1. Present plans no. tentatively approved by United States and
British Embassies in Rome and submitted 14 November in WA 21233
for approval of Combined Chiefs of Staff envision future organization
to discharge, after the end of military period, all remaining commit-
ments of Allied Forces Records Administration. Responsibilities
would include, in addition to those pertaining to Allied Commission
Archives, the reproduction and proper disposition of certain combined

3. The estimate of approximately three years to complete this project is based upon capacity of present Microfilming equipment and considers the fact that over two years will be required to micro film Allied Commission records alone.
4. In order to clarify administrative picture for your information herewith are present essential details. Allied Forces Records Administration formulates all procedures and directs all Micro-filming and records disposition work under policies established by Combined Chief of Staff. These functions include but are not confined to the Allied Commission project. Allied Forces Micro-filming and Records Depot reproduces Combined records for the entire theater and houses and services and ultimately disposes of such records. These administrative provisions would not be affected by dissolution of Alog but would disappear at end of military period unless provisions are made for their continuation.
5. Should Combined Chiefs of Staff approve plans for transfer to the Embassies at the end of the military period of the undischarged Allied Forces Records Administration responsibilities completely new organisational and cost tables will be prepared in consultation with the Embassies. It is therefore requested that State Department be so informed with a view toward withholding final action until these plans are approved.

1. You SMC authorize Supreme Allied Commander to make necessary arrangements with United States and British Embassy for transfer of responsibility for United Commission archives and for transfer of necessary personnel and equipment to comprise morofliming project at end of military period.
2. Allied Forces microfilming and records depot, operated by Allied Forces Records Administration has just begun the morofliming of allied American records. This project alone will require over two years for completion with present equipment and does not take into account other Allied Forces records administration commitments, which cannot be entirely ~~known~~ prior to the end of the military period.
3. It therefore appears desirable to transfer also to the British and American agencies, at the end of the military period, all other undischarged responsibilities pertaining to the duplication of records of a nonmilitary British character, on the appropriate **F620** classification of such records per your instructions in FAD 630. Included in these additional responsibilities would be the morofliming of certain active communis that cannot be released for morofliming until those Headquarters are inactivated.

1. United States and British embassies in Rome have agreed subject to concurrence by proper authorities in Washington and London, to the under mentioned proposals to become effective upon dissolution of Allied Forces Headquarters on withdrawal of military forces in Italy.

(a) The respective military attaches of the British and American governments will assume responsibility for the compilation of the entire Allied Forces Records Administration program following the Allied Commission records, and would maintain direct contact with the various Chiefs of Staff in order to complete the program, with the reservation that major problems affecting the use and ultimate disposition of Allied Commission inventories would be formulated by the Disbursers on a separate basis.

(b) The contemplated organization would be completely self sufficient and would comprise the present Disbursing Unit and one liaison unit, both of which would operate under the immediate control of the Allied Technical Administration group responsible to the respective military attaches of the British and American governments, this group would take on present function of Allied Forces Records Administration and would be composed of technical and administrative personnel ~~whose~~ thoroughly familiar with all the aspects of this program.

(c) The cost of the whole undertaking would be borne by such departments of the United States and UK Govt and determined by those governments.

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3. This Headquarters is now preparing detailed plan of organization and cost analysis as a basis for early discussion with embassies. Inasmuch as no final decision can be reached pending approval of plans described herein, request decision at earliest possible date.

1. As a result of conversations with the two embassies in Rome have already recommended to the Foreign Office and the State Department that the strength of the Archives to be transferred to the Embassies will be (A) Officers or civilians of officer status - 6,3 British and 3 American (B) EN/ORS or civilians equal status 10 , 5 British and 5 American (C) Italian civilians 34.
2. The Archives Division of ALGOV is largely staffed in this strength and all existing personnel have expressed their willingness to continue under the Embassies in a civilian capacity subject to the terms of employment being acceptable.
3. This estimate takes no account of the Microfilm Unit the future status of which has not yet been decided. At present Microfilming is being carried out by the Unit operated by Allied Force Records Administration which is an integrated military body dealing with the records of AFHQ.
4. A conference will shortly take place in Rome as a result of which it is hoped to make recommendations for the reorganisation of AFRA. Until then it is not possible to state to what extent the Embassies will become responsible for any part of their existing organisation.
5. It is proposed that should ALGOV be abolished prior to the end of the Military period the Archives Division of ALGOV will become an integral part of the Liaison and Civil Affairs

TO : A.H.Q. Attn. G-5 Section.

