MEMORANDUM FOR THE ALLIED COMMISSION

Subject: Water-way traffic with Switzerland on Lake of Como.

1. The Municipal Authorities of Porlezza (Lake of Como) have called the attention of this Ministry to the serious transport difficulties which hamper the arrival there of the necessary supplies.

2. Owing to the regulations at present in force forbidding the direct shipment through Swiss waters across the lake from Como to Porlezza, supplies must be sent by boat from Como to Menaggio, where they are unloaded and later reloaded on motor-trucks bound for Porlezza. The freight and handling charges are high, and the quantities which can be carried very limited. Moreover, the present system renders it impossible to lift the timber of which Porlezza is a large producer.

The adoption on the part of Italy of the Allied Black Lists to which the reopening of the border-traffic was conditioned, can now be considered to be an accomplished fact.

3. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs should consequently be grateful to the Allied Commission if they would recommend to the competent Authorities to authorize the resumption of traffic across the Swiss waters of Lake Como, thereby alleviating the distress of the people living in the northern regions of the Lake.

SUBJECT: Italo-Swiss Frontier Trade

TO : Ministero Industria e Commercio,
Direzione Generale Commercio Estero,

1. With further reference to the subject of reopening the Italo-Swiss border for trade, it can now be stated that it is considered the frontier can be opened in its fullest sense when ANG's cease to function in the border provinces.

2. ANG offices have been instructed to interpret generously any relaxations in the passage of goods which Allied Commission indicate as being the desire of the Italian and Swiss Governments.

3. Therefore, in order that ANG's may be instructed further, it is requested that this Headquarters should be informed of the type and scope of trade which it is the desire of your Government to approve. 3545

4. Meanwhile, as your Ministry has already submitted certain requests in connection with the passage of goods across the Swiss frontier, ANG's have been told to agree to the following :

- a) Import of 450 tons of cellulose, the property of SOCIETA' NAZIONALE CARTIERE, now lying at Basle (Reference your letter No. 21229 of 18 September)
- b) Completion of the shipment of 50,000 kilos of broom-corn to Switzerland by the firm STEFAN

Dear Admiral,

the association 'swiss relief for war victims' which - with many other organizations of this friendly country - is carrying out a generous and active relief activity for such part of our population as suffered from war, works in close collaboration with E.M.D.S.I. and with the Centrale Italiana di Assistenza sanitaria (C.I.A.S.) of Milan.

The Italian Government considers it its duty materially and morally to help the action of the said swiss organizations, financing and supporting in every possible way the Italian organizations which can take care of the distribution of relief and mention the requirements of the population.

The transport of the materials, foodstuffs and medicines destined to Italy, as well as the passage of the staff across the Swiss frontier are meeting with serious difficulties because of the long and complicated formalities which are necessary to obtain transit passes from the allied military Government. Such passes are sometimes granted months after the request has been made, and this prevent relief for the soldiers from arriving in time.

Considering how important Swiss relief is for the population of northern Italy, for whom it is mainly destined, I beg you to consider the advisability of issuing orders to facilitate as much as possible the crossing of the frontier to the goods and persons connected with such organizations.

Meanwhile AMG should interpret generously any relaxations indicated by ALCOM as being the desire of the Italian and Swiss Govts. This applies particularly to the passage of goods since movement of persons across frontier already largely covered.

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1. Look at MAP 1053 now answered in TMW 673 of which paraphrase beings. No authority can be given to open Italian/Swiss frontier until Italians accept either existing or revised statutory and proclaimed lists. Approval is given to recommendations MAP 1053; para rear (four). You will be advised when sufficient progress has been made in representations now being made on diplomatic level. Paraphrase ends.

2. You will realize that this veto applies in similar cases and is the bottleneck in all attempts to restore normal commercial activity. The Italian Govt should be so informed.

This is NAV 1065. Reopening of the Italian/swiss frontier.

It is most desirable that normal trade relationships between ITALY and SWITZERLAND should be re-established, the frontier opened and restrictions on communications removed.

The primary obstacle as seen here is the non-acceptance by the Italian Government of the US proclaimed and UN statutory lists. In this connection the ALLIED COMMISSION has informed AMHQ that the Italian government on 12 July instructed its ambassadors in WASHINGTON and LONDON to press for the removal of most Italian and certain neutral firms from the lists after which the Italian Government will effect the necessary legislation to recognise the new lists. Meantime no progress is likely here in persuading the Italian government to take action.

Existing external censorship controls of outgoing mail and telecommunications are being maintained. Such controls are no longer of material interest as regards military security and their continuation is therefore primarily to enforce the economic and financial policy laid down by you.

It is therefore recommended that,

- A. AMHQ be informed of the progress of the diplomatic representations referred to above.
- B. Continued representation to the Italian government respecting the adoption

SUBJECT: Reopening of the Italian-Swiss Frontier.

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission, APO 394.

1. In connection with a study which has been made at this HQ on the Internal situation in Italy the following views have been expressed:

"The danger of the economic crisis in Northwest ITALY being exploited by political parties in order to deepen class and political cleavages is enhanced by the present policy of strict frontier control as a result of which North ITALY remains isolated from the rest of EUROPE. In order to counter this danger it is desirable that normal intercourse between Northern ITALY and SWITZERLAND should be re-established as quickly as possible. From the security point of view there is no objection to the re-opening of the Italian-Swiss frontier. Quite apart from the impetus to trade which would result from this measure, the restoration of normal contacts between the two countries would have a healthy influence on the political life of Northwestern ITALY."

2. The views set out above are receiving further consideration at this HQ and in connection therewith it is requested that you will forward your comments as a matter of urgency.

1. Lumbardia Region has raised the question of the policy of the passage of civilians and merchandise between Switzerland and Italy. The same question also arises in Piemonte and Liguria between France and Italy. The matter was referred to Political section who were of the opinion that in the early stages there should be a maximum flow in, but minimum flow out, of merchandise, and minimum flow in and out of persons. Political commented that whatever decision was arrived at, our requirements would have to be registered with the Swiss and French authorities, and a letter written to AFM with copies to the US Political Adviser and British Resident Minister.

2. It is for consideration whether there will in fact be any merchandise for export from Italy in the early stages of occupation and whether the movement of persons out of Italy, which it is agreed should be restricted if possible, could be properly enforced.

3. Would you please give this matter careful consideration and submit your recommendations to me as soon as possible.
