and Installations

1. Recent monitoring of telephone conversations has shown that there is a considerable lack of security on the part of all ranks.

2. It should be noted that due to the release of personnel, civilian operators and installations are being increasingly utilized. It is, therefore, the duty of all personnel to observe all the security precautions and to be just as security minded now as they were during the actual operations.

3. All personnel must realize that the telephone is definitely an unclassified means of communication. An indiscreet telephone conversation in any part of this theater might give rise to unfounded rumors.

4. Unit commanders will include telephone security in the normal security indoctrination of personnel in their units. Special attention will be given to personnel recently arrived in this theater.

5. Disciplinary action will be taken against offenders when a breach of security of this nature is reported in the future.

SUBJECT: German Personnel in Italy.

TO : Commanders of all Major Commands and Prisoner of War Camps, AFHQ

1. It is desired that positive measures be instituted to improve the lot of those Germans who by their good work have evidenced their concern for the future welfare of this world and its inhabitants regardless of race or creed.

To this end:

- a. The contents of this letter will be published to all Germans.
- b. Normal process of law will be involved for all except the most serious crimes. German commanders will be promptly and fully informed of disciplinary action taken against their personnel. Where possible and appropriate German commanders, or representatives designated by them, will be permitted to be present at investigations, trials, or hearings.
- c. As stocks become available, clothing will be issued without markings such as POW and SEP and replaced by clothing with colored circle, 1½ inches in diameter, on the left shoulder. This insignia may be of blue cloth, if such material is available, or stenciled on the garment itself. Priority in the issue of this clothing will be given POW/SEP's whose work and conduct have been outstanding.
- d. Specified zones and areas will be designated by local commanders within which German personnel will be permitted complete freedom of movement during non-working hours. Where British-held and United States-held Germans occupy the same or nearby areas, local commanders will coordinate their instructions to insure that equal privileges are given to all Germans.
- e. Athletic and recreational activities will be encouraged to the maximum consistent with facilities locally available.
- f. Germans will not be deprived of their personal belongings unless this is required by military necessity. In such cases an adequate accounting system will be devised and proper receipts issued to the individual concerned.
- g. An increase in the cigarette ration is being arranged and the supply of an additional blanket on discharge is under consideration should stocks permit.
- h. All Germans will be allowed to mail two letters and one post card weekly.
- i. A distribution of books, magazines, and newspapers will be made subject only to security objection on the part of G-2. (G-2 will publish list of publications which will NOT be distributed.) (Special Service, MPOUSA, and

Welfare, CMF, will expedite the collection of used English language periodicals and continue their efforts to obtain German and Swiss publications.)

j. Moving pictures will be provided where practicable.

k. The matters stated in sub-paragraphs (1), (2) and (3) are under study at this headquarters and will be covered in later orders:

- (1) Status of Germans under the Geneva Convention.
- (2) Pay, pension and disability benefits to which Germans are entitled.
- (3) Establishment of canteens at German camps.

l. Above measures will be applied to nationalities other than Germans who now occupy the status of SEP's or POW's. Substitute throughout the name of the appropriate country.

m. Above privileges may be withdrawn at any time for disciplinary purposes.

TO : General Officer Commanding, British Army on the Rhine
General Officer Commanding, British Troops in Austria

1. Transmitted herewith is a copy of a letter from the Allied Commission, File 183/5.16, dated 27 May 1946, with which is enclosed a request from the Italian Government that they be allowed to send a Technical Mission to Germany and Austria with the object of locating Italian property removed by the Germans.

2. It is considered that the application is reasonable, and it has the support of this headquarters.

3. Vast quantities of material were removed from Italy during the period of German domination. Preliminary lists, extracted from the RUK (Ruestung und Kriegspredation) records left behind by the Germans, run into 100 foolscap pages and show this material as having been dissipated to all parts of Germany and Austria. The value has been estimated at Lit. 28,126,073,390 on the cessation of hostilities in Italy, or £ 1,406,303,694 at the rate of Lit 20 to the dollar.

4. So far as is known, none of this material has as yet been recovered.

5. At present the Italian Government must use diplomatic channels when representing these questions. Executive action must, however, ultimately rest with the military agencies of the occupying powers. The existence of an Italian Mission, accredited to your headquarters, and to those in the other zones of occupation, and working alongside them would, it is believed, considerably simplify the present arrangement.

6. It would be appreciated, therefore, if you would state whether your headquarters would be prepared to receive such a mission to operate in the zone under your control. Details of its composition and the proposed date of its arrival will then be forwarded.

SUBJECT: Italian Technical Mission to Germany.

TO : The Supreme Allied Commander.

1. The Prime Minister has requested assistance in obtaining authority to send an Italian technical delegation to Germany with the purpose of locating Italian material which was taken there by the Germans (copy of letter inclosed). In the letter it is made clear that an approach, already made through diplomatic channels, has not been successful.

2. It would appear that the desire of the Italian Government might be met, in the American Zone, under the provisions of instructions from the Joint Chiefs of Staff to US Commanders. It is suggested that your Headquarters obtain the view of the Commander American Zone, Germany, on a visit of an Italian technical delegation to his zone.

3. With respect to British, French and Russian Zones it would appear that further authorization from the three Governments will have to be awaited. Provided there is no objection on your part, I shall inform the diplomatic representatives of the three Governments in Rome, of the need for the restoration of Italian material.

