## I. PERSONNEL SITUATION - ITALIAN NAVY.

1. The total strength of officers and men administered by the Stalian Navy on 31 December 17/17, was 42, 893 as aginst 44,055 on 31 December and 46,613 at the end of November, 1746.

#### II. WARSHIP MOVEMENTS.

- approval for the Jualian battleships TTALIA and VITTOITO VANATO to be moved from the bitter Lakes, Egypt, to Augusta Sicily.
- 2. Arrangements were made for the Italian ships TOSCANA, GIUCH PE MEDOINA, and mobile CUCCO to evacuate Italian nationals and their possessions from Pola.

## III. HETURN OF PORTS TO ITALIAN CONTROL.

1. Notification was received that, effective 1 February, the Port of Naples was to be returned to control of the Italian authorities.

## IV. REPAIRS OF FOR JON WARSHIPS BY ITALIAN SHIPPYRDS.

has approved the repair of Turkish destroyers of Italian manufacture by Manie) providing that repairs to Allied and Italian ships are not hampered and that the Supreme Allied Commander, mediterranean's policy for the rehabilitation and utilization of Italian ship repair and shipbuilding facilities in Italy is not violated.

- 2. The ministry of marine was informed that the United States .rmy abandoned its rights in, and title to, the small craft marked with the letters m.T.I. locat a in the harbour of Pionbino.
- 3. Ind United States maritime Commission announced that the bulks of the following American ships beached in Italy are to be sold for sora ping:
  - (.) ELIMU YALE, Liberty ship. Dombed and proken in two at Anzio in February 1944. Hull located at Anzio.
  - (b) Golf rallow, tanker. Torpedoed in July 1943 near Naples, now affoat at Taranto.
  - (c) IsinC ShannY, Liberty ship. Struck The in January 1945. Efter Specian towed to Na les, bow beached 100 miles away.
  - (d) James Gurhale, Laborty snip. Struck two mires in April 1944 near Capri, beached at San Glovanni near Naples.
  - (c) PIERRE GLANGET, Liberty ship. Struck mine in 10,000 1945. Low section busched at Paragus, Gresce, and after section docked at reservo.

#### VI. THACING OF SHIPS

1. Information was received that the Italian minesweeper ELVIGA must be considered as having been

sunk during the war as there has been no trace of her since 8 September 1943.

- 2. In rely to a request for information of the tanker SAN M.noO the Navy Sub-Commission was informed that the tanker ran aground on a shoal in the vicinity of runta Grossa, North of modelina (052 degrees, Porer nock lighthouse, 6 miles) early in 1944. She was later bombed out. Since then she has broken up in the seas and become a total loss.
- 3. In response to a request for information concerning the yacht militarion II, word was received that she was sunk by the Germans at Porto Maurizio.

#### VII. RETURN OF SHIPS

- 1. Appropriate steps have been taken during the month in order to expedite the turnover of the French barge JUYCE, referred to in sub paragraph 2 of paragraph VI of the monthly report for December 1946, to the French authorities.
- 2. The Admiralty have been requested through the Commander-in-Chief, Mcditerranean to consider the early release to the French Covernment of the French barge IDOL.ThL (ex NOCHICGERRG), referred to in subparagraph VI of the monthly report for December 1946, pending the result of the Prize Co.rt proceedings in London.

#### VIII.SUPPLY.
