Subjects discussed:

- x-386.8-1 1. Told B for his secret info that Greek Govt coming to Italy on 7 Sept. Premier happy about resuming relations. In Cava because of lack of accommodations at Rome.
- x-100-1 2. Question of frozen bank account of Marchese Giacomo del Vascello. B not too familiar but has no sympathy for the Marchese. Said I would be guided by him. He says will discuss with Sforza.
- x-000.1-2 3. Discussed Gen O'Dwyer's recommendations contained in
x-091.1 correspondence re "Representations to the Ital Govt", that It Govt should bring fwd as soon as possible a detailed program of relief & rehabilitation. We would prefer it to be on basis of increased food & clothing rather than on increased money allowances. He agrees.

x-680.41 This program (see 3 above) might help B's govt's recommendations for application of lend-lease to Italy.

x-321-1 4. Asked B's reactions to my personal views on most effective
x-000.1-2 help Allies could give Italy after the war. Discussed: Group of 5 US & UK experts; joint economic mission; either FEA or UNRRA; etc. B expressed himself in full accord.

x-321-1 5. Asked B's reactions to proposal that Regional Comm's staff
4450 be withdrawn from Sicily, leaving only a skeleton crew, giving Lush's and Spofford's views. He agreed with Spofford & welcomed it as an experiment.

Dear Captain Stone:

I have checked with the Chief of Staff, Fifth Army to determine the answer to your query contained in the attached letter.

General Gruenther states that the creation of a G-5 Section, and the assignment of General Hume thereto with the title of Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, was for the purpose of organizing their staff on a proper basis to handle civil affairs and to give Hume an appropriate staff status in Fifth Army. The establishment of this section in no way alters the relationship of General Hume and the Allied Control Commission.

I trust that this clears up any doubt that might arise as the result of the issuance of General Orders No. 142, Fifth Army.

I am impressed with the suggestion that certain ACC and Regimental functions be amalgamated, such as S-1 -- G-1 and S-4 -- G-4. I note also it has been recommended that the suggested post of Deputy Chief of Staff and Director Establishment Branch and the position of Regimental Commander be held by the same person, who of course would have to be an American officer of the rank of colonel or above.

It would be appreciated if you would look over the report and on Monday, September 4, come to my office and tell me what you think about it. Can you come in at 3:00 P.M. (1500 hours) please.

In accordance with the terms of reference laid down by the Acting
Chief Commissioner, viz.,

"To consider the re-organisation of Headquarters, Allied Control
Commission, with the mission of making the greatest possible number
of Officers and EM/ORs available for field assignments and with a view
to securing optimum efficiency with the most economic employment of
available manpower. Consideration will be given to effecting the
elimination of all activities not absolutely required for the accomplish-
ment of the mission of the Allied Control Commission, and also to the
consolidation of offices and Sub-Commissions where possible, consistent
with the present situation".

The Committee examined the reports of all Sections, Sub-Commissions
and Branches of the Allied Control Commission, except those of the Service
Sub-Commissions, and interviewed the heads of such Sub-Commissions and Branches.

The Committee now submits its report.

1. In the opinion of the Committee the present organisation of the
Headquarters of the Commission, although suitable for the initial stages of
the amalgamation of AMG 15 Army Group and the Allied Control Commission, has,
by the experience of the last seven months, entailed certain redundancy of
work and personnel which, now that the Headquarters are concentrated in one
place and in view of the present situation, could and should be avoided.

2. In the opinion of the Committee the existence of four parallel
Sections and several independent Sub-Commissions, all having direct channels

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2. In the opinion of the Committee the existence of four parallel Sections and several independent Sub-Commissions, all having direct channels to the Chief Commissioner, has placed on him too heavy a burden of administrative detail. Furthermore, there appears to have been confusion of thought and practice with regard to the channel of command.

3. In order to overcome these difficulties the Committee recommends the institution of an Office of the Chief of Staff in the line of command from the Offices of the Chief Commissioner (and his Deputy) and the Sections and

(and Service Sub-Commissions.)

