YOUR 1310 CONCERNING ISSUE PERMITS TRAVEL FROM GERMANY TO ITALY AND VICE VERSA REFERS

1. ASSUME REFERRED TO OUR PERMIT OFFICE DOES NOT REFER TO THOSE OUTSIDE GERMANY SINCE THEY NO LONGER DEAL WITH TRAVEL TO ITALY WHICH IS HANDLED BY ITALIAN CONSULS. PERMIT OFFICES DEAL WITH TRAVEL TO VENEZUELA OUTLIE DIRECT WITH AUTHORITIES THERE. CAN BE NO QUESTION OF ATTACHING ITALIAN OFFICIALS TO THESE PERMIT OFFICES AS WOULD HAVE NO FUNCTIONS TO PERFORM.
2. TRAVEL GERMANY TO ITALY. VOLUME IS SLIGHT. NOT PREPARED TO ACCEPT ITALIAN OFFICIALS TO DEAL WITH THIS. 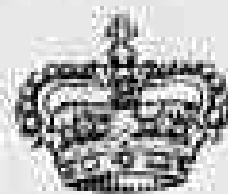

One of the heirs of their royal highnesses the young princess, Lida Mini, of Pilsade and Costanza Pignesschi - born at Pistoia on 27.3.1915 died at Pioncasse-Montreux, Plarimond Nursing-home after an operation, on August the 15th, a victim of the typhus epidemic at Milan.

The body is at present in the Veytaux cemetery:

A.R.D. the Lieutenant General of the Pilsade and the princess of Pilsade expressed the wish of having the body transported to Pistoia, where the Mini family is living, and asked me to see with you, my dear Admiral, whether you could kindly allow the transport of the body, and, if possible, supply a track for the transport from Pioncasse-Montreux or Chiasso to Pistoia.

In Switzerland, all documents have been supplied, and the necessary agreements made with the Pilsade Consulate and the Swiss Authorities which allow the transport which should take place by railway from Montreux to Pioncasse-Montreux, or, if you prefer, to Chiasso.

The coffin has been made according to all sanitary regulations for transport abroad, and there is no danger of infection; the certificates are in order.

Will you kindly let me know in time whether you allow the transport, so that I may have time to make the necessary agreements with the Pilsade Consulate and the Pistoia Prefect.

SUBJECT: Documentation for Entry into Switzerland

TO: All Concerned

Owing to the haphazard arrivals of numbers of military personnel at the Swiss Frontier desiring to visit Switzerland, the following information covering entry into that country is issued for your information and guidance:

a. BRITISH SERVICE PERSONNEL

- (1) British service personnel are only allowed to enter Switzerland individually when on duty or official business. Prior concurrence is obtained from the Swiss Government in all cases and can be obtained through G-1 (Pr) AFHQ.
- (2) Only exception to above are parties of military personnel in transit through Switzerland under the "REDLOC" scheme. Members of these parties are not permitted to detrain while travelling through the country.

b. UNITED STATES SERVICE PERSONNEL - Entry of United States Service personnel is divided into three (3) categories: (Special Service MTOUSA Bulletin Number 17, contains full particulars of these categories).

- (1) Duty or official business requiring advance clearance with the Swiss Government, obtainable through G-1 (A), this headquarters.
- (2) Organized seven-day conducted tours under MTOUSA orders, individual members may not leave the tour party at any time during stay in Switzerland.
- (3) United States personnel are permitted to enter Switzerland for the purpose of visiting blood relatives. Procedure is the same as for conducted tours except that MTOUSA orders must specify name, address, and relationship of person to be visited.

c. CIVILIANS

- (1) Swiss Nationals may enter on production of valid passport.