1. Reference is made to your G-5:200,24 of 11 June 1946 and to your R 72750 of 18 October 1946. The present position is as follows.

2. Following many discussions with British and American Embassies a tentative procedure for the transfer of Archives Division to the Embassies at the end of the Military period has been submitted, by the Embassies, to the Foreign Office and State Department.

3. The salient points are:-

(a) The Embassies are willing to accept the responsibility for the continuance of Archives Division at the end of the Military period, subject to receipt of authority to do so from Foreign Office and State Department.

(b) The question of staff and terms of service to be investigated by a representative from London in conjunction with a representative of the State Department, Washington.

(c) No definite proposal regarding microfilm Depot has at present been submitted. It is anticipated that the expense of this Depot will be much higher than that of Archives Division, and its future policy is entirely controlled by A.F.B.A. 1015

4. The personnel required for Archives Division upon transfer to the Embassies will be at least-

- 6 Officers or civilians of Officer Status
- 10 EM/OMs or civilians of equal Status
- 34 Italian Civilians.

I acknowledge letter dated 21 August No. 75163/16644.12/9.11 addressed to you by the Undersecretary of State to the Presidency of the Council of Ministers and, as the sequestrator of the "Istituto Archeologico Germanico" of 79, Via Sardegna, I state that following the disposition of the Undersecretary of State, nothing prevents the premises of this Institute being occupied by offices of the A.G.

I must point out, however, that the Institute in question is only proprietor of the furniture - desks, chairs, shelves, etc. - per inventory already sent to the Intendenza di Finanze of Rome (a small part of which is being claimed by the Czechoslovak Legion (in Rome) while the building has been rented by the Institute belonging to the ecclesiastic evangelic commission of Berlin, represented in Rome by Pastor Erich Dahlgren - 7, Via Toscano.

Therefore arrangements are to be made with Pastor Dahlgren regarding the renting conditions of the building, which I have already visited with an officer of the archives of A.G., while arrangements to establish the compensation for the furniture's use must be made, through myself, with the Intendenza di Finanze of Rome.

The position can be handed over by Oct. 1st as I will be out of town at the end of September.

1. Recommendations contained in paragraph 3, MAP 1123 are approved subject to the following provisions:

(a) In reducing the files to archive form the segregation of documents that under NO circumstances can be shown to the Italian Government must be considered. This segregation would make it possible eventually, to turn over the remaining archive to the possession of the Italian authorities if circumstances should so dictate.

(b) Regarding screening of files, it is our impression that the major reduction will consist of elimination of duplicates, which is considered satisfactory as long as the cost of screening is NOT more than the savings on the cost of microfilming. If elimination of blocks of material other than duplicates is proposed, an inventory of this material will be furnished to Combined Chiefs of Staff for review prior to elimination or destruction. Screening should be held to a minimum because of the difficulty of finding personnel skilled in archival techniques or with allied military government experience and because of limitations on number of persons who can be transferred to the civilian list at the end of the military period.

(c) Microfilm will be forwarded periodically to the United States War Department (Attention: the Adjutant General) and to the British Cabinet Office, (Attention: historical Section) for review to assure adequate standards of arrangement, indexing and film processing as at present provided for other combined records.

1. The following is the text of PAI 672:

This is PAI 672.

1. Recommendations mentioned in paragraph 3, PAI 1426 are approved subject to the following provisions:

(1) In regard to the plan to archive form, the segregation of accounts that under no circumstances can be given to the Italian Government must be maintained. This segregation will make it possible eventually, to turn over the records exclusive to the commission of the Italian authorities if circumstances should so dictate.

