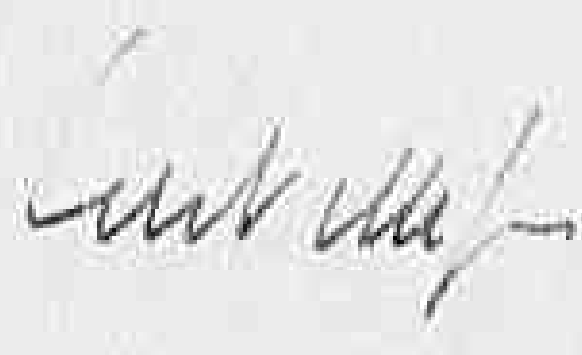

Most specifically he assured me that his Government would insist on functional participation by French officers in Service Sub-Commission or their successors.

2. Admiral MOULLEC's successor, Captain DE VILLEFOSSE, who has just returned from LONDON where he assisted in some of the deliberations of the Deputies of the Foreign Ministers, confirms this.

Thank you so much for sending me the Soviet's reply to your Embassy in MOSCOW on US participation in the Allied Control Commission in the Balkans.

The credentials of the Soviet member of the Allied Commission were laid down in the Chief of Staff's (AFHQ) letter of 26th January 1944 (attached), which were implemented in General Mason Macfarlane's memorandum of 31st January. As you will see from both these documents, the Russian member attends the weekly meetings of Vice Presidents, works on a Vice President's and Director's level, he has complete access to officers on that level, and copies of reports and correspondence considered of interest to him are forwarded to him.

As you know, matters of policy are invariably discussed, generally before their execution, at the Vice Presidents' meeting, and the Russian member has full opportunity to join in this discussion which takes place every Wednesday morning. You will doubtless also remember that only on one occasion in the past year has the Russian member joined in the deliberations of this meeting. That was when he raised his voice in protest against the action of the military police who fired upon some Russian General who broke a military police road block.

In fact, consultation needs cooperation, thought and work. This has not been found with our Russian members.

Provided they obtain permission from the Commission and AFHQ and obtain proper travel orders, there is no general restriction on the Russian members visiting any part of Italy. They are not, however, encouraged to visit AMG Territory, for this is outside the scope of the Commission. The mention of a 50 kilometre limit is, of course, quite inaccurate.

I shall be glad to discuss with you whenever you are next in the Commission building.

REGULATION ON THE ITALIAN ARMED FORCES FOR FRENCH
AND USSR REPRESENTATIVES WITH THE ALLIED COMMISSION.

1. In view of the importance of adopting a common policy in regard to the treatment of requests from the French and USSR representatives in the Allied Commission for information about the Italian Armed Forces or requests for visits to them, the following notes are issued for the guidance of Navy, Land Forces and Air Forces Sub-commissions.

2. Contact between Allied Officers and Italian Service Ministries.

Direct contact between Wish, French and USSR Representatives ^{in the AC Ministry} and Italian Service Ministries ^{and Comms} will not be permitted. Allied officers wishing to correspond or to have interviews with members of the Ministries will do so through the Sub-Commissions.

Where, however, a French or USSR officer may have to deal continuously with a branch of a Ministry on account of some special task that he has to undertake under the terms of the Armistice, the above rule may be waived by the Director of the Sub-Commission concerned.

3. Information.

- (a) Information may be given to the French and USSR Representatives on the Allied Commission on matters of strength, composition, establishments and armament of Italian Armed Forces.
- (b) Information will not be given on future plans and policies of a secret nature while these are still under discussion, without reference to the Director of the Sub-Commission concerned.
- (c) Information on questions of morale, fighting value, personalities of Italian officers, or on the relationships between...

requests for visits to them, the following rules are issued for the purpose of Navy, Land Forces and Air Forces Sub-Commissions.

2. Contact between Allied officers and Italian Service Ministries.

Direct contact between USAR, French and USAR Representatives and Italian Service Ministries will not be permitted.

Allied officers wishing to correspond or to have interviews with members of the Ministries will do so through the Sub-Commission.

Where, however, a French or USAR officer may have to deal immediately with a branch of a Ministry on account of some special task that he has to undertake under the terms of the Armistice, the above rule may be waived by the Director of the Sub-Commission concerned.

3. Information.

(a) Information may be given to the French and USAR Representatives on the Allied Commission on matters of strength, composition, establishments and armament of Italian Armed Forces.

(b) Information will not be given on future plans and policies of a secret nature while these are still under discussion, without reference to the Director of the Sub-Commission concerned.

(c) Information on questions of morale, fighting value, personalities of Italian officers, or on the relationships between services or between services and civilian sides of Ministries, will be confined to generalities and will normally be referred to the Director of the Sub-Commission concerned.

4. Visits of French and USAR Representatives to units or establishments of the Italian Armed Forces.

Visits by French and USAR Representatives to Italian service units or establishments may only be made when authorized by the appropriate Service Sub-Commission. If the necessity arises of authorizing visits not

within the terms of the last sentence, authorization should only be made after notification to the appropriate Italian Ministry, and the visiting officer should be accompanied by a representative of the Sub-Commission concerned.

