SUBJECT: Officer Replacement

TO : Commanding General, MTOUSA, APO 512.

1. Unless further postponement of reduction in grade is approved, the present Director of the Communications Sub-Commission, Colonel Henry E. Scudder, Signal Corps, will be returned to the United States for release on or about June 1, 1946, which will leave this Sub-Commission with no U.S. officer. Regardless of whether the functions of the Communications Sub-Commission are retained by the Allied Commission or assumed by AFHQ, it is considered essential in the interests of the United States that a qualified replacement be found to carry out the duties at present performed by Colonel Scudder.

2. The replacement officer should be a Signal Corps officer with the rank of Colonel or Lieutenant Colonel to avoid placing him in a position of inferiority to British officers in the same field. Technical knowledge is desirable but not essential and is subordinate to the ability, personality and experience of the officer which should be such as to enable him to deal with high officials of the Italian Government and representatives of Allied and Foreign Governments as well as international communication companies.

3. Previous experience in commercial communications work and a knowledge of Italian or Italy would be of course valuable attributes but it is appreciated that under present conditions chances of obtaining an officer with such qualifications are exceedingly slim.

4. In view of the international importance of communications in the Mediterranean Theater it is considered that it is of the highest importance that the replacement officer be fully qualified and it is requested that this Headquarters be given the opportunity of passing on the names of any officers available.

My dear Admiral:

I refer to your conversation with General Hamblen regarding the status of Colonel Floyd Stearns. Under existing War Department criteria, Colonel Stearns must be on board ship returning to the United States on the first available shipping after his volunteer certificate has expired. The schedule for April is still uncertain although we do know that we will have a ship returning to the United States after the 15th of April. If it happens that this ship sails on or after the 25th of April it will be possible to comply with your desires that Colonel Stearns remain in this theater until that date.

Would it be possible for you to have Colonel Stearns keep a close eye on the shipping schedules to determine whether this very desirable solution presents itself and to notify this office if it does not so present itself? In this latter case General Lee has indicated his complete willingness to request the War Department to make a special exemption in this case in order to retain Colonel Stearns until date you require him.

1. Request is hereby made that I be granted 15 days temporary duty in the U.S.A. effective December 20, 1945 and that travel by military aircraft be authorised.

2. Request is made by reason of news recently received that this Officer's wife has undergone a serious operation and is not well. There are other pressing family matters which can only be satisfactorily solved by personal contact.

3. Request for effective date of TDY of December 20, 1945 is made by reason of fact that this Officer is at present the only Telecommunications Officer in the Communications Sub-Commission and his services cannot be spared until arrival of a British Officer, who is expected to return from TDY in the U.K. on or about December 15, 1945.

4. Request for air travel and limitation TDY to 15 days are dictated by consideration that this Officer is the only U.S. Officer remaining in the Communications Sub-Commission and it is essential that his absence be reduced to a minimum.

5. Following data is submitted as to service

- c. Present principal duty assignment: Director Communications Sub-Commission, Allied Commission.

SUBJECT : Reformation of Police Forces.

TO : AFHQ, G-5 Section.

With reference to your G-5: Oth. 12 of 7 Oct 45 and in continuation of my letter 3636/191/EC of 30 Oct 45.

1. Owing to the recent continuous changes in regard to the numbers and categories of officers remaining with or leaving the Allied Commission it has not been possible to form earlier an estimate of the number of police officers available for duty with IMIA.

2. No officers will be available for assignment to IMIA before the hand-over of the Northern Regions. After the hand-back to Italian control of the Northern Regions, it is estimated that 10 Police Officers can be made available for assignment outside the Public Safety Sub-Commission and AMG territory. At least one of these would be of the rank of Lt. Colonel. Owing to the requirements of Venezia Giulia, all officers available will probably be British. If the mission is to be Allied, as recommended, arrangements for the provision of US personnel will have to be made.

3. In connection with this matter I must be satisfied on behalf of the British Home Office that any British Officers assigned to IMIA are employed on purely police duty, for which purpose they have been provided to the British Army from the Home Office.

SUBJECT : Compassionate Leave to European Countries

TO : Distribution below

1. A limited leave scheme to Switzerland on compassionate grounds only has been approved by the War Office. Compassionate grounds on which leave may be authorised are similar to those which would secure reversion to UK under the terms of GRO 165/45 or the fact that the applicants family has been resident in Switzerland since June 1940 and owing to the war the applicant has been unable to see them since that date.