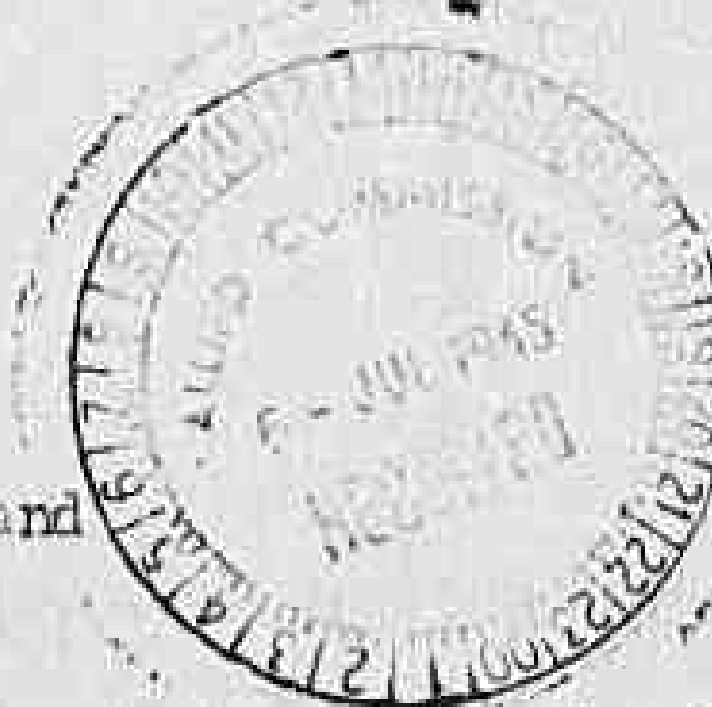

INTRA-THEATER TRAVEL

AFHQ Administrative Memoranda Number 70, 1943; Numbers 3 and 55, both 1944; and Section II, Number 1 and Section I, Number 9, both 1945, are rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. The following instructions concerning intra-theater travel are published for the information, guidance and compliance by all concerned.
2. For the purpose of this memorandum, the Theater boundary will be considered to include all territory, except Malta and Gibraltar, located within the extreme limits of either the MTOUSA or AFHQ boundary.
3. Commanders to whom authority is delegated to issue travel orders will determine the need for and mode of travel necessary for the accomplishment of the duty directed, secure liaison and security clearances when necessary, and then issue written travel orders. However, only those commanders subsequently authorized by this headquarters, in separate and specific instructions, to authorize travel by aircraft will issue orders authorizing or directing travel by aircraft.
4. Subject to the exceptions contained in paragraph 5 below, and without prejudice to the British system of unit movement orders issued by respective commanders within the limits of their competence, the following commanders are authorized to issue orders directing travel of personnel assigned or attached to their respective commands, and of American or British civilians, as applicable, who are assigned or attached to, or reside within their respective commands, to destinations within the geographical limits of their commands, or to geographical areas and units under the jurisdiction of, or assigned to other major commands, provided the concurrence of the other major commanders is obtained in advance.

Requests for travel to geographical areas and units under the jurisdiction of, or assigned to other major commands will contain name, grade, nature of visit, localities to be visited, expected time of arrival, mode of travel and estimated length of stay.

5. The following types of cases will be referred to AFHQ for approval:

- a. Requests for travel to Malta and Gibraltar for other than personnel of the British Armed Services.

- b. Requests for travel to points in French North Africa by personnel except:

- (1) Personnel of the British Armed Services.
- (2) Personnel of the French Armed Services.
- (3) ADLS and Ships Manifest Couriers.
- (4) Personnel departing from Greece whose travel has been approved by AMET or Headquarters, BTNA.

6. The following modes of travel will be used:

- a. Surface as necessary.

- b. Air:

- (1) Priority for air transportation will be granted only in cases where the time element and/or type of mission justifies it.

- (2) All travel to be performed via Air Transport Command or Naval Air Transport Service facilities (US) will be governed by the provisions of War Department Circular 451, 1944, as amended, to be subsequently implemented by an AFHQ directive subject: "Procedures Concerning Air Transportation via the Air Transport Command or Naval Air Transport Service".

- (3) Each commander or chief of staff section must be certain that the mission of the individual concerned justifies the request and that other means of transportation are less practicable, before he approves a request for air travel to be presented for preparation of orders.

- (4) Under no circumstances will air travel be approved solely for the convenience of the individual concerned.

c. Rail: - Full use must be made of existing rail schedules, and when possible, travel will be planned sufficiently in advance to permit utilization of this means of transportation.

d. Government Motor Transportation:

(1) Government motor transportation will not be authorized for transporting individuals to points more than 100 miles distant from points of origin except when it is uneconomical or militarily impracticable to accomplish the mission by any other means of transportation. Whenever possible two or more individuals will use the same vehicle.

