I am taking the opportunity of Monfort coming to AAI to send you copies of SACMED's telegrams of September 24th and Oct 19th regarding the issue of a 300 gram bread ration all over Italy. You will see that action is being taken at the very highest level in order to try and get the bread ration on to this minimum subsistence scale. If this can be done, and we have been fighting for it now for six months, then I think a great deal of our, and your, anxieties can be assuaged.

We are, as Monfort will tell you, faced with a very serious food situation throughout Italy if the general terms of the President's and the Prime Ministers utterances are not implemented. It is the usual story of shortage of shipping.

There also arises the difficulty of transportation. We are having great difficulty in getting AFHQ to implement the assurance given to us that 500 trucks would be provided and formed into British and American GT Coys. There is, in fact, a time lag of very nearly a month. We are doing our best to overcome this but with your knowledge of the shortage of transportation throughout the theatre you will realise that our hopes are not very high.

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With regard to feeding the population in NW. and N. Italy, even if we have both the food and transport the lines of communication in the first instance are going to be so long that it may be impossible to provide proper food supplies for the civilian population until the port of Genoa is open. You yourself indicated this at the meeting on 12th Oct.

I am asking Monfort to explain this to General Hume and if possible to General Gunther, and I hope that the telegrams sent by General Wilson will show that the best is being done to meet the situation caused by lack of coordination between public utterances and the implementation thereof.

SECRET. Civilian food situation throughout 5th Army area is critical and will become increasingly so as we advance. The 200 grams of bread distributed daily are inadequate. Widespread unrest is manifest in LUCCA and PISA while actual public demonstrations have occurred in PISTOIA and FLORENCE. Unofficial sources of information indicate that more serious incidents may develop. If such occur combat troops might have to be diverted to maintain law and order. I am informed that enough imported food supplies are not in sight to permit adoption of a ration sufficient for health and efficiency in accordance with assurances recently given in WASHINGTON. An inseparable part of the food problem is the provision of sufficient road transport for the movement of imported or local supplies to the centers of consumption. Recommend that the urgent matter of providing adequate food and transport be given immediate consideration.

Present flour stocks in Florence will be exhausted by night of 8 September. By depleting Cecina depot we can give Florence flour for three days more. However this means we have no flour for other cities and towns in recently occupied areas.

Conditions in such towns are bad.

In Prato, population 60,000, for instance, there has been no food distribution since 22 August.

Ampoli and other places are likewise in serious plight.

Electricity for flour mills in Florence cannot be expected before 15 Sept. and possibly later.

Minimum of 150 tons flour per day is required by us and any failure in this amount will entail most serious consequences.

This flour must be sent us daily no matter from what source or what distance of haul, otherwise cannot answer for consequences.

MANY OF THE TOWNS ARE NOT SELF MAINTAINING AND STARVATION WILL STARE THEM IN THE FACE. THE MILITARY IMPLICATION OF THIS IS TREMENDOUS AND APPALLING. IT MAY EVEN BECOME NECESSARY TO EMPLOY COMBAT TROOPS TO MAINTAIN ORDER THEREBY STULTIFYING THE ENTIRE CONCEPT OF ALLIED MILITARY GOVT. THIS WOULD FORM A MOST DANGEROUS GROUND FOR ENEMY PROPAGANDA AND THEY WOULD AT ONCE REALIZE THAT THEIR DESTRUCTION OF FOOD STOCKS, MILLS, BAKERIES AND THE LIKE AS WELL AS TRANSPORT WOULD MAKE ALLIED MILITARY GOVT COMPLETELY INEFFECTIVE IN THIS THEATRE. ALL THIS HAS A TREMENDOUS BEARING ON PLANS NOW BEING FORMULATED. WE MUST HAVE SOME DEFINITE ANSWER AS TO WHAT IS TO BE EXPECTED IN THE WAY OF FOOD IN ORDER THAT THE ARMY COMMANDER MAY BE FULLY ADVISED AS TO WHETHER MILITARY GOVT CAN OR CANNOT CARRY OUT THIS PHASE OF ITS COMMITMENTS.