2. If an application is granted it will be subject to the following conditions:-

- (i) Valid British passport and Swiss visa must be in the applicants' possession.
- (ii) Plain clothes must be worn.
- (iii) Currency regulations must be obeyed.
- (iv) Travel from the Swiss border will be at private expense and the individual concerned must be maintained in Switzerland entirely at his own expense or the expense of the persons he is visiting.

3. Compliance with the above conditions will be the applicants' responsibility. A British passport can be obtained from the British Consul Naples (or Athens for personnel in Greece) and a Swiss visa from the Swiss Legation Rome.

4. Applications for leave will be submitted in accordance with GRO 165/45 to this HQ. A firm address at which the applicant will spend his leave if granted must be given. Leave will be for a period not exceeding 28 days from the date of crossing the Swiss border.

TO : Distribution below.

1. Compassionate leave on a limited scale is now open to JERSEY and GUERNSEY but not yet to ALDERNEY; leave can only be granted ex UK and this means that personnel in this theatre must first be reverted to Home Establishment except as provided below.

2. Compassionate posting to UK, where the object is to obtain a period of compassionate leave in JERSEY or GUERNSEY, will be authorised by AFHQ in cases where the grounds are such as would obtain a compassionate posting to UK under the terms of GHO 165 of 1945 had the application been one for compassionate posting to UK. Long absence from the CHANNEL ISLANDS by itself is not considered to be sufficient hardship.

3. Personnel returning to UK on LILOP or normal leave and who have grounds for a grant of compassionate leave in the CHANNEL ISLANDS may make application to the War Office for such leave but, to avoid accumulation of individuals awaiting passages, should not be despatched to UK on normal leave out of turn solely for the purpose of visiting the CHANNEL ISLANDS.

4. LILOP, normal leave and compassionate reversion cases should on arrival in UK make detailed application to the War Office, Whitehall, London S.W.1 submitting full particulars and an address in the Islands where enquiries can be made.

5. Application for compassionate reversion to UK in cases of this nature will be submitted in the form prescribed by GRO 165 of 1945 and should be accompanied by supporting evidence and in this connection attention is invited to GRO 707 of 1944.

6. A War Office ruling as to whether personnel domiciled in the CHANNEL ISLANDS are eligible for DOMCOL under GHO 305 of 1945 has been requested.

SUBJECT : Leave, Officers, OR's/EM.

TO : Acting Chief Commissioner.

1. I had intended raising at yesterday's meeting the question of officers ORs/EM's leave but in view of the presence of our distinguished allies I thought it better to postpone mention of so trivial and domestic a matter.
2. Although RCs have, I believe, long exercised a discretion over leave in Regions there has been no general scheme of leave at this HQ, with the result that a very large number of officer, ORs/EM (most of whom came out in Aug or early Sept of last year) have now been without leave for nearly if not quite a year.
3. I am sure that this lack of leave is affecting the efficiency of many officers OR/EMs at this HQ especially those who are older and holding the more responsible jobs. Need for some leave is aggravated by the particularly trying atmospherical conditions in Rome during the last 2 months.
4. Accordingly I suggest that leave be regularly allowed to officers and OR/EMs of this Hq. It could I am sure be done, under arrangements to be made by each section without any formal roster, on the basis that in a Sub-Commission having 10 officers or less one officer and one OR/EM could be away at any time (and proportionately in the larger Sub-Commissions); the actual order of officers and OR/EMs to go be arranged between V.P. and Directors of Sub-Commissions concerned.
5. Such a system would, I believe, greatly increase the efficient discharge of their duties by many officers.

SUBJECT : Leave for officers.

TO : Regional Commissioners, Regions I, II, III, IV, V, VI and VII.

1. With reference to para. 4 Minutes of Regional Commissioners' Conference 15-16 April, "Local leave" was authorized by the Executive Commissioner provided that no more than 20% of officers were on leave at any one time, and that the officers did not make any attempt while on such leave to enter Army areas. It was further agreed that the above provisions should also apply to EM/CRs. Travel will be regularized by the issuance of Regional Orders under authority of this letter placing the officers or EM/CRs on temporary duty for not to exceed six(6) days at the location for which the leave is requested. The order placing them on temporary duty will authorize the travel.

2. The regional Commissioners of Regions I and VI have previously been authorized to order air travel in the name of Headquarters ACC and that authorization is extended to this type of temporary duty. Regional temporary duty that the MATS will not be over-crowded with officers on "Local leave".