(2) Scheduled military bus service will be used to the maximum extent practicable.

(3) When applicable and necessary, all travel orders not involving assignment of motor transportation for principal portion of travel to be performed will include authorization for the appropriate command, having primary responsibility for the area in which initial destination is located, to furnish such motor transportation as may be required for local travel in furtherance of the official mission. Need for such special motor transportation, other than that which is normally furnished for short distances and duration by local motor pools, may be indicated in cables which advise interested headquarters of the expected time of arrival.

7. Upon request of the Delegate, American Red Cross, or an authorized representative, final action on request for travel of American Red Cross personnel within the Mediterranean Theater of Operations may be taken by the Commanders concerned, without reference of higher headquarters. In cases involving unusual circumstances, requests may be forwarded to this headquarters for final action.

8. Air travel for personal reasons:

a. The Chairman, Air Priorities Board, is authorized to consider on its own merits, each request for travel for compassionate reasons which has been personally approved in writing by an officer of the Allied Forces of the grade of Colonel or higher grade, or its equivalent in the other services. In case of travel for temporary duty for rehabilitation, recuperation and recovery, the Chairman, Air Priorities Board, is authorized to grant priorities for travel by aircraft in accordance with provisions of Section V, War Department Circular Number 369, 1942. Compassionate reasons include compassionate leave or furlough, compassionate posting and emergency rotation, and temporary duty for rehabilitation, recuperation, and recovery.

b. Priority rating for air travel solely in connection with leave or furlough other than for compassionate reasons is not authorized and will not be assigned except as in c. below.

c. Lieutenant Colonels or officers of equivalent rank and above, proceeding to the U.K. under "Leave in Addition to PYTHON" or similar scheme may be granted air priority when such officers hold operational commands or positions in this theater, the importance of which necessitates that they return in a minimum amount of time.

1. The extreme shortage of accommodation in the large northern cities has made it necessary to restrict the issue of Travel Orders as indicated below.

a) To Italian Civilian Personnel.

Orders will be issued only to Italian officials travelling by AC courier plane and will bear the endorsement:-

"The procurement of billet and messing facilities in the city of is the responsibility of the traveller, and Allied Commission/AC assumes no liability in connection therewith."

b) To Allied Civilian Personnel.

As a general rule no orders will be issued to Allied civilian personnel not having assimilated commissioned ranks indicated on their WD, AC Form 65-8/Identity Cards. It is not anticipated that the need will exist for the services of female civilian employees on such journeys, but in the event of it being necessary each case will be considered on its own merits.

2. All requests for Travel Orders should contain a clear description of the mission to be performed - such notations as "AC activities" being unacceptable.

3. The above applies to travel orders for the following cities:-

and will come into force w.e.f. the date of this memorandum.

4. In no circumstances will orders be issued for leave or recreational purposes.

SUBJECT: CI/Security Instruction (Austria) No. 3 - Travel to and from Austria

TO: All Concerned

Travel to and from Austria (zones occupied by American or British Forces) will be severely restricted and regulated in four phases.

1. First Phase - from the date of surrender or occupation of the whole or part of the territory concerned to the date when a skeleton form of CI Travel Control has been established. During this period:

- a. The Frontier Zone will be occupied by tactical units with the object of "sealing" the borders as they existed at 31 December 1937.
- b. The frontier will be closed to all travellers (including Kleiner Grenzverkehr - frontaliere) not forming part of the Allied Forces of occupation.
- c. CIO/TC Control personnel will take up posts on the frontier.
- d. Forward CI Travel Control Office will be set up at HQ Occupying Force in the American and British Zones respectively, and machinery for occupation and disposition of applications for authorization to cross the frontier will be prepared.
- e. Travel to Austria will only be permitted to the following:

- (1) US and British military personnel on duty. When travelling as individuals, military personnel must be in possession of regular travel orders.
- (2) Holders of Allied Force Permits endorsed "Valid for entry to Austria only" and issued by G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, or other authority designated by that office. Allied Force Permits at this stage will be issued "for entry only" unless exceptional circumstances are present and to individuals whose proposed journey is of immediate operational importance.

f. Travel from Austria will only be permitted to the following:

- (1) US and British military personnel on duty. When travelling as individuals they must be in possession of regular travel orders.