4. In this connection the Italian Government would be greatly aided if their officials were given access to the RUK records, now in Rome. It is my considered opinion that such permission should be granted in order that the Italian Government can formulate a more effective recovery program.

Therefore, I ask your favourable consideration to granting permission to Italian officials to have access to the RUK records, under supervision of Allied Officers. I understand from the U.S.A. Embassy that the State Department is favourable to such an authorization.

Dear General:

The Industrial Institute of Reconstruction controlling many firms which have been heavily plundered by the Germans, has pointed out for many months the advisability of sending to Germany a delegation composed of four technicians to locate the material which has been taken there.

Due to the nature of the proposal, it was broached through diplomatic channels with the four great powers who occupy Germany. It has not been possible however up to date to arrive at a completely favourable decision. France has declared herself unfavourable to the sending of the a/m delegation, Russia has not yet made known her ideas on the subject and America and Great Britain are at present studying the question which should, in the interests of national economy, be resolved as quickly as possible so as to avoid the increasing probability of the disposal of the machinery.

In view of this last consideration and of the fact that Admiral Stone, who was approached some time ago by the I.R.I., promised his support, I deemed it advisable to inform you of the present position of this important question of recovering the Italian material and installations taken to Germany. Although I fully recognize that this matter comes strictly within the jurisdiction of the powers who occupy Germany, I hope that your personal intervention with the representatives in Italy of the four Nations interested, will induce them to consider favourably the Italian request and agree to it within as short a time as possible.

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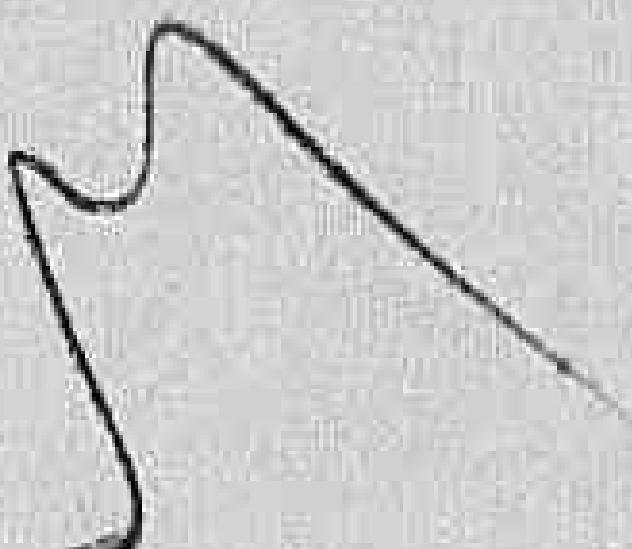

