I take the liberty of asking you for a favor, sure of your prompt and kind interest: I wish that the enclosed letter be sent by your office to the addressee in order to make an experiment to make sure, as having sent 28 letters to Major Malatesta, I never had any reply. As I am quite sure of the Major who would have replied to me immediately, I am afraid that my letters are being destroyed here in Turin by a mysterious censorship or that there may be a ruling that all letters of Italian girls to American officers be destroyed. I have expressed my fears to Col Fiore here in Turin and he does not believe this and with kind understanding has at once forwarded a letter of mine with his own mail, but to this day I have not got a reply and torment myself in a nameless anxiety as I adore Major Malatesta whom may be you know too. I am a serious, honest, good girl and am working in a railway office to support my 73 years old mother who is ill and a sister who has a delicate health and does not work. The Major was my sweet dream, my joy and my hope, and destiny has carried him away from Turin as soon as I met him.

Dear Admiral, I beg you to help me. You too have a heart and have loved and still love: try to understand me! I would follow the Major on my knees, I love him so much! Be kind! Try - as only you can do - to send my letter by air mail. I shall pray from here also for you and for your loved ones and if I get the grace of marrying the Major, I shall come to Rome to thank you personally. I send you with a smile my sincerest thanks and the deepest expression of my grateful heart.

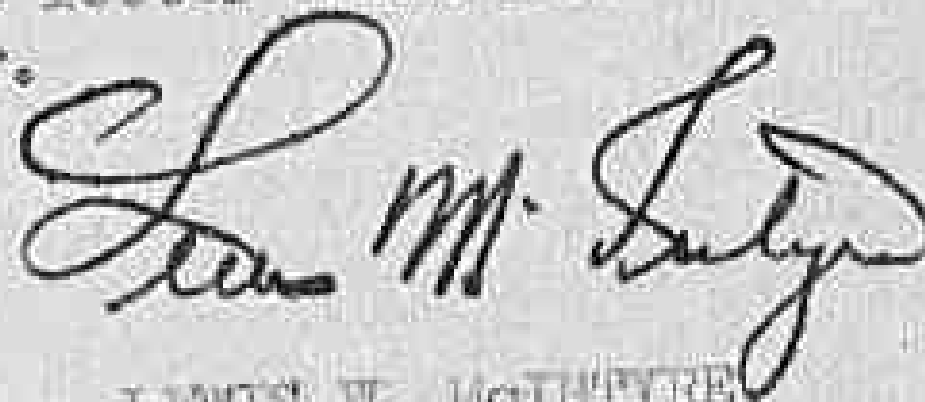

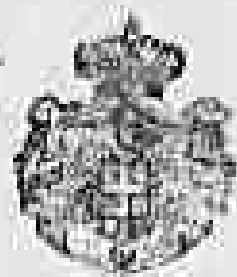

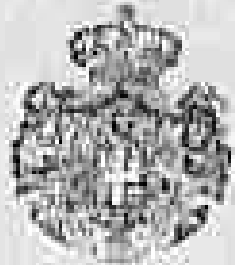

We hope and pray that your right to extend the control of your victorious army of true liberation over the entire territories of Northern Italy including Trieste and Istria in the interest of justice, democracy and freedom will not be denied or frustrated.