5. No information regarding the Italian Armed Forces should be given to enquirers not attached to the Allied Commission (excepting US and British officers assigned to this theatre); such enquirers should be referred to their respective diplomatic representatives.

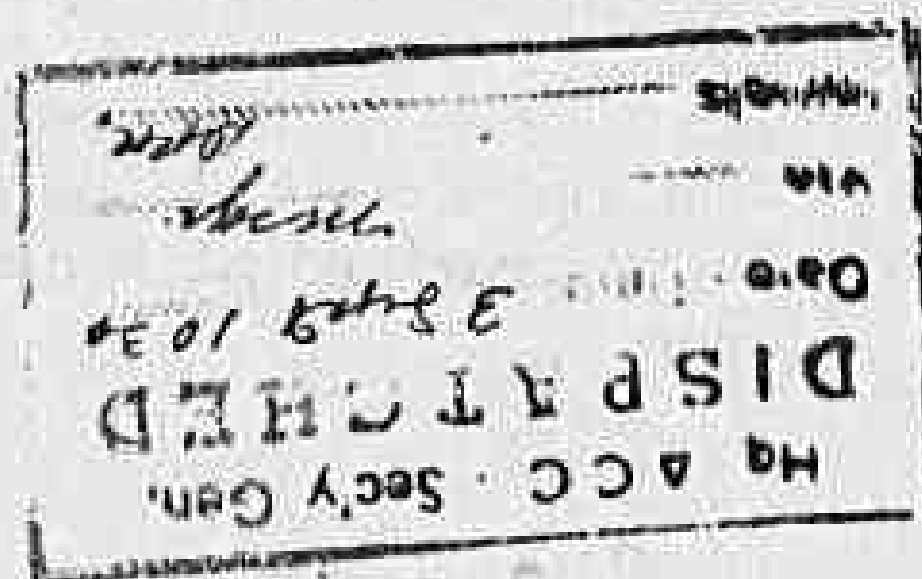

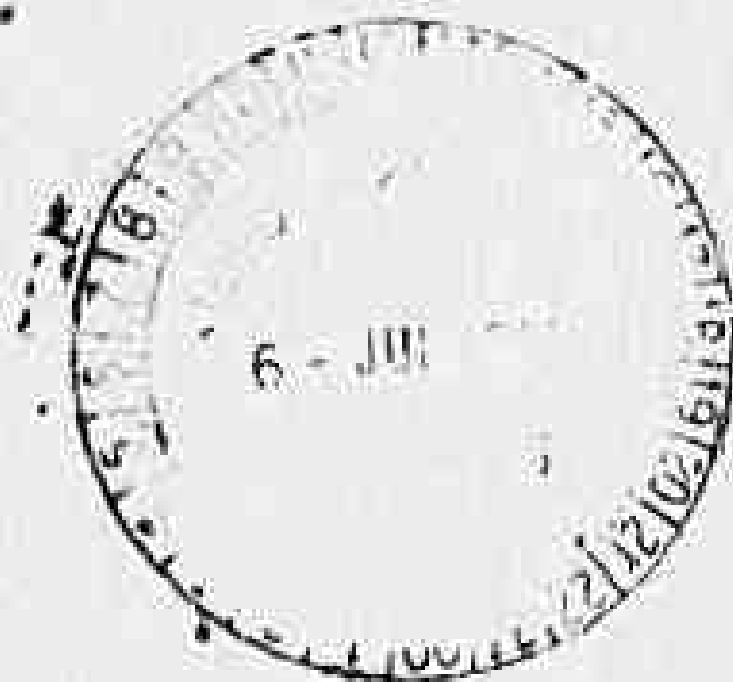

The United States Government considers that the request by the Yugoslav Government for representation on the Allied Commission is unjustified in the present circumstance. That Government is not participating in the military operations in Italy and is adequately represented on the Advisory Council in regard to matters of a non-military nature. Furthermore, it is the policy at present to eliminate control features of the Allied Commission, thus reducing its activities, and accordingly it is regarded as inappropriate and unnecessary at this time to increase membership on the Commission.

Similar considerations apply to the request on the part of Greece for representation on the Allied Commission.

The grounds put forward by the Yugoslav Government for participation in the Allied Commission are specious and H. M. Government are not prepared in present circumstances to support their request in the Advisory Council.

Ultimate decision may be governed by arrangement eventually made for dealing with Venezia Giulia. This is however no reason for not refusing Yugoslav request now.

You should inform the Government to which you are accredited that H. M. Government consider the Yugoslav request is unjustified in present circumstances and express the hope that the United States/Soviet Governments share their view and will be prepared to instruct their representatives on the Advisory Council accordingly.

If the Soviet Government are inclined to support the Yugoslav request it can be pointed out that neither Yugoslavia nor Greece have a seat on the Roumanian, Bulgarian or Hungarian Control Commissions although they have considerable interests in these countries.

1. While the question as to the size of General Susloparov's staff has not been definitely settled, I feel that in the meantime we are obliged to provide him with a car for his personal use commensurate with his grade.

