Subject: Policy Letter on the Military Section, AGC.

To : Brigadier Gueterbock, Hq AGC, Naples.

I made a diligent search for the policy letter on the Military Section concerning which you telephoned us today. The only letter on the Military Section itself which any of us have been able to locate is one forwarded on December 5th by General Taylor to Admiral McGrigor. I take it that it had been received not long before, but the AMHQ letter itself is actually dated 12 October. General Joyce submitted his comments on 29 October.

On the other hand, we did receive recently a letter relating to appointments to the Naval Sub-Commission and I am forwarding two copies herewith. We will shortly issue the order announcing Commodore Palmer as Head of the Naval Sub-Commission but will await issuance of orders relating to the other officers until they have reported for duty.

Perhaps if General Taylor is still available he can identify any more recent letter from AMHQ concerning the Military Section or perhaps indicate where it might be found.

SUBJECT: - WAR ESTABLISHMENT FOR MMIA

Allied Control Commission15 Army Gp (GSD) for info

1. Further to my G/8/11 of 27 Dec I forward herewith for your general agreement the basis on which I am preparing the W.E. (T of O) for MMIA. Proposals are at Appendix "A".

2. As you know MMIA started in CALABRIA as an EIGHTH Army instrument to control in the first place the divisions of XXI Italian Corps and later (after the capture of TARANTO) the whole of what was then the Seventh Italian Army. In mid Oct it came direct under 15 Army Gp and has since functioned as its executive agent for dealing with all Italian forces on the mainland of ITALY. It has therefore grown up and is now in being as an essentially British headquarters. Details of how many British bodies already exist are shown in the footnotes to Appendix "A", though naturally they are not all yet officially confirmed in their appointments.

3. The legal standing of MMIA is now to be as part of the Allied Control Commission, but its immediate future is to be loaned to 15 Army Group to continue to be their executive agent as heretofore. This will mean that MMIA will continue to deal with two headquarters, 15 Army Group and AFHQ Adv Adm Ech, in which the heads of Ops, Staff Duties, Sigs, Engrs, "Q" (Adm and Mov), Med, S & T, O.S. and E.M.E. are all British. It appears soundest therefore to confirm its present general composition, and to add such American staff as may from time to time be shown desirable. Do you agree?

4. The American portion is at present proposed as

(a) on headquarter staff one colonel second in command; and two majors, one for staff duties and one for administration.

(b) on outstation staff one lieutenant colonel for NAPLES plus liaison staff for CAMPANIA and FIFTH ARMY to be produced as required. (incl Pbs)-- this note in pencil in parens.

5. The total staff required is based on the programme outlined in 15 Army Gp letter 1605/50/GSDI of 26 Dec 1943. This is a slightly larger programme than was discussed at the 20 Dec Conference at 15 Army Gp and takes up for the provision of 60,000 men in labour units and 50,000 men in skilled and semi-skilled units. British and American requirements are approximately equal. The formation of these units involves also their technical equipment and movement to destinations. Of this equipment the transport element above may involve the allotment of some 2,000 ve-

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6. It will be essential for the Stato Maggiore to organise a special planning staff to deal with this programme; and to appoint English speaking liaison officers to me, just as I have Italian speaking officers to deal with them, in order to cut down letter writing and its consequent translation and delays to a minimum. I should be glad if you would make this point to Marshal MESSE when the time comes to present the programme to him.

7. The organization herewith proposed is designed to cover the period of remoulding the Italian Army as laid down by General ALEXANDER within the general ARHQ policy. It should cover requirements up to inclusive the capture of HQME, though it may be necessary to make minor modifications (especially as regards the American element) from time to time. I suggest it should be subject to major review in six months time.

8. 15 Army Group inform me that their normal practice is to submit separately the British and American portion of an establishment. I should like to discuss whether to put the British portion through that and the American portion through you: or whatever would be the best course.

SUBJECT: Military Government Establishments.

TO : Acting Deputy President, Allied Control Commission.
 Chief, AMG, 15 Army Group.

1. a. This directive assumes that personnel of Regions I and II are under command of the Allied Control Commission. During such time as may elapse from the date of this order and Regions I and II come under command of Allied Control Commission, the channels of administration and communication outlined in this directive will operate so far as is possible as though Regions I and II were under command of Allied Control Commission.

b. Personnel of AMG, Fifth Army, AMG, Eighth Army, and of Regions III and IV are under command AMG, 15 Army Group.

c. In this directive 1a. above will be referred to as "ACC Command", and 1b. above will be referred to as "AMG Command".