(2) Regarding surviving copies, it is our impression that the major reduction will consist of elimination of duplicates, which is considered satisfactory inasmuch as the cost of recording is far more than the gain in the cost of preserving. If elimination of all copies of material other than duplicates is demanded, an enclosure of this material will be furnished to commandant of AFN 734 for review prior to elimination or destruction. Screening must be held in a timely manner because of the difficulty in later recovering original material in archival techniques. It is believed military experience and knowledge of institutions in number of countries can be transferred to the commandant at the end of the military period.

(3) Materials will be forwarded periodically to the USDAO, G-3 Department (Archives), the Adjutant General, and to the British Cabinet Office, Ministry of Information, London, for review to assure adequate standards of arrangement, indexing and file processing as at present provided for their official records.

2. You are authorized to make necessary arrangements with USDAO, G-3 and British Agencies for transfer of responsibility for the archive and transfer of custody 1945 and the duty will be to conclude the main file project at the end of the military period. You will keep

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the Combined Chiefs of Staff advised in accompanying note, 2nd of Feb 672.

2. The instructions in paragraph 1 (B) as to the destruction of "stocks of material" will apply, whenever any particular class or category of material is proposed to be destroyed. To this end will be required of appropriate individually authorized representative. So long as you continue to retain personnel with survival and APF experience your recent procedure may continue; but, in calculating the degree of reduction, regard must be had not only to the skill and knowledge of the present staff but to the time that skilled staff will be available, the staff that the successor may be expected to take over, the quantum of time and the relative expense of securing or training.

3. You will please segregate those documents which it is considered should under DD circumstances be known to the American Government. Subject to the overriding requirement, for removal of documents which unless so designated would be no use, the originals should be in as late and an installation as possible.

4. Documents segregated will be catalogued in usual manner but specially stored. Instructions as to their disposal will be issued at a later date. Consideration of the probable volume of such records.

5. I furnish you a copy with the U.S. and British information relative to the provisions of Article 2 of Reg. 672 and have pertinent representations in connection therewith.

1. You have recently made queries with other agencies, relatives, and myself, regarding the prints of air photographs alleged to be held by the British School in Rome.

2. Your impression is that these prints are the property of the Allied Commission and you have queried the retention of them by the British School. The total photographic material originally in the possession of the Allied Commission can be divided into two parts:

- (a) photos taken by the allied air force, prints of which were passed to the Allied Commission, Commissario & Miss Aris Mu-Commission, in order that they could assess the damage done and also arrange for protection from bombing. These are property the property of the Allied Commission and are in the archives of the Allied Commission, safe and sound;
- (b) a number of prints taken by the allied air force during operations based on Italy during 1944-5. These constitute the scientific portion of the print-collection held by G-2 and passed to it by the U.S. Air Force custody at the time of the disbanding of the former body. The basic and original intention for the future of these photographs is that they should be used for scientific and cultural research. The AO can lay no claim to retention of these photographs and we are under instructions, at the proper time and with the full consent of the Inter-Secretary of G-2 to ask for U.S. to send the Director of the British School made application on 21 January, these photographs have been handed to the British School for use w.t. certain conditions of copyright.

3. I hope this clarifies the situation and I should like to add that I am perfectly satisfied that the British school certainly intended to retain the prints mentioned in para 2 above but that it would be a great loss to scientific and cultural research if they were not left in that school.

Lieut. Colonel WHITE has at last returned from LIAP and I understand has already left to join you. He has done invaluable work here and I do hope you will find him of as great assistance as I have here.

I have charged him particularly to speed up at your end the question of the archives of the Allied Commission. I was very much distressed to learn on my return from LONDON that no action had been taken regarding the future of these archives in spite of the submission by us of several memoranda beginning as long ago as April 1944. It is true that Colonel JACKMAN has taken an active interest in the microfilming process and that is going ahead well, but we must, and I repeat must, have a decision on the future of these archives because it is essential that we should work out plans for storage, staff and so on. The attached draft signal prepared by JACKMAN has not found concurrence in the Embassies for the reasons explained in HARRISON's note.