- (2) Persons travelling under escort and/or in possession of a Waybill Authority issued by CI/CBI(b), Fifth or Eighth Armies.
- (3) Allied ex-prisoners of war evacuated to Italy by air and controlled under C-1 (A) and C-1 (B) arrangements.
- (4) Russian citizens moved under special arrangements.

2. Second Phase - after skeleton CI Travel Control is operating. Separate American and British CI Travel Control Offices with Fifth and Eighth Armies will move to Vienna as soon as operationally possible, having due regard to the status of the remainder of the CI organization. During this period:

a. Forward CI Travel Control Offices at Fifth and Eighth Armies' Headquarters, respectively, will begin to operate and the frontier will be opened to limited traffic.

b. Frontier Guards drawn from occupational troops will:

- (1) Prevent all persons and goods not forming part of the Allied Forces from entering or leaving Austria except at authorized Frontier Control Posts.
- (2) Arrest and hand over to the nearest CI Frontier Post for examination and detention all unauthorized persons detected crossing or attempting to cross the Austrian Frontiers.

c. Travel to Austria will be extended to:

- (1) Holders of Joint Chiefs of Staff Permits issued in Washington) endorsed

- (2) Holders of Allied Force Permits issued by the Military Permit Office in London)
 and by SIBEL.)

During this stage, permits may be issued for entry or for entry and exit.

d. Travel from Austria will be extended to:

- (1) Holders of JCS and AF Permits endorsed for a return journey.
- (2) Holders of Military Exit Permits issued by Forward CI Travel Control.
- (3) Displaced Persons documented and moved under C-5 arrangements. Each group will carry:

- (a) 1 copy of DP 1 (Index Card) on each individual.
- (b) 1 copy of the nominal roll with each Group leader for delivery to CI Frontier Control at crossing point of exit.
- (c) 1 copy of DP 2 (Registration Card) per individual endorsed with visa of country of destination. These will be held by the group leader in respect of each member of his party.
- (4) Allied ex-prisoners of war moved under G-1 (A) and G-1 (B) arrangements. Each PW (unless evacuated by air under special J.F. orders) will hold a PW Identity Card issued by a PW Contact Officer or his representative.
- (5) Such other categories as may be notified by Forward CI Travel Control.

3. Third Phase - after CI Travel Control is fully established. This phase coincides broadly with the remainder of the period of control by this headquarters. During this period:

a. Frontier Guards will continue to operate as before.

b. Personnel engaged on frontier and airport control will confine themselves to travel security duties and operate under the direct command of the Travel Control Sections at Allied Commission/Army Headquarters British and US elements, respectively. Their duties, undertaken in Phase Two where possible, will include:

- (1) Manning of frontier and airport control posts.
- (2) Examination of all travellers and enforcement at the frontier or airports of travel regulations and instructions.
- (3) Making preliminary investigations into and interrogations of doubtful and unaccounted travellers and persons detected attempting to cross the frontier or to leave or enter Austria illicitly by air.
- (4) Insuring suspects are sent to detention camps for further investigation.
- (5) Security Control of the movement over the Austrian border of displaced persons and Allied ex-prisoners of war.
- (6) At frontier posts making local arrangements to deal with Kleiner Grenzverkehr (Borderers).
- (7) Organizing security patrols on unauthorized routes in conjunction with the local military commander.

(5) Advising the local military commander on the disposition of frontier guards.

a. Detailed instructions covering military entry and exit permit procedure will be issued. Civilian traffic will be kept to a minimum compatible with the interests of the Allied Administration of Austria.

4. Fourth Phase - From the time when this headquarters starts to hand over to the Control Commission. During this period, conditions will be as in the Third Phase, except that:

a. If deemed desirable, the categories of persons who may obtain entry and exit permits will be expanded.

b. Personnel of a purged and reorganized Austrian Frontier Control organization should be available to assist in dealing with the increase in traffic.

5. As a matter of travel control procedure, the beginning and ending of each phase will be decided and publicized by the Counter Intelligence Travel Control Organization for Austria.
