SUBJECT : Removal of Restrictions on the Travel to, and Residence in, Italy of Allied Civilians

TO : Assistant Chief of Staff  
G-5, AFHQ

1. Reference your memorandum G-5:500.4-7 of 25 September 1945.
2. The Italian economy, in so far as food is concerned, is already dependent on the import of supplies that are rationed to the Italian population. The present availability of a balanced diet in Italy as these people are accustomed to in the US and UK is non-existent, and it is felt that Allied civilians could not lead a healthy life on the present rationed foods. However, as long as commissary privileges are available, there should be no drain on the Italian economy.
3. Inasmuch as the number of people involved is not known, it is difficult to ascertain the effect on the fuel supply. However, it is felt that the requirements of such a limited group would not seriously effect the Italian fuel supplies available.
4. It is suggested that the dependents of governmental employees be sustained with supplies made available through governmental agencies in the same manner as are the governmental employees themselves. Commercial employees would not be dependent on the military or government agencies but would have to provide through their own means.
5. In compliance with para 8 of subject memorandum, it is recommended that military control of travel to, and residence in, Italy of dependents of commercial and governmental employees be discontinued; i.e., the answer to para 8 is "no".

PARAPHRASE EXTRACT OF W-68208 from AGWAR

There are in the State Department several applications for families of Commercial and Governmental employees to travel to and reside in Italy, and other applications have been previously disapproved.

If military control of civilian travel is to continue what are your views as to the policy which should be employed? In view of the fact that Italy may shortly become one of the United Nations it is believed that it will be most difficult for the military to justify continued control of travel by civilians. Just because there are US troops in Italy it is not an occupied country in the same way Austria and Germany are. There is no implication that the military should be responsible for civilians unless they are dependents of military personnel travelling in or through the country. The JCS believe that military control should cease.

The commanding generals of the forces were urged to keep approvals at an absolute minimum and to encourage the use of skeleton staffs instead of complete staffs as a means of reducing the numbers of those

who may required to be employed in excess of 40 hrs per week.

The 40 hrs of regular scheduled work will wherever possible be confined to the period of Monday to Friday inclusive. No work schedules for the basic 40 hours week will, therefore, be established which provide for a shorter work day than 8 hours so as to extend the 40 hours into the 6th day.

The reduction in hours will not be considered as justification for any increase in total civilian strength in any force or War Dept group.

Finally the foregoing will not operate to change the tours of duty of on - call employees established in accordance with applicable regulations. Request this office be advised by cable immediately if it will not be possible for your command to conform to this policy;"

SUBJECT: Allied Civilian Travel.

TO : Vice President, Establishment Section

1. It has been noted that the Commission is publishing numerous orders authorizing travel, both by government motor transport and military aircraft, for various Allied and Italian civilians on trips which the military necessity thereof may be quite open to question.

2. I cite for example:

a. Paragraph 5 of Special Orders #95, this hq, dated 5 April 1945 in which three American civilians of the Economic Section were authorized to proceed to the Isle of Capri on five (5) days temporary duty in connection with activities of the Allied Commission. It is not exactly clear what official activities that the Allied Commission was engaged in on the Isle of Capri at that time.

b. Paragraph 46 of Special Orders #96, this hq, dated 6 April 1945 two American civilians were directed to proceed to Foggia on temporary duty for two (2) days on an assigned mission. In this particular case travel was directed by military aircraft and indicating that all charges and expenses incidental to travel would be chargeable to the War Department. Again it is not clear what the exact mission on the weekend of April 8th that Miss Wolfe and Miss Carter had in Foggia.

c. Your attention is also invited to paragraph 3 of Special Orders #142, dated 22 May 1945 in which Miss Sheppard and Miss Assante of the Economic Section were sent on seven (7) days temporary duty to Venice in connection with activities of the Economic Section. It is not understood what official mission this personnel was assigned to in Venice during this period.

You are accordingly directed to institute an official inquiry, immediately, as to the exact nature of these and any other similar trips.

3. The use of military facilities for personal pleasure trips that are covered by official orders under the guise of official business is a courts-martial offense. Further, the use of military aircraft

for personal pleasure trips has been specifically forbidden by AFHQ directive. Accordingly every effort will be made to eliminate this practice and you will take such steps as may be appropriate to prohibit any recurrence.


