SUBJECT: Proposed Consecration of a Portion of the Anzio Battlefield.
TO : Commanding General, Rome Allied Area Command.

Reference to your DO/9 of 27 December 1945, under the heading, "Association for the Revival and Development of Anzio and Nettuno".

1. There are at hand in this headquarters various pieces of informal correspondence proposing the consecration of a portion of the Anzio battlefield and a ceremony in this connection, to be held on the 22nd of January. Apparently Prince Steno Borghese and the Organization for Reconstruction and Development of Anzio and Nettuno, headed by Prince Enrico Barberini, are interested in the project.

2. Will you please inform those principally concerned that the Supreme Allied Commander deeply appreciates this gesture on the part of the Italian people. Despite his feeling in this matter, however, it is impossible for him to approve such a project or even to take cognizance of it unless it is presented by the Italian Government through the Allied Commission.

3. Further, will you also please indicate that even should this project be presented by the Italian Government through the Allied Commission it would be necessary, before approval could be given by this headquarters, to refer the matter jointly to the War Office and the War Department. Please make it perfectly clear that until such a procedure is completed the Supreme Allied Commander is unable to sanction the project or to permit any personnel under his control to participate in a ceremony in connection therewith.

Days with beneficial collections were the most valuable period in the organization's history. The collections were the result of the efforts of the people of England, Scotland, Ireland, and America.

In 1190, the Second Crusade reached Antioch, where it was joined by the army of Godfrey of Ibelin, Count of Ibelin, and Tancred, Count of Galilee. The crusaders besieged the city for four months before it fell. In 1191, the crusaders captured Jerusalem, but they were unable to hold it for long. In 1192, Saladin recaptured the city. The crusaders returned home, having failed to achieve their goal of reclaiming Jerusalem.
