Particular attention will be given to include the figures showing authorized grades based on the latest Table of Allotment (cf. 2. All promotions of enlisted men will be announced in Regimental Special Orders except those from Private to Private First Class which are announced in Company Orders.

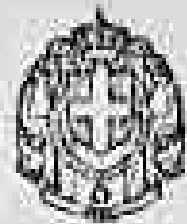

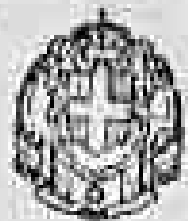

He made a personal appeal for prompt delivery of the enlisted men and through personal contacts at the 27th Replacement Depot, the best men available were assigned. In order to obtain quick delivery, a 1st Sergeant and a vehicle were dispatched from this headquarters on the morning of 6 May and returned in the afternoon of 7 May.

I wonder if you can help me to settle the mess difficulties of the staff of the Italian Liaison Officer to the Acting Chief Commissioner.

Sergeant Pennone and the other clerk mess with the Italian ACC Unit located at Via Lambro, which is a one-hour walk from here. Messing hours are 1130 and 1730, which means that the clerks must leave during office hours and when they come back it is time to knock off. Commander Apostolo has already tried unsuccessfully to change this schedule. When possible, the clerks accompany the driver, who messes there too, but the driver is not always readily available. Due to these circumstances, Commander Apostolo cannot efficiently produce his work, which is of great assistance to the Acting Chief Commissioner.

Could not Sergeant Pennone and the other clerk be fed at the EM mess at the Hotel Nord e Nuova Roma? I don't mean necessarily that they should mess with the EM, though they are well known and would, I think, be welcomed. But to avoid complications another solution might be found. For example, I understand two civilians are having their meals in a small room adjoining the mess, and I understand there is plenty of food.

I'd be very grateful if you could help in this as our poor Italians have had rather a hard deal lately.

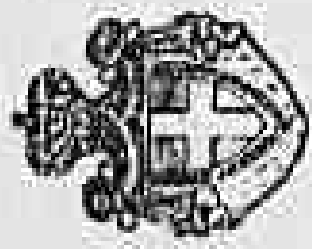

 - (b) CO 2675th Regt had informed Col. Clough "no vacancies" exist.
3. Col. Clough has agreed to detail an American Major who is familiar with Army T/O's, grades and ratings, to take charge of the matter.
4. Col. Clough will coordinate with the regiment and determine whether or not any enlisted promotions can be made.
5. I suggested to Col. Clough that if it is determined that certain vacancies do exist, that they should be apportioned to the various sub-divisions of AMG/ACC according to enlisted strength.
6. Col. Clough stated that four attempts had been made to obtain additional T/O grades and ratings without success and that it would be futile to approach ANHQ again.
7. I am of the opinion Col. Clough will be able to obtain some vacancies that can be used to take care of the most urgent cases.

MEMORANDUM TO: Captain Stone

1. I have been checking into the question of promotions for enlisted men. As you know, these promotions have been held up for some considerable time. I do not think that it is conducive to good morale to hold men down who are fully deserving of promotion, and we have many such. The reason for non-promotion which has been given to G-1 (American) by Colonel Parkin and Colonel Uhler of Regimental Headquarters is that no promotions will be made until the enlisted strength of the Regiment is reduced to the T/O level. However the Regimental Headquarters has violated this precept themselves by promoting about 100 men within the past month throughout the Regiment from Private to Private First Class. No other promotions have been made. The total enlisted strength of the Regiment two or three days ago was 1077. The T/O authorized strength is 1045. Of this strength charged to us 64 enlisted men of varying grades have gone to North Africa with the Gerry Operation, and are still charged to our strength although not expected to return and not doing one of our jobs insofar as I know. 10 enlisted men employed with MGS, AFHQ are also charged against our strength. If these 74 men could be removed from charge against the Regimental T/O, our actual strength would then be under the T/O authorization. Below is a table listed showing the various grades of actual strength and of T/O authorization. You will see that in nearly all categories vacancies exist. I can see no reason for further delaying the promotion of deserving enlisted men and penalizing these men because of the policy of waiting until the Regiment is down to T/O authorization, a factor over which they themselves have no control.

2. If there is anything that you can do to get this matter clarified, it will be greatly appreciated.

MEMORANDUM TO: Captain Stone

1. Attached are copies of papers relating to recommendations for promotion of officers and enlisted men of the Allied Control Commission. These recommendations are all concerned with personnel formerly at Brindisi. The recommendations for the American officers listed have all been destroyed in accordance with memorandum from Headquarters 2675 Regiment attached. The case of Captain Collins (British) is now being considered with other recommendations by the British C-1.

2. The recommendation for commission for Sgt. Sorisi was returned from AFHQ with no action and with the note that it is not the practice to return enlisted men to the states to attend OCS and that direct commissions for men in this theatre have been withdrawn, except for battlefield appointments. Detachment Order No. 2, 1 February, has been revoked because of instructions from NATOUSA freezing all promotions. At the time this order was issued the NATOUSA instructions had not been received at ACC Headquarters.

3. It appears under present NATOUSA instructions that nothing can be done regarding any promotions until NATOUSA issues instructions "un-freezing" the situation.