I do ask you to give this matter very early consideration and to extract from the proper quarters a firm decision. It would be a disaster if the archives of this Commission suffered extermination.

Mr. MALCOLM of the British Embassy telephoned yesterday afternoon upon the subject of the draft cable to Chiefs of Staff proposed by Lt. Col. JENNINGS. He had been in touch with Mr. WESLEY JONES and the points that had occurred to them were as follows:

1. Second Page, Line 4. It is not understood why Archives should be "loaned to British Embassy in custody of a Military Attaché". Archives are a joint American and British responsibility and in his opinion the CCS would not approve.
2. Financial liability should also be mentioned.
3. In their opinion both embassies thought that a building should be negotiated through the Italian Government, either on lease or as a gift and the Archives administered there by a combined American and British staff for as long as time are required in Italy.
4. Final disposition to be as directed either by U.S.C. or the governments concerned.
5. Mr. Malcolm concluded with a promise that he might possibly be able to discuss these points with you yesterday morning.

MR. WESLEY JONES telephoned late this morning to say he was leaving on a trip and would not be back for a week but that Mr. MCNAUL would deputise in his place, should this be necessary.

I read over the points outlined above and he concurred that these had been discussed by him with Mr. Malcolm.

He asked that a copy of the final draft cable be forwarded to Mr. MacNaul for information and concurrence.

This embraced such activities as agricultural reconstruction, public works, utilities and communications, finance, banking and currency, commerce, education, civil law, politics and administration, etc. The advance of the Allied military forces through Italy necessitated the frequent opening and closing of many Regional and Provincial AMG offices as the war progressed up the peninsula. To protect records created by these and other Allied Commission subsidiaries, a central repository was created wherein they could be saved, arranged, screened and preserved for use of the Commission, Embassies and other authorised agencies, and for microfilming. - c. Organizations, installations or agencies which can present adequate written justification to the Allied Force Records Administrator for retention of certain blocks or series of records required for future use. Lack of duplicate copies of records will not automatically be considered sufficient justification. Small groups may be reproduced by typewriter; large groups by photostat or similar methods. In the absence of written requests for retention, records will be considered non-essential to the needs of the agency concerned and will be ordered by their headquarters for shipment to the Allied Force Depot on or before 1 January 1946.

SUBJECT: Historical Records of the Mediterranean Theater

TO: All Concerned

1. Reference is made to AFHQ Circular 8, of 18 July 1945, as amended.

2. The Combined Chiefs of Staff have directed that the combined British-American records of permanent value of the various theaters be preserved, and film copies furnished to the American and British Governments. In the Mediterranean Theater the Allied Force Records Administration is responsible for this work. The duplication of the integrated records will be done by micro-filming and the original paper records will be finally disposed of under direction of the Combined Chiefs of Staff. Pending final disposition the Allied Force Records Administration is responsible for the custody of the original records.

3. It is appreciated that certain Headquarters and Staff Sections will not be able to retire all their allied records to dead storage immediately, due to continuation of certain functions of these organizations, after withdrawal of either the American or British contingent or upon reorganization or reconstitution. Such records will therefore be shipped to the Allied Force Microfilming and Records Depot for microfilming and then may be returned to the originating sections or their successors. Further, it may be found that section require to refer to records which have been placed in dead storage.

4. a. A "charge out" system will therefore be instituted to deal with these requests. Records will not be charged out to sections etc. unless there is strong and adequate justification. Records will only be charged out for the shortest possible time and will be returned to the Allied Force Microfilming and Records Depot as soon as possible after completion of the necessary work.

b. When records are required, application in writing will be made to the Allied Force Records Administration, AFHQ, giving the following information:

- (1) Reason for requiring the records.
- (2) Full identification of the records required, stating the Headquarters, Staff Section and blocks of files required.
- (3) Where these records are required.
- (4) Period for which the records are required.

5. It must be clearly understood by any officer initiating such a request that these records are the joint property of the American and British Government


