This Ministry has been informed verbally that before long the War Material Disposal Sub-Commission will hand over to the Italian Government all the files regarding the regularization of car wrecks rebuilt by Italian private persons, with the authorization of the above mentioned Subcommission.

As this will mean settling relations with several hundred people concerned, according to the procedure and regulations fixed by the Commission, even if it is under the responsibility of this Ministry, it is a matter of great interest for the Italian Government that the files should go on being handled by the people who, up to now, handled them ably and disinterestedly.

I therefore beg you, my dear Admiral to allow the personnel attached to this Subcommission, Mrs. Pessina, Aldo Franco, Valetti Ciriaco, and Berardinelli Fernando, to be transferred to the dependence of this Ministry, which already informed the Ministry of Treasury about this request.

However, the settlement of the cases with the above mentioned personnel could only take place under the orders of Lieutenant Hubert Daniels Phillips, who has been handling such cases ever since the Commission was formed, and knows better than anybody else what criterions are to be followed and whether it is advisable to choose one system rather than another, and can give to the Italian Government the benefit of his experience and valuable advice.

For the above mentioned reasons, I ask you to allow Lt. Phillips to work with this Ministry, which feels that thus only, it can solve the very numerous and often intricate problems regarding salvage, which, till now, had been handled by the War Material Disposal Subcommission.

My dear Signor DeFeo:

Due to the press of considerable work, I have just now been able to give attention to your letter of November 22nd.

As you may have read in the Italian press, the Allied Commission was abolished on February 1st. My present duties are therefore military only. Moreover, as you know, AMC does not exist anywhere in Italy, except in the Province of Udine and in Venezia Giulia.

It is difficult for me to know how to advise you. There is no military method by which assistance can be given you, although during the period of AMC occupation in Avellino, assistance probably could have been given you. However, at the present time there is an organization in Italy jointly sponsored by American Relief for Italy, the Vatican, and the Italian Government. It was headed by the Hon. Myron C. Taylor, the President's Personal Representative to the Holy See. U.R.D.S.I. has a branch in Naples, whose address is shown below:

Dear Sir:- I am taking the liberty of writing these few lines congratulating you on the prominent part you have taken towards the reconstruction of Italy.

I'm an American Citizen and an ex-veteran of world war no. one. I happen to be in Italy since 1935 not because I wanted to come to Italy of my own volition but was sent to Italy because my father was very sick and in feeble health and at one of my dad's attorney's in Hartford Conn. I was told it was my duty as a son to stay with him until the end and when I come back I'll feel better and during this period everything went wrong from the day I buried my poor father which was in **5632**.

In 1936 I listened to my father's advice and he suggested that before he would die to see me married and his only ambition was to see a heir named after him which I did do but the only regret is that the heir was born three weeks after he was buried.

I wrote a letter to a friend of mine in Washington D.C. June 20<sup>th</sup>, 1946 making them understand that I'm a married man and have a wife and three children and in dire financial circumstances and over anxious to get back after spending all these years of torture and hell. I haven't received any answer from the letter but two political leaders from Washington D.C. came over to

my home town waving a hand and calling me over  
and showing me a brief case full of occupation currency  
and I thought they were robbing me not knowing who  
they were from a distance for the simple reason that  
I was robbed four or five times before by the Italians  
in Oct 1941 and three or four times in 1942. but  
if they sent some one of the Questura or someone from  
the prefect office to get me and bring me there or  
else have one of those chauffeurs announce who  
they were I'd be tickled to death to see them.

You see these Italians has always been on my nerves  
they knew my dad's status because my dad had a large  
safe deposit with the Bank of Italy in Tivoli  
and I believe you know how they operate these banks  
are sent to the Bank of Italy in Rome for safe keeping  
and only on request after two days that you have advised  
your local Bank your safe box will arrive from Rome  
in other words they had a master key and more  
or less what information was there so that's why  
they robbed me all they use to say was these words  
one of the wealthiest men in the U. S. of A. left stranded  
by your government and American friends and were asking  
**#631** because of everything and I told them I don't know  
but I suggest to my dad in 1937 when the Italian  
Government passed a law that it was up to the  
Italian residing in Italy to disclose their credits abroad  
that's the time I advised my father to turn everything  
over to me so I could leave for the States and he was  
stubborn and refused a compromise plan I made  
for him understand them to go to the American Consulate  
Service and make them understand the situation  
and if its to much trouble make them understand  
that you intend to disown me that way they'll  
do what you say and until now I haven't heard  
from my lawyers or bankers yet.