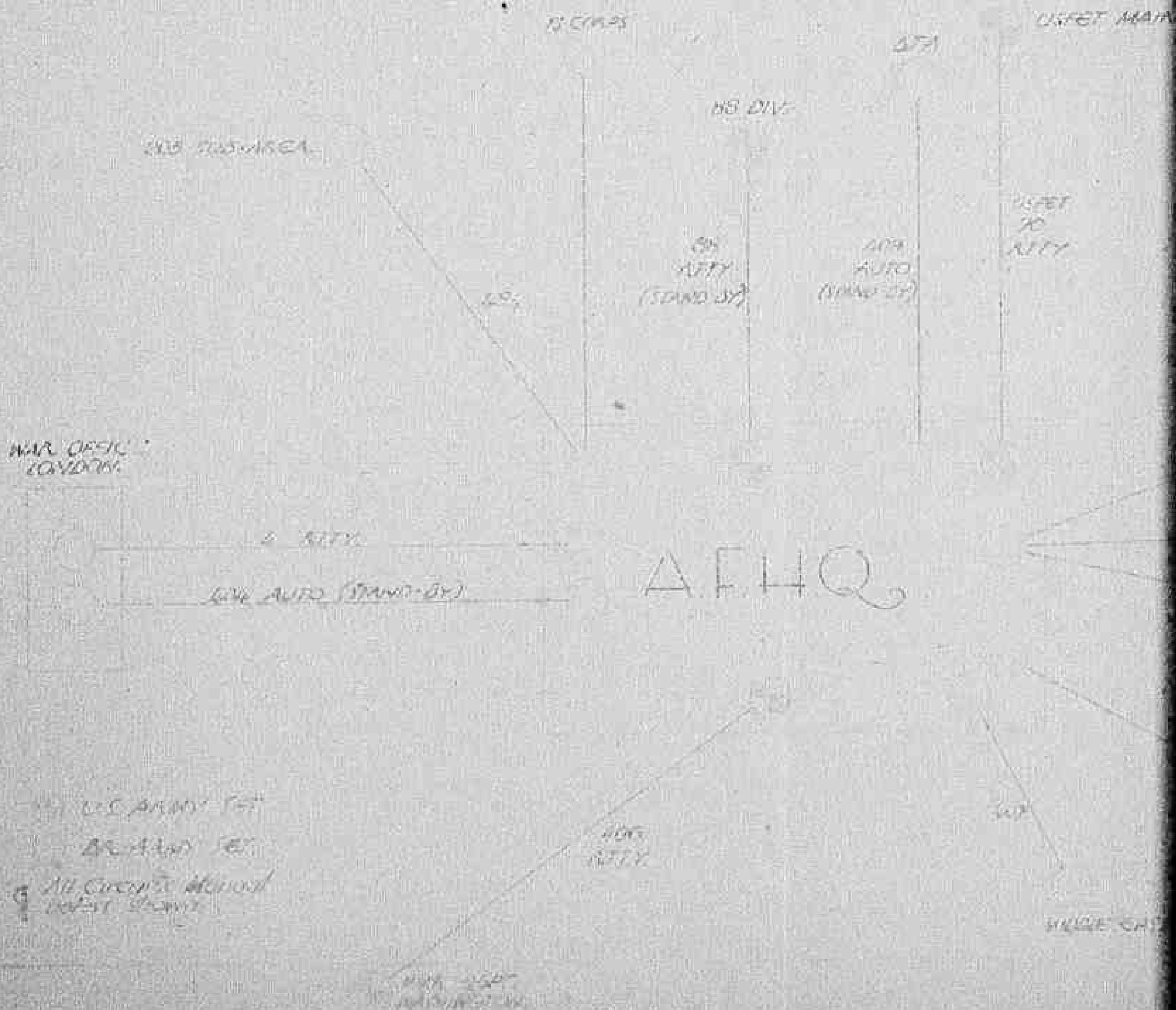

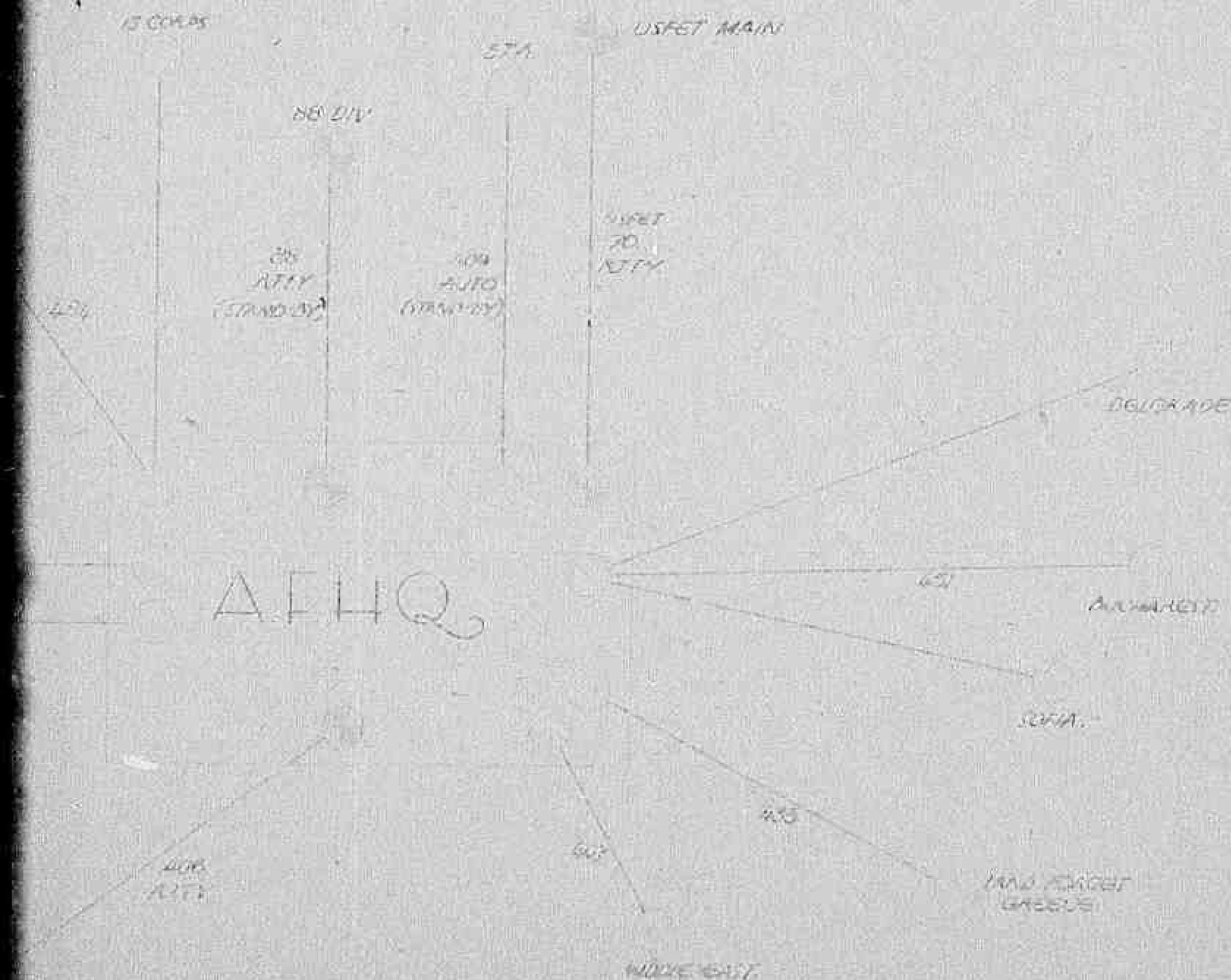

SECTION IV

WIRE COMMUNICATION

Item 7: USE OF CIVIL TELEPHONE CIRCUITS.

