Your Excellency:

As you will have already been informed by Marchese Cittadini-Cese I am sending to you for your approval a slightly amended copy of Enclosure 1 to letter 234 of 21 March 1945 from His Excellency The President to Admiral Stone on the transference of the Ufficio Informazione (ex-S.I.M.).

The amendments are very slight and arise from the following considerations:

1. Elements which are part of the Truppe di Sicurezza are also "under Allied operating command".

2. Serial 11, "Codes and Cyphers" is NOT "under Allied operating command" but IS part of Category 5.

As it is urgent to have Sig. Bonomi's proposals cleared by the Allied military authorities with the least possible delay, I would be most grateful if Your Excellency would inform Marchese Cittadini by telephone that the new "Enclosure 1" has your approval. I would be obliged if Your Excellency would confirm, at the same time, if the Ufficio Informazioni is definitely now the new title which it is intended to employ.

Translation

The President of the Council of Ministers
23/4

Rome, 21 March 1945

Reference to our conversation of this morning, I want to emphasize my point of view about the passage of the Ufficio Informazioni (ex S.I.A.) under the dependence of the War Department.

- 1) This passage which was decided in the Council of Ministers of March 7th, was, as you know, approved on general principle by the Allies, who asked for some conditions to be respected, so that they could give a final approval. -
- 2) I sum up these conditions which I have no difficulty in accepting:
 - a) the elements forming the Ufficio Informazioni appear in enclosure n. 1, and were drafted in agreement with M.A.I.A.;
 - b) the office will depend directly from the Chief of Staff of the Army;
 - c) the organization and the functions of the elements of the Ufficio Informazioni, at present 'under Allied operating command' (c.f. enclosure 1) will remain unchanged;
 - d) when the passage will have taken place, the organization and personnel of the remaining elements of the Ufficio Informazioni will be examined in view of a possible reorganization; nevertheless, no changes or transformations will be made without the previous approval of the Allies for any proposal whatever on this subject presented by the War Ministry;
 - e) the passage under the dependence of the War Ministry will have to take place as soon as possible; in no case later than April 1st;
 - f) these various conditions give the guarantee, required by the Allies, that the Ufficio Informazioni will not be used as a political instrument.

I shall be most grateful, my dear Admiral, if you will kindly send me an answer on this subject.

The President of the Council of Ministers

Dear Admiral,

yesterday, during the meeting of the Council of Ministers, it seemed necessary to appoint without delay the Chief of the Arm of the Carabinieri. A vacancy during these difficult days would have been dangerous.

However, the name we had agreed upon (that of General Segrè) hasn't been accepted. There is a heavy charge against him because of some facts which took place last year in Pisa. We had to choose a young general who hadn't been politically compromised, and who - living and knowing Rome - could take command immediately. General Brunetti commanded the town of Rome and seemed therefore the best man to take in hand the Rome Carabinieri. We had thought of naming a general of Army Corps (Brunetti is only general of Division) but none of the names seemed advisable.

GENERAL BRUNETTI.

The abovenamed was born at Pesaro on 25.11.1887 and has served in his present grade since 27 June, 1940. He is an Artillery officer and has commanded the "Brescia" Division and the "Aosta" Division. Before assuming command of the Lazio-Umbria-Abruzzi zone he was the military commander of Sardinia. He has two military medals, and a cross for military valour.

He has no political affiliation, but is monarchically inclined. He is said to have ^{had} anti Fascist leanings by his pupils, when he was a Colonel commanding the artillery school at Turin.

He was taken prisoner by the Allies in Tunisia, but was later released to take up his duties in Sardinia.

Preliminary enquiries made at S.I.M. and F.S.S. have revealed no grounds upon which objection could be based to his appointment as Commanding General of the CCRB upon Security grounds. A full report will be submitted in due course.

THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS

Rome, March 8th, 1945

Dear Admiral,

I received your letter dated today which crossed mine where I explained why the Council of Ministers has abandoned the name of General Sogno, already agreed upon, for Gen. Brunetti's.

Of course, in doing so, the Council meant, as it is a military matter still under the control of the AC, to submit to the approval of same this appointment, which, as a matter of fact, has the character of nomination.

It is for such reason that I ask you, dear Admiral, to bring up to the Allied Command the new nomination, pointing out that the serious internal situation requests the appointment be promptly made.

It is understood that, if for said reasons of internal order Gen. Brunetto BRUNETTI will provisionally act as Commander of the Carabinieri, his appointment will not become effective and the necessary decree will not be signed until the ~~WZwxwix~~ AC's approval will be given.

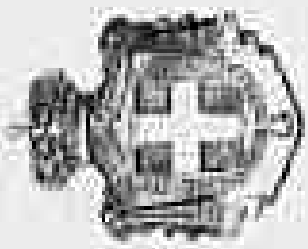

My dear Mr. Prime Minister:

On 6th March I received a communication from you asking whether the appointment of General Sogno as General Commanding the CC.RR in succession to General Orlando would be acceptable to the Supreme Allied Commander. I obtained the Supreme Allied Commander's approval and communicated it to you.

I learned from the radio last evening and read in this morning's newspaper that the Italian Government has approved the appointment of General Brunetti as the General Commanding the CC.RR. I presume that this is a mis-statement.

If the report is true and the Italian Government has, in violation of the terms of the Armistice as modified by the communication recently made to you by the Acting President and myself, made an appointment of military importance without seeking the approval of the Supreme Allied Commander, then I must request that the reason for such an appointment should be communicated to me and that the officer in question shall not take up his appointment until the approval of Field Marshal Alexander has been obtained.

I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter Prot. No. 205 of 6th March 1945 and in confirmation of oral communication made to Dr. Montanari by myself this morning, have to inform you as follows.

The Supreme Allied Commander will not object to the transfer of S.I.M. from S.M.G. (Italian General Staff) to S.M.R.E. (Italian Army Staff) provided that:

- (a) that part of S.I.M. now operating under the Supreme Allied Commander's direction continues under his direction unchanged;
- (b) the organisation of S.I.M. under the S.M.R.E. shall be such as to prevent S.I.M. from becoming a political instrument and as to ensure the fullest coordination with the Allied war effort. To this end the details of such transfer to S.M.R.E. shall be approved by the Supreme Allied Commander before such transfer takes place.

Dear Admiral,

As you know the SIM, after the accusations which appeared in the Italian press, has thought it expedient to change the name to the office of Information.

The change in name of the SIM has not stopped suspicion. Because of the fact that the Information Service is not part of the Ministry of War but of the Chief of General Staff and therefore of the Presidency of the Council. It is believed to be still partially a police organization which exercises its own political policy.

To cut short these unfounded rumors it seems to me expedient to pass the office itself under the direct responsibility of the Minister of War. Minister Casati and all the principal Ministers are all in agreement on this passage which we would like to decide upon tomorrow.

If the passage of the office from the Presidency to the Ministry of War is decided upon, measures will also be taken to cut down the excessive personnel of the office, as its organization seems too large. With a smaller staff it will be able to carry out its military function more speedily.

In this case Minister Casati will propose the opportune measures which I will submit to the preventive examination of the Allied Commission.