I believe one of the Attorneys happen to busy in

Europe with the United Nations and just got back shortly.

I was told in Jan 1944 by Maj. Chas. P. Sisson of the R. M. G. that if I need any money I could have it because the United States Steel Corporation is back of me. I told him I thank him but don't need it just now. I'll only have to pay it back in real American dollars and that I didn't want to do at that time. I thank his Honor Ed. R. Stettinius the Secretary of State and Chairman of the Board of Directors of the U.S. Corporation.

What I would suggest to know is this did the U. S. Government or any official representative or firm leave any way open through you so I can obtain a loan.

The War in Italy has made a pauper out of me from the day the Germans were in my home town after I assisted some of the troops from 501 Bn. of Paratroopers from Salerno Italy Sept. 14th 1943.

I'm in dire financial circumstances with a wife and 3 children with no money and no rations and a long winter ahead.

I would suggest if it's a little difficult for you to decide to send a wire direct to Washington to the Department of State or Chairman Robert C. Hannegan of the Democratic National Committee because it will be more official through you.

I thank you and hope and trust that you will do me this favor and give this letter a little consideration.



We very come to know and admiring the multitude of aid which your Excellency has generously contributed for the "GRANDE DON ORIONE" which on the occasion of your honourable visit to the Institute of the Camilluccio in November 1946 had the son of the undersigned to read in latin all their gratefulness, encloses the photograph begin to accept it. The undersigned Alberto Giuliana exposes with this letter his pitiful case, trustful that Your Excellency assists in his favour for what he asks.

An Italian citizen, born in Cairo Egypt on December 13<sup>th</sup> 1907 where he studied and resided up to 1940 with his parents, a distinguished family still living in Cairo in Madabeg Street 15-A, a clerk by profession of Catholic Religion, he returned to his country definitely from Egypt in May 1946 together with his two children, being a refugee caused him by his wife from whom he is legally separated.

After having spent all the period of the war in home as clerk at the Post, fighting with enormous sacrifices to educate in a Christian way his two children without any relative in Italy and succeeding to keep himself always neutral both in politics and the war, thanks to his absolute military discharge, finds himself at the moment for the time being sheltered together with his children at the Institute Don Orione at Street delle Camilluccia n.10, being a refugee without a home or work.

We begs his Excellency that they grant him.

An employment, owing to his sad economical conditions, the difficulty to find any owing to the actual moment and the preference granted only to war returned.

We would have need of a Touristic visa for Egypt of two months only to reembrance his family in Egypt since it is 7 Years he has not seen them.

And if it was possible, he would wish also to receive throught

V.V.R.R.A. of Italy and Egypt or in the way which is throught best, some help from his family in packages of clothes, sweets for the children, seeing that postal communications of this kind are still closed with Egypt.

Whilst waiting to be able to receive help from his people, since the war lost has answered him he must wait long for the new arrivals, and finding himself absolutely deprived he woud accept any whatsover clothes.

As regards the employment, owing to his honesty, knowledge of languages English, French, Italian, Arabic and Book keeping, he could honourably fulfill the post of accountant, storekeeper's help a controller at the Custom Office "American department of many port in Italy for the disembarkement and embarkation of merchandise.

As regards the tourist visa, through the Non-American Embassy Cairo and the Egyptian Ministry of Interior one could obtain it.

We made in 1,45 through the English Embassy to me his regular practice n. 585, (especially on the occasion when he wanted to assist at his late father's funeral in May 1,46) to which he received no answer. Therefore through the American Embassy in Cairo with the assistance of Your Excellency one could surely obtain it.



Dear Admiral:

Please permit me to call your kindly attention to the following matter.

In the Province of Udine there are three hundred and forty crippled children suffering from wounds to their legs or arms, blindness or other injury as a result of the war. Some of these are without means of support, while others, because of their injuries are not able to attend school.

The Provincial Office of Udine of the Ministero dell'Assistenza Post-Bellica, about a month ago, under the terms of a preliminary contract which will become definite on the seventh of this month, bought the villa "Florio" of Buttrio (Udine) intending to turn it into an Institute in which these unfortunate children might be brought together and where they might be educated. The money required for this was given by Ministero dell'Assistenza Post-Bellica.

The building, together with all the other buildings previously occupied by the Germans, was requisitioned immediately upon liberation; a Command of the "Blue Devils" took lodgings there for a time and then departed from the neighborhood leaving behind some German prisoners who were to clean up the place.