4. The Committee recommends the abolition of the Section now called Regional Control and Military Government Section and the setting up, under the Chief of Staff, of four Sections, the heads of which will be equivalent to Deputy Chiefs of Staff, viz:-

Civil Affairs Section
Economic Section
Political Section
Establishment Section

5. The Committee recommends that the Civil Affairs Section shall deal with those functions now operated by the Administrative Section together with the Patriots Branch, Italian Refugee Branch, and the Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, now dealt with by the present R.C. & M.G. Section: that the Economic Section be responsible for its present Sub-Commissions and in addition the Communications Sub-Commission and the Property Control Sub-Commission: the Political Section to remain with its present functions: the Establishment Section to deal with the matters now dealt with by the same Branch of the R.C. & M.G. Section, with the exception of domestic transport and the

Message Centres: the Regions for command purposes and the Army AMG's for functional purposes to depend from the Chief of Staff, *acting in the name of the*

8. The Committee recommends that a change in nomenclature is desirable in the title of the Administrative Section in order to describe the proper functions of that Section, and to remove confusion of thought, especially among other military organisations, which has arisen from its present title.

The Committee considers that the title "Civil Affairs Section" best describes its functions. The Committee also recommends a change in title of the Interior

Sub-Commission to Local Government Sub-Commission.

9. In order to avoid confusion which might arise from other changes of title, the Committee recommends that the following titles be adopted:-

Chief Commissioner.
Deputy Chief Commissioner.
Chief of Staff and Vice President.

Deputy Chief of Staff and Vice President, Economic Section.

The Committee recommends that the Director of the Legal Sub-Commission shall also carry the title of Chief Legal Adviser to the Chief Commissioner.

10. Subject to approval of the above basic change in organisation, the Committee recommends the changes, amalgamations and reductions in the Headquarters Staff of the Allied Control Commission shown in Appendix "B" attached.

11. The plan of the re-organisation recommended is defined graphically on the attached chart (Appendix "A").

12. The most important changes are:-

10. Subject to approval of the above basic change in organisation, the Committee recommends the changes, amalgamations and reductions in the Headquarters Staff of the Allied Control Commission shown in Appendix "B" attached.

(1) the reorganization of the Establishment Branch, to be called Establishment Section;

(2) the abolition of the War Material Disposal and Italian POW Sub-Commission and the absorption of its functions as follows:-

(i) War Material Disposal by Industry Sub-Commission;

(ii) Italian POW by Army Sub-Commission.

13. In considering the amalgamation of the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission and the Italian Refugee Branch, the Committee has recommended reductions in the field as well as in HQ.

14. The Committee, at your request, reconsidered its original recommendation made in its interim report that the Communications Sub-Commission should come under the Economic Section. The Committee fully appreciates the unique position of this Sub-Commission and its responsibility for civil censorship. Nevertheless, the Committee maintains its recommendation that this Sub-Commission should be absorbed into the Economic Section. If you do not agree to this proposal, the Committee recommends that it be placed in the same position as the Service Sub-Commissions. See para 15.

15. The Committee fully appreciates the special position of the Service Sub-Commissions, ~~(who are under the operational command of their respective service commanders)~~ but considers that channels of communication to the Chief Commissioner on Allied Control Commission matters should be through the Chief of Staff.

16. In considering the re-organization of the Establishment Branch the Committee was influenced by the peculiar position of the Headquarters of the 2675th Regiment established by NATOUSA. The position has caused much confusion and redundancy of work and personnel. The Committee therefore strongly recommends that the Director of the Establishment Section should be the

reductions in the field as well as in HQ.

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16. In considering the re-organisation of the Establishment Branch the Committee was influenced by the peculiar position of the Headquarters of the 2675th Regiment established by NATOUSA. The position has caused much confusion and redundancy of work and personnel. The Committee therefore strongly recommends that the Director of the Establishment Section should be the Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, provided that the Director is an American officer. If this can be done the amalgamation of G-1(A) and G-4(A) of HQ ACC with the HQ staff of the 2675th Regiment will be possible. This will make a balanced, economical and practical organisation for the Section. The Committee realises that the approval for this change will have to be obtained from NATOUSA and recommends that representations should be made as soon as possible.

17. The Committee has taken into account the Allied civil affairs now serving with the Allied Control Commission: it recommends that the introduction of any further Allied civilian staff should be in substitution of officers now holding the posts who will then be available for services in the field.

18. Certain re-organisation in the Economic Section is still under consideration by the Vice President (vide 12(f) above) and will affect the final figures in Appendix "B". The Committee has thought it wise not to wait for the conclusion of these considerations.

19. The Committee recommends that a standing Committee be maintained for the periodic review of the organisation and internal administration of the Allied Control Commission.