1. Military subscribers connected to a military exchange, or to an Italian automatic or manual civil exchange having local access to military long-distance telephone facilities, are not entitled to make long distance telephone calls over civil circuits, and are liable for the cost of any such calls attributed to their numbers.
2. Military subscribers connected to Italian civil exchanges at places where no access to the military long distance net is available may make only official calls over civil circuits.

Item 6: Handling of UERRA Traffic.

Purpose.

1. The purpose of this instruction is to outline the policies to be followed by all Signal Officers concerned in handling UERRA traffic into, out of and within the Theatre.

Responsibility for Policies.

2. All matters of policy regarding the use of military signals facilities by UERRA will be referred to the Chief Signal Officer, AFHQ.

Channels of Communication.

3. The service channel of communications on signal matters between AFHQ and the following UERRA missions will be as follows:

- With the UERRA Liaison Office, AFHQ - direct,
- With the UERRA Greece Mission - LIEF & LT Greece,
- With the UERRA Yugoslav Mission - TMS Belgrade.

4. Signal Officers of units and formations in the field are authorised to deal directly with UERRA liaison communications officers or their representatives.

Handling of UERRA traffic over military circuits.

5. Traffic includes both written messages and telephone conversations.

6. UERRA traffic will be handled over military circuits only when adequate commercial facilities are not available. The military telephone long distance network may be used by UERRA subscribers when:

- (a) They are local subscribers on a military exchange.

3. The service channel of communications on signal matters between AFHQ and the following URMRA missions will be as follows:

- With the URMRA Liaison Office, AFHQ - direct,
- With the URMRA Greece Mission - IET & LT Greece,
- With the URMRA Yugoslav Mission - EL Belgrade.

4. Signal Officers of units and formations in the field are authorised to deal directly with URMRA Liaison communications officers or their representatives.

Handling of URMRA traffic over military circuits.

5. Traffic includes both written messages and telephone conversations.

6. URMRA traffic will be handled over military circuits only when adequate com circuit facilities are not available. The military telephone long distance network may be used by URMRA subscribers when:

- (a) They are local subscribers on a military exchange.
- (b) When the called party is a military subscriber.
- (c) When, in exceptional circumstances, chief operators of a military long distance exchange sanction an individual call. Such calls may be caused by non-existence, interruption or congestion of civil circuits.

7. All messages originated by URMRA and which require to be passed over military circuits will be authenticated only by:

- (i) the Head of the Mission or his immediate deputy, or
- (ii) the senior official at any sub-headquarters or office or his immediate deputy.

8. The setting up by Signal Officers of special tele-communication facilities for URMRA involving the use of military equipment or personnel will, in each and every case, be subject to the prior approval of the Chief Signal Officer, AFHQ.

Use of Naval and Air Force channels.

9. Arrangements for transmission of UMRRA traffic over Naval or Air Force facilities will be coordinated with the Chief Signal Officer, AFHQ.

Use of Commercial Channels.

10. All UMRRA messages passed by Signal Officers to commercial carriers for onward transmission over commercial facilities will bear a clear indication that they have been originated by UMRRA. This will enable the commercial carriers to bill UMRRA direct for transmission charges. Bills for UMRRA are NOT payable by the U.S. or British military financial authorities.

Air and Motor Dispatch Letter Service.

11. UMRRA will be permitted to use existing SDS facilities in the areas in which they are functioning, subject to conditions laid down in AFHQ Signal Instructions, Section VI, Item 1. (paras 3, 4 & 5).

Ciphers.

12. When enciphering is necessary, UMRRA will normally encipher their own traffic employing their own material and personnel. Signal Officers may, however, at their own discretion, render assistance to UMRRA. Whenever UMRRA traffic is enciphered in British/U.S. Service ciphers, one-time ciphers will normally be used. Where one-time systems do not exist, current instruction regarding paraphrasing of literal text must be strictly observed. Signal Officers will assist UMRRA with the training of their cipher personnel.

Signal Security.

15. Such priorities will be considered as ranking below that of military, government and press traffic of similar priority.

Accounting.

16. All UNRA traffic carried over British/U.S. Service channels will be carried free of charge and no accounting is necessary. (see also para 10 re traffic via commercial carriers).

17. Signal Officers will keep a normal check on the volume of UNRA traffic being passed over military facilities with a view to preventing the overloading of such military facilities.

If arrested they are accorded civilian status.

b. For Category B arrests the proforma AFIB/1 (specimen at Appendix B) is required.

c. For Category C arrests NO reports are required unless detention exceeds a period of 14 days. As soon as possible after the 14th day notification is required of the following particulars:-

Category of Arrest, Name, Christian names and paternity, home address (including province or gu), date of original detention, designation of present prison or other detention center where held, District/Formation responsible for arrest.

If, after such notification, a detained person is arbitrarily released or transferred to another detention center, Allied Force Headquarters must be informed accordingly.

The proforma AFIB/1 must only be used for civilians in Category B and NOT for Prisoners of War, Surrendered Enemy Armed Forces or civilians in categories A or C.

5. An arrested person should be given the opportunity to pack essential personal effects such as clothes, washing kit, etc. These effects should be checked before departure to ensure that there are not included any arms or instruments of escape.

6. Money and valuables will NOT be taken from an arrested person unless considered necessary in the interests of security or unless special instructions have been given. In all such cases the owner must be given a detailed receipt, a copy of which will be sent to Allied Force Headquarters.