The villa was offered for sale on attractive terms and the Provincial Office of Assistance considering the fact that it would provide very well for the needs of these children and knowing that another organization was thinking of buying it and believing that it would soon be released by the Military Authority negotiated the purchase. At the time the contract was made it was known to the purchasers that work had been started to adapt the villa for the use of the families of two American officials and that these officials had already expended eight hundred dollars for materials and other expenses. When the proposal to seek the release of the property was made it was agreed to refund the moneys paid by these officials, if requested.

For the release of the property: 1) there was some interest on the part of the Governor of Udine (Colonel Bright, English office) and the Prefect of Udine, who promised to do what they could; 2) the assistance of the Archbishop of Udine was asked for and he in turn asked the Archbishop of Gorizia to look into the matter since the headquarters of the 88th Division is in Gorizia; 3) the Archbishop of Gorizia, about two months ago, spoke to General Moore, who agreed to help. The work of adapting the building, however, for the two American officials still continues; 4) Major Mittoni, head of **5576** the Provincial Office for Post-War Assistance, went to Padua to ask the Bishop to take up the matter with the Regional Commander. I do not know the outcome of this visit.

The Bishops were interested in the Matter because the operation of the Institute would be confided to the care of a Friulan Organization (Ente Friulano di Assistenza) whose principal committee

members are the Archbishops of Udine and Gorizia and the Bishop of Portogruaro since the Province of Udine extends to the Dioceses of Gorizia and Portogruaro.

It is very urgently desired to begin the work of adapting and refurnishing the villa for the children and therefore to obtain the release of the building and to have the work, which is now being done for the families of two American officials, stopped.

Since it is a matter of such importance for the welfare of these innocent children, three hundred and forty of them, and consequently to three hundred and forty of their families that have already suffered much, I take the liberty to appeal to your generous heart, dear Admiral, as Chief of the Allied Control Commission for Italy, to make intervention for us with the Command of the 88th American Division (Gorizia), office "Real Estate", so that we might obtain release of the villa.

To the Italian officers Prisoner of War, cooperators, was issued from the American Authority a certificate of credit that still now has not yet been paid by the Italian Government.

The Italian Authority said us that they have not paid the certificate of credit because they are awaiting an agreement with the allied Authority to fix the modality and the competence for the payment.

With the omitted settlement of these matters, that interest a considerable number of Officers P.W. returned from the Camps of North-Africa and France, has failed the purpose that General Wilson explained us in a meeting with the Commanding Officers in North-Africa; this purpose was an aid for the first necessity of Civil life when we should have been returned home.

Really over one year of our return in Italy we are still awaiting to have our due credit, and now we are compelled to ask you to do all the possible to define the agreement in way that we can get our credit.

We should be very glad if you can give us some explanations on the following subject:

- 1) In the case that we can have back the certificate of credit detained by the Italian Authority, is possible to get the direct settlement if we present it to the American authority?
- 2) In which way we could be in possess of our credit, if the certificate cannot be gave back from the Italian Authority?
- 3) We wish to know if the food rations gave to the Italian Service Unit, were enclosed in the total retribution of cooperation fixed for these Units; necessary explanation to fix the amount of our competence with the Italian Government.

Considering the critical economic situation of their families, and the necessity of feeding and educating them, I have taken a keen interest in the Orphans of our Aviators from the first moment of my being appointed as Air Minister.

The colleges of Loreto and Gorizia which were at the disposal of the "National Institute for Aviators' Orphans" entrusted under the guidance of this Ministry, with the care of these orphans, are up to this day under requisitions by the Allied Authorities.

There do not seem to be any probabilities of the college located at Gorizia being de-requisitioned. But the Institute was hoping to have back these days the Loreto College (requisitioned by the departing Polish troops).

However we have heard that this building will not be returned to the Institute, but used as married quarters for Polish military personnel.

High Ecclesiastique Authorities have interceded but to no avail to have this building returned to the National Institute for Aviators' Orphans.

At present, more than 90 orphans between 6 and 10 years of age are temporarily housed in a building lent by the Bishop, who is requesting the return of this building.

In the case that the College could not be returned to the "National Institute for Aviators' Orphans", the children will have to be sent back to their families and thus be deprived of all help and care.

I am appealing to your kindness of heart so that convinced of the necessity of helping these and other children who for years have been awaiting to be cared for by their Institute, you kindly examine the possibilities of returning the Loreto building to the National Institute for Aviators' Orphans.

It will be one more deed of high humanity to be added to your record of acts of generosity towards those in need.

Grateful for all that your Excellency will do for our small orphans, please receive my highest regard.