2. a. All U.S. Army personnel concerned with administration of Italian territory under both Allied Control Commission and Allied Military Government are held on the manning table of 2675th Regiment, Allied Control Commission (Provisional).

b. All British personnel similarly concerned will be held on a consolidated War Establishment now in the course of preparation.

c. Headquarters of 2675th Regiment (Rear Echelon) has been established at Tizi Ouzou (North Africa) where the Headquarters will remain until the events contemplated in paragraph 2 d. occur. A British Administrative Headquarters has likewise been established at Tizi Ouzou to administer the personnel held on the proposed consolidated War Establishment and to keep appropriate records of equipment held on Army Form G1098. The British Administrative Headquarters will remain at Tizi Ouzou until the events contemplated in paragraph 2 d. occur.

d. Both the above headquarters will move from Tizi Ouzou to join their immediately superior headquarters (see letter, this headquarters, file 437 AG 387.4-1 MGS-ACM, subject: Organization of 2675th Regiment (U. 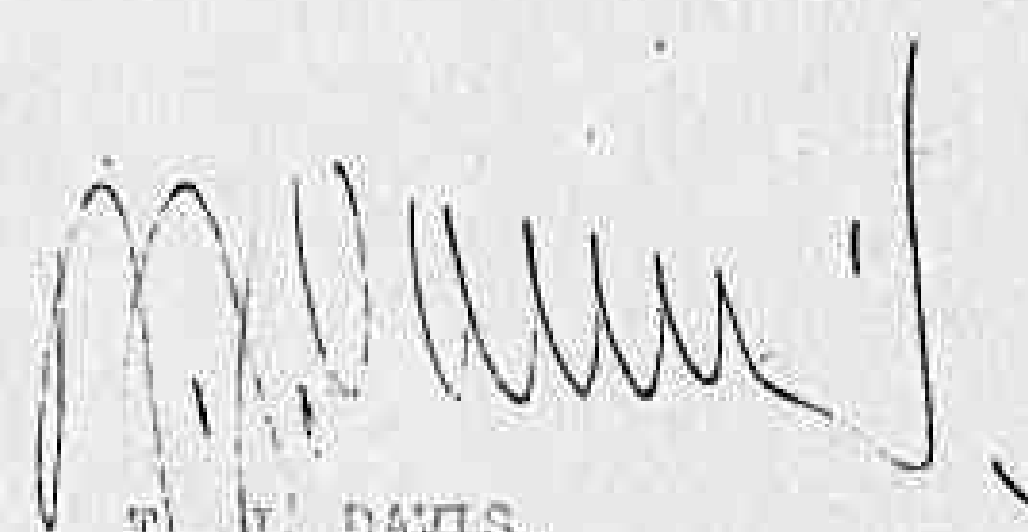

SHIPPING SUB-COMMISSION

1. The Shipping Sub-Commission of Allied Control Commission is established as part of the Communications Section.
2. It will be composed of the Senior Representative of the War Shipping Administration and the Senior Representative of the Ministry of War Transport at Allied Force Headquarters and necessary staff.
3. It will deal with matters affecting the use of Italian merchant ships, exercising its functions through appropriate representatives in Italy, subject to the limitations in paragraph 4.
4. All matters relating to the movement and control of ships in port or at sea are subject to the orders of the Commander in Chief, Mediterranean.
5. During such time as matters affecting Italian Merchant Shipping are handled by the Italian Minister of Marine, all such matters will be dealt with through the Flag Officer, Adriatic and Liaison Italy direct, or via the Naval Sub-Commission.

I - ESTABLISHMENT OF THE ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION

Announcement is made of the establishment of the Allied Control Commission for Italy, effective 10 November 1943.

II - FUNCTIONS

The functions of the Allied Control Commission will be as follows:

1. To enforce and execute the instrument of surrender under the orders and general directives of the Allied Commander-in-Chief.
2. To insure that the conduct of the Italian Government conforms to the requirements of an Allied Base of Operations, especially transportation and communications.
3. To be the organ through which the policy of the United Nations towards the Italian Government is conducted and the relations of the United Nations with the Italian Government are handled.

III - PRESIDENT OF THE ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION

1. The Allied Commander-in-Chief will be ex officio President of the Allied Control Commission.

2. A senior officer will be appointed to serve as his Deputy on the Commission.

Relation to Allied Forces
Assignment of Acting Deputy President

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1. The Allied Commander-in-Chief will be ex officio President of the Allied Control Commission.

2. A senior officer will be appointed to serve as his Deputy on the Commission.

IV - ORGANIZATION OF THE ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION

1. The Allied Control Commission will maintain a National Headquarters and will have such Regional, Provincial or other outlying offices as may be found convenient.
2. The Allied Control Commission will be organized into Sections, each administered by a Vice President. A Section will comprise a number of related Sub-Commissions, each charged with a special function.

V - RELATIONS WITH ALLIED MILITARY GOVERNMENT

1. The relations between the Allied Control Commission and Allied Military

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Government operating in the field will be coordinated by this headquarters.

2. Whenever it is decided that an area under Allied Military Government shall thereafter be administered by the Italian Government subject to the directions of the Allied Control Commission, the latter will extend its activities to include that area.

3. The decision when an area is to be transferred from one government to another will rest with the Allied Commander-in-Chief.

4. Personnel both for the Allied Control Commission and for Allied Military Government will be provided and allocated by this headquarters.