20. The Committee wishes to record its appreciation of the invaluable work performed by the Secretary, Lieut. Colonel J.L. Jones.

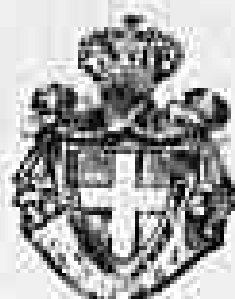

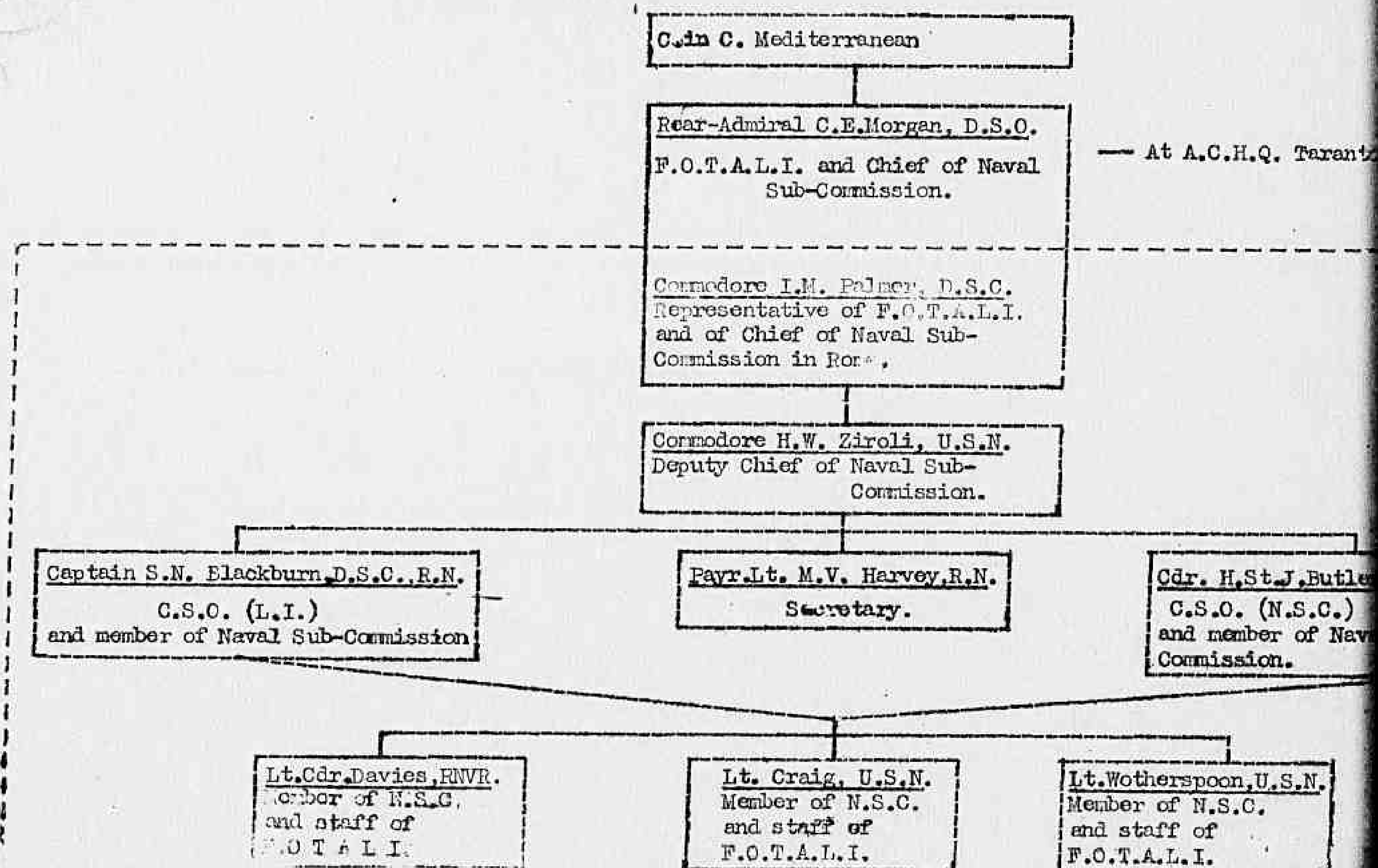

MEMO FOR: Colonel Densmore

SUBJECT: Report for Manpower and Reorganization Committee

1. I am required to submit a report to the Manpower & Reorganization Committee on the morning of Saturday, the 12th.

2. In view of the fact that my office is an integral part of the Chief Commissioner's office, I would like to have his opinion on the following:

3. The personnel of the Secretary General's office includes two civilians for typing work and the pressure of work is such that a request for a third has been made necessary. One enlisted man from my office has recently been assigned to the Chief Staff Officer on a full-time basis and another has been reported to G-1 (British) as available for immediate release. Further elimination of military personnel of the Secretary General's office can only be made by

- a. Eliminating one set of the duplicate files now being maintained.
- b. Slowing down the passage of correspondence in and out of the section.
- c. Slowing down of filing. In general, at present, everything is in the file, properly recorded, not later than the day following that when sent out to file.

4. With reference to 3a -

The duplicate set of files is being maintained on orders of the Acting Chief Commissioner in order that a set of the Chief Commissioner's files may be available later for both the American and British Government Archives.

5. With reference to 3b -

- In order to keep a proper check on the flow of correspondence and guard against loss and mishandling, correspondence must be properly logged, both in and out. At present one man is occupied full time in maintaining the logs. If this job were to be combined with another, it would mean the inevitable slowing up of the flow. Elimination of the logs would mean that there would be absolutely no means of accounting for any correspondence once it had left the hands of the receiving or dispatching clerk. It would even be impossible to say with certainty whether any given piece of correspondence had actually been received or dispatched.

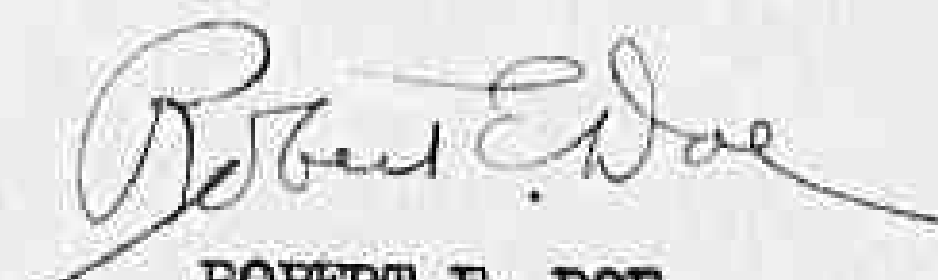

6. With reference to 3c -

In order to be properly filed, papers must be classified by a trained clerk who is thoroughly familiar with the filing system. This again is a full-time job for one man. In addition to this two men are required, full time, as file clerks (one for each set of files), to do the work of filing the papers, recording outgoing files, and keeping the files in order. The chief file clerk supervises the above three men, substitutes for any one of them when absent, also substitutes for the Chief Clerk of the Secretary General's office when he is absent, and acts as a relief stenographer when needed.

7. Without elimination of one set of files no reduction in personnel is possible here without causing delays in getting material into the files; with the consequent danger of loss if papers are not bound into their proper files as rapidly as possible. Once work is allowed to fall behind, the amount backed up will not remain static, but will tend to increase. If this is allowed to happen it will only mean that the Chief Commissioner will be unable to get references without increasing time lags.

8. Inasmuch as reduction of personnel in the Secretary General's office depends largely on whether or not two sets of files are maintained, a ruling is requested from Captain Stone on this point. If he wishes to continue two sets of files, then I believe the report to the Reorganization Committee should be that the only reduction possible is in the two messengers, I/Cpl Heath and Gunner Lally, and then only if civilian replacements would be permitted to carry highly classified documents.