7. War Criminals arrested by FSS (British) should be transferred as soon as possible to the custody of SIB (War Crimes)

(2) The Italian Government or the Allied Military Government concerned will make immediate arrangements to take over the ammunition and will be totally responsible for its safe custody until its final disposal. The Italian Government or the Allied Military Government concerned will assume the responsibility, within a time limit to be set by mutual agreement with the competent Allied Military Commander, for safeguarding such ammunition.

(3) In the interest of internal security the Italian Government or the Allied Military Government concerned will be instructed to concentrate for particular guarding all ammunition of 20mm calibre and below including mines, grenades, etc. They will be further instructed to place special guards on ammunition of a dangerous nature until its disposal. Commanders will satisfy themselves, when handing over, that such arrangements are in fact in hand. Such handover will only be at their discretion having regard to any operational directives to the contrary and to the maintenance of the security of the area.

The Italian Government when making disposal will have regard to the requirements of the future Italian armed forces.

1. Allied Force Headquarters letter file AG 386.3 Q (AE)-O dated 2 October 1945, paragraph 9g (3), states that "Italian military vehicles can usually be identified by two stars to be found on the engine".

2. The Italian Ministry of Marine states that it is having difficulty in recovering its motor vehicles from CEM dumps because of the above statement, it being assumed in some instances that the two star identification applies to Italian Naval vehicles. The Italian Ministry of Marine further states that:

a. I.R.N. regulations have never provided for motor vehicles to be marked in this manner.

b. The only distinctive markings on I.R.N. motor vehicles are the engine and chassis numbers.

c. From information received it would appear that the above marking - two five pointed stars - was adopted by the Italian Army for several lots of motor vehicles.

d. All Italian manufacturers have been approached formally in the matter and have given assurance that in supplying motor vehicles to the I.R.N. in no cases have they used this marking to distinguish them from those supplied to the public.

3. It is desired that information be promulgated to the effect that the two five-pointed star identification does not hold true for Italian Naval vehicles.

2. The amateur operation of radio by military personnel of British and United States Armed Forces is now authorized as follows:

a. Frequency bands:

- (1) 28 to 29 mc/s in all parts of the world.
- (2) 58.5 to 60 mc/s in the European region and regions other than American as required by military authorities and administrations concerned.

b. Power: 25 watts in the antenna.

c. Call signs: A series made up of "XA" followed by two further letters will be allotted by this headquarters to approved applicants.

d. Procedure: That now used on service or amateur nets.

e. Log: A log considered adequate by the responsible officer will be kept of all transmissions.

f. Messages: Plain language messages in English other than official, between operators, and plain language messages in English for a third person, provided he is a member of the British or United States Armed Forces, may be handled. No military information may be passed. Messages will on no account be passed on behalf of civilians.

3. Equipment may not be requisitioned on the basis of this letter, though military radio stations on hand but not engaged in operational radio circuits may be utilized.

POST TO AND FROM GERMANY

1. On receipt of this instruction every Prisoner of War/Surrendered Enemy Personnel will be permitted to complete and despatch to his next of kin one buff postcard. This will contain prisoner of war authorized address. (See Paragraph 15). Upon receipt of this card the next of kin may tear off the bottom half of the card and post it back to the sender with a message not exceeding 25 words. If the buff cards cannot be delivered, due to the absence of the addressee, it will be automatically forwarded to a Central Enquiry Bureau in the appropriate zone of occupation.

2. The supply of these buff cards is limited. Only one card will be issued to each prisoner of war. The prisoner will be required to show his pay book or other documents as evidence that his registered next of kin resided in the BRITISH, US or FRENCH zone. Buff cards will NOT be issued to prisoners whose next of kin reside in the RUSSIAN occupied Zones of GERMANY.

3. On 18th September any GERMAN civilian in the BRITISH, US or FRENCH Zones who had not received a buff card and who had reason to believe that a near Wehrmacht relative was in BRITISH, US or FRENCH zones or in prisoner of war camps under BRITISH control, may write a message not exceeding 25 words on a special green coloured postcard and despatch it to the Central Enquiry Bureau, Hamburg.

4. The Central Bureau will, wherever possible, effect contact between the member of the Wehrmacht and his next of kin by the interchange of addresses and redirection of the green and buff cards.

5. Both the member of the Wehrmacht and the civilian having once received the address of their relative, may conduct future correspondence by ordinary postcard not exceeding 25 words once per week in accordance with the existing Postal and Censorship arrangements. This card is AFM 3494. Each PW is permitted to have one AFM 3494 per week.

2631 7. In cases where Part (iii) of the buff card is addressed to a destination in the US or FRENCH zones, the sender will delete the word "Hamburg" from Part (iv) and insert "American Zone" or "French Zone" whichever is appropriate.

8. On receipt of a reply from next of kin the prisoner may proceed as in paragraph 5.

9. Prisoners will be informed that any attempt to mutilate or disfigure the buff cards, or to send messages in code may result in this privilege being withdrawn.

SUBJECT: Conservation of Electric Power

TO: All Concerned

1. The following letters, this headquarters, containing previous instructions on this subject, are hereby rescinded:

a. File AG 675/171 GDS-O, dated 31 October 1944, Subject: "Conservation of Electric Power Facilities of Italian Utilities."

b. File AG 675/047 GDS-O, dated 18 January 1945, Subject: "Conservation of Electric Power Facilities of Italian Utilities."

