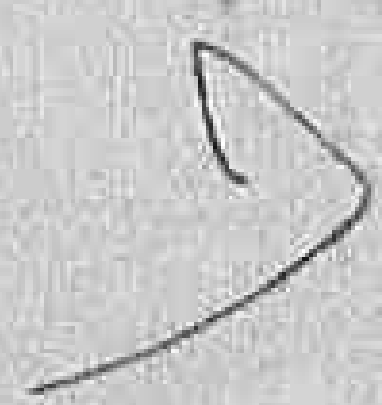

Before a Military Commission which convened at Florence, Italy, on 25 September through 4 October 1946, pursuant to paragraph 1, Special Orders Number 193, Headquarters, Mediterranean Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 7 September 1946, and of which Brigadier General Ridgely Gaither was president, and Lieutenant Colonel Clyde W. Wellen was judge advocate, was arraigned and tried:

MARIO CARLONI, ITALO SIMONITTI, AND BENEDETTO PILON, Italian Nationals.

CHARGE: Violation of the Law of War.

Lyth, an officer of the Army of the United States, who had been recently captured and was a prisoner of war, by causing him to be shot to death with a gun.



During the early morning hours the 1st Battalion, 47th Infantry (reinforced), made an assault landing on the beaches and among the docks at Safi. Colonel (then Major) Feil, 47th Infantry, commanding the battalion landing team, landed with his units on Blue Beach. At the time small arms fire, both machine gun and rifle, was being directed at the beach, and enemy artillery shells were bursting regularly near the waters edge. The heavy weapons company of the battalion had stopped on the beach immediately after landing and the men were digging into the sand. Knowing how vital it was that this company proceed to its objectives to support the rifle companies which were fighting to capture the initial beachhead, Colonel Feil, with complete disregard for enemy fire which was falling around him, fully exposed himself, moving among the prone men, who were experiencing their first battle, and reassuring them. Getting them to their feet, he quickly reorganized them in good order, with only a minimum of delay to their objectives. Later in the day Colonel Feil accompanied a small patrol which succeeded in wiping out two groups of the enemy which had been by-passed and which were intermittently firing on the beach and in the area in rear of the initial beachhead. Colonel Feil's courage, initiative, and gallant leadership contributed materially to the success of his battalion landing team in quickly capturing and successfully defending all of its objectives. His conduct was an inspiration to all who observed it.

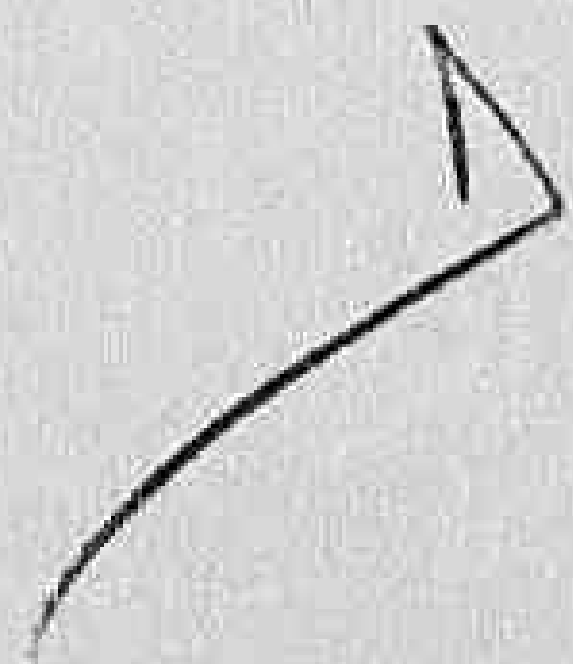

I -- AWARD OF SILVER STAR (POSTHUMOUS)

By direction of the President, under the provision of Army Regulations 600-45, as amended, the Silver Star was posthumously awarded by the Theater Commander to the enlisted man named below:

GEORGE E. HAYES, H-69853, Private, Loyal Edmonton Regiment, Canadian Army, for gallantry in action near Cosena, Italy on 21 October 1944. In the face of intense enemy machine-gun fire, Private Hayes, seizing the only remaining automatic rifle in his platoon, and with utter disregard for his own personal safety, ran forward across fifty yards of open ground, firing the weapon from his hip, killing one enemy machine-gunner and wounding two others, and then directing his fire upon another heavily defended enemy position, he enabled the remainder of his platoon to successfully counter-attack. On 22 October 1944, during a continuation of the bitter battle of the previous day, Private Hayes was killed in action as a result of enemy fire. His heroic devotion to duty and gallant actions in the face of the enemy were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service. Next of kin: Mr. Douglas Hayes (father), Cobble Hill, British Columbia, Canada.

II - AWARD OF SILVER STAR

By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, as amended, the Silver Star was awarded by the Theater Commander to the enlisted man named below:

JOSEPH F. APPLEBY, D-138362, Lance Sergeant, Royal 22d Regiment, Canadian Army, for gallantry in action on 14 December 1944 near Bagnacavallo, Italy. Armed with an automatic rifle, Lance Sergeant Appleby, with great courage and in the face of heavy machine-gun fire, single handedly charged an enemy position, capturing four prisoners. Demonstrating great tactical ability and leadership, he later maneuvered his men so that they gained another position, and in the ensuing counter-attack by the enemy so inspired them by his repeated acts of heroism that they captured ten more of the enemy. Later, in repelling a second counter-attack, through his gallantry and great devotion to duty, Lance Sergeant Appleby led his men in such an outstanding manner that 612 additional prisoners were taken, and by his initiative and complete disregard for his own safety he was almost entirely responsible for the capture of twenty prisoners and the successful completion of the action.