VI - RELATION TO ALLIED FORCE HEADQUARTERS

1. The Allied Control Commission will operate under Allied Force Headquarters.

2. All communications between the Allied Control Commission and the governments of the United Nations will be transmitted through this headquarters.

VII - ASSIGNMENT OF ACTING DEPUTY PRESIDENT

Announcement is made of the assignment of Major General Kenyon A. Joyce as Acting Deputy President of the Allied Control Commission.

SUBJECT: Staff study of the organization of the 2675th Regiment (American) and its British counterparts.

FOR : Major General Emyen Joyce

I. The problem presented

1. The organization of the American 2675th Regiment, Allied Control Commission (U.S. Contingent) (Provisional) and its British counterparts.

II. Facts bearing on the problem

1. Eventually there will be several general officers in the Allied Control Commission. All will have important assignments and none of them will care to take the time from those assignments for the duties of commander of either the American regiment or the British Administrative Headquarters.

2. The fact that general officers are carried on the rolls of the Regiment and of the British Headquarters does not necessarily mean that the senior American should command the American regiment, or that the senior British officer should command British Administrative Headquarters. For example, a division commander does not exercise immediate command of the Headquarters Company on which he is carried for administration and supply purposes.

3. The commander of the American Regiment should be an American Colonel. Colonel C. R. Parkin is now in command of an organization that can readily be converted into two Headquarters, one for the American Regiment and one for the British Administrative Headquarters. It would cause the least reorganization to put Col. Parkin in command of the American Regiment and some British officer of the same grade in command of the British Administrative Headquarters, reorganizing the permanent establishment at Tini Ouzou to meet the new requirements. The organization which Col. Parkin now commands has functioned as permanent personnel for a large tactical command prior to its present duties. That experience should be used.

4. AFH has responsibility for both AMI 15 Army Group and MI AMI (ACC). It should therefore make the initial allocations of personnel equipment and transportation to each of these units and order such subsequent changes between them as the high command considers necessary.

5. All personnel administrative and supply records of the American Regiment should, of course, be kept at the headquarters of that regiment, AMI 15 Army Group supplying data for that part of the regiment assigned to it. The regiment will forward to the Headquarters Command, Allied Force,

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the data and returns required by that headquarters. A similar procedure, conforming to British Army practice, applies to British personnel held on W/Es.

6. In order that AFHQ may have the necessary data upon which to coordinate personnel and supply matters between AMG 15th Army Group and HQ AMG (ACC), such reports of personnel and status of supply as it requires should be sent to AFHQ, as specified by that headquarters through HQ.

7. Because the best nucleus for the American Regimental Headquarters and the British Administrative Headquarters is now at Tizi Ouzou, and since the initial bulk supplies and all additional personnel must, for the present, come from North Africa, the regimental headquarters and the British Administrative Headquarters should be constituted at Tizi Ouzou initially. These headquarters should be moved to the location of HQ AMG (ACC) at the earliest practicable date.

8. Officer personnel over and above the authorized strength of operating Regions and their next higher headquarters, should be given permanent assignments only as approved by AFHQ. This is necessary in order that AFHQ may control assignments for future needs, some of which will not be known to HQ AMG (ACC).

III. Recommendations.

It is recommended that AFHQ, with the concurrence of Major General Kenyon Joyce, issue an order substantially as follows with distribution as indicated.

1. See Administrative Memorandum No. 69, AFHQ, dated 18 Oct 43, and letter from HQ NATOUSA (AG322/164 A-0) to CG HQ Comd, Allied Force, APO 512, dated 30 Sep 43.

2. a. The Headquarters and Headquarters Company 2675th Regiment, Allied Control Commission (U.S. Contingent) (Provisional), less detachments with AMG 15th Army Group and Headquarters AMG (ACC), will be established initially at Tizi Ouzou, North Africa, using U.S. personnel now on duty with the Military Government School and Holding Center as a cadre.

b. The British Administrative Headquarters, less detachments with AMG 15th Army Group and Headquarters AMG (ACC) will be established initially at Tizi Ouzou, North Africa, using British personnel now on duty with the Military Government School and Holding Center as a cadre.

3. a. The officer (U.S.) now Commandant, School and Holding Center, at Tizi Ouzou, North Africa, will command the 2675th Regiment, Allied Control Commission (U.S. Contingent) (Provisional) for administration and supply. He and his unit, in turn, are under the command of the CG, HQ AMG (ACC).

b. The British Administrative Headquarters will function in similar manner.

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4. Officer personnel, over and above the authorized strength of operating Regions and their next higher headquarters, will be assigned by HQ AMI (ACC), subject to the approval of this headquarters. Such officers may, however, be attached, to Regions or other headquarters for instruction or to meet temporary needs.

5. All records and returns of the 2675th Regiment ACC (U.S. Contingent) (Provisional) now at HQ AMI (ACC) will be forwarded without delay to Headquarters and Headquarters Company of that regiment, Military Government School, ARD No. 512.
