Approval has now been given to the formation and despatch of screening Commission object of which is to assist in dissolving the Sep/DP problem in Italy by (A) Isolating quislings war criminals and other wanted person liable for forcible repatriation to countries of origin. (B) Establishing those likely to be acceptable Iro or interim organization (C) isolating those elements capable of organising opposition to policy of HMG. (D) persuading as many dissidents as possible to return to their country of origin (E) reporting and recording any other information as directed (F) making recommendations as to disposal of those screened.
2. Commission is qualified mainly to screen Yugoslavs it should be utilised to screen such other categories of DP or SEP as you in consultation with the head of commission may think of. Detailed instructions for completion task in para 1 will be issued by you direct to head of Commission.
3. Commission will be composed of 12(15?) members each with own secretary all of officer status plus 2 additional officers for HQ Staff also 1 civilian confidential messenger of or status. Brig FHR Maclean MP War time head of British mission to Yugoslavia is head of commission he is being recalled to military service for this duty. Secretarial staff and members are mainly civilians but will include 2 or more serving officers. Head of commission will have nominal roll.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister:

1. Your letters of 15 and 17 January from Undersecretary of State Cappa have been forwarded to the Supreme Allied Commander with appropriate recommendations. Before its receipt by the Supreme Allied Commander, I received his letter on the same subject dated 18 January and as directed by him to inform you that:-

- (a) It is most important in the interests of all concerned that immediate plans should be made by the Italian Government for the orderly evacuation of those Italian citizens who desire to leave the FOIA enclave in anticipation of its transfer to Yugoslavia. It is understood that the number involved ranges from 20,000 to 25,000.
- (b) Some 750 of these will be employees of the Allied Military Government, including Venezia Giulia Police. The Allied Military Authorities accept responsibility for the evacuation of these employees, their families and personal effects. They are not, however, in a position to accept responsibility for the movement of the remainder, nor can they place shipping for this purpose at the disposal of the Italian Government or guarantee the safe passage of evacuees or their property by rail or road through territory under Yugoslav control.
- (c) It is feared that a most dangerous and confused situation may arise if the move of these persons is left to the last moment and it is considered essential that the Italian Government should make very early and comprehensive arrangements for their removal from FOIA and their resettlement in Italy.

2. I am further directed to urge the Italian Government most strongly to take immediate action:-

- (a) to set up a special Italian authority to be responsible for all aspects of the evacuation of Italian citizens desirous of leaving FOIA and for their reception and resettlement in Italy.
- (b) to establish without delay a bureau in FOIA to which citizens may address themselves and through which they may receive instructions and advice.

- (c) to make available sufficient Italian merchant shipping for this move in readiness to begin the evacuation as soon as the necessary administrative machinery has been provided both in POLA and Italy. For political reasons Italian warships will not be acceptable in POLA.
- (d) to publish at the earliest possible moment a statement of their policy and programme for the evacuation of citizens desiring to leave POLA, including information as to the administrative machinery to be set up at POLA and the arrangements to care for and resettle the persons concerned on their arrival at Italian ports.

3. It is appreciated that some of the foregoing requirements have already been anticipated, as evidenced by Gen. Cappa's letter of 15 January and as a result of discussions which I have held during the past several days with Consul Colonna of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, attached to my office.

4. The Supreme Allied Commander considers it of the greatest importance to make available as quickly as possible to the Italian population of POLA the fullest possible information as to the plans of the Italian Government for their evacuation and ultimate resettlement in order to alleviate so far as possible fear and despondency in the minds of the Italian residents of POLA. While Vice-prefect Meneghini's visit to POLA last week will no doubt have been of material benefit in this regard, the publication of an official statement of the Italian Government as to its plans and intentions in this matter is viewed of the greatest and most urgent importance.

5. I desire to assure you that while the Allied Military Authorities are unable physically to assist the evacuation, they will accord the Italian officials sent to POLA for this purpose all reasonable facilities and cooperation to enable them to carry out their mission.

1. For OMGUS . Request obtain clearance for Italian train of 670 German repatriates from Bolzano to Germany. Etd Bolzano 30 January. Breakdown by zones as follows:
US 170 , British 160, French 15, Soviet 325.
2. Rolling stock consists of 45 Italian box cars escorted by Captain Melotti Giuseppe and 50 Italian Military Guards. Food and medical supplies for the journey will be carried.
3. Further request, after unloading repatriates, train and escort returned Italy without delay.
4. For Alcom. Instruct Italian authorities to load repatriates for each zone separately. Train will unload United States and French zone Germans at Glessen and then proceed to Vebra, where boxcars with Russian zone Germans will be detached and taken to Eisenach. After unloading at Eisenach boxcars will be return to Vebra and train will proceed to Warburg to unload for British zone.