2. Although the electric power situation generally has improved over the past few months, there is still a serious shortage in central and southern Italy. In order to conserve the limited supply of electric power available and to meet the military and essential civilian requirements, it is necessary to reduce to a minimum non-essential electricity consumption from supply undertakings by both military and civilian users in Italy south of the northern boundaries of the provinces of Lucca, Pistoia, Firenze and Ravenna.

3. South of the boundary referred to the following steps will be taken to reduce loads on commercial electric systems.

a. LIGHTING

- (1) Offices - No lights will be burned during daylight hours except in cases where natural lighting is insufficient for proper working conditions. Wattage of lamps will be limited to a minimum requirement, and fixtures will be located for most economical utilization of light source.
- (2) Halls and Stairways - Lamps in halls, corridors and stairways will be of the smallest wattage commensurate with safety, and a minimum number will be illuminated.
- (3) Hotel Rooms and Private Living Quarters - No more than two (2) lamps per private living room and one (1) lamp per bath room will be connected. No more than one (1) lamp per private living room will be illuminated at the same time. The lamp bulb will not exceed sixty (60) watt rating. Lighting, when permitted in living tents of military personnel, will be limited to one (1) lamp of sixty (60) watt rating in pyramidal or small wall tent.

- (4) Public Space in Hotels, Cafes, Clubs and Public Buildings - Wattage will be reduced to a bare essential commensurate with area, use and occupancy. All electric signs or display lighting will be discontinued.
- (5) Other Military Facilities - Lighting of mess halls, kitchens, work shops, etc., will not exceed the following scale:

<u>Type of Accommodation</u>	<u>Watts per sq ft.</u>
Store Room, Latrine	0.2
Mess hall, Post Exchange)	0.3
Hospital Ward, Bath House)	
Kitchen, Recreation Building	0.5

- (6) Outdoor Areas - Guarded areas, POW enclosures, storage areas, streets, etc., will be lighted only in accordance with necessity.
- (7) Lights Not In Use - All lights not being used will be turned off. Post signs conspicuously and make every individual economy-minded in use of electricity.

b. HEATING AND COOKING

- (1) Electric heating will be permitted only in essential industrial processes engaged in production for the military effort, and in hospitals for the treatment of patients.
- (2) No electric cooking will be permitted.

c. POWER

- (1) The use of electric power will be limited to:
- (a) Those industries contributing directly to the military effort or essential to the civilian economy.
- (b) Installations necessary to safeguard public health.
- (2) Elevators will be operated by electric power only for movement of hospital patients or for heavy freight.
- (3) Electric motors will not be allowed to idle for extended periods.

d. ELECTRIC RAILWAY POWER will be utilized only on approval by the Electric Power Committee of the AFIR (Italian) Board.

e. ELECTROLYTIC PROCESSES AND ELECTRIC ARC FURNACES will be utilized only on approval by the Electric Power Committee of the AFIR (Italian) Board.

4. North of the boundary referred to in paragraph 2, no general restrictions are necessary and the allocation of power is the responsibility of Chief Engineers of Districts.

5. Military Commanders will be responsible that the instructions detailed in paragraph 3 are carried out within their jurisdiction of military installations. Civilian authorities will be required to enforce similar measures in those civilian installations which are allowed to receive electric service.

SUBJECT: Venereal Disease.

TO : Chief Commissioner
Allied Commission.
APO 394

1. The increase in the incidence of Venereal Disease among Allied troops in Italy is viewed with grave concern by this headquarters. It is considered that with the object of attempting to reduce the danger of infection, a more efficient system of inspection and treatment of prostitutes is essential.

2. It has been reported that the treatment of prostitutes at civil hospitals is unsatisfactory in that the hospitals have neither the facilities for examination, the drugs for effecting a cure, nor are the staffs adequate or competent. The result is that the women are not properly examined or effectively cured, and return to their trade as much a danger to the Allied troops as ever before.

3. It is suggested that the hospitals listed at Appendix 'A' to this letter be supervised by Allied medical personnel, and that where Italian medical supplies are not available these should be supplemented from Allied stocks, with the exception of blankets, bedding and heavy equipment.

4. It is requested therefore that the Italian Government be approached with a view to obtaining their agreement to the suggestion in paragraph 3 so far as hospitals situated within Italian Government Territory are concerned, and that it be explained to them that if and when further territory is handed back to their administration the same arrangements would be desired in respect of the balance of the hospitals covered by the Appendix to this letter.

5. If agreement of the Italian Government is obtained, and in view of the urgency of the matter, every assistance will be afforded by this headquarters in the provision of drugs and personnel in the Allied military interest.

SUBJECT: Supplying of Information to Italian Tax Officials.

TO : All Concerned.

1. Although the Allied Forces are not liable to Italian taxation, this exemption is not extended to their Italian or other civilian employees who are normally resident in Italy. Similarly, an Italian contractor is liable to taxation under Italian law in respect of profits arising out of any contract entered into with an element of the Allied Forces.
2. Italian tax-assessing officials who make application, may be allowed, as a means of assisting them in the collection of taxes and not more frequently than once in six months, to inspect the Social Insurance Cards kept in accordance with Administrative Memorandum Number 61, this headquarters, 1944, and may be furnished with the names of Italian persons or firms having contracts with the Allied Forces. The minimum value of contracts for which contractors names are furnished will be at the discretion of the military officer concerned.
3. Italian tax-assessing officials will not be furnished with copies of payrolls of civilian employees or given information as to amounts of wages paid, nor will they be supplied with information regarding contracts other than as provided in paragraph 2 above.