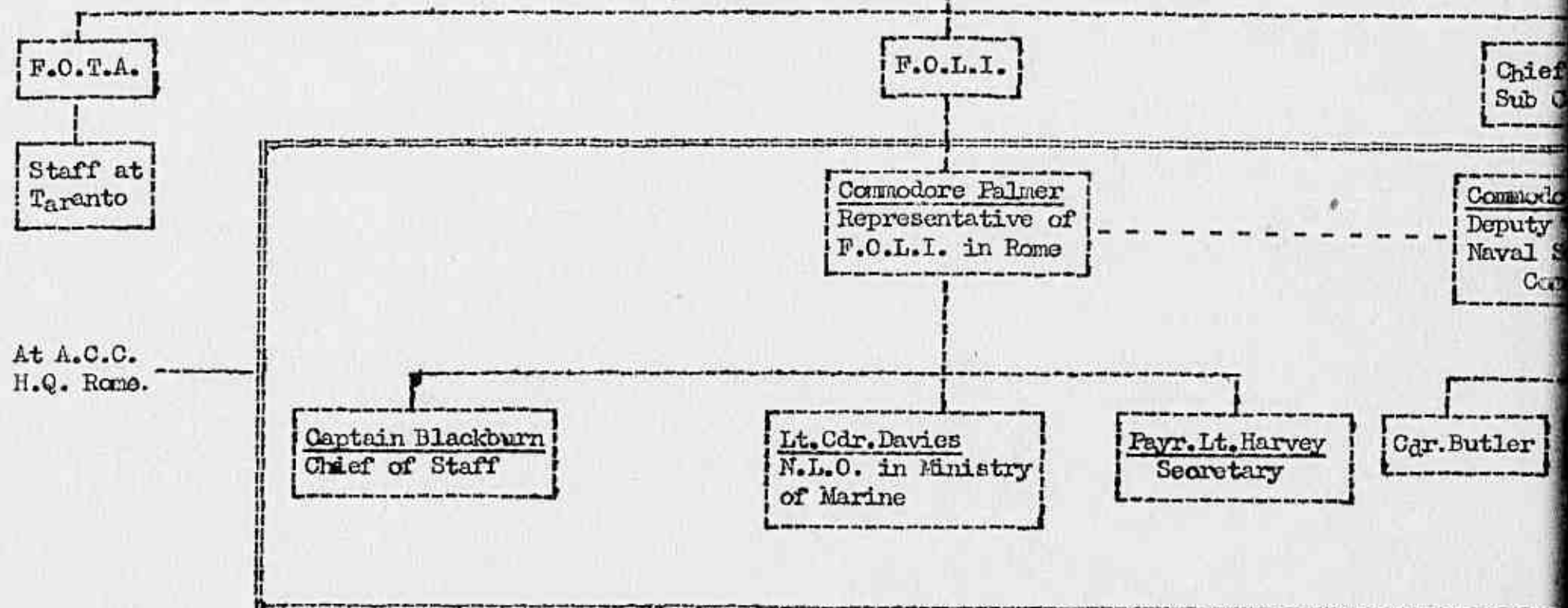

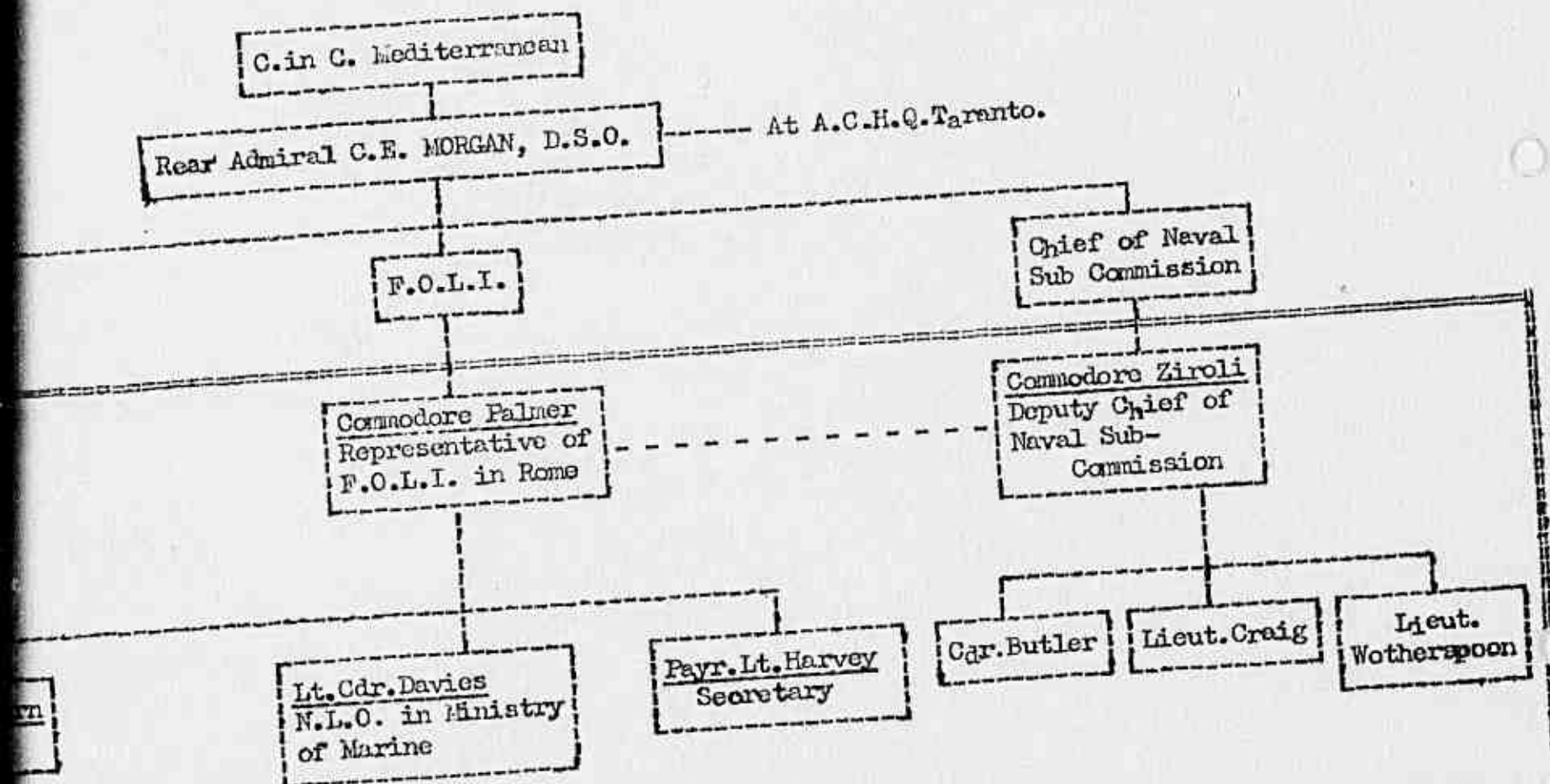

FUTURE OF THE POLITICAL SECTION

It is my understanding that the Moscow Declaration laid down that at a given moment the Advisory Council would take over either the control of the Allied Control Commission or the work of the Allied Control Commission. Presumably what this meant was that we envisage the ultimate form of control of Italy by the Advisory Council acting as a council of Ambassadors. When will this moment be? The most logical moment for such a transfer of authority would be when we can relax on the tight form of Anglo-American controls embodied in the Allied Control Commission, i.e., when hostilities against Germany in Italy cease.

If this is the ultimate aim, are there any interim steps that can be taken towards it which would simplify our set-up and yet maintain the necessary degree of executive efficiency? On the face of it the existence of a political section in A.C.C. as well as British and American representatives on the Advisory Council with their staffs look redundant.

Suggestion 1. Complete abolition of the Political Section.

This would only be possible if the Advisory Council were to take over the whole political work of the Control Commission. The executive drawbacks would be as follows:

a. Many military decisions, e.g., over Partisans, despatch of a military mission to Yugoslavia, etc. have a strong political flavour. Would we want all six nations of the Advisory Council to be consulted about these matters?

b. Even if the answer to a is yes, how could we prevent such consultation taking so much time as to clog all action?

c. What would be the channel of communication for exercising control between the Advisory Council and the Italian Government: the British and American representatives? Or an Anglo-American Secretariat? Would the other four countries ever agree to such a proposal?

Suggestion 2. The reduction of the Political Section from the status of an independent section with Vice Presidents to a liaison section with the British and U.S. members of the Advisory Council.

This would meet a great many of the objections to Suggestion 1. The difficulty would be in keeping an efficient organization running. At present the Political Section are able to answer off the bat a very large number of the enquiries addressed to them, either by the Chief Commissioner or by other Sections of the Control Commission, or by outside enquirers. A purely liaison section would slow down administration by having to refer matters to two separate diplomatic missions in Rome and corollary answers.

Suggestion 3. The appointment by the U.S. and British representatives on the Advisory Council of their deputies as political advisers to the Chief Commissioner in place of the existing Political Section.

It is possible, but presumably unlikely, that the other members of the Advisory Council would object to this. This is, in effect, a proposal that the Chief Commissioner should have political advisers of roughly the same standing as at present. Its practicability would depend on whether the U.S. and British members would be prepared for their deputies to give the Chief Commissioner a whole day's work. In our experience in the last nine months and more there have been very few days in which it would have been possible to do more than the one job.

I therefore conclude that it would be politically wrong and organizationally inefficient to attempt to carry out Allied control of Italy as at present understood without something corresponding to the Political Section of present standing.