 - A. Amounts they are costing BMA in relief and present number unemployed Italians.
 - B. Why it is impossible to employ these Italians in agriculture and forestry or other work.
 - C. Recent anxiety of these people for repatriation.
 - D. Any admission made during previous negotiations of this subject by Italians that Eritrea cannot support anything like this European population in normal circumstances.

Dear Brigadier Lush,

I thank you for your letter No. 2230/50 IC dated 31st of May. (137) and for your interest in our request concerning the return to Tripolitania of Italian citizens who have there their families and their businesses.

Referring to the last paragraph of your letter, I agree with you that every Italian citizen can return his country if he wants, provided he according to the rules of Frontier Authorities, let me add, that in consequence of the principle pointed out by yourself, each Italian man should have also the right to go back to Tripolitania which is a Region that is still now integral part of National territory, with its two provinces Tripoli and Misurata.

Therefore, we can't understand why, till when peace-treatment, has not modified the juridical constitution of Tripoli and Misurata, we can forbid to Italian citizens, already admitted according to the principle of "bread-winner" to go back to their houses.

My dear Dott. Franas,

With reference to your letter No. 13552/25 dated 19 April 1946, I regret that I can give little hope of being able to assist you at the present moment regarding the return of Italian to TRIPOLITANIA.

As you know, over 800 Italians have been accepted by the British Military Administration under the "bread-winner" scheme, but their departure has been held in abeyance until the future status of TRIPOLITANIA has been decided at the Peace Conference. In these circumstances it is not considered the present time appropriate to send an Italian Mission to TRIPOLITANIA.

Regarding the 498 persons who were returned to ITALY, I assume you will agree that it is the right of every Italian to return to Metropolitan ITALY provided he can satisfy the Frontier Control Authorities by passport or identity card that he is an Italian citizen.

2. Representations on whole subject repatriation now before war office and do not consider interim steps should be taken before decision given.
3. As regards ex Cyrenalians these are uneconomically unabsorbable in Tripolitania where there are already a number waiting repatriation to Italy. No italian repatriation to Cyrenaica is permitted. Paragraph 2. If these persons have status of PW office directions exclude repatriation to any country but Italy.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ALLIED COMMISSION

Subject: Repatriation of Missionary Fathers of the "Don Orione" Institution from Albania.

1. The well known Religious Institution "Don Orione" has been carrying on, in Albania, for the last 11 years a very meritorious charitable and welfare work among the poorest sections of the population of that country taking particular care of orphans and abandoned children.

2. The Missionary Fathers of "Don Orione" were left undisturbed up to the beginning of January, but since then they were taken away from their homes, prevented to carry out their work and interned at Durazzo with many other members of religious orders.

3. On February 10th the Albanian authorities denied them the possibility which was offered them of being repatriated on board of a UNRRA ship, under the pretext that they were to return to Italy, via Yugoslavia. It is feared that such pretext is only an excuse to keep the a.m. Missionary fathers interned in Albania.

4. The Ministry for Foreign Affairs would be very grateful to the Allied Commission if they would take an interest in the matter with a view to have the Missionaries in question released from internment and repatriated at the earliest moment.

It is suggested that such officials commence operations in British zone and work south through United States and French zones of Germany and AUSTRIA. To facilitate screening, will it be possible to concentrate repatriable spaniards in particular camp in each zone.
- C) It is assumed that the screening team will eventually arrive by air from Spain, or possibly SWITZERLAND. Will each zone afford accomodation. Rations and motor transport facilities also. Mrs Giraldi would point out that the only letter which she has received from her daughter in this period indicates that the girl's health is in a precarious state and she would ask therefore that kind consideration be accorded her plea for the expedition of the repatriation of her daughter.

The Secretariat of State of His Holiness will appreciate any attention which you may give to this matter.

SUBJECT: Immigration to Latin America.

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission,
APO 394.

1. The United States Government have intimated that it may be possible to arrange immigration to Latin America for certain classes of Displaced Persons now in ITALY who have refused to return to their native countries because of their opposition to political regimes. The nationals most likely to be acceptable are POLES, YUGOSLAVS, LATVIANS, LITHUANIANS and ESTONIANS. The chief qualifications are that they are Roman Catholics and equipped by training to participate in agricultural or technical enterprises, but not commerce.

2. In order to frame a definite proposal, certain statistics are required initially. These are shown in specimen proforma attached as APP. A. All of this information should be available from the DP Registration Record Cards. At a later date, nominal rolls and additional information will be called for.

3. Please submit as soon as possible a return (drawn up in accordance with the specimen proforms) of those DPs who appear to be eligible for immigration as outlined in para 1 above.

4. At this stage, in order to avoid raising false hopes, no mention should be made to any DP of the possibility of this plan coming into effect.