SUBJECT: Soldiers' Savings Campaign

TO : All Concerned

1. An intensive and vigorous campaign to increase soldiers' savings will be inaugurated immediately in this theater. Information contained herein is to assist commanders and their War Bond and Savings Officers in instituting and conducting the campaign within their respective commands.

2. The purposes of the campaign are:

a. To insure that military personnel will have sufficient assets at time of discharge to enable them to establish a business, or to tide them over the rugged path they may encounter on their return home and until they are reemployed. It is essential to the soldier and his family that he possess the proverbial "nest egg" at time of discharge, in order to facilitate readjustment and starting again in the American way of life.

b. To reduce the retained pay in this theater. Such reduction will help to minimize inflation which works a severe hardship on the local citizenry, and to minimize useless spending for merchandise of little value or for excessive amusement.

3. While the responsibility for this savings campaign is a command function, the War Bond and Savings Officer of each echelon is charged with the preparation and execution of the program. The results are dependent on the efforts he puts forth.

4. The savings program, as it is now established, encompasses insurance, family support, war bonds, soldiers' deposits, P.T.A. and PQ-MO. These phases will be stressed in the following sequence:

a. Insurance - Every individual of the military personnel should have government insurance in the maximum amount of \$10,000.00.

b. Family Support is provided under two forms:

(1) Class "F" Allotments are simple in scope and it should be sufficient to advise the eligible individual of their provisions and availability.

- (2) Class "E" Allotments generally are authorized to be deducted regularly from pay for the primary purpose of providing for the care and support of dependents or relatives. Practically everyone, including many of those who have a Class "F" Allotment, should authorize a certain portion of his pay for this purpose.
- (3) War Bonds - Can be purchased by the soldier by either of two methods:
 - (a) Class "B" Allotments are the surest way to make regular purchases and to implement a continuous saving plan. Everyone who has not already done so, should be urged to start a Class "B" Allotment. Many of those who have Class "B" Allotments can and should increase them. Class "B" Allotments are now authorized for entire pay of commissioned and enlisted personnel.
 - (b) Cash Purchase - Every effort will be made to encourage purchase of Bonds for cash. This effort must begin at the pay table and be continuous. All agencies authorized to sell Bonds should exert all means to keep the prospect aware of the availability of bonds. The purchase of Bonds with ready loose cash is a sure way to financial safety and a guarantee of a fund that can be reached in a time of need. High government officials, top ranking businessmen, and financial experts agree that the War Bond is the best and soundest investment which can be made by those in foreign service. Military personnel of all grades must be made fully acquainted with this fact and other reasons why they should invest now in bonds.
- (4) Soldiers' Deposits are designed for enlisted personnel only. Those who absolutely cannot be induced to invest in Bonds should take advantage of this form of savings. It is a splendid plan for systematic saving, and an ideal way to lay something on the shelf for the "rainy day".
- (5) Personal Transfer account is the best, safest and most convenient method to send home any excess money which the soldier may have. Whether or not he has taken advantage of one or all of the aforementioned forms of savings, he should be encouraged to send home all of his remaining money in this manner, except the minimum required for actual current expenses.

- (6) Post Office Money Orders are a choice provided in lieu of the P.T.A. This an easy way to send funds home and the recommendation made with respect to the P.T.A. is also applicable to PO-MO.

5. A wide field for increasing the number of Class "B" Allotments exists at present among officer personnel in this theater. This is due largely to the publication of Circular Number 290, War Department, 1944, which requires that WD AGO Form Number 29-6 be filled out on each change of station. Disbursing officers in this theater have recently be directed to give a completed copy of form 29-6 to all officers who now have Class "B" Allotments, and further to give one to each officer when he is first paid at a new station. This procedure will simplify Class "B" Allotments for officers and they should now be eager to purchase bonds by this method. Officers having Class "B" Allotments will be instructed to keep the completed form 29-6 for presentation to the finance officer upon arrival at a new station.

6. Many posters and pamphlets covering these savings plans have been distributed and should be in the hands of all units. It is planned to distribute such material continuously. Strict attention will be given to the proper use and distribution of these items by unit commanders and soldiers' savings officers.

7. War Bond and Savings Officers will make a study of War Department Pamphlets, numbers 21-18 "THE SOLDIERS' SAVINGS PROGRAM (A Guide to its Conduct)", and 21-19 "HOW TO HATCH A NEST EGG", and of WD AGO letter, AG 123 (1 Jul 44) OB-S-E-M, subject: "Reduction of Inflationary spending by Armed Personnel Overseas", dated 14 July 1944. Following this preparation, each War Bond and Savings Officer should make an analysis to ascertain the scope of present pay distribution and savings in his unit. He can then direct his efforts toward the most fruitful field.