2. I understand that recently a car for the accommodation of VIPs has been obtained by Colonel Clough from some one in the Vatican. It would appear that such VIP's car which is under the control of Colonel Clough should suffice for VIP's traffic. If this assumption is correct, would it not be possible to assign the "BUICK" which is now under the Secretary General's control for General Susloparov's personal use?

3. In any event, I feel that an appropriate car for General Susloparov should be made available without delay. At present he has been provided with a small "LANCIA", but this car is inadequate for his use.

Dear General Susloparov:

During our recent conference you informed us that you planned to include in your staff eight Soviet officers as assistants in addition to your aide-de-camp. In order that I might be clear on the position of the Soviet member of the Allied Control Commission, I have reviewed the terms of reference of this appointment which were sent to the Commission on 26 January 1944 by Allied Force Headquarters.

The instructions were to the effect that the Combined Chiefs of Staff had approved the appointment of a Soviet member of the Allied Control Commission for Italy with statement of functions as follows:

"The functions of the Soviet member will be consultative. You will accord him access to information on all aspects of the Commission's work and he will have the right to make suggestions to the Deputy President of the Commission."

I referred the matter of an increase of eight additional officers in your representation to the Supreme Allied Commander Mediterranean. I have now been directed that I must await instructions before permitting any of the additional officers to take up any duties with the Allied Control Commission.

Pending a decision and clarification on this matter, it is considered that cars for the additional officers should not be requisitioned. Information has also been received that the Supreme Allied Commander Mediterranean has decided that no more villas are to be requisitioned in Rome, but pending his further instructions as to the status of the four additional officers who have already arrived, we shall be glad to accommodate them in a hotel.

I will give you further information with respect to these matters upon receipt of a decision from SACMED.

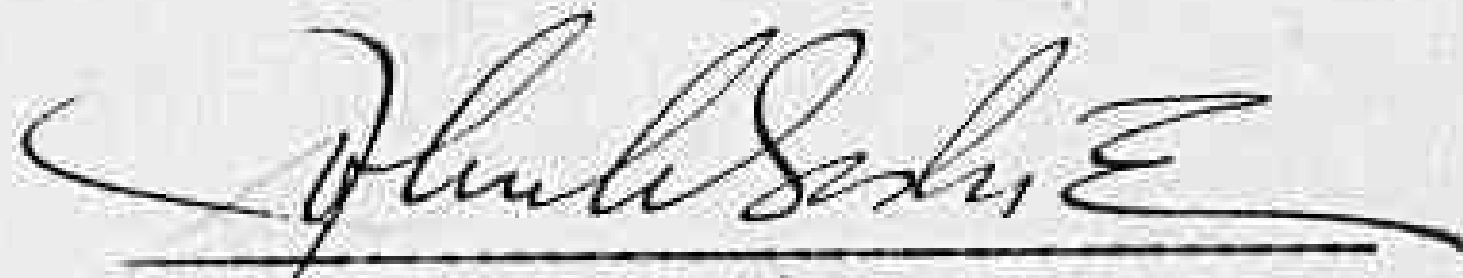

I TURNED OVER TO THE MILITARY AUTHORITIES ON JUNE 17 OVER 100 BOYS SNATCHED OUT OF GERMAN HANDS WHOM I HAD BEEN, WITH THE AID OF A FEW COLLABORATORS, HIDING IN ROME. AMBASSADOR INFORMED YOU CONCERNING MY OFFICE BUDGET. A LUMP SUM IS URGENTLY NEEDED TO AID 500 POLES IN ROME ALONE. I PAID SUBSIDIES DURING THE WAR FROM THE FUND FOR POLAND AND ALSO SUPPORTED THE BOYS ABOVE REFERRED TO OUT OF THE FUND FOR 6 MONTHS. MY REGISTRATIONS SHOW THAT THERE ARE NOW ABOUT 800 POLES IN ROME SOME OF WHOM ARE NUNS AND CLERGYMEN. MANY OTHER POLES EXPECTED ARRIVE FROM ALL OVER ITALY. I ASSUME THAT ADDITIONAL BOYS TO THE NUMBER OF A 1000 DESTINED FOR THE POLISH ARMY ARE IN ITALIAN TERRITORIES OCCUPIED NOW BY THE GERMANS. I AM PLANNING A CELEBRATION IN COMMEMORATION OF GENERAL SIKORSKI ON JULY 5 END MESSAGE PARA PLEASE INSTRUCT WHETHER SUCH MESSAGES SHOULD BE ACCEPTED IN THE FUTURE AND HOW MINISTER LORET SHOULD BE REGARDED BY ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION

1. Delicate situation has arisen regarding position of General Solodovnik and his two aides, Golubev and Belobokoe. Solodovnik was apparently intended by Russians as permanent member of Commission and this is his understanding of his status. Vyshinski has raised this matter at Advisory Council and British and American Ministers here have advised their governments and asked for instructions.

2. This Headquarters has asked to be consulted before any status is accorded to Russian Representatives.

3. Pending decision of this matter, consider inadvisable that Solodovnik and aides should be despatched to Algiers unless willing to go. They should therefore either be accommodated locally, or preferably arrangements made for further tour in occupied territory for present.