8. Responsible officers will initiate steps immediately to revitalize the Soldiers' Savings Program. Interest and enthusiasm must prevail in order to achieve success. The program must be explained to everyone and recommendations made for the best interest of the particular individual, leaving it to him to make his own decision and choice. No coercion or undue pressure will be employed, but every persuasive means will be exerted to induce personnel to save money.

a. Mediterranean Theater of Operations boundaries include the entire Mediterranean Sea (excluding the island of Cyprus and the Turkish Islands adjacent to the Turkish mainland), Italy, Austria, Hungary, Rumania, Yugoslavia, Albania, Bulgaria, and Greece.

b. Africa-Middle East Theater (formerly Middle East Theater) boundaries include the entire continent of Africa, Palestine, Trans-Jordan, the island of Cyprus, Turkey and the entire Saudi-Arabia peninsula, excluding Iraq and Trucial-Oman.

TO : All Concerned.

1. It has been brought to the attention of this headquarters that Italian florists have solicited floral telegraphic orders for transmission to the United States and United Kingdom from United States and British personnel.

2. There is no way at the present time by which an Italian florist can effect delivery of flowers in the United States or United Kingdom. Such activity is patently illegal. Consequently, any member of the Allied Forces who expends monies for such service can expect to suffer the resulting financial loss.

3. Personnel having knowledge of such activities are requested to report the facts to the nearest Military Police.

4. It is desired that the foregoing be brought to the attention of all personnel.

SUBJECT: Yugoslav Deserters.

TO: All Concerned.

1. The following instructions are issued regarding the apprehension and disposal by you of deserters from the Yugoslav armed forces.

2. In general, the policy of this headquarters is to assist the Yugoslav authorities as far as possible in the apprehension and return of genuine deserters from the Yugoslav armed forces; it is essential, however, that a distinction is made between such personnel and political or other refugees. This letter deals only with genuine deserters.

3. Any Yugoslav whom you have reason to believe is such a deserter will be taken into custody under local arrangements to be made by your headquarters; he will then be screened by FSS or CIC and if it is clear that there is no political or refugee aspect to his case, his name will be notified to the Yugoslav Delegation on the Advisory Council for ITALY who will be requested to provide the following particulars within 90 days to show that he is in fact a genuine deserter from the Yugoslav armed forces:

- a. Rank of deserter
- b. Military unit from which he deserted and its location
- c. Date of enlistment or induction
- d. Date and circumstances of desertion
- e. Full description of deserter.

4. In comparing any evidence produced by the Yugoslav Delegation in accordance with paragraph 3 above, with the evidence obtained from the alleged deserter during FSS or CIC screening, you will use your discretion as to detail. If, however, you are satisfied on all the available evidence that the Yugoslav in question is a genuine deserter and that his case has no political or refugee implications, you will arrange to hand him over to the Yugoslav authorities for return to Yugoslavia. Cases of doubt should be referred to this headquarters for special instructions.

5. Any Yugoslav who has been conscripted in VENEZIA GIULIA since the cessation of hostilities in Europe will NOT be considered a member of the Yugoslav armed forces and will not, therefore, be considered for return to Yugoslavia.

6. If conclusive evidence is not forthcoming from the Yugoslav authorities within the time limit of 90 days, the alleged deserter will be released from custody.

7. In any case in which a Yugoslav is taken into custody as a suspected deserter and the evidence obtained from FSS or CIC screening reveals political or refugee implications or that he has been conscripted as in paragraph 5 above, his name will NOT be notified to the Yugoslav Delegation and he will be released from custody, unless, in the opinion of your headquarters, it is considered desirable to keep him in custody as a Civilian Internee, in which case a full statement of the facts will be forwarded to this headquarters.

8. The above instructions are issued for your guidance and will NOT be made known to the Yugoslav authorities to whom the views of this headquarters are being communicated through Allied Commission in the form of the letter at Appendix "A".

SUBJECT: Yugoslav Nationals in ITALY.

TO: Chief Commissioner
Allied Commission

1. Reference is made to letter from G-5 Section, this headquarters, reference number G5: 250.1-5, dated 24 March 1945, subject as above.

2. While the policy of this headquarters (namely, to assist the Yugoslav authorities as far as possible in the apprehension and return of genuine deserters from the Yugoslav armed forces) remains unchanged, it is nevertheless considered desirable to clarify and supplement the provisions of the above cited letter.

3. If a Yugoslav national is taken into custody by the Allied forces and appears, on interrogation, to be a genuine deserter from the Yugoslav armed forces his name will be notified to the Yugoslav Delegation on the Advisory Council for ITALY, who will be required to produce the following information within a period of 90 days from the date of notification to show that he is in fact such a deserter:

- a. Rank of deserter.
- b. Military unit from which he deserted and its location.
- c. Date of enlistment or induction.
- d. Date and circumstances of desertion.
- e. Full description of deserter.

4. If, after the production of such evidence, the responsible local Allied commander is satisfied that the Yugoslav in question is a genuine deserter from the Yugoslav armed forces, he has been instructed to hand over the deserter to the Yugoslav authorities as soon as possible for return to Yugoslavia.

5. If, in the opinion of the Allied commander, the evidence gives rise to any doubt he has been informed that he should refer the case to Allied Force Headquarters.

6. If, however, the Allied commander is of the opinion that the Yugoslav is not a genuine deserter or if the Yugoslav Delegation fail to produce the necessary evidence within the specified time limit the alleged deserter will be released from custody.
